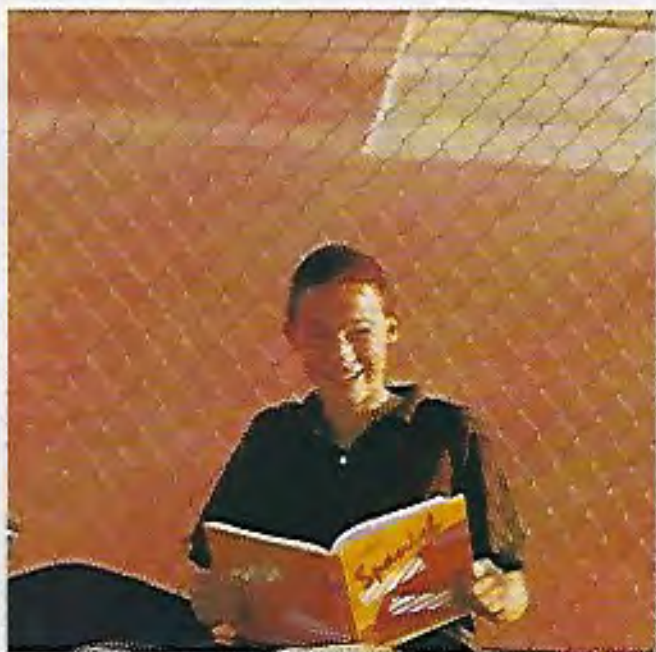

Brother Joseph Enright (1924-1991)

Brother Joseph Enright was always a serious student, excelling in math and science, subjects he loved and taught all his life. So great was his fervor, after completing his MATM degree at the University of Chicago in 1959, he took on a double assignment, teaching full-time at CBS and traveling daily to Galt to teach math and science at St. Pius X Seminary.

In spite of serious health problems that beset him in recent years, Brother Joseph elected to remain at CBS as long as possible. It was only in April of 1991, when special care became absolutely necessary, that he allowed himself to be moved to Mount La Salle.

Brother Joseph's impact on the personal lives of others perhaps was described best by co-teacher Mike Costello: "Brother Joe was a very close and personal friend. His sense of humor and inner peace with God were strong reasons for me to stay with CBS for the last 12 years. He will be missed by myself and my family for the rest of our lives. I hope that he has found the peace he so richly deserves."

In his short life span as a Christian Brother, Jaime Gonzalez endeared himself not only to the Brothers with whom he lived, but to his students as well, while teaching at La Salle High School in Pasadena when he passed away in November of 1991.

Brother Jaime was born in Mexico, but the family moved to Los Angeles while he was still a young boy. He attended Cathedral High School there and went on to the Christian Brother Novitiate in Napa, pursue his vocation to the religious life. He received his BA degree at St. Mary's College and was transferred to his alma mater, Cathedral High, as his first teaching assignment from 1982 to 1988. He was then assigned to CBS in Sacramento for two years, where he again found a respected place in the hearts of all those who knew him. At CBS he taught math classes and was moderator of the yearbook. He was also an accomplished artist, working in many different kinds of media; see the falcon in Room 107.

Although he had to contend with problems of health during most of his life, Brother Jaime was always faithful to his duties both as a religious and as a teacher. Many of the students here at CBS remember him for his generous spirit and quiet ways.

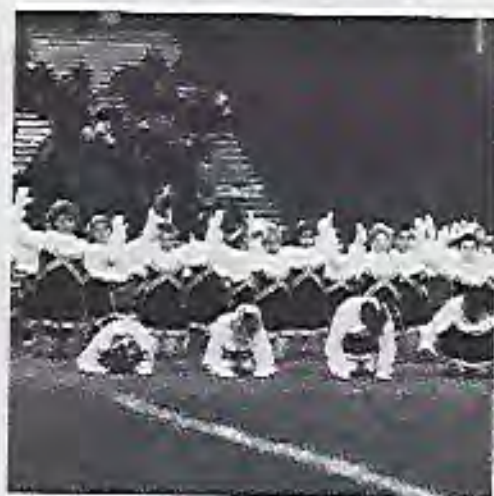

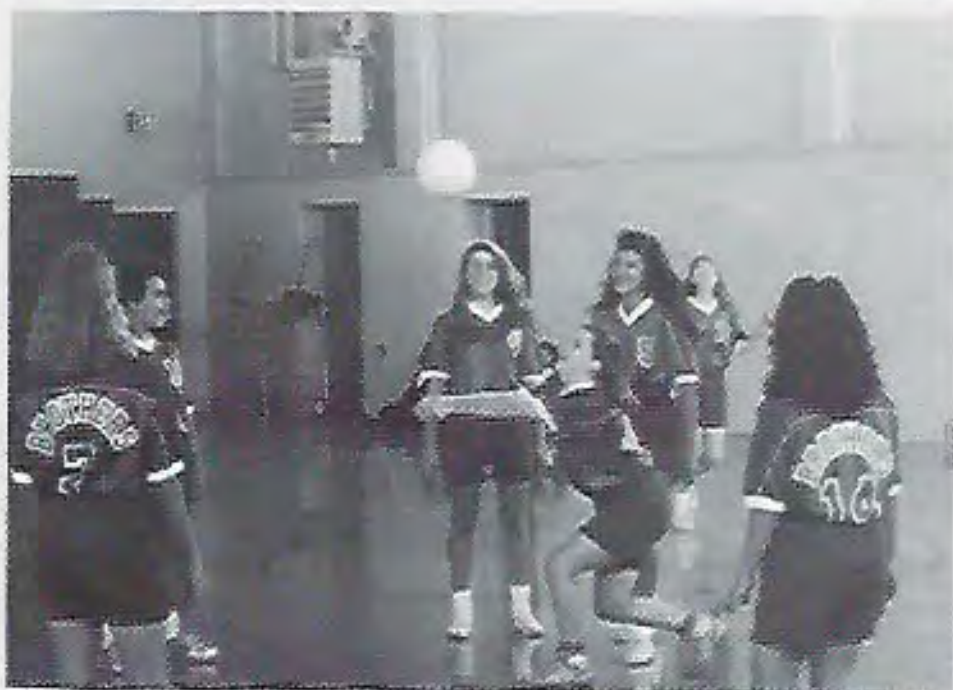

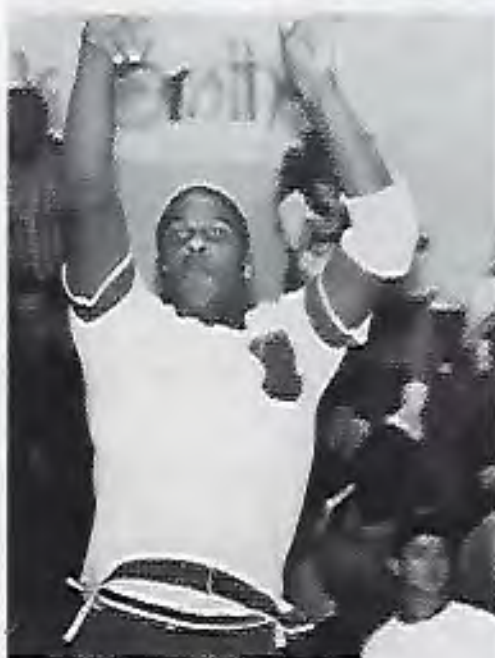

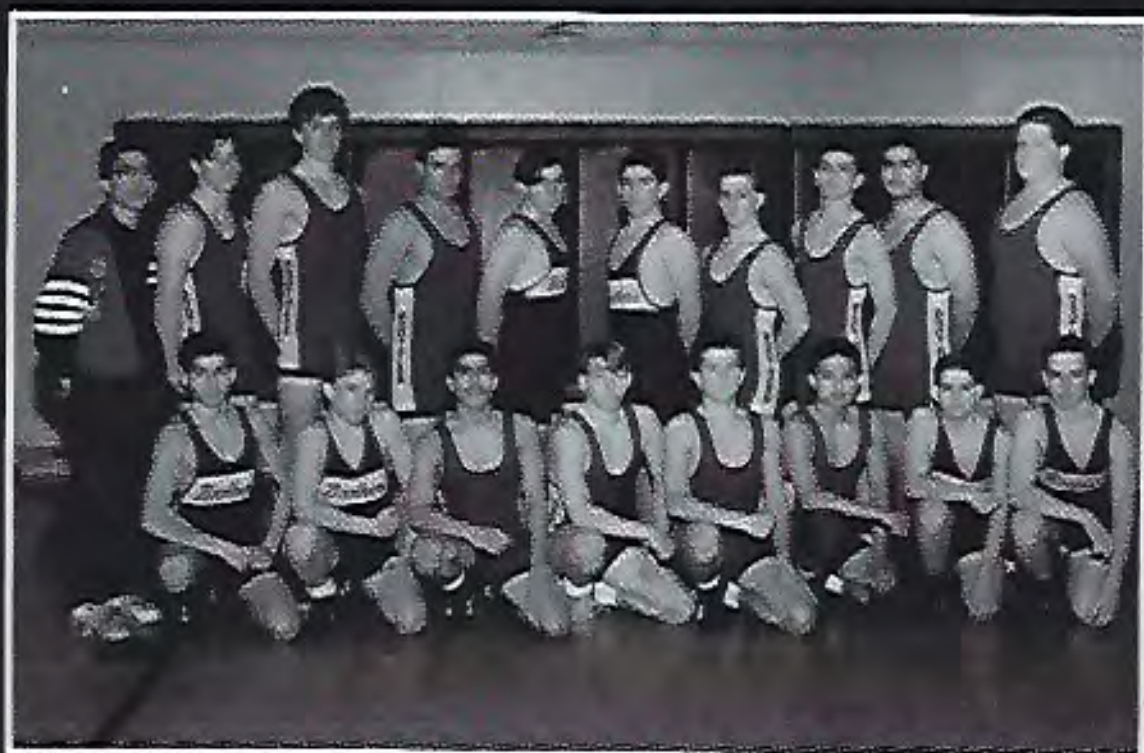
