History

In 1876 Christian Brothers began educating young boys in preparation for college. 1878, The first commercial telephone exchange opened in Conn. on Jan 28. 1890, Peanut Butter was invented. 1890, Poems by Emily Dickenson were published. 1906, San Francisco earthquake. 1910, The Boy Scouts of America were founded. 1912, The Girl Scouts were founded. 1919, The 18th Amendment-Prohibition (repealed by Pres. Roosevelt in 1933). 1920, The Red Scare. 1920, 19th Amendment, ratified Aug. 26, giving women the right to vote. 1923, The first sound-on-film motion picture. 1929, The stock market crash, Oct. 29. 1931, James Dean was born in Marion, Indiana on Feb. 8. 1931, The Empire State building opened to the public. 1937, Amelia Earhardt Putnam, aviator, lost July 2nd near Howland Is. in the Pacific. 1940, The first FM radio (in Chicago). 1940, "For Whom The Bell Tolls" by Ernest Hemingway. 1940, First nylons sold in the U.S. 1940, M&M's candy first sold. 1940, popular songs - "Blueberry Hill," "Back in the Saddle Again," and "You Are My Sunshine." 1940, Mc Donalds opens first drive through in Pasadena, Calif. 1940, movies released - "Fantasia," and "Pinocchio." 1954, Racial Segregation in public schools was unanimously ruled unconstitutional by the Supreme Court May 17, as a violation of the 14th Amendment guaranteeing equal protection of the laws. 1955, Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat to a white man on a bus in Montgomery, Ala., on Dec. 1. 1960, Sit-ins began Feb. 1 when four black college students in Greensboro, N.C. refused to move from a Woolworths lunch counter when denied service. By Sept. 1961 more than 70,000 students, whites and blacks, had participated in sit-ins. 1962, Pres. Kennedy said Feb. 14, "U.S. military advisers in Vietnam would fire if fired upon." 1963, Pres. John F. Kennedy was assassinated on Nov. 22. 1965, The mini-skirt was introduced. 1965, The Vietnam War was "Americanized," with the policy of bombing North Vietnam. 1965, movie released - "Doctor Zhivago." 1965, Diet Pepsi was introduced. 1965, popular songs - (I can't get no) "Satisfaction," "Yesterday," and "I Got You Babe." 1965, Malcom X's autobiography was released. 1968, Martin Luther King Jr. 39, was assassinated on April 4th in Memphis, Tenn. 1969, The first lunar voyage May 18-26 to the moon. 1969, Neil Armstrong the first man to walk on the moon. 1970, the first Earth day Apr. 22. 1973, Watergate Trials. 1973, The birth of Aaron Moreno. 1974, Nixon resigns from office on Aug. 9th. 1976, U.S. Bicentennial; Christian Brothers celebrates 100 years of continuous education. 1980, Former Beatle John Lennon was shot and killed on Dec. 8th. 1981, Sandra Day O'Connor was the first woman appointed associate justice of the U.S. Supreme Court. 1985, The government of South Africa declared a state of emergency. 1985, LIVE AID - a 17hr. concert on July 13th, radio and T.V. coverage helped raise \$70 million from London to Phil., for starving people in Africa. 1986, On Jan. 20th, for the first time the U.S. officially observed Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. 1986, After three days, Soviet authorities reported a major accident at Chernobyl. 1987, Wall street crash, Oct. 19th. 1989, San Francisco earthquake hits on Oct. 17, killing 67 and causing \$10 billion in damages. 1989, The Berlin Wall comes tumbling down on Nov. 10. 1990, Saddam Hussein invades Kuwait on Aug. 9, U.S. troops soon sent to Saudi Arabia. 1990, CBS Goes Co-Ed Sept. 4.

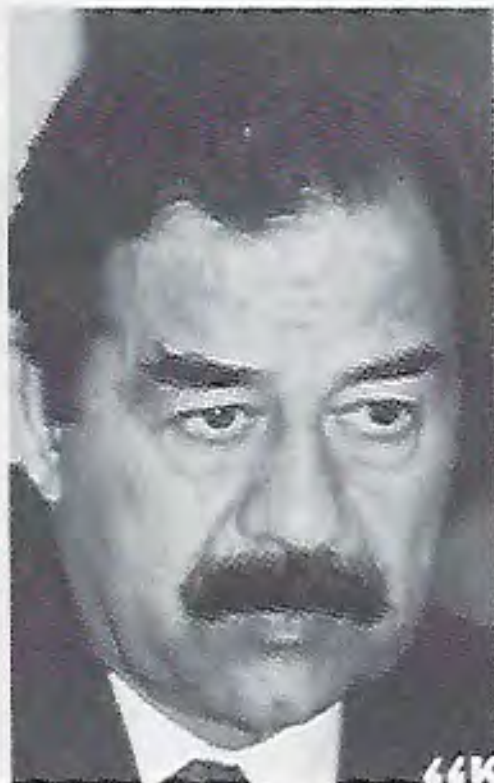

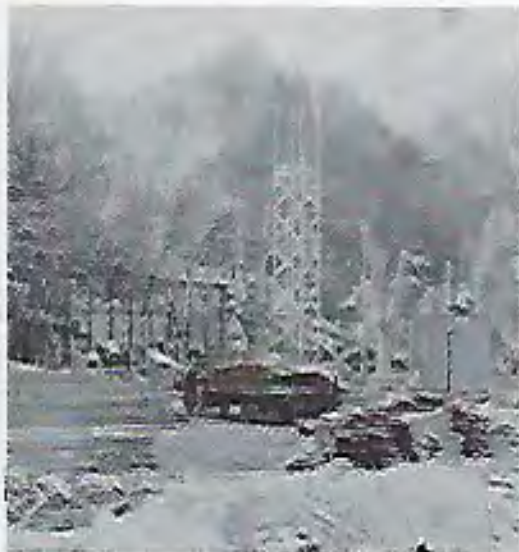

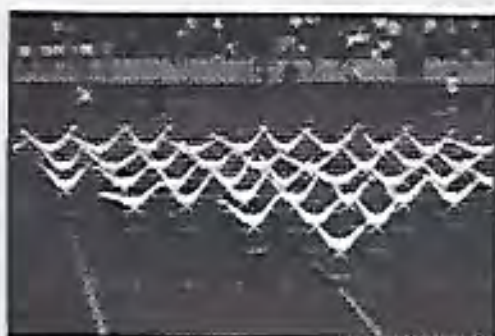

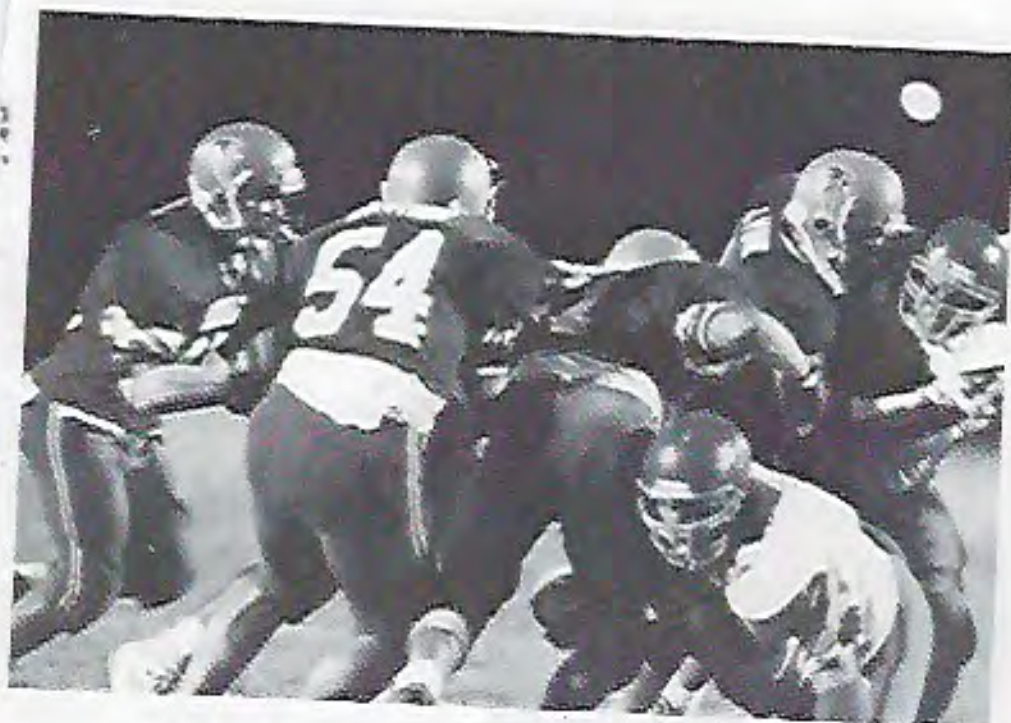

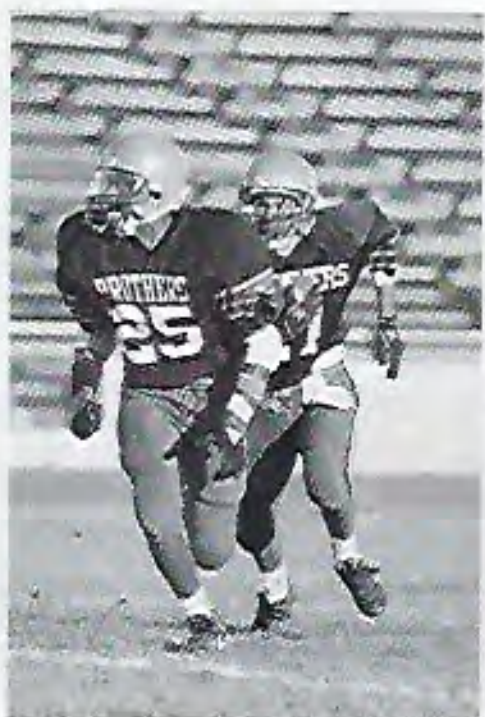

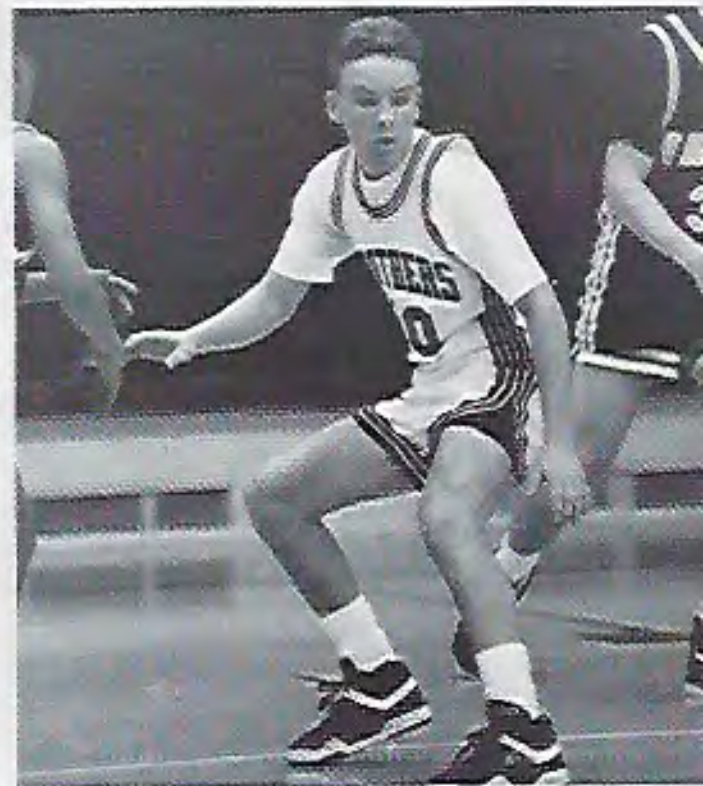

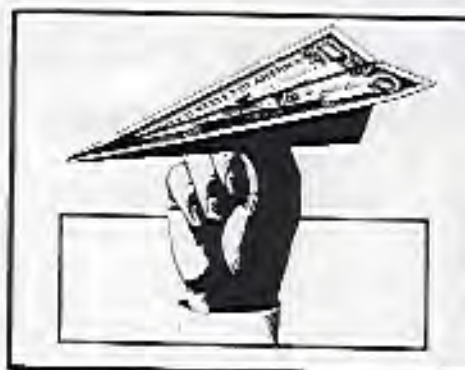
CBS Has Got The S.P.I.R.I.T.

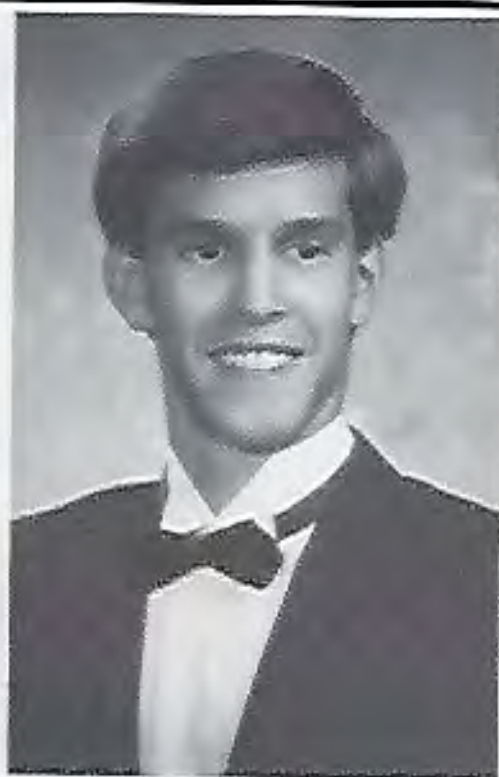

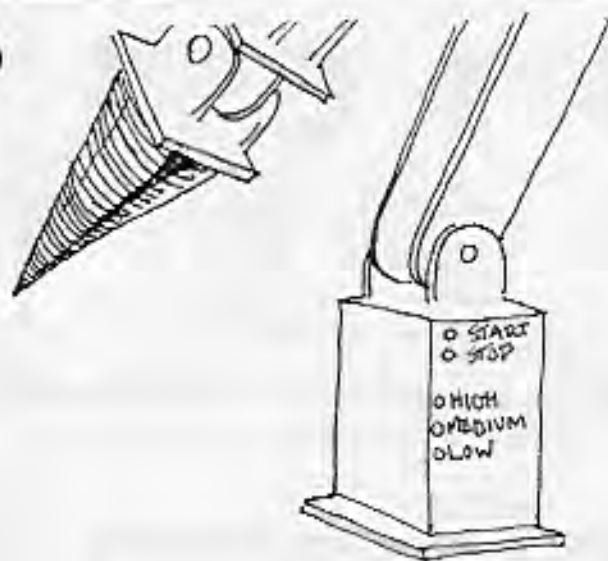
