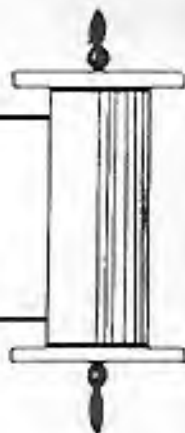

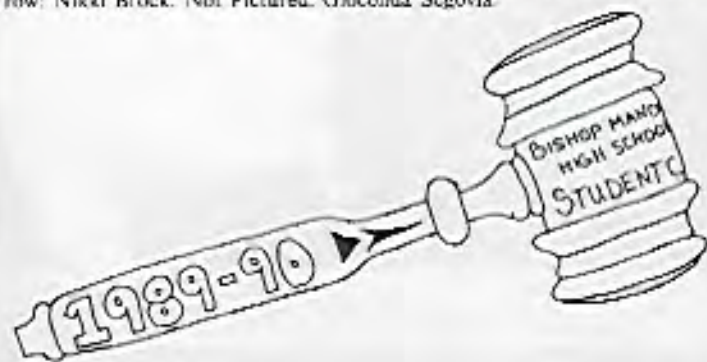

"For years I was held in a tiny cell. My only contact was with my torturers. My only company were the cockroaches and mice. On Christmas Eve the door to my cell opened and the guard tossed in a crumbled piece of paper. It said: 'Take heart. The world knows you're alive. We're with you. Regards, Monica, Amnesty International. That letter saved my life.'"

A released prisoner of conscience from Paraguay.

Amnesty International protects human rights and focuses on prisoners. Thousands of people are in prison because of their beliefs. Many are held without charge or trial, and torture and the death penalty are widespread. In many countries men, women, and children have "disappeared" after being taken into official custody. Still others have been killed without any pretense of legality. Amnesty International works for the release of prisoners of conscience—men, women, and children imprisoned for their beliefs, color, sex, ethnic origin, language, or religion, provided they have neither used nor advocated violence; fair and prompt trials for all political prisoners; and an end to torture and executions in all cases.

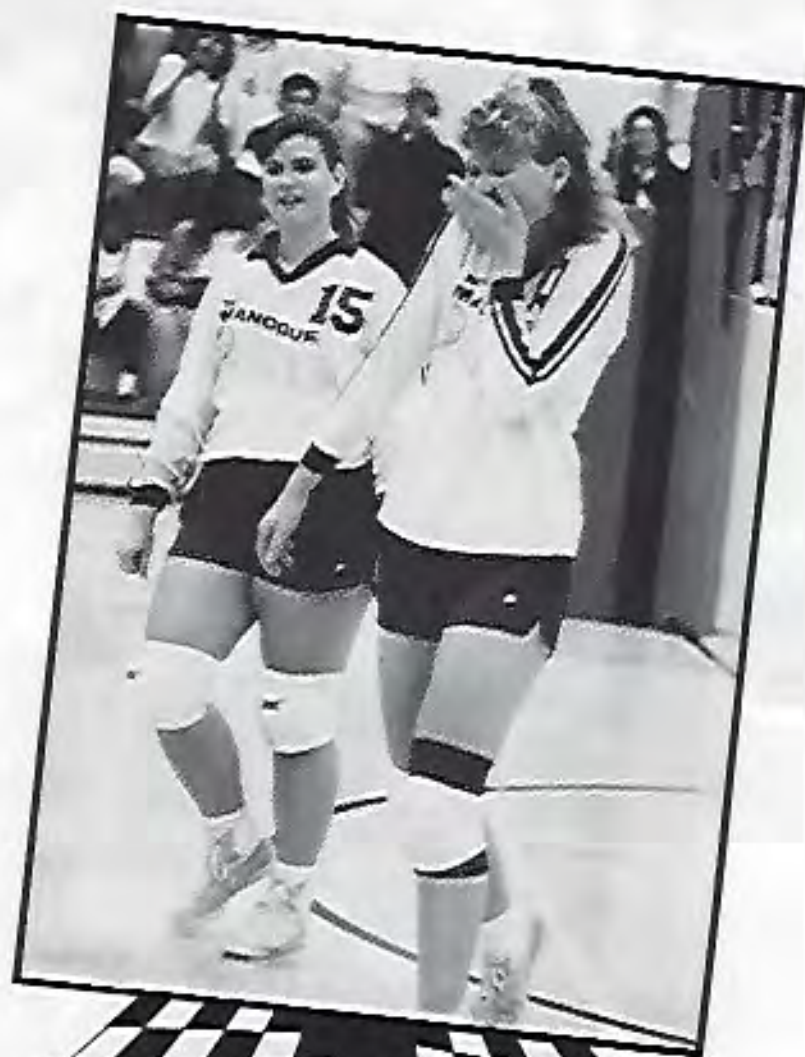

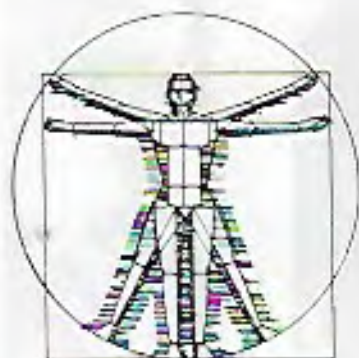

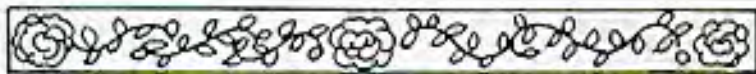
