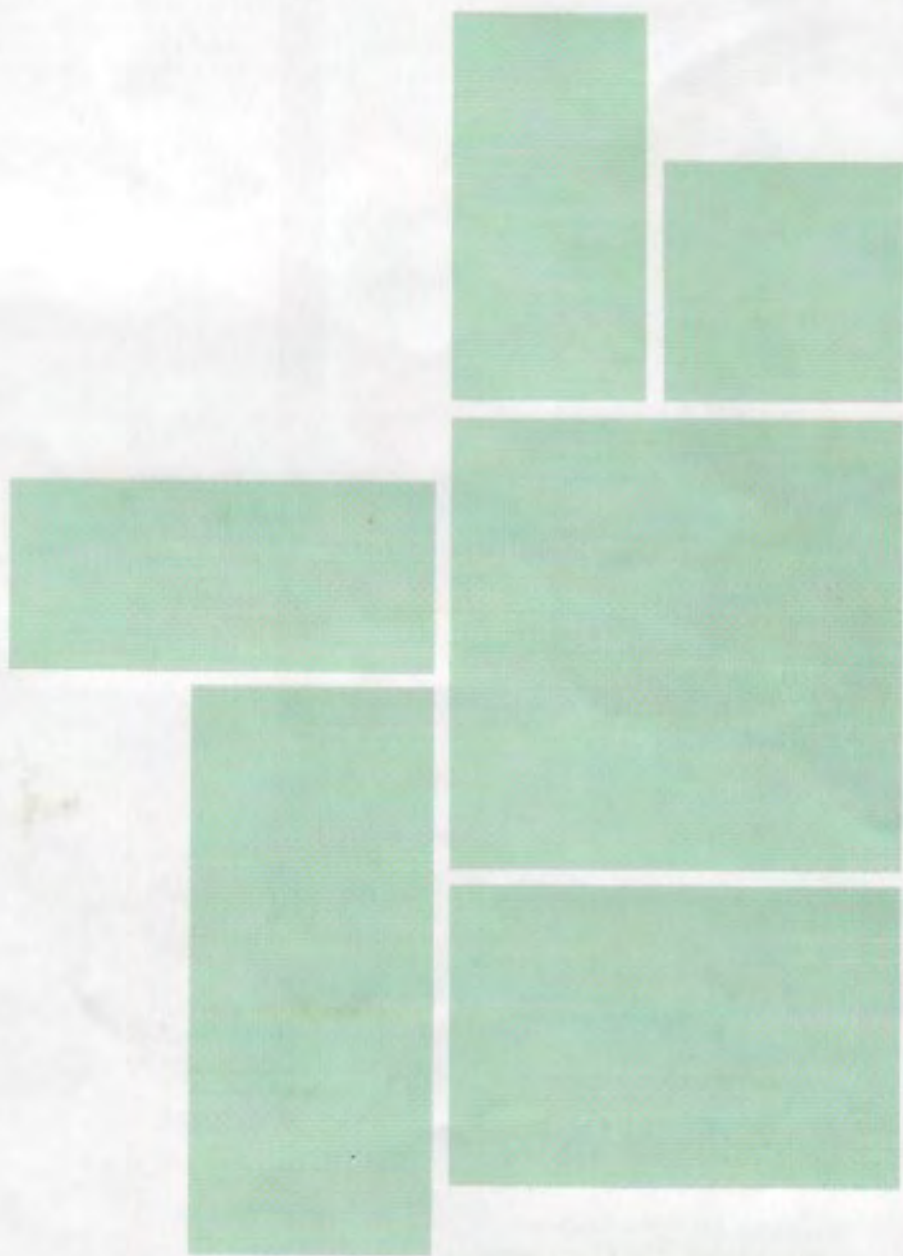

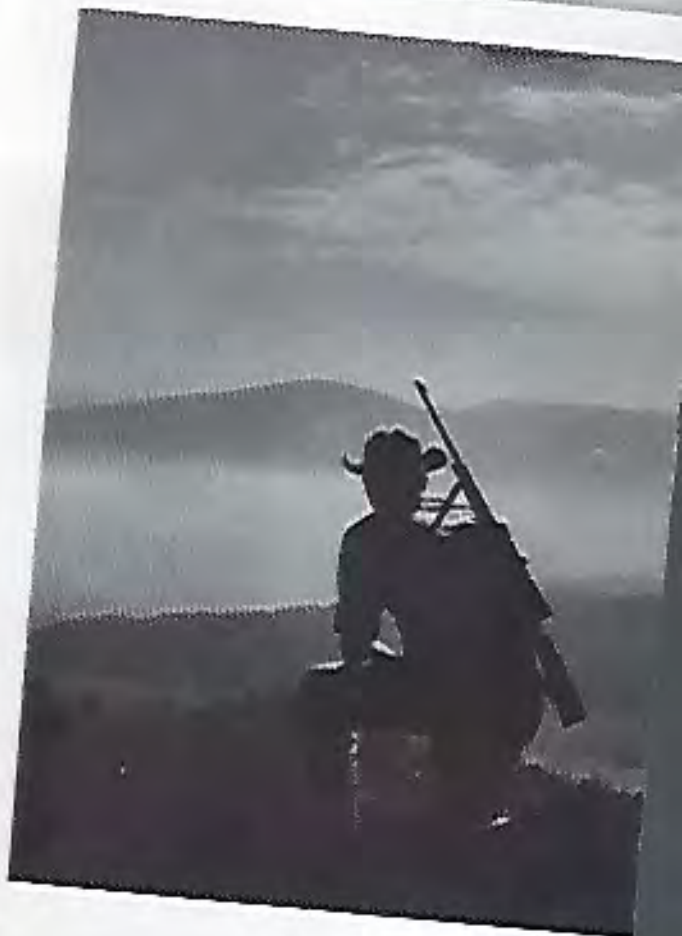


DEDICATION

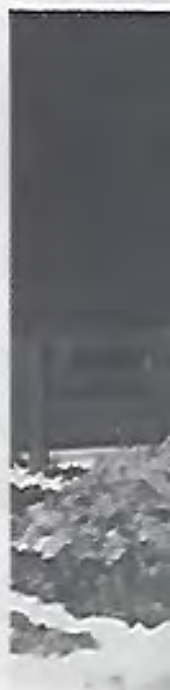

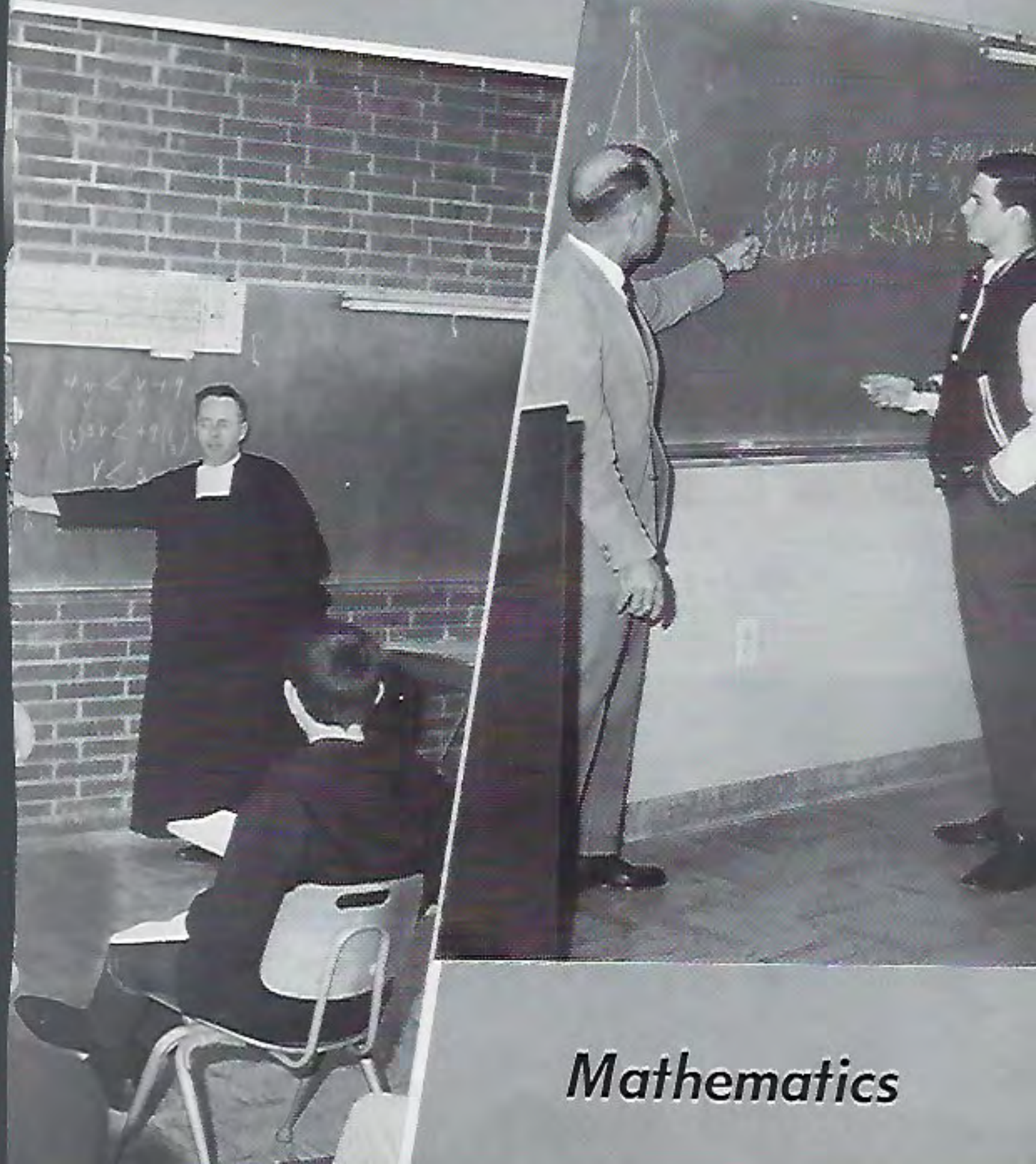
CLASSES

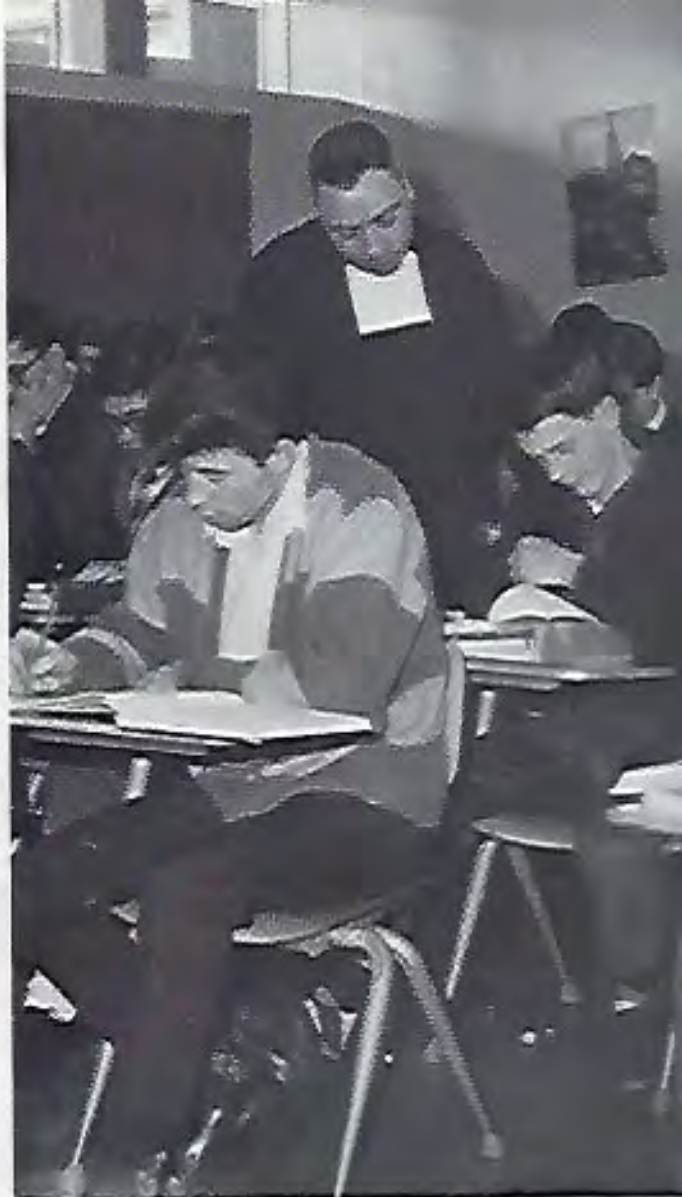
Religion

FALCONS '66

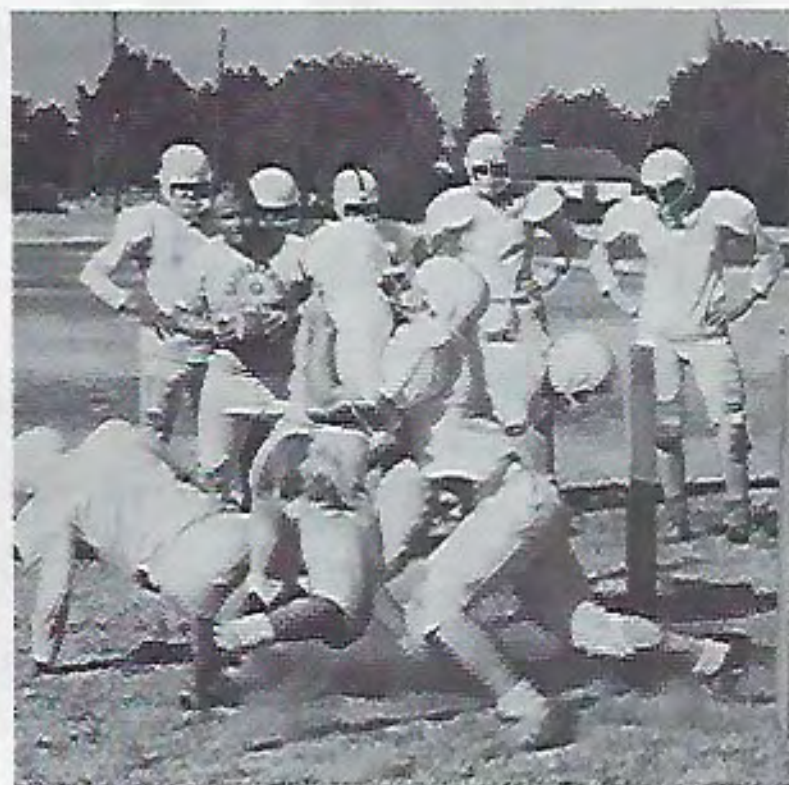
Although Armstrong's grid season did not meet the full expectations of the coaching staff, the team placed a respectable fourth in the Metro League en route to a 3-6-0 record.

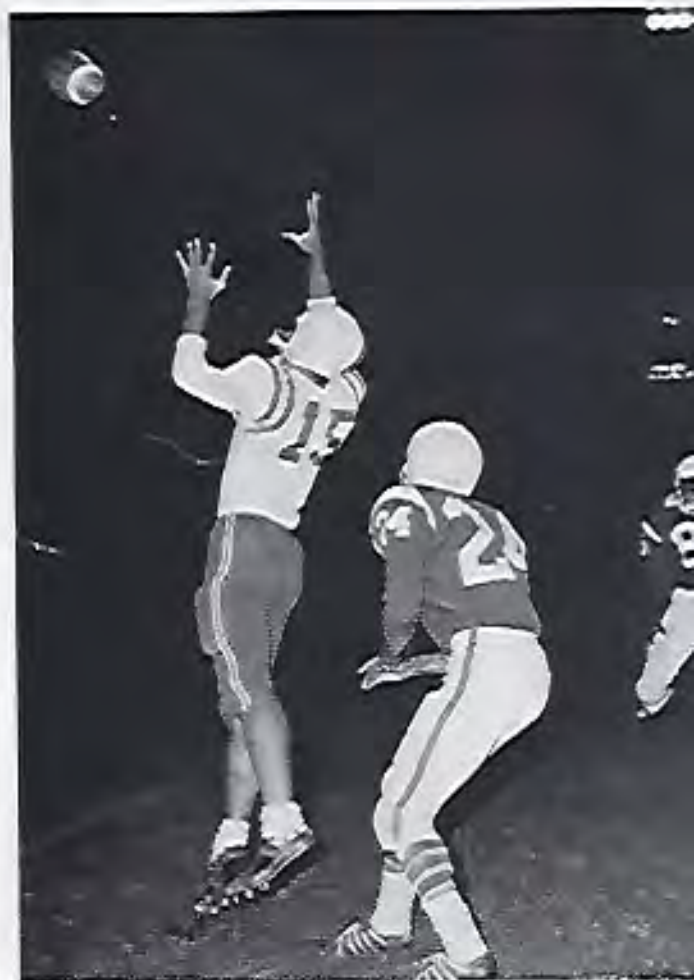


Sacramento

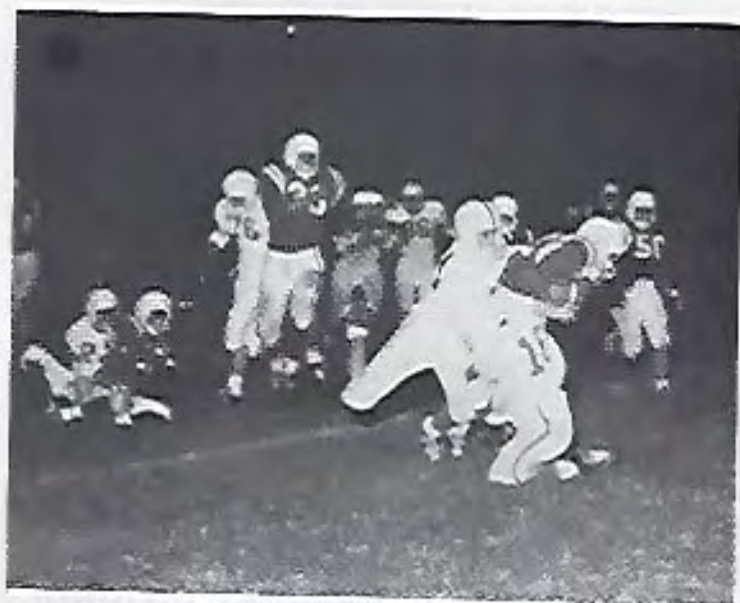

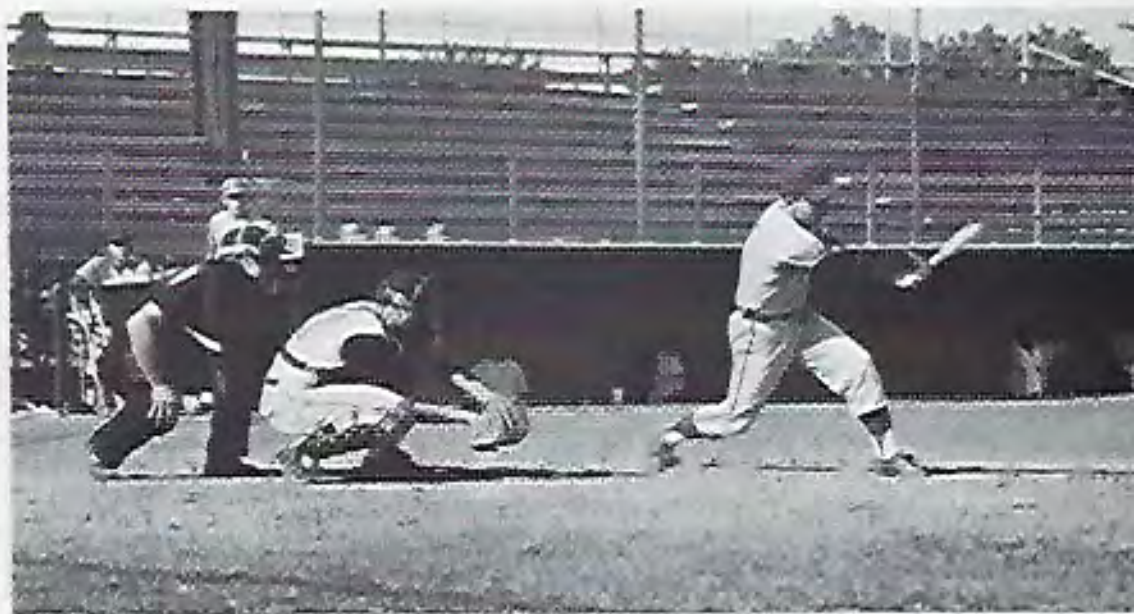

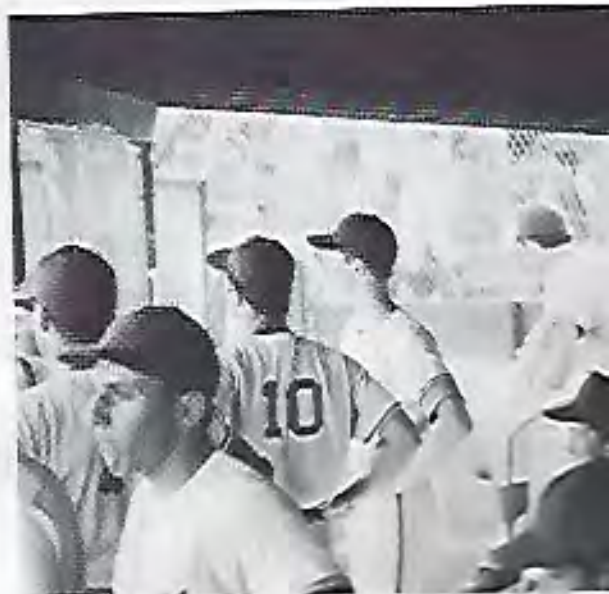

The 41 man team, comprised of 3 seniors, 5 juniors and some 33 sophomores and freshmen, set an enviable number of new records for Armstrong. The Varsity division was led by Tony Jackson who was our top scorer. He established the triple jump mark of 42' 6½" and was also instrumental in setting the mile relay record of 3:33.0, team up with Eric Andrus, Jim Reel and Walt Johnson. In the Frosh-Soph division only 3 records established in 1966 were left untouched; they were the pole-vault, shot and 880 relay. The record column wasn't too impressive because of having to split up the Frosh Soph. But when it came down to large meets, where each division ran with their own, the Frosh-Soph placed third at the Vanden Relay, losing by one point to Armijo High out of 18 schools.
