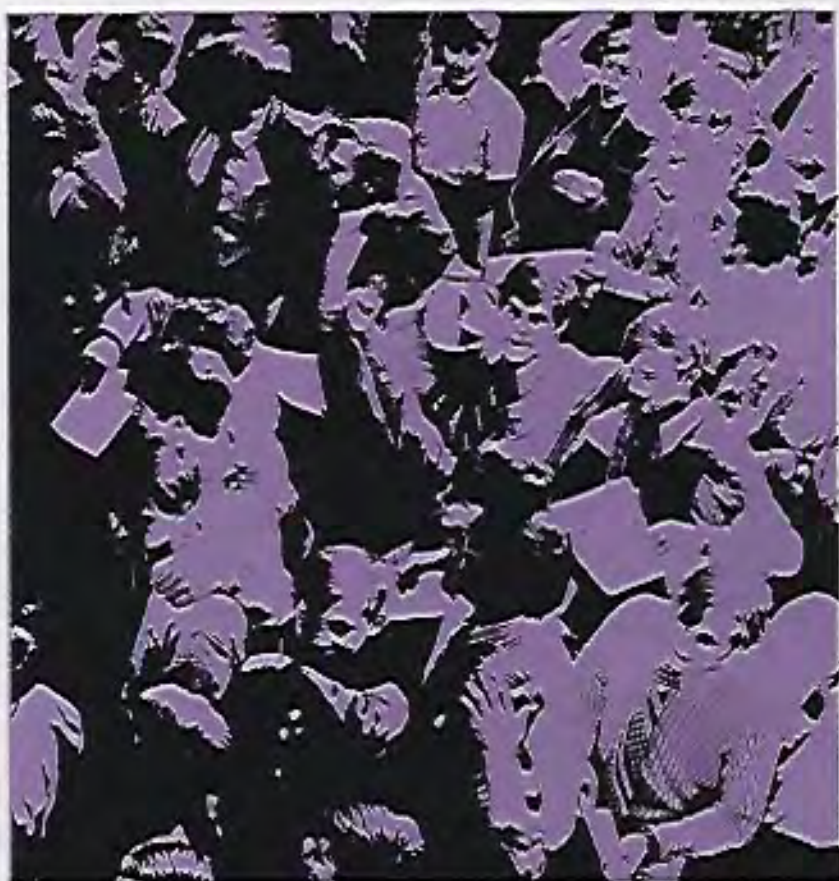

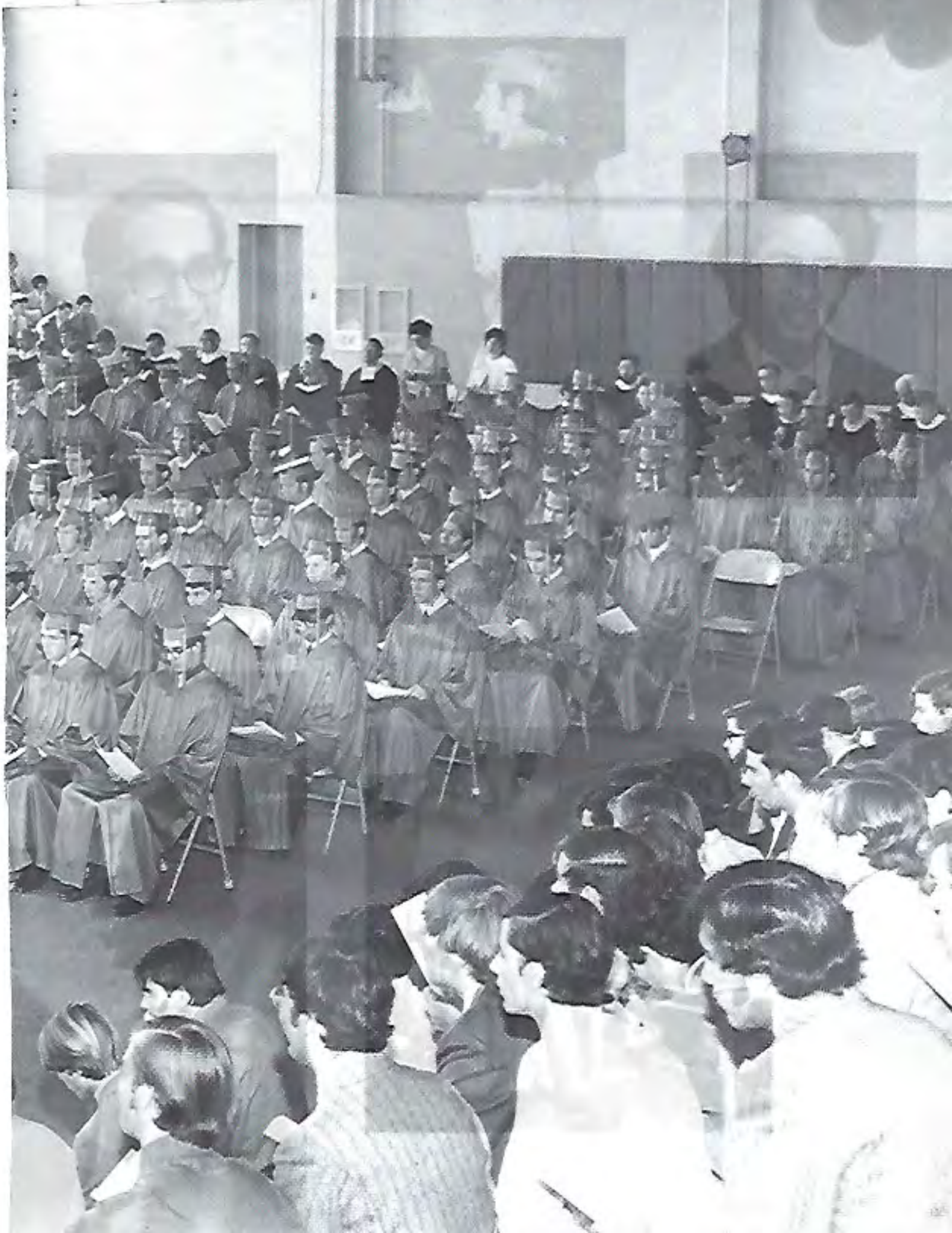

And even though he had so many other duties to perform around the campus (full time teacher, counselor, bus-driver, band-leader, book store vendor, track meet starter, and basketball scoreboard operator) he still had the genuine concern to guide the class both in social activities and spiritual functions.

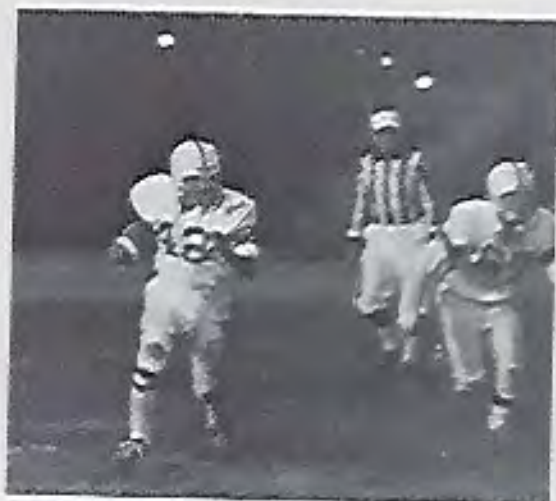
