The Christian Brothers *Talon* is the long standing periodical that records and presents the Monumental events that articulate the journey down the path of each school year. It is responsible for identifying and refining the character of Christian Brothers as it reveals itself from September to June. A forum designed as the vehicle for the student voice, the *Talon* is intended to exhibit in achievements, congratulate personal accomplishments, recognize needs, examine methods, and criticize faults. The *Talon* reflects the interests and involvement of that community known to all of us as: BROTHERS!

In the past, The *Talon* was published on a monthly basis by a few dedicated students who sacrificed their time and energies to guarantee a quality newspaper. Articles were alive with expression as they encompassed everything from satire to documentary; from investigative reporting to features. It was student journalism at its best. With a rise in "student apathy" those standards soon became as extinct as the dinosaur.

With student disinterest rising, the *Talon* was hardpressed to get the reporters and workers it needed and the quality began to suffer. This culminated infamously with a degrading, cheapshot rag that came to be known as the McGag papers of 1980-81. The paper became a shallow parody of journalism that was characteristically void of quality as it repeatedly lacked accuracy in its reporting and defamitory in its content. Its sporadic appearance qualified it as a true periodical — it was periodically published (the last issue appearing three days after the end of the school year!). The *Talon* was declared.

Then, this past year, the *Talon* rose amid the ashes as it strived to eradicate the stain on its history and reputation. Under the capable editorship of senior Dave Wood, quality once again started to become analogous with the *Talon*. Organizing the talents of a fresh crew of enthusiastic "cubby" reporters centered around the Journalism class of ex-*Talon* and Sacramento Bee reporter, Mr. Kevin Matheny and with the zealous efforts of moderator, Mr. Bill Cerney, Dave Wood was able to restore a degree of dignity to the *Talon*.

The *Talon* again became a cohesive paper, tightly organized and stylishly laid out. It recounted the monumental events with precise investigative reporting, comprehensive coverage of activities and sports, poignant editorials, and lively feature articles! Though not perfect, Dave Wood and company was able to get the *Talon* on the road to recovery and re-establish student journalism here at Christian Brothers.

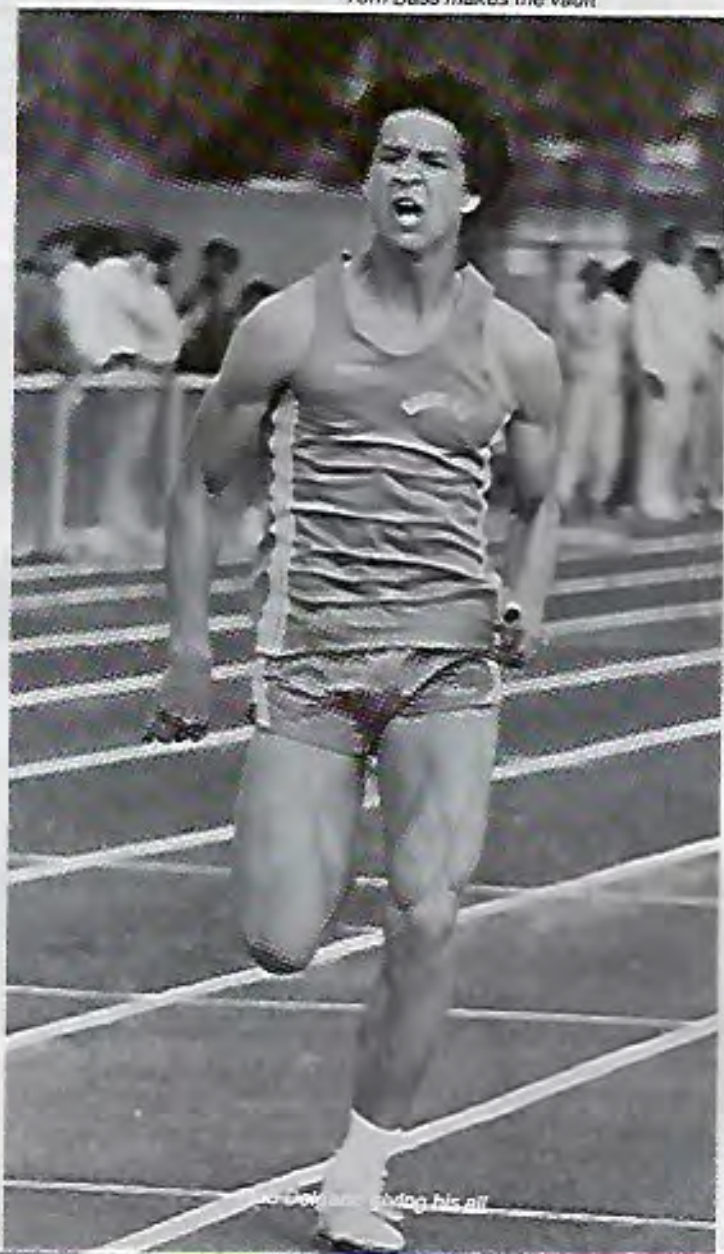
