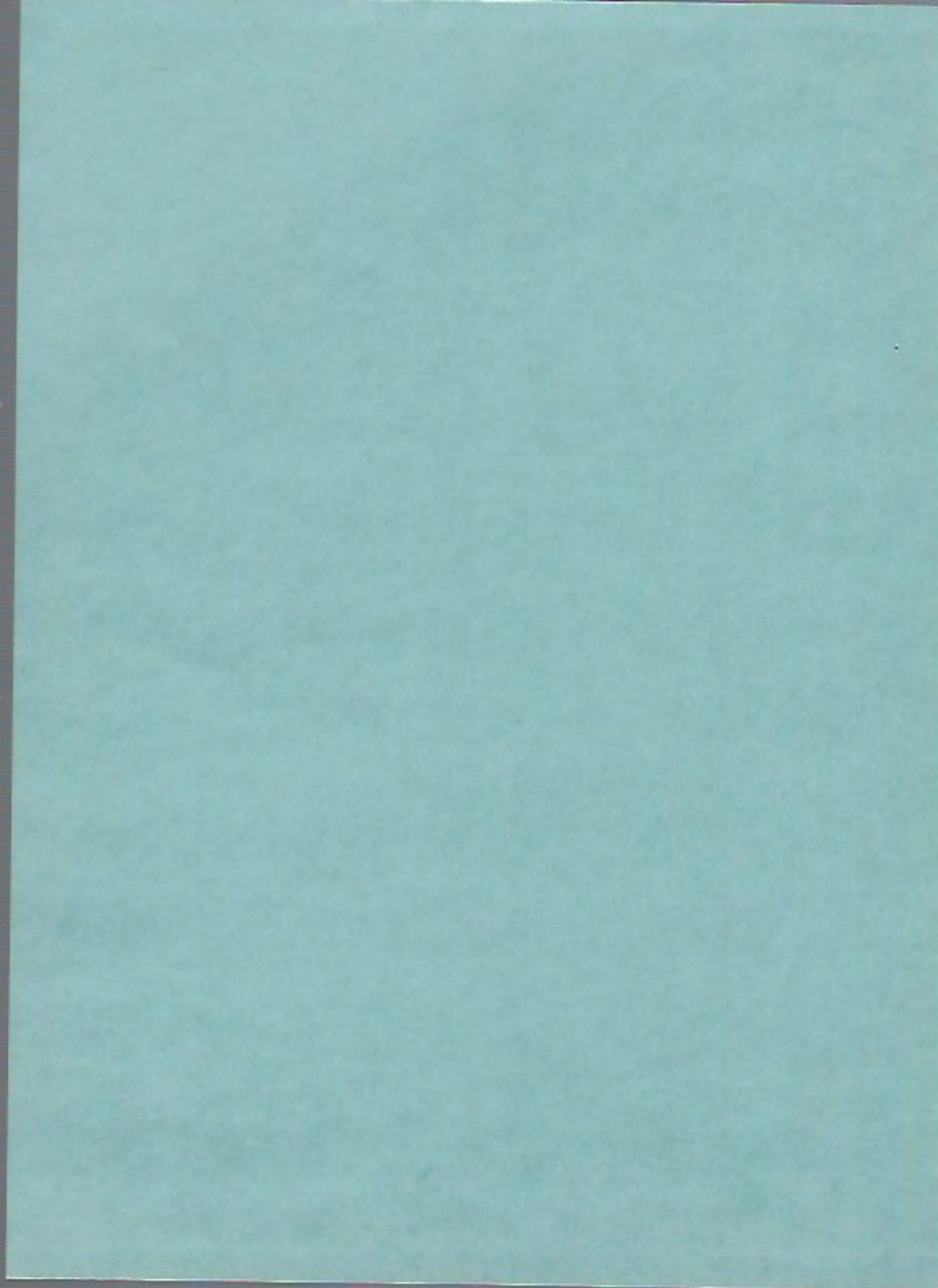

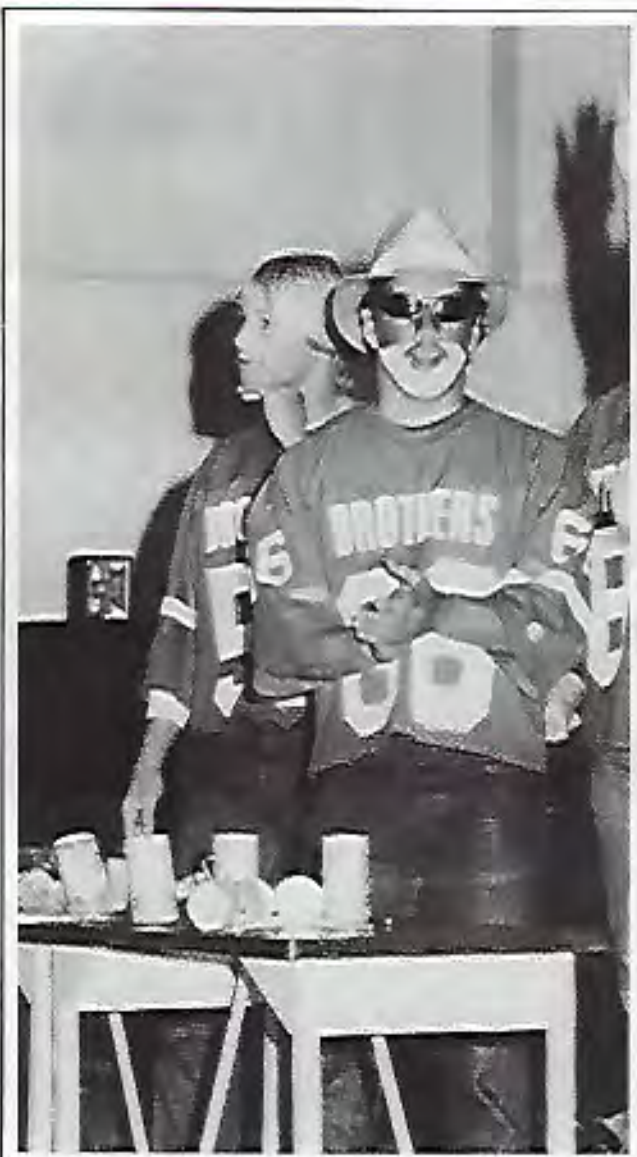

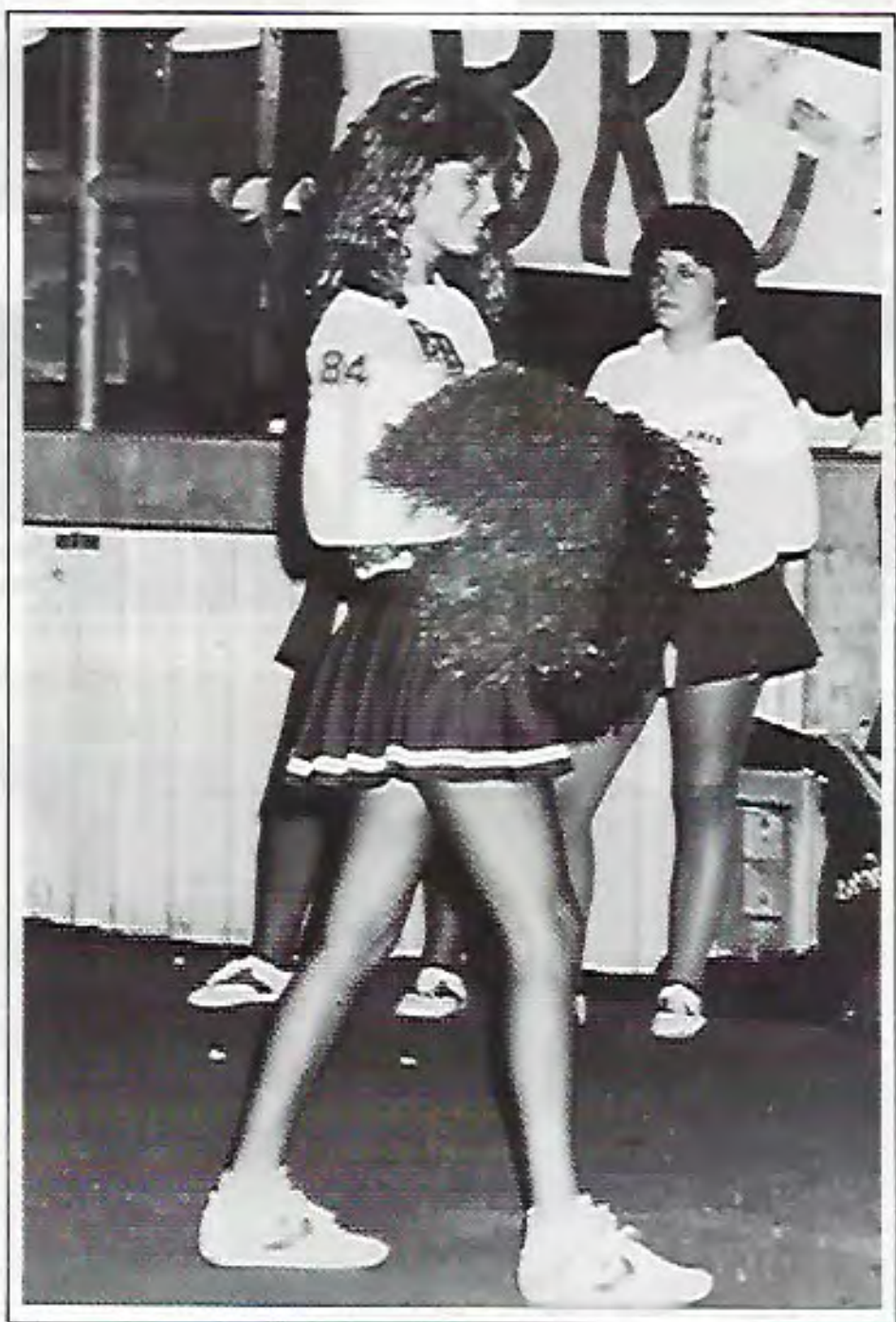

May 15 was set aside as a half day in order to celebrate the Feast Date of St. John Baptiste De La Salle, founder of the Christian Brothers Schools. The student body and staff took part in the noon-day events, which featured a liturgical service in his name and included various other activities as the day proceeded.

In the 1500's LaSalle gave a new meaning to the term *education* as he developed the Order of the Christian Brothers, beginning with a few school teachers and a handful of students. Since then, the idealistic views of La Salle and his works have spread throughout the world. And his ways of teaching have become the focal point of education for the Christian Brothers ever since.

The Church later recalled La Salle's lifelong devotion to Christian education. They saw him as both a thinker and an initiator. And on May 15, 1900, the Church canonized him as Saint John Baptiste De La Salle.

Following the liturgy on Tuesday, students were granted the remainder of the day to indulge themselves in various prepared activities. Such activities included 4-on-4 basketball, tennis doubles matches, movies, and a Seniors vs. Faculty softball game. And for those who just wanted to lie out in the sun listening to tunes, live music was provided by "Little Larry and the Lords of Discipline."

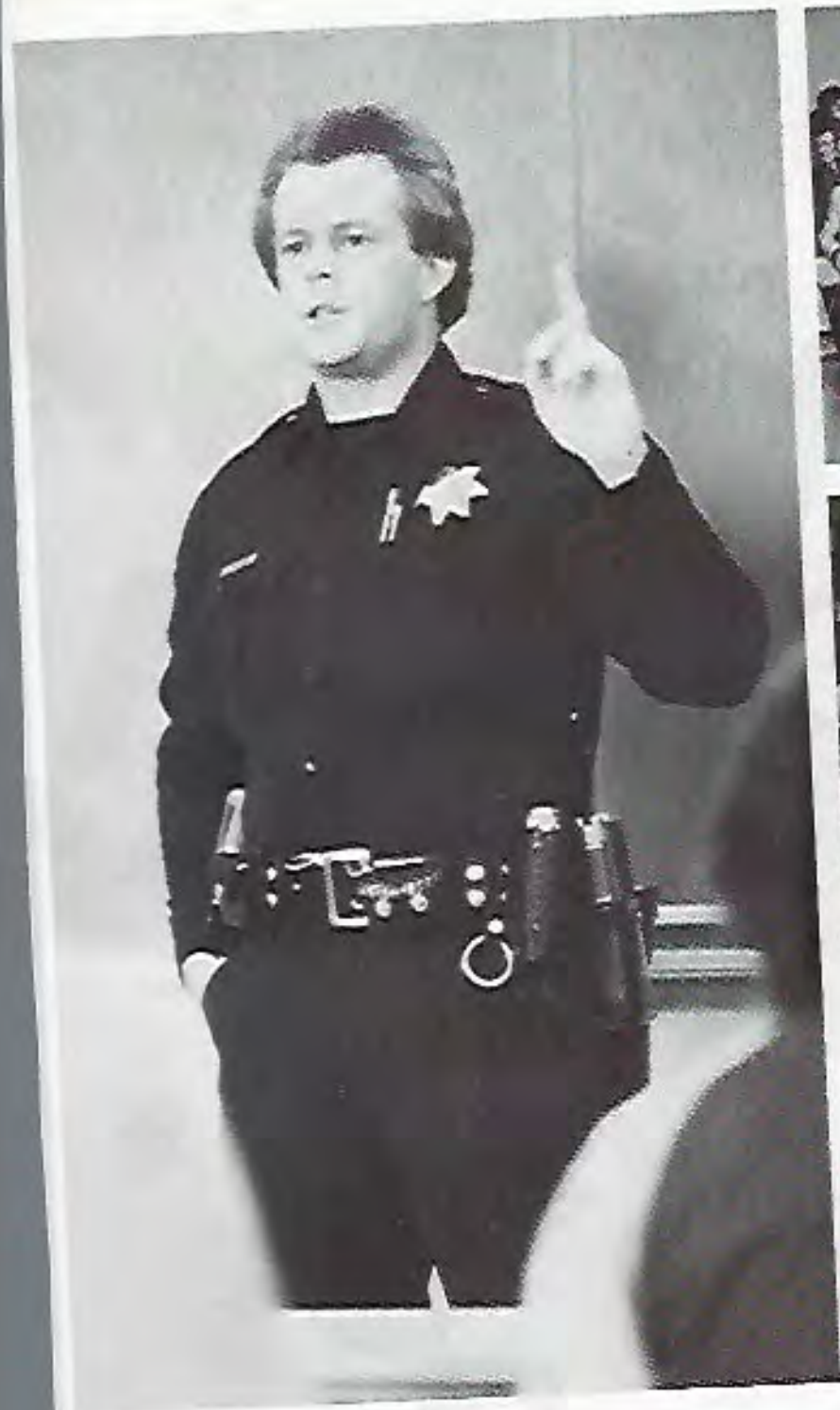

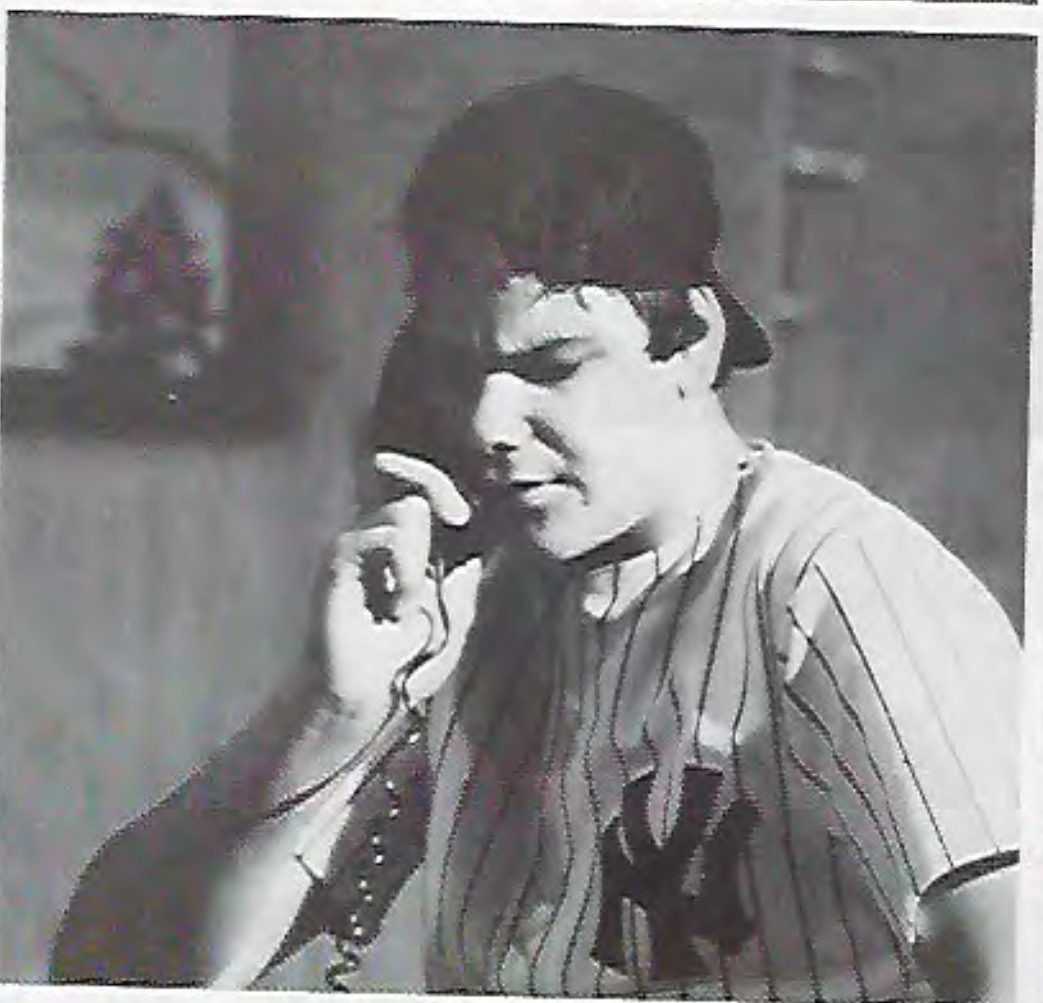

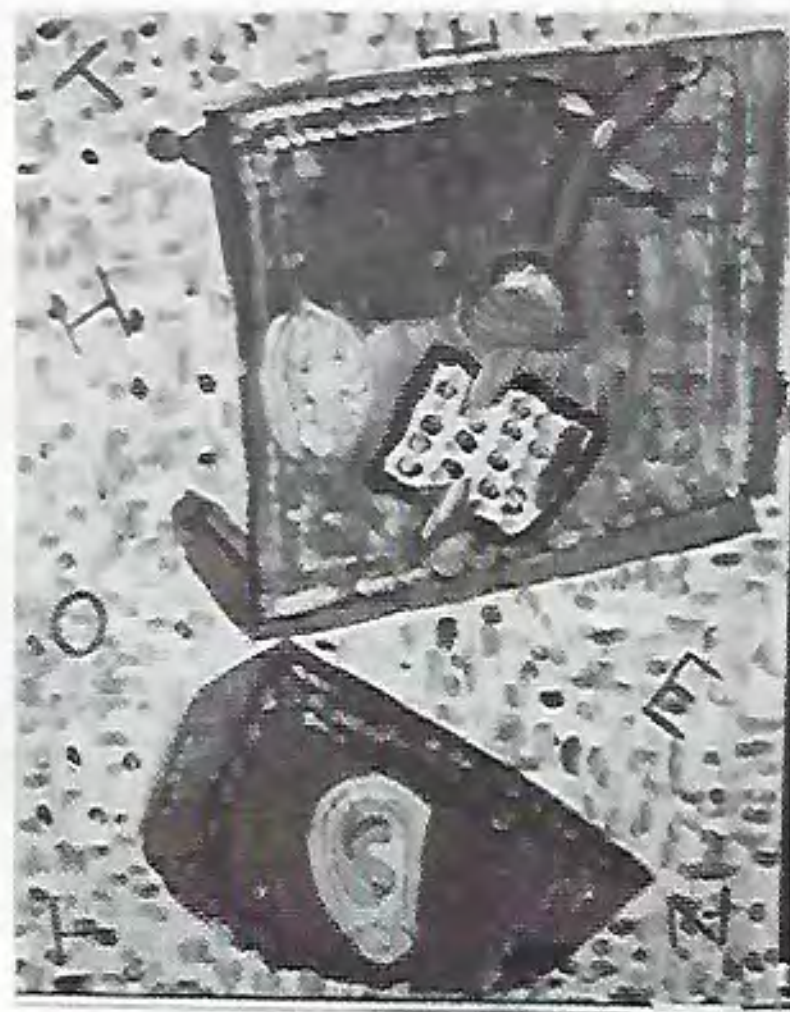

The Source of Creativity

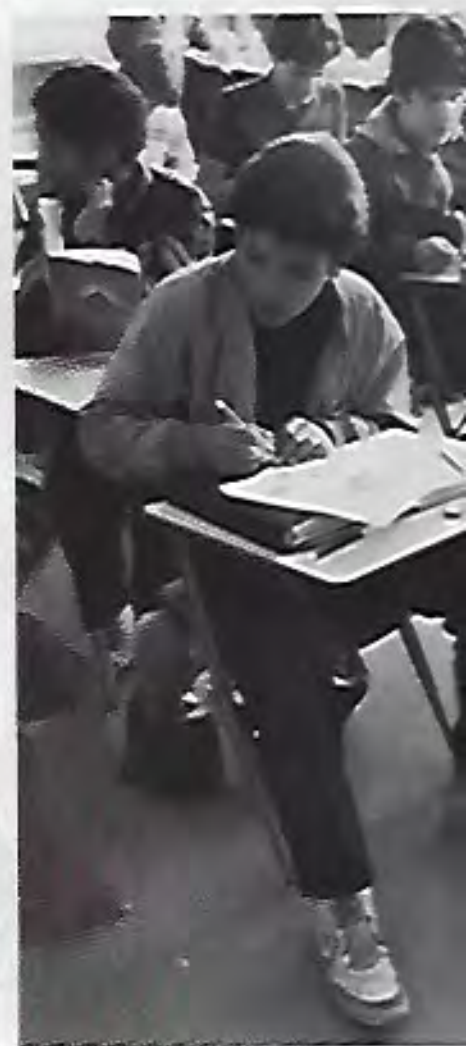

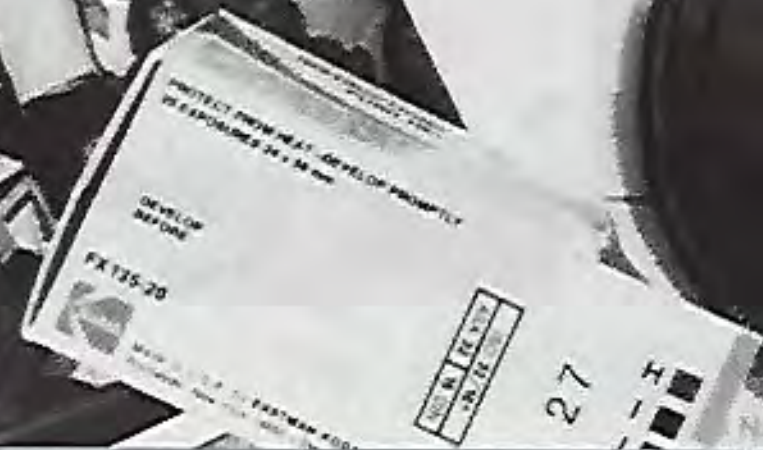
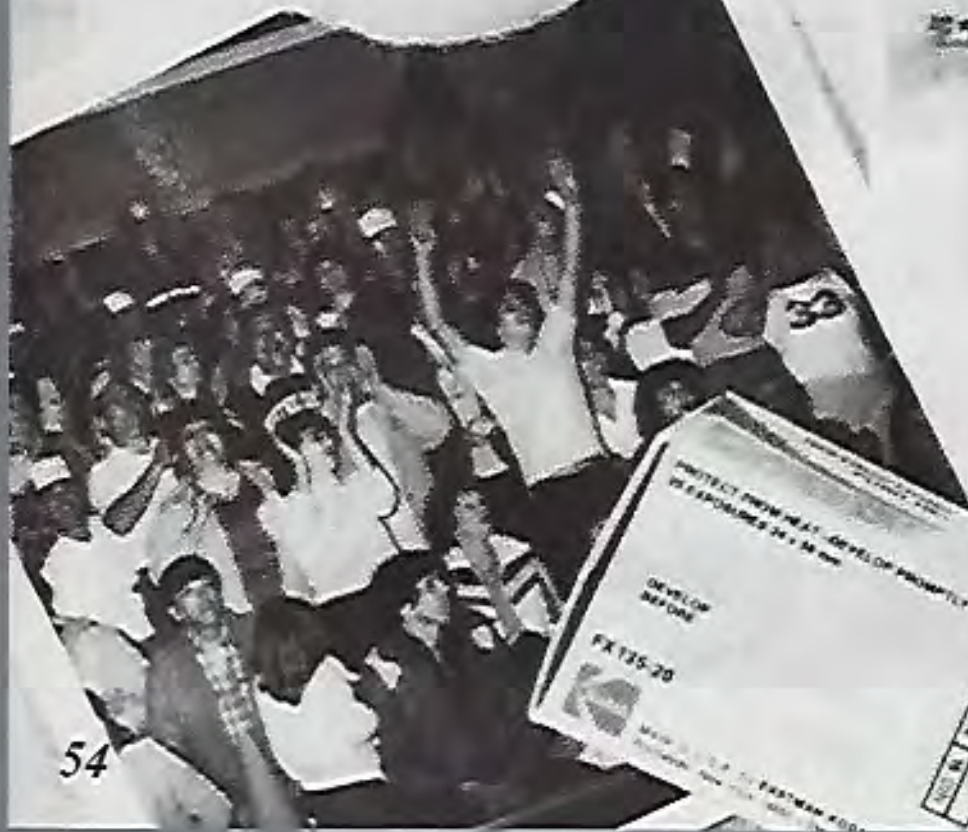


Never Out- Classed!

This year's C.B.S. Varsity Soccer Team was once again one of the dominant teams in the Sac-Joquin Section. The season began as planned, with the Falcons being ranked #1 and entering the league at 4-0.

With six starters from last year's squad and rookie coach Dave Kelly, the Falcons failed to capture their 5th consecutive Metro title and placed 2nd under the Kennedy Cougars. But entering the playoffs at 7-3-1 and ranked 7th in the city, the Falcons played brilliant soccer and captured their 2nd T.O.C. Championship in two years. After beating (#6) Oakmont 4-0, (#3) Elk Grove 2-0, and Napa 2-1, the Falcons faced their cross-town rival, the #1 ranked El Camino Eagles. After 45 minutes of play the score was 0-0 at a windy Consumnes field. With 20 minutes left in the game, Falcons mid-fielder Dan Landenberger hit brilliant shot from 18 yards out which left El Camino-goalkeeper picking up the ball out of the net. Two and one half minutes later Luis Ramirez dribbled from El Camino's side of the field and fired a shot past the goalkeeper which made the score 2-0. El Camino scored with 5 minutes remaining in the game, but the Falcons defense, headed by Edgar Chavez, held off the Eagles to capture the crown.

Again this year the Falcons dominated the All-Metro team by placing 3 of 11 players on the Sacramento Bee's team. Dan Landenberger, who received co-M.V.P. honors in the Metro league, and Edgar Chavez, both were selected for their second time in a row. Along with Landenberger and Chavez, Steve Barros, the Falcons' leading scorer, was also selected. Junior mid-fielder Tim Mastretti was placed on the Honorable Mention team.

By placing on the Union's 1st team all-Metro, Landenberger and Chavez again proved to be two of Sacramento's top players. They were also selected to the 1st team as juniors. Sammy Bates was selected for the second team and Luis Ramirez grabbed the Honorable Mention.

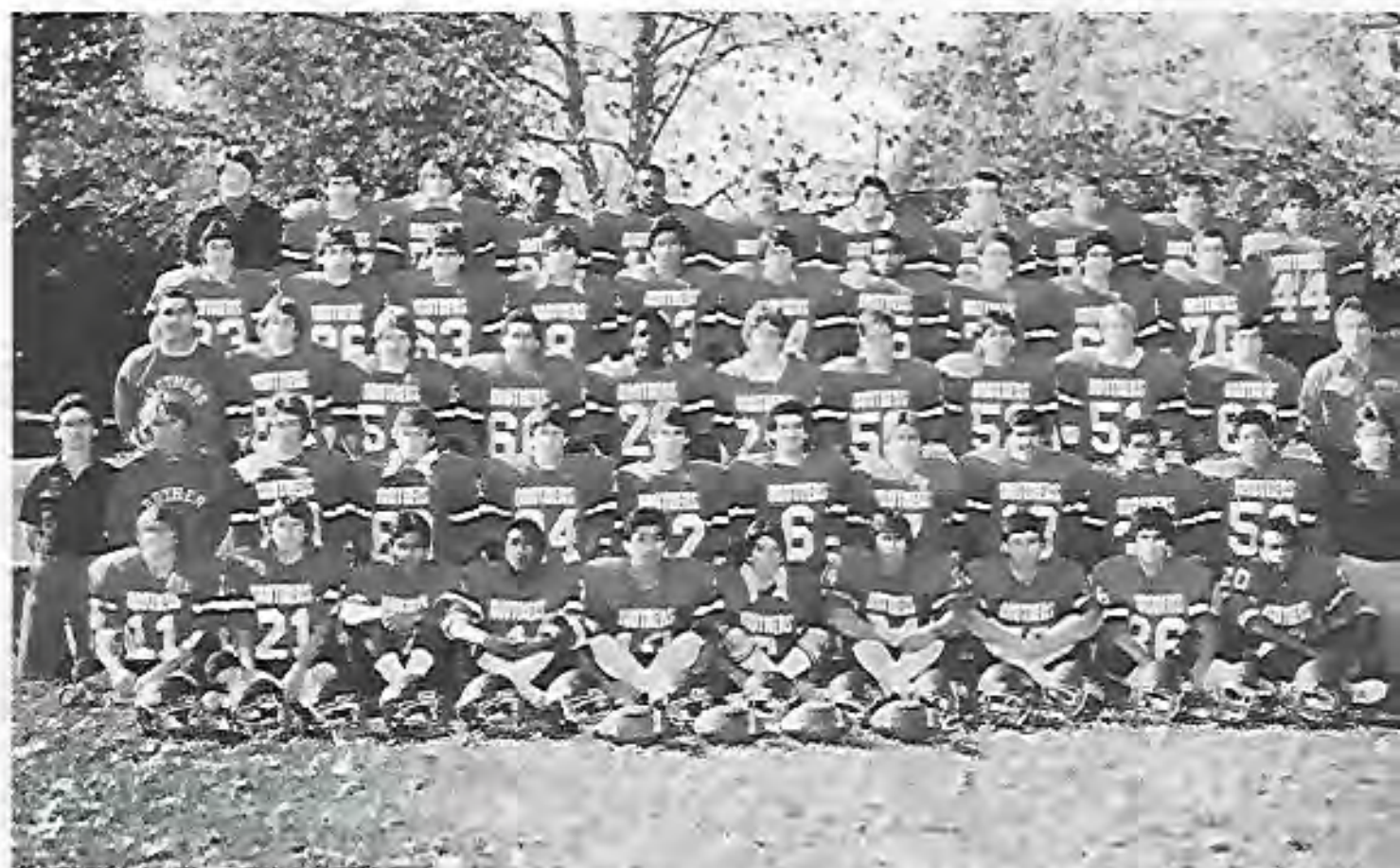
The coaches and players dedicated themselves to cross every obstacle necessary to attain the championship.
