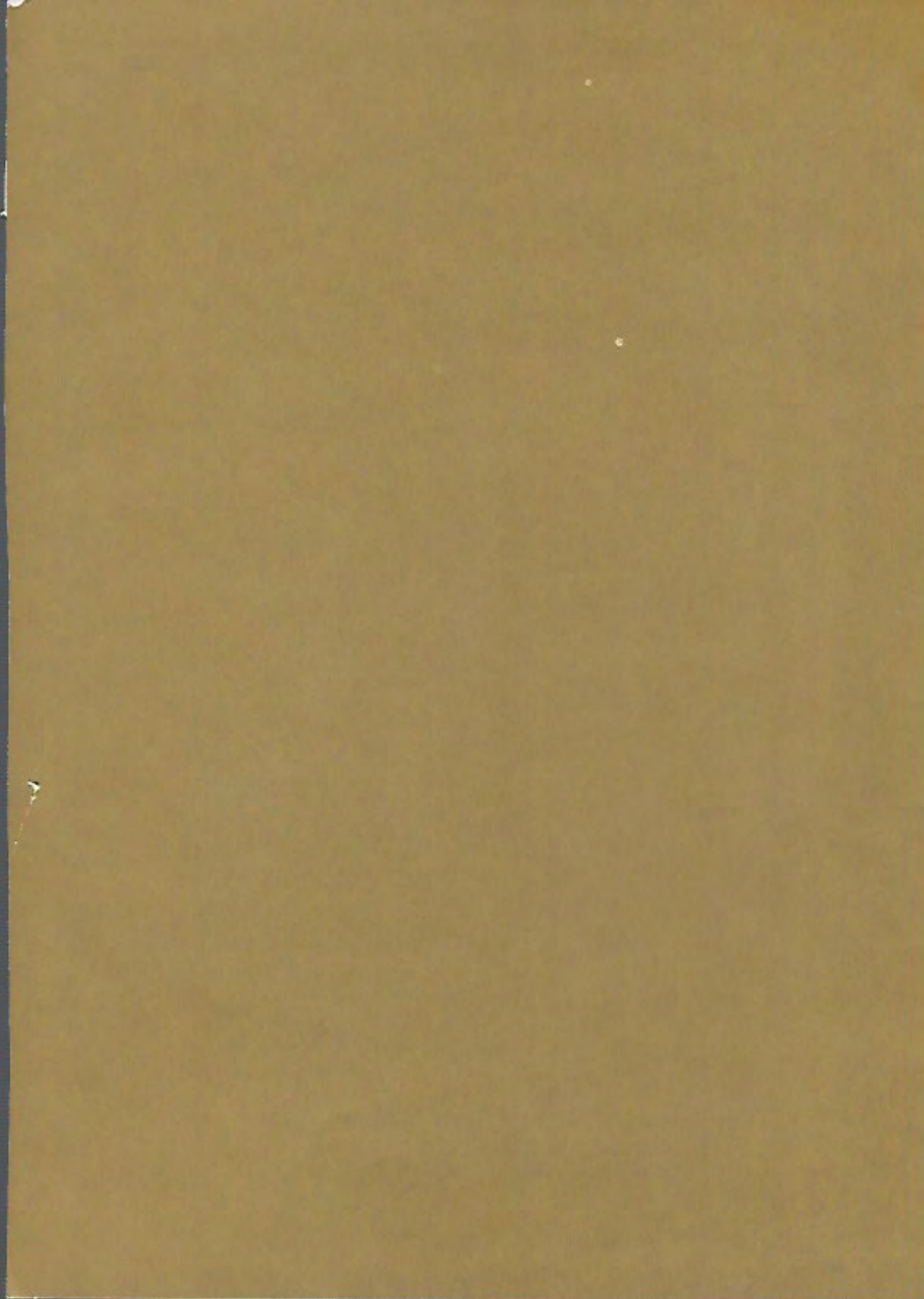

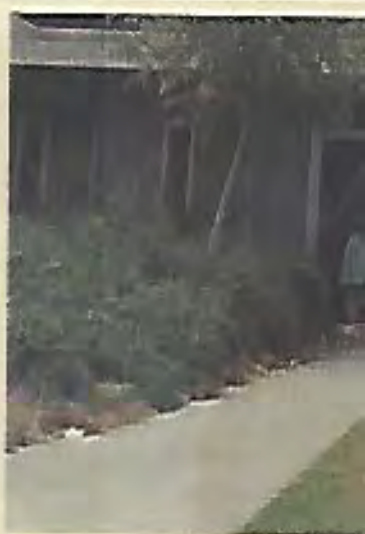

MASSES

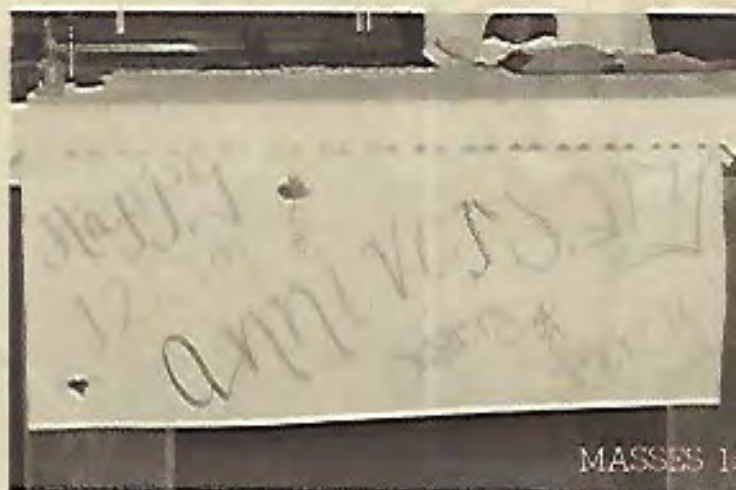
