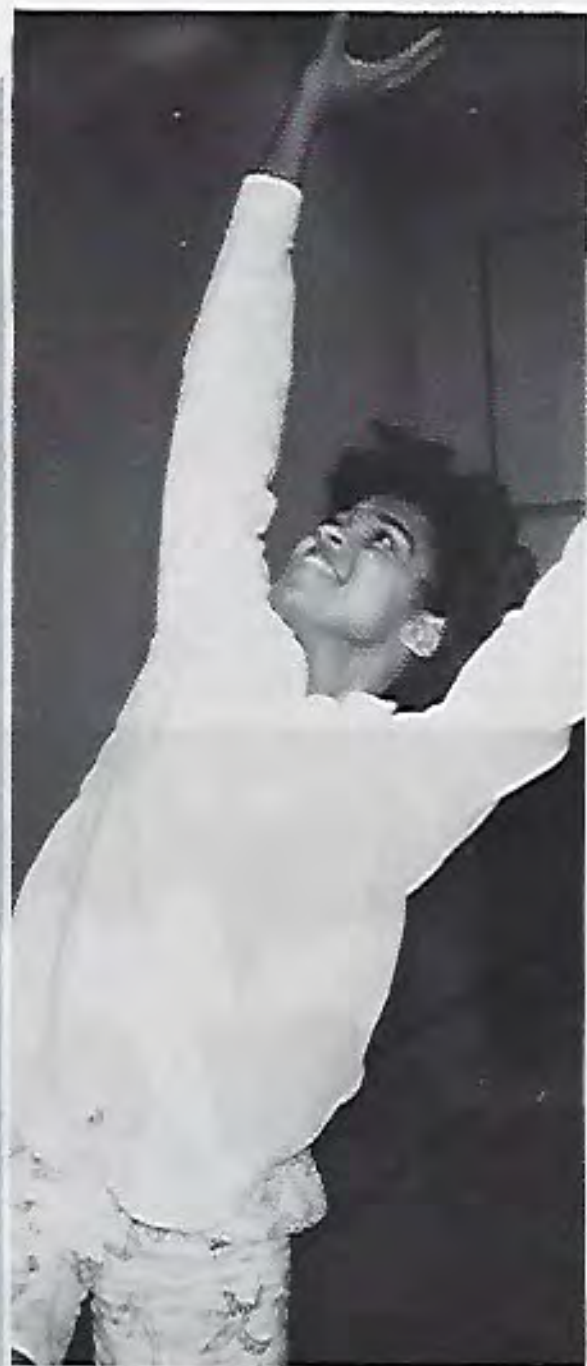

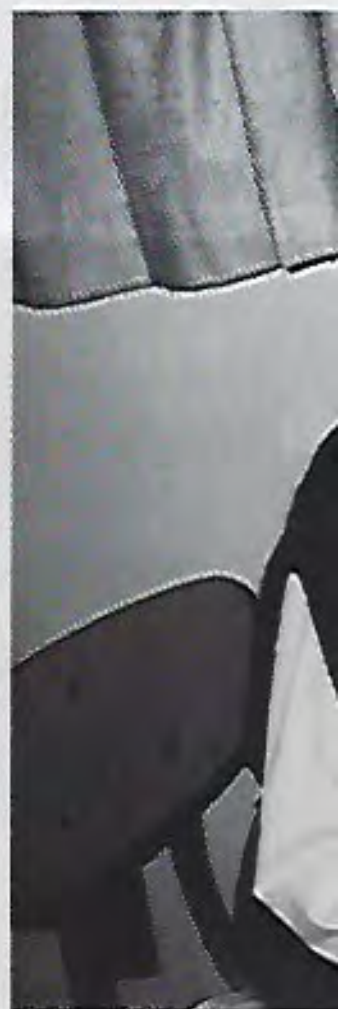

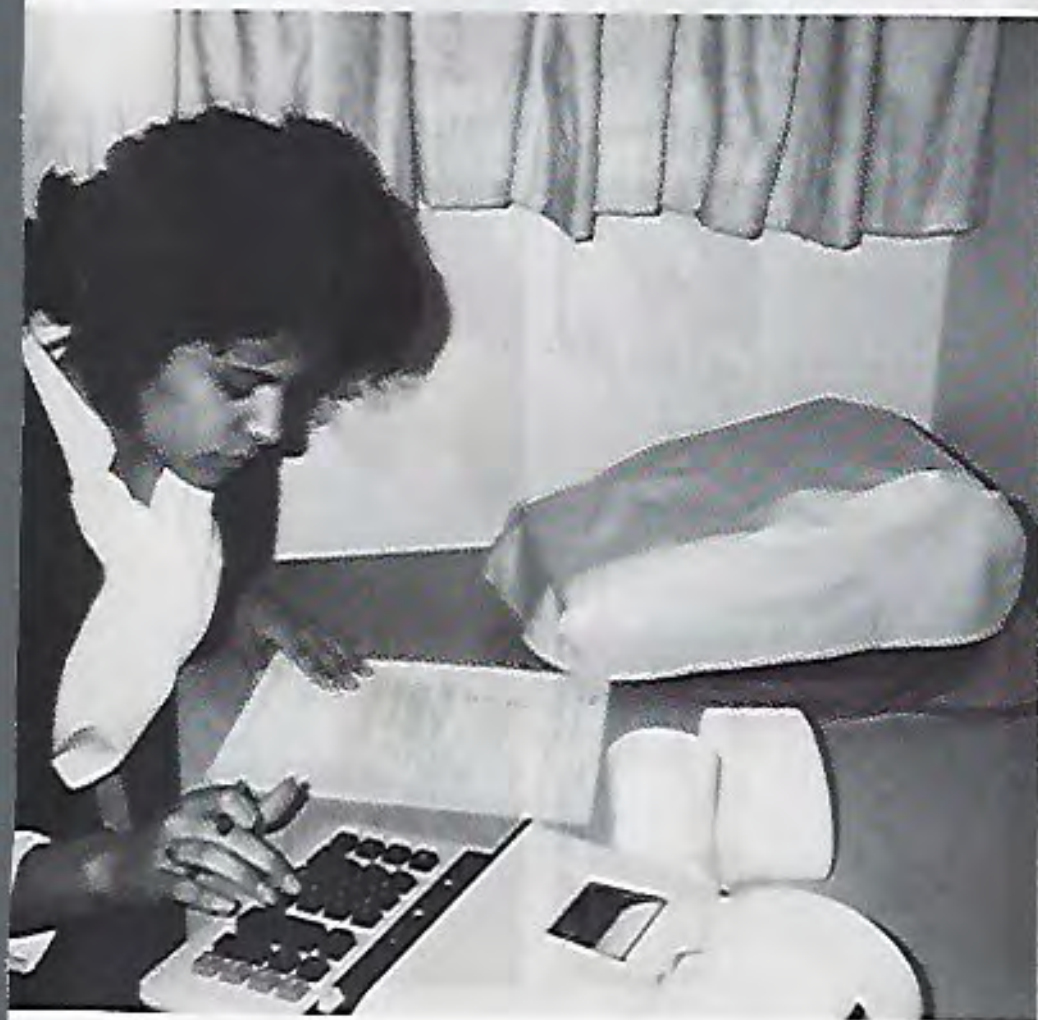

## Aids Alarm

In a 374-page report issued last November, the prestigious National Academy of Sciences predicted a medical and social catastrophe if the spread of AIDS is not checked. In fact, the choice now is between a lesser catastrophe and a very much larger one. The NAS urged a massive national crusade — with a price tag of \$1 billion — to emphasize "safe sex" and called on President Reagan to mobilize the country against the deadly disease.

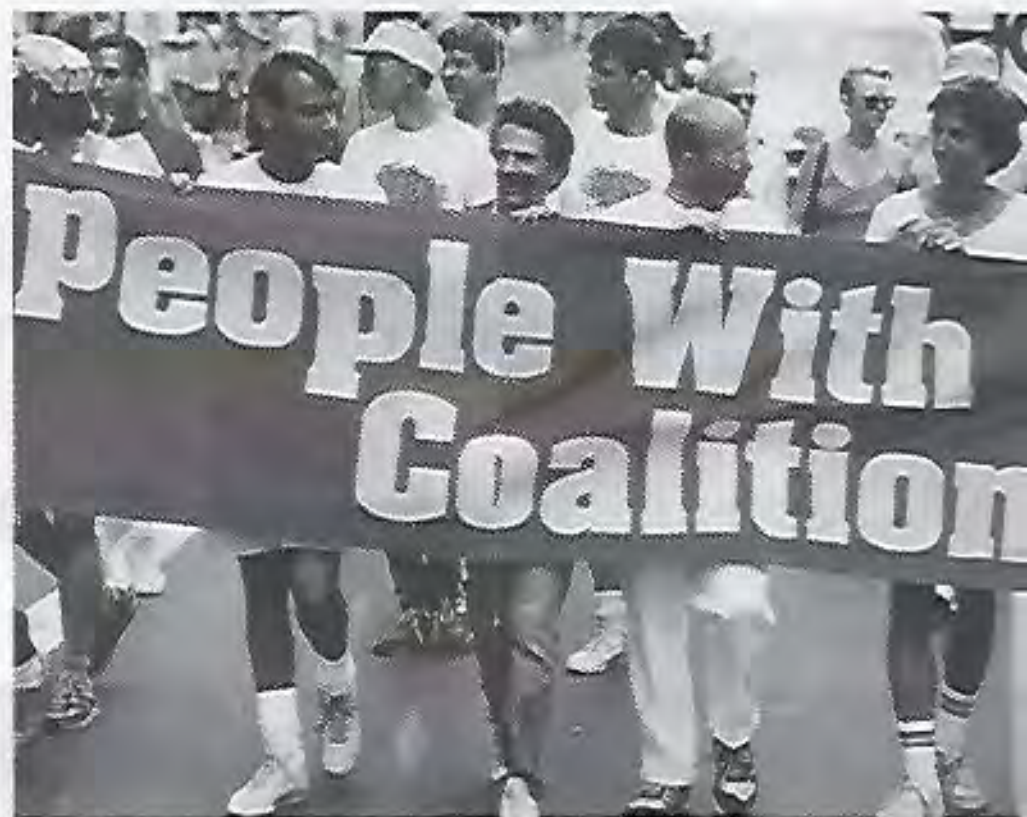
As of November 1985, 15,000 Americans had died of AIDS or AIDS-related diseases, 27,000 had been diagnosed as suffering from AIDS and 1.5 million Americans were estimated to be carrying the AIDS virus — in most cases, without knowing it.

By 1991, 27,000 Americans will have been diagnosed as having risen to 54,000 a year and the virus, in all probability, will have spread to between 5 million and 10 million persons. How many of those 5 million to 10 million Americans will eventually die of AIDS? Perhaps half — but no one really knows.

America and South Africa became closer as Paul Simon raised our consciousness with his album, "Graceland" which made the American Top 40. Although Simon was criticized by some as plagiarizing African music, most agreed that his honoring of composer's credits with the African musicians was fair; it marked the beginning of a new era in music.

The president welcomes Jacobson: Cutting a deal with terrorism

Despite Ronald Reagan's vow that he would never deal with terrorists, the administration has secretly permitted shipments of U.S. military equipment to Teheran in return for help in securing the release of Americans held by pro-Iranian terrorists in Lebanon.

The revelations spotlighted Marine Lt. Col. Oliver North, a White House aide, pointed to a power struggle in Iran and overshadowed the homecoming of released hostage David Jacobson, who had been held for 17 months.
