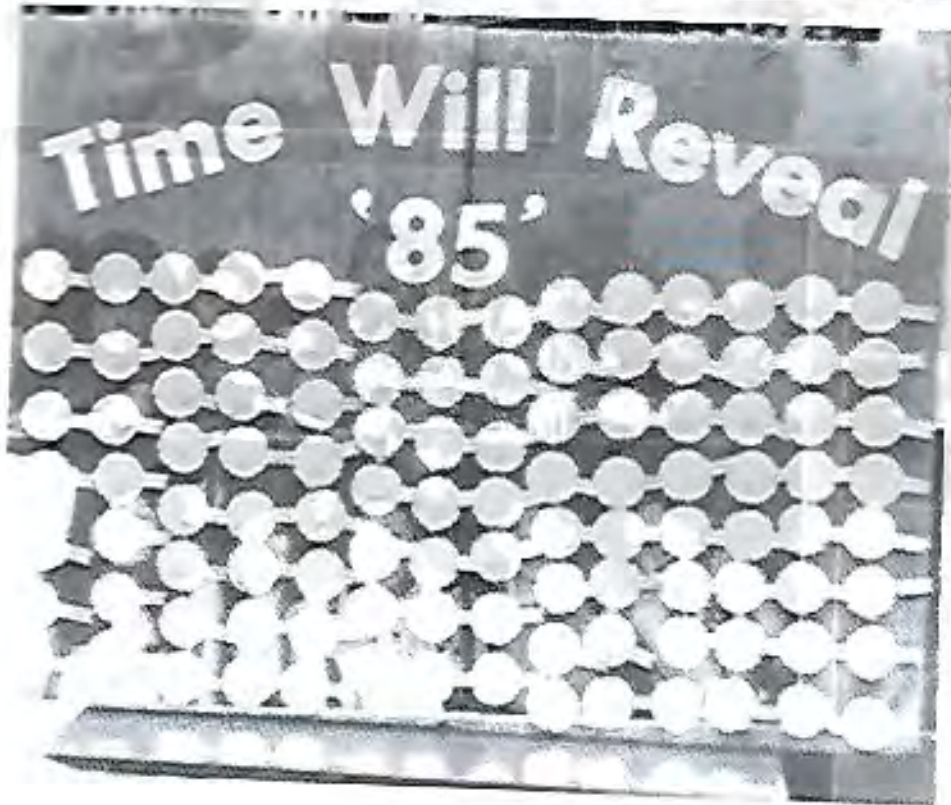




# TIME WILL REVEAL THE CLASS OF 85
