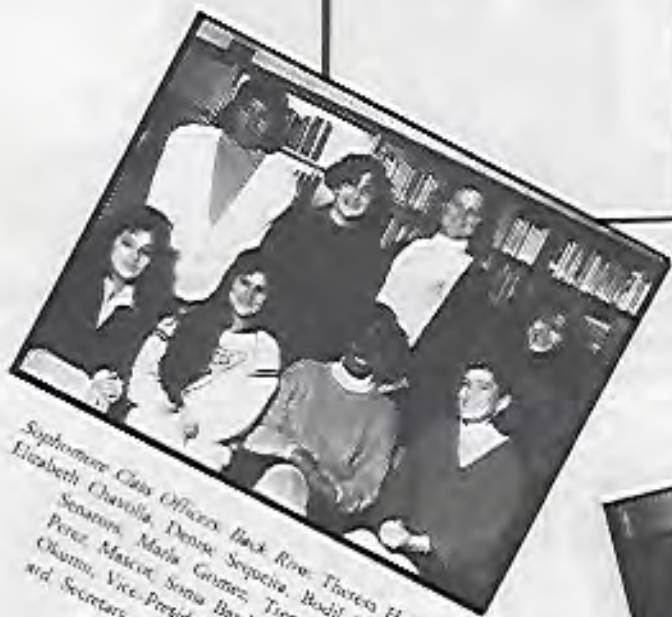

I nternational Human Rights



In the first year at Bishop Manogue, Amnesty International helped the students open their eyes to the harsh realities outside their own country. While images of people being unjustly imprisoned for their beliefs threatened to darken their outlook on life, the students at Manogue kept trying to make the world a better place for all. Those who joined Amnesty faithfully attended meeting during lunch twice a month to write letters asking other governments to release prisoners of conscience who were being unjustly held and tortured. Said Becky Lopez: "It's good that we have AI because it does not limit us to helping our own country, but it lets us help everyone."

María Quintero found her inspiration in any anonymous quote: "I would rather fail in a cause that one day would triumph than triumph in a useless cause." Asked about the effectiveness of Amnesty, Gwin Mosher quoted well-known popstar Sting: "Over 50,000 prisoners of conscience have been released due to the efforts of ordinary people writing letters to government authorities through Amnesty International. These people are just the same as you and me -- but they learned to UNITE. That's what all the students at Manogue worked so diligently for -- unity in the cause of suffering brothers and sisters throughout the world."

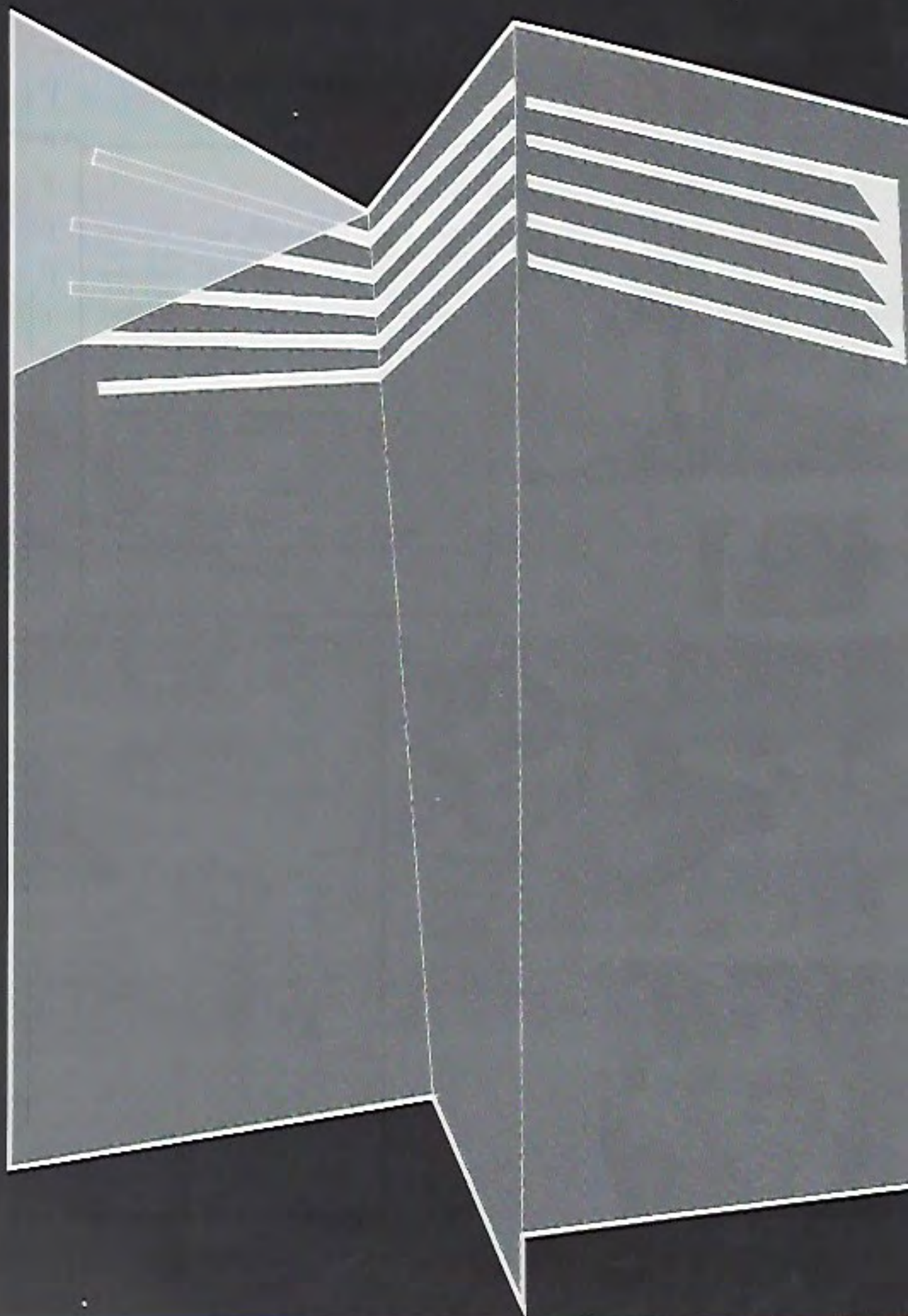

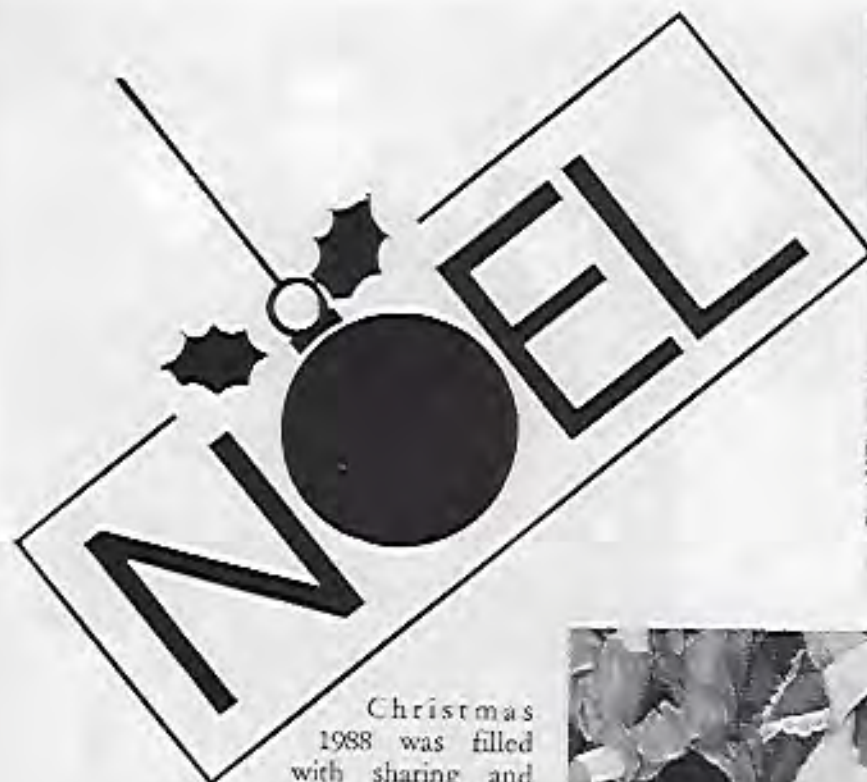

ience of ROP training, Michelle may now receive better opportunities that will help her be a success in acting. Good luck to Michelle in the future!

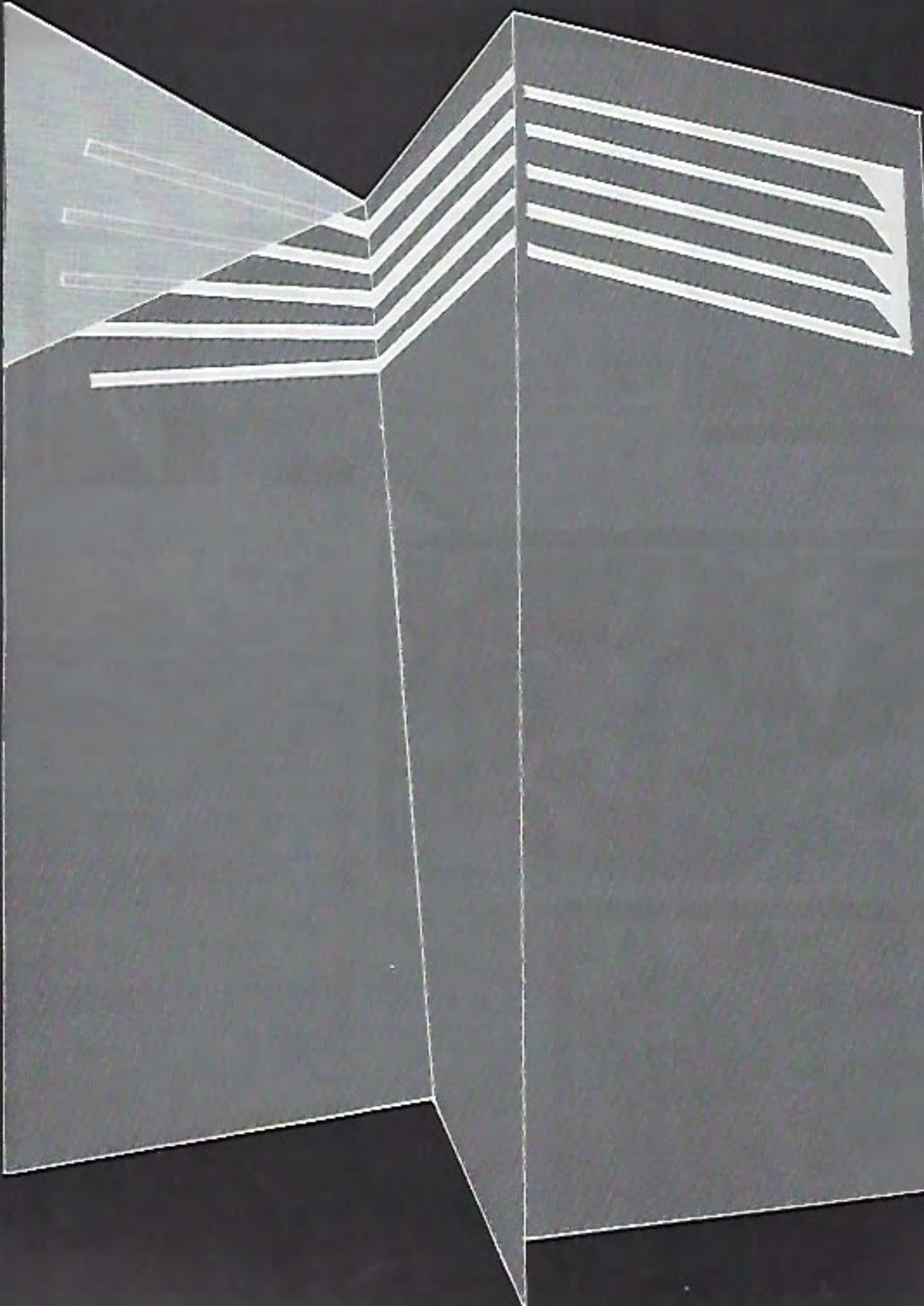

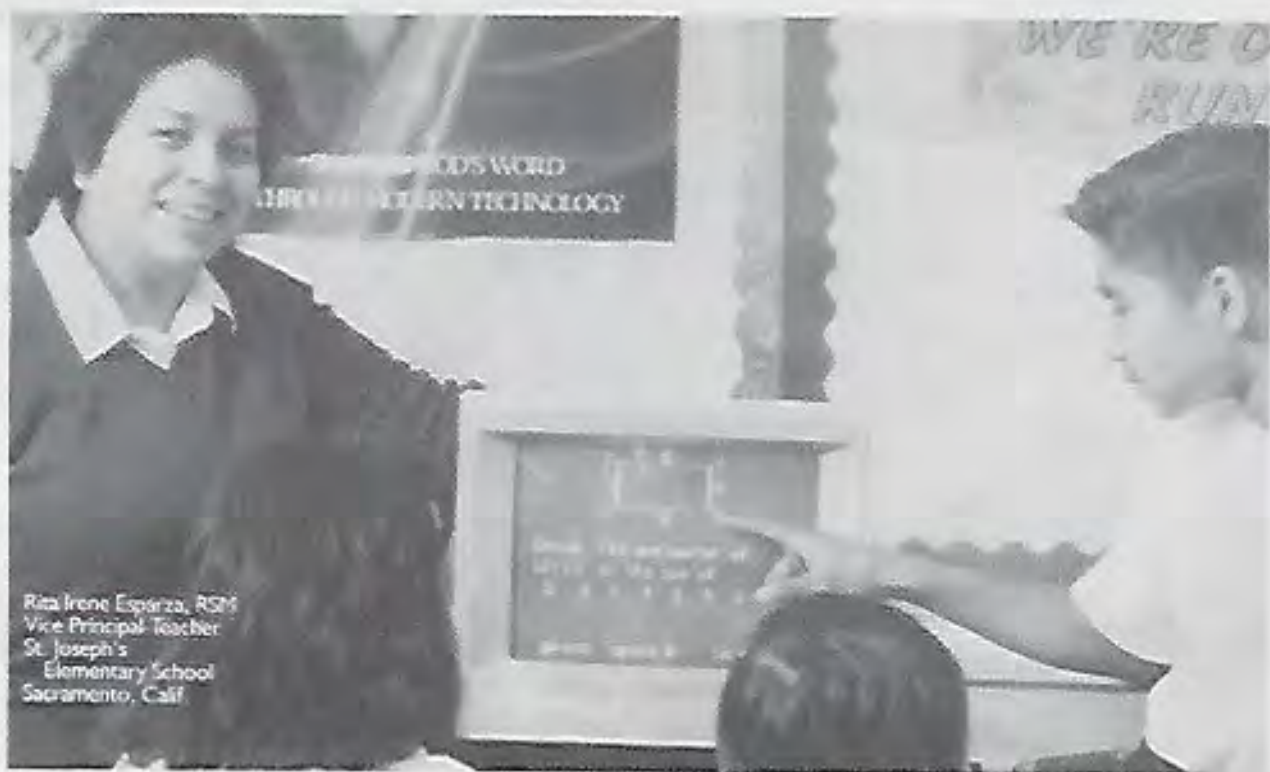
