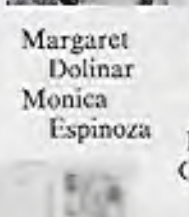

ORGANIZATIONS



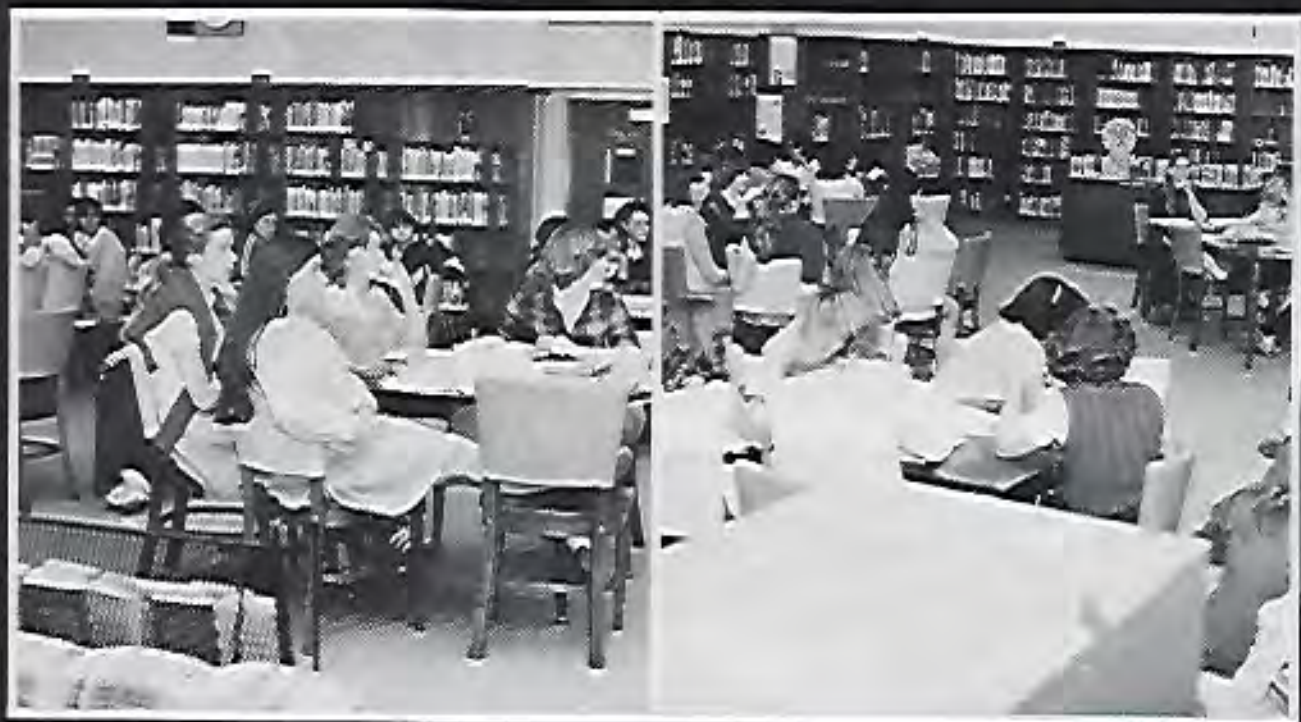
