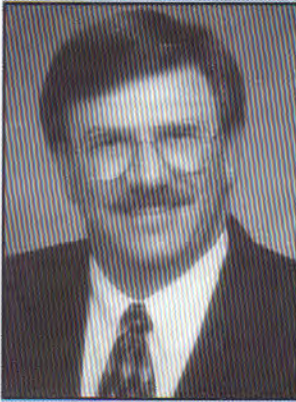

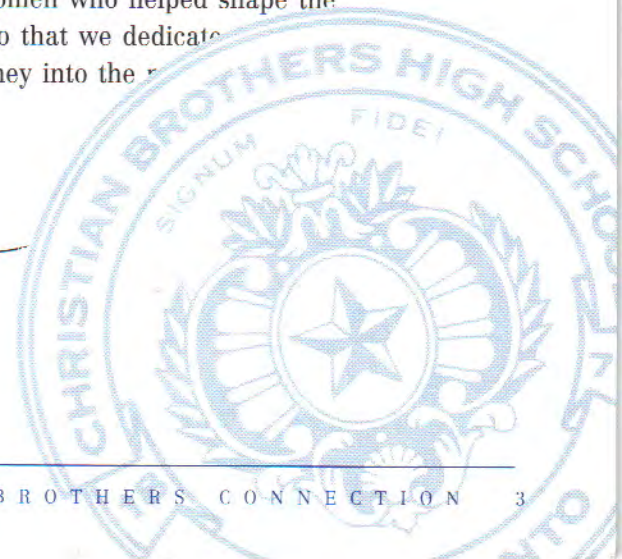

Christian Brothers College, 12th and K Street

St. John Baptist de La Salle, the “patron saint of teachers,” founded the Brothers of the Christian Schools in Reims, France, in 1680 to provide youths the opportunity for religious education and the means to achieve academic excellence. For over 300 years the Brothers have earned a distinguished reputation by their devotion to the universal education of young people. Today, they sponsor approximately 1,600 institutions of learning in 83 countries worldwide, serving over one million students.

In 1876 members of the Catholic community in Sacramento were not satisfied with public education and wanted to provide a religious education for their children. Maggie Cunningham and Father Patrick Scanlan led the way in opening our first Christian Brothers school. The first campus was a three-story, four-classroom building on 12th and K Streets with seats for 260 male students. All but 10 seats were filled within 6 months. Seven Brothers of the Christian Schools were assigned to this school. Brother Cianan was founding director-principal.

Since its beginnings in 1876, the Christian Brothers tradition has flourished. Generations of Christian Brothers' alumni have been and continue to be leaders in Sacramento — providing vision and dedication to our region and beyond. We celebrate our 125-year heritage with you — our alumni, parents, students and friends.

During the 125th year, the *Connection* magazine will highlight moments in our history, which have defined our school community and created lasting memories for many Sacramentans. Each issue will focus on a campus and period of history.

Enjoy the journey through the past years and our celebration of our Lasallian heritage.

A True Unsung Heroine

MAGGIE CUNNINGHAM



Way back in 1876 it was Maggie Cunningham who brought the Brothers College to Sacramento. She came to Sacramento in 1865, but her interest in the College and in the boys who have gone out from it had been undimmed.

She had interest in many other areas: politics, real estate and Weinstock's.

How did Christian Brothers College come to Sacramento? While Maggie was visiting in San Francisco, she saw St. Mary's College, which had just been taken over by the Christian Brothers. Their work became of great interest to her. She felt the young boys in Sacramento were slipping downward, and some school like St. Mary's College was needed at once.

Upon her return to Sacramento, she spoke with Father Scanlan and said, "We ought to have the Brothers College here."

"Maybe we ought", said Father Scanlan, "but how are we going to get it without money?"

"You leave that to me. I'll find the money. We must have it."

In those days Maggie could get a horse and buggy from Stanley's stable – and they gave it to her without any charge for the job she had begun to undertake. In one day, riding around town, she collected enough to build the college.

The building was considered one of the best in the state. It was erected by William Kirk, architect, at a cost of \$14,700, exclusive of furnishings.

As we think back on the school days at Christian Brothers, we must remember and appreciate Maggie Cunningham, a woman who had the vision.



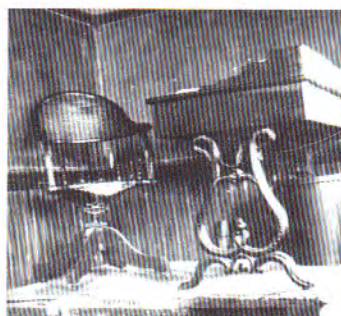

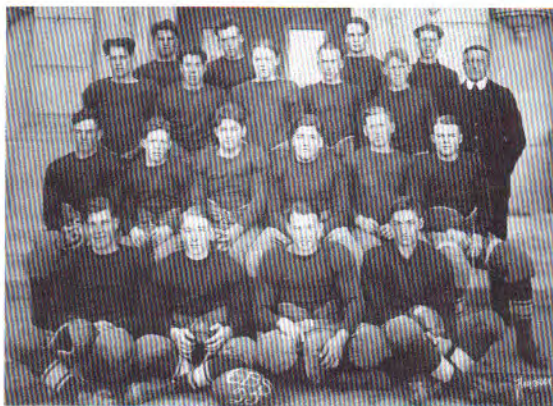

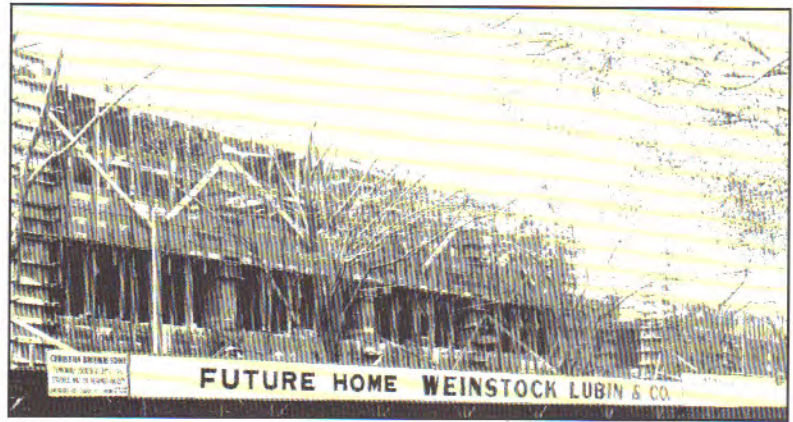

In 1923, the land on which Christian Brothers College stood for 48 years was sold. The school was demolished for a new store to be built, Weinstock, Lubin & Company. The Brothers moved out June 1st, and the new site for Christian Brothers College would be located on six acres at 21st and Y Streets (Broadway). With added facilities, the school would be placed on the accredited list of the University of California. Total cost would be about \$200,000. The College would be opened for the Fall term of 1924. For one year prior to its opening, the abandoned school building, East Sacramento Public School, located on 39th and J Streets, would be the students' temporary home.

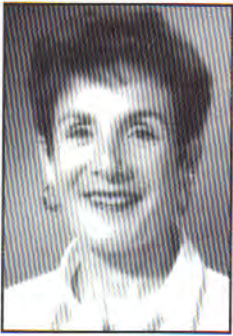

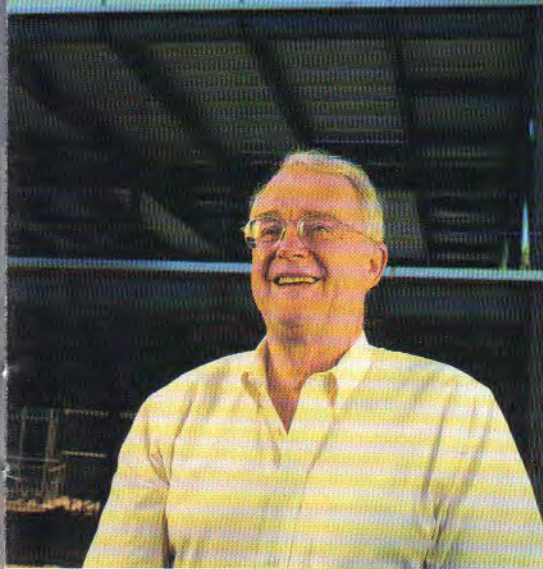

"A" MAN ON BOARD

This year marks the 350th anniversary of the birth of St. John Baptist de La Salle, the founder of the Christian Brothers, and a true pioneer of education. De La Salle put into practice his belief that a quality education is a prime determinant of a fulfilled life. Alone among his peers and at a great personal sacrifice, the former nobleman established a community of dedicated teachers who organized schools throughout France that provided a Christian education to destitute children. De La Salle created systematic innovations in pedagogy that are still in use today in classrooms throughout the world.

No one need remind Asa Whetstone (CBS class of '51) about the relevance and implications of the Lasallian tradition inherent in a CBHS education. Asa Whetstone has found the time and personal commitment to support the core values of De La Salle through his work on behalf of the CBHS community. According to Whetstone, De La Salle's vision continues at CBHS because it is, "transmitted from the Brothers and teachers to the students. De La Salle took poor youths who didn't know how to behave in a higher level of society and taught them manners and practical things so that they could get employed."

A member of the CBS City Championship basketball squad of 1950 and a former employee of Aerojet and IBM, Whetstone emphasizes that, "a Christian Brothers' education gives the

other dimension to education – the spiritual, that is essential for a firm foundation for life."

Having recently completed his five-year tenure on the Board of Trustees, the last two as Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Whetstone's leadership has helped develop and secure CBHS success for future generations. Chief among the many accomplishments during his tenure was the unprecedented success of the Capital Campaign that has come remarkably close to meeting the \$7.5 million goal. "I didn't spearhead it. Chuck Sylva was pivotal in the campaign, and he is the incoming Board Chairman," he adds modestly.

Other themes of his presidency include Board Policy Governance and accreditation. In reference to the latter, CBHS has recently been accredited for six years, a validation of the quality and success of CBHS. Whetstone also served on the Ad Hoc Committee that is responsible for defining the mission for CBHS. Recently, he was honored at the 40th anniversary of the Saint John Vianney

Elementary School for his support over the years.

For the class of '51 reunion, Whetstone led a drive of his classmates to create an endowment of \$51,000 to help needy CBHS students in perpetuity. It is his hope that, "other alumni classes will feel a responsibility to do similarly, supporting the Lasallian mission and returning support to the school for all the benefits received." Whetstone is familiar with the expenses involved, "Operating the school is costly and tuition is currently at \$6,700 per year," he explains.

Christian Brothers' slogan is "Enter to Learn, Leave to Serve." Few supporters have taken this theme so very much to heart as Asa Whetstone. He offers his energy and passion toward providing what he calls a "spiritual infusion which is the most important dimension of education." ♦

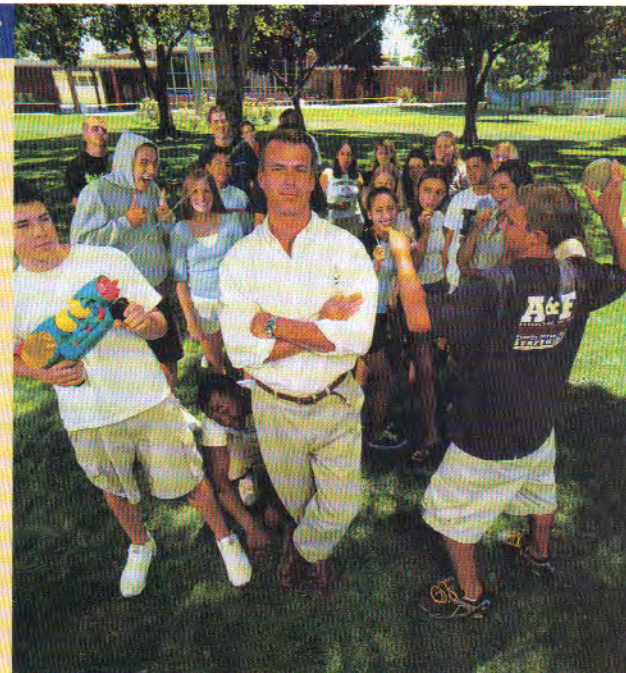
CBHS FACULTY PROFILE
