Raber's 66 sets tourney mark; Christian Bros. grabs team title

The Sacramento area gave the Northern Section a taste of state-level competition Monday at Gold Hills Golf Club.

The brothers Rappleye, Cameron and Grant, propelled Christian Brothers High School to its third straight Shasta Wolfpack Invitational title. Meanwhile, Davis' Tyler Raber was wrapping up a tournament-record, 6-under-par, 66 on the 6,205-yard course.

Davis, obviously, was medalist with Cameron Rappleye's 73 good for second place and Grant's 74 enough for third.

Foothill's Mitch Card shot a 76, tied with Chico's Cody Thompson for fourth.

If you're a prep golf fanatic, you'd recognize both the Christian Brothers brand and the names Rappleye and Raber. Christian Brothers took third at the 2007 NorCal tournament and sixth in the state meet last season. Cameron tied for second at the NorCals, Raber fourth.

Shasta's Nick Fasiano was conspicuously absent from the field. He's still sidelined with a muscle injury in his forearm relegating the Northern Section champion to go-fer status as he carted around doing odd-jobs for the tournament and left Card to battle the big guns on his own.

The Cougars senior brought Foothill (425) within seven strokes of topping Chico (419) as the top Northern Section team of the tournament. The Cougars weren't alone, though. Beating of an Eastern Athletic League race the coaches say could be as tight as ever, five LAL teams clustered around the 420 mark.

"It's roll the dice — who's hot on the right day," Foothill coach Layne McLean said.

Shasta (424), Red Bluff (425), and Pleasant Valley (420) all came away from Monday with positives they can spin into momentum going into the first league meet, April 3 at Chico's Canyon Oaks Country Club.

The Wolves, for example, hung with the best in the area without the section's top golfer. Had Fasiano played and scored — conservatively — a 75, it would have cut

Rappleye shoots a career-best 64

He leads Christian Bros. to the D-II title.

Grant Rappleye was so disappointed with his game last summer that he withdrew from a few tournaments and contemplated quitting because what once was so easy had become so frustrating.

But the rejuvenation of Rappleye hit its pinnacle Monday.

The senior shot an 8-under-par 64 — the best round of his life — at Wildhorse Golf Club in Davis to lead Christian Brothers to the Sac-Joan Section Division II title. The win moves Rappleye and CBS into next Tuesday's Masters Championship at Stevinson Ranch, south of Modesto.

The Falcons are the defending Masters champions, but they lost last year's section title by two strokes to rival Rocklin.

So Rappleye's performance was huge, as the Falcons' 365

beat runner-up Oak Ridge by four strokes and third-place Rocklin by 13 strokes.

Rappleye had eight birdies and no bogeys in finishing four strokes better than Rocklin's Nick Brown, who shot a 68. Rappleye came within "seven or eight inches" of an eagle on the par-5 17th hole and also had eagle opportunities at No. 5 and No. 7.

"I've never been that under so far into in the round," Rappleye said. "To be honest, I knew we had a good chance of advancing as a team, so I wasn't really pressing. I probably played a little too aggressive, but it worked out."

Rappleye is a much more confident golfer these days, which should be a boon to Sacramento State. He and his brother, Cameron, have signed letters of intent with the Hornets.

Last year, Grant Rappleye's scores steadily worsened in the postseason — from a 72 at the D-II finals to an 85 at the state championships — then contin-

ued to decline during the summer when he often found himself shooting in the mid 80s to low 90s.

"My postseason was really scary last year," Rappleye said. "I think I was pressing too much with trying to get into college."

In other divisions:

Division III — Medalist Justin Estrada's 5-under 67 led Yuba City to a three-stroke victory over Benicia at Peach Tree Country Club in Marysville. Woodland placed third.

Division IV — Austin Heikila, Derek Zachman and Danny Kraker placed third through fifth in helping lead Colfax to a repeat championship at Greenhorn Creek in Angels Camp. Sonora took second, Bear River third.

Division I — Jesuit won the title and Folsom and Davis placed second and third, respectively. Davis' Tyler Rober was the medalist with a 1-over 73 at Paradise Valley in Fairfield.

Imagine that you're a college coach. You know that one game-changing recruit can turn around the fortunes of your entire program.

Imagine David Sutherland on Wednesday after Grant and Cameron Rappleye signed letters of intent to play golf for Sacramento State.

"This is as important as anything that will happen in our future," the Hornets' director of golf said. "Having these two kids on board allows us to really compete."

The Rappleye brothers are 18-year-old seniors at Christian Brothers High School and were recruited by Division I schools throughout Northern California.

Cameron was a first-team All-Metro selection last season and an eight-shot winner of the Father Barry Junior Masters at Ancil Hoffman two weeks ago.

The Rappleyes chose Sac State because they were recruited as a "package deal," the team has potential, Sutherland has years of experience competing on the PGA Tour, and they can remain close to home - but not too close.

"We live out in the boonies of Elk Grove," Cameron said. "It will still be like going away to college."

The comfort level and familiarity they share, often spending 15 hours a day together at home, school and on the golf course, drove them to the same school when other siblings might have wanted some space.

"It will make the transition into college a whole lot easier," Grant said. "Plus, I need someone to make fun of."

Grant is tall and thin. Cameron is shorter and stockier. Their scores over four years in high school have been almost inseparable. Their decision came down to Nevada and Sac State.

Better weather and a strengthened fall schedule helped sway their decision.

Sutherland's excitement couldn't be more palpable.

"Having them come here makes everything we do more important," he said. "We're going to keep working at this. It's the start of something big. I really think we can move this program forward to compete on a national level."

Cameron was more casual but just as confident.

"The team just needed a couple of extra good players, and they got them," he said.

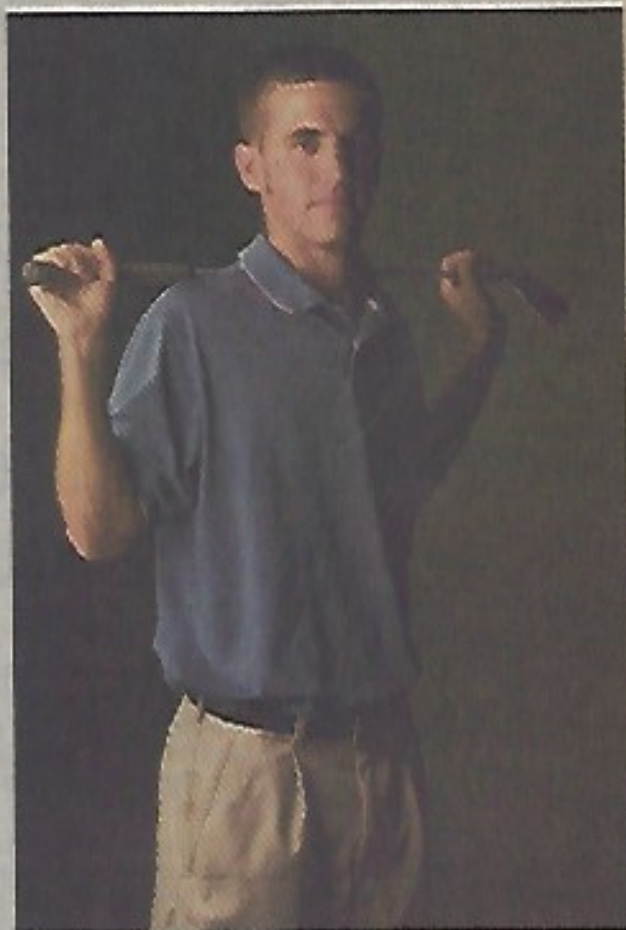



Varsity Coaches' Corner



Kirk Purdy
Varsity Head Coach

Kirk Purdy is starting his 5th season as the Christian Brothers Varsity Golf Coach after serving as JV Coach for the 2003 season. Prior to coaching golf, he was the Falcons Head Freshman Boys Basketball Coach for five seasons, from 1997-2002. Coach Purdy has also coached girls basketball, track and field and football at other schools before coming to CB. In his four years of coaching varsity golf at CB, Coach Purdy's teams have compiled a 40-9-1 dual-match record in the Sierra Valley Conference. They are the two-time reigning champions in the league and have also won the last four SVC league tournaments.
