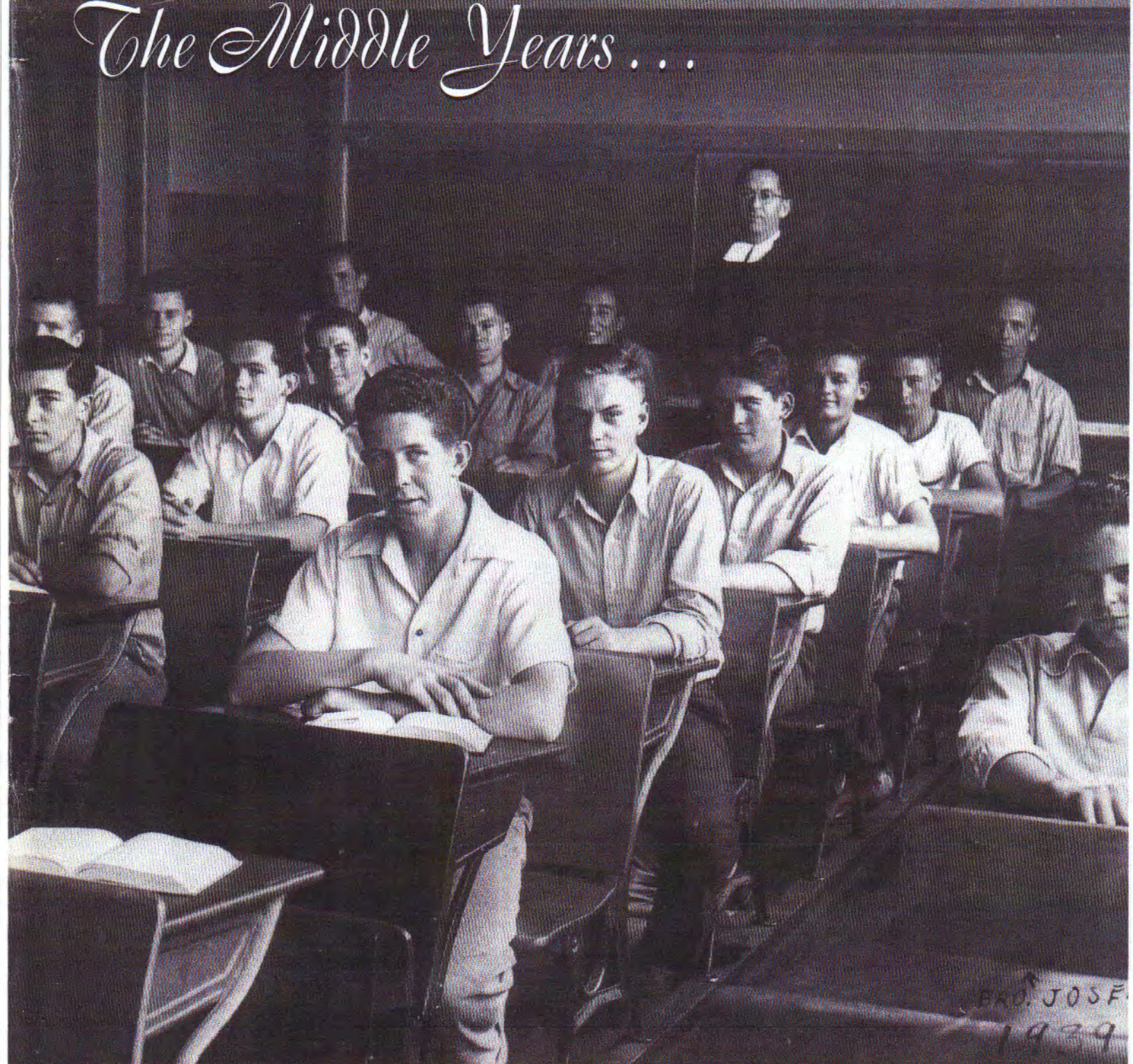

What's in a brick? It contains some clay, perhaps a little sand, some coloring, and initially a bit of water. Hundreds of years ago the Indians used to add some straw. Today, we have high-pressure machines that press bricks together and kilns that dry them. Rickety wheelbarrows no longer deliver them. They arrive on giant, flatbed trucks and are unloaded on pallets by forklifts.

Whether made painstakingly by someone's hands, a few at a time, or by a large industrial machine, bricks are and have been used to build things. They are used in some places to make roads or planters or barbecues. But most often they make buildings.

And what's in a symbol? Sometimes safety. Flashing red lights at a railroad crossing may not say, "Train's a'coming," but we get the message. A stylized fish on the back of someone's car announces that the occupants are Christian. A seven candle menorah in someone's window in December says the occupants are Jewish. A picture of almost anything with a red circle around it and a red line through it means "not this, uh-uh, or no way."

Once in a great while bricks and symbols are allowed to come together, and this is one of those times. Many of you recently received an invitation from either me or the honorary chairman of our building effort, Brother Bertram Coleman, F.S.C., to consider buying a brick for our new Science, Math and Technology (SMAT) Wing. Your name would be put on this brick and mortared into a monument wall, a permanent record of your support of the effort.

The Brothers of the Christian Schools, priests, sisters, and laity have been active more than 125 years and have been serving the Sacramento community for 125 years. For one-and-one-quarter centuries, these men and women have taught, coached, mentored, counseled, helped, and befriended countless young men and women. They have spent many, many hours inside and outside the classroom, sometimes in your homes. Some of us would not have made it without the help of one of these people who served at Christian Brothers School, or Bishop Armstrong, or Bishop Manogue or St. Joseph Academy or Christian Brothers High School.

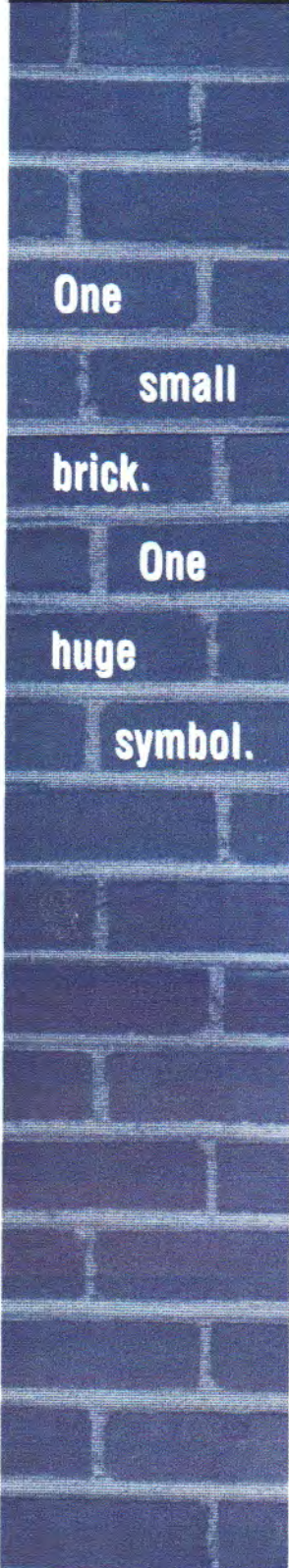
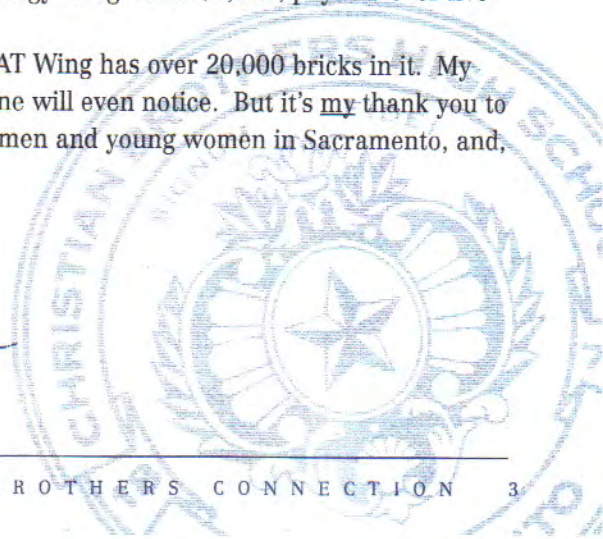
My opportunity to work beside these dedicated individuals came late, five years ago. But every day I witness the tremendous impact this school has had on Sacramento. I hear about it at Rotary. I hear about it at the other Catholic high school crab feeds and auctions I attend. People stop me in the supermarket because I have on my Falcons jacket. It's all around ... and you know it. Because you are a part of it. You experienced it.

One brick for the Science Math and Technology Wing. Cost \$1,000, payable over five years ... or all at once.

It's not the brick. It's the symbol. The SMAT Wing has over 20,000 bricks in it. My little brick with my name on it? Probably no one will even notice. But it's my thank you to the Brothers and all they have done for young men and young women in Sacramento, and, for the past five years, for me.

One small brick. One huge symbol.

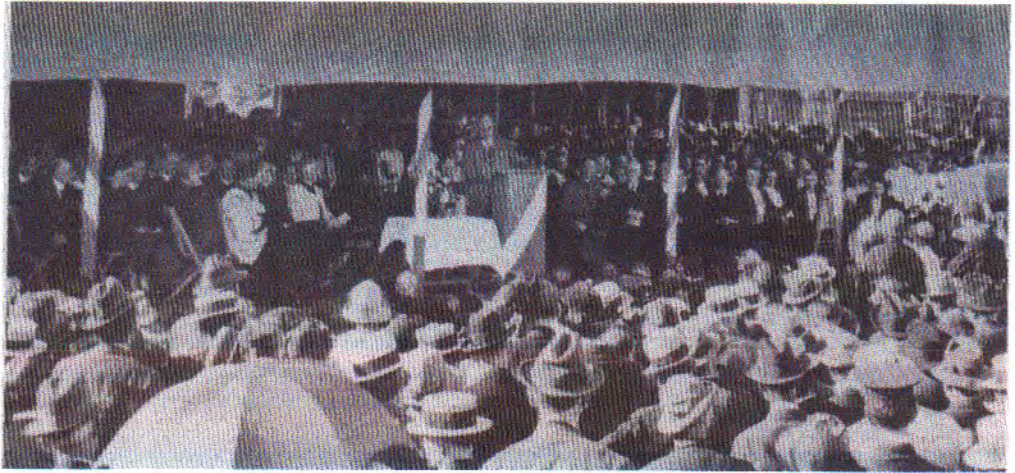
CHRISTIAN BROTHERS: 125 YEARS OF SERVICE

One hundred twenty-five years! A long time, indeed, since an energetic young maiden lady, named Maggie Cunningham, saw her fund-raising efforts brought to fruition with the opening of what has, at various times, been known as St. Patrick's Institute, The Sacramento Institute, Christian Brothers College, Christian Brothers School, Bishop Armstrong High School ... and now ... Christian Brothers High School.

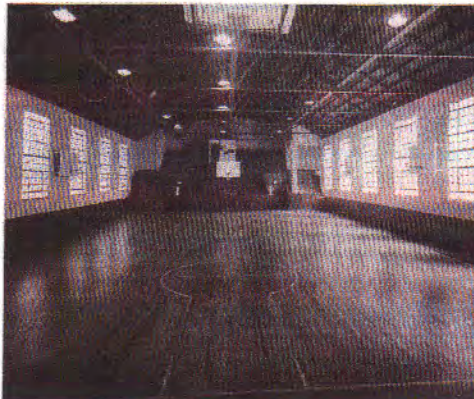
The reasons behind the establishing of a school by the sons of St. John Baptist de La Salle, the Christian Brothers, in Sacramento were basically two: The desire by Catholics to provide a religious education for their children and general dissatisfaction with public education as it then existed. Accomplishing this task took a good five years.

Finally, aided by the impetus from Father Patrick Scanlan and doorbell ringing and arm-twisting by Miss Maggie Cunningham, the great day arrived ... establishing the first high school offering both academic and commercial classes in Sacramento. Officially known as St. Patrick's Institute after the patron saint of the Sacramento (then Grass Valley) Diocese, the school was dedicated July 16, 1876, by Archbishop Joseph Alemany. The next day, the Brothers began enrolling students and by the following Monday ... July 24 ... 200 students began their first classes. They wasted no time in those days.

What sort of school was it that opened its doors in the nation's centennial year at 12th and



On May 18, 1924 cornerstone ceremonies were held on the ground of the yet to be completed campus of Christian Brothers School at 21st and Broadway (then Y Street). Judge Peter J. Shields, Class of 1882 and Chairman of the Day, provided the opening remarks. The major speeches of the ceremony were given by The Honorable Elkus, Brother Z. Joseph, Provincial of the Christian Brothers, and The Honorable Thomas J. Lennon, Class of 1881 and Associate Justice of the California Supreme Court. The ceremonies drew a large crowd including such early pioneers as Maggie Cunningham who remembered well another dedication held 48 years prior. The ceremonies were preceded with a parade that began on 20th and T Streets and included a division of "Old Boys" as well as all of the Catholic organizations of Sacramento.

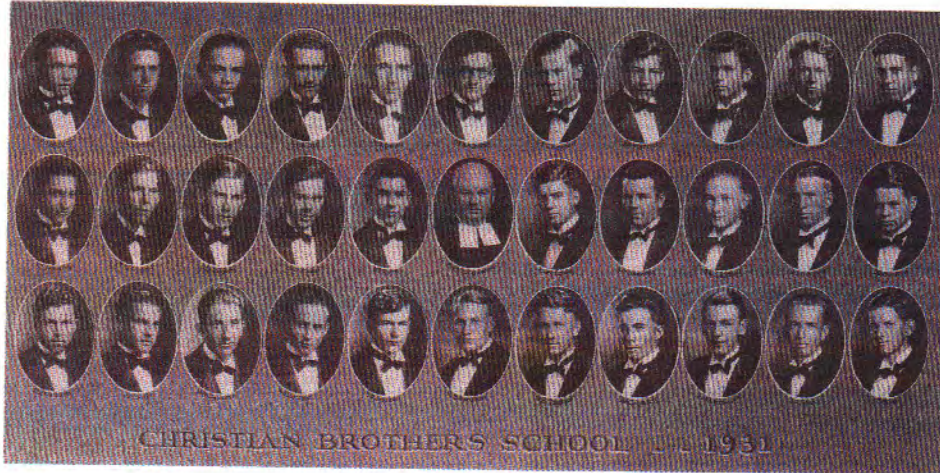

K Streets on the site that was for many years Weinstocks department store? There were all of four classrooms with seats for 260 students. The most basic division problem indicates the teacher-pupil ratio was such as to put to the acid test even renowned disciplinary talents of the Brothers who took over the new building. For each classroom there was furnished, according to contemporary accounts, a teacher's desk and revolving chair. With classes averaging over 60 students, the later were probably kept in perpetual spin. All of this required the expenditure of \$24,000, a substantial sum for that day. In just months after its opening, the school conferred its first diplomas ... two, to be exact ... in the Assembly Chamber of the Capitol, just two blocks away, with Governor William Irwin presiding.

During the next two decades the school ... by then known as the Sacramento Institute ... thrived until, in 1896 and at the urging of Bishop Thomas Grace of Sacramento, it became Christian Brothers College. The term "college" was not inappropriate, for in those days it was possible for a student to spend his years from the first grade through three years of college right there at 12th and K Streets before ... if he wished a degree ... transferring to Saint Mary's College. Thus it was that the concept of the junior college came a reality to the Sacramento area in the hands of the

Brothers a good twenty years before Sacramento Junior College, as an adjunct of Sacramento High School, began offering post-secondary courses.

Brother Cianin, founding director-principal, was succeeded by members of his first Institute whose names ... Bertram, Sabinian, Genebren and Victor Ambrose ... are now footnotes to history. In 1900 Brother Vellesian came onto the scene only to return years later in the 1920's to preside over the construction of the "new school" at 21st and Y Streets. The history of the school in these early years is minimal in detail, perhaps because, as Brother Lewis noted with a rare touch of asperity, "Brothers Florinus Peter, V. Leo, and Jasper kept poor records." Maybe, by way of excuse, they were just too busy trying to keep board nailed to board in a crumbling edifice.

The downtown school was falling apart and the commercially valuable property ... still owned by the Diocese ... was sold. This put Brother Vellesian, his faculty, and student body in a position that was, at best, somewhat awkward. The property had to be vacated by June of 1923, and it would take a series of miracles to have a new school ready for the start of classes in August. Vellesian, a practical man, preferred to depend on his own resources rather than tax divine providence. The result was a move to the abandoned East Sacramento Public School building at 39th and J Streets, where Sacred Heart Church now stands.

It took seven months to iron

out the details of construction which advanced at a break-neck pace: The contract was let on Feb. 4, 1924; ground was broken Feb. 11, the corner-stone laid on May 18, and students were in their classrooms and Brothers and boarders in their living quarters on Sept. 15. It would seem Brother Vellesian did have his miracle of sorts. The curriculum having been reduced some years before to eliminate college level courses, the school officially became known as Christian Brothers School on Nov. 5, 1924.

The 1930's saw an athletic program reach an even par with other schools of the area. The gridders, under young Jim Flynn, were able to stun Sac High's Purple Dragons two years hard-running (at which point Sac High followed the only sensible course and hired Flynn), and Henry "Bud" Hanna's basketball and baseball teams played all corners on even terms.

It was during the depression years that the school suffered a premature aging process. When maintenance money was just not there, the well loved Brother Patrick kept the boiler together with bailing wire and magic to provide heat for the classrooms. Meanwhile, the Brothers, on too many mornings, were shaving with cold water. Brother Patrick was also responsible for a major curriculum revision that revitalized the academic program of the school.

The toll of time was felt simultaneously by Christian Brothers, and the two girls high schools ... St. Joseph and St.

Francis ... and thus it was in 1957 Bishop Armstrong High School, a co-institutional experiment in Catholic secondary education, was opened, and "old" Christian Brothers remained as a feeder school, offering freshman and sophomore classes only, and it appeared that never again would a diploma bear the name "Christian Brothers."

Tradition finally was served ... and restored ... in 1964, when two new four-year high schools for girls made it, once again, possible for a four-year high school (grammar school classes had been discontinued in 1957) under the Christian Brothers to exist in Sacramento. The culmination was the restoration of the old name, in 1968, with the addition of one word: Christian Brothers High School.

The "old boys" from the Sacramento Institute are gone now and the ranks of those who still call it the "Brothers College" are thinning. But the graduates, young and old, will still agree that what Daniel Webster once said in arguing the famous Dartmouth College case also applies to this alma mater:

"... it is a small school, but there are those who love it..." indeed there are ... they number in the thousands.

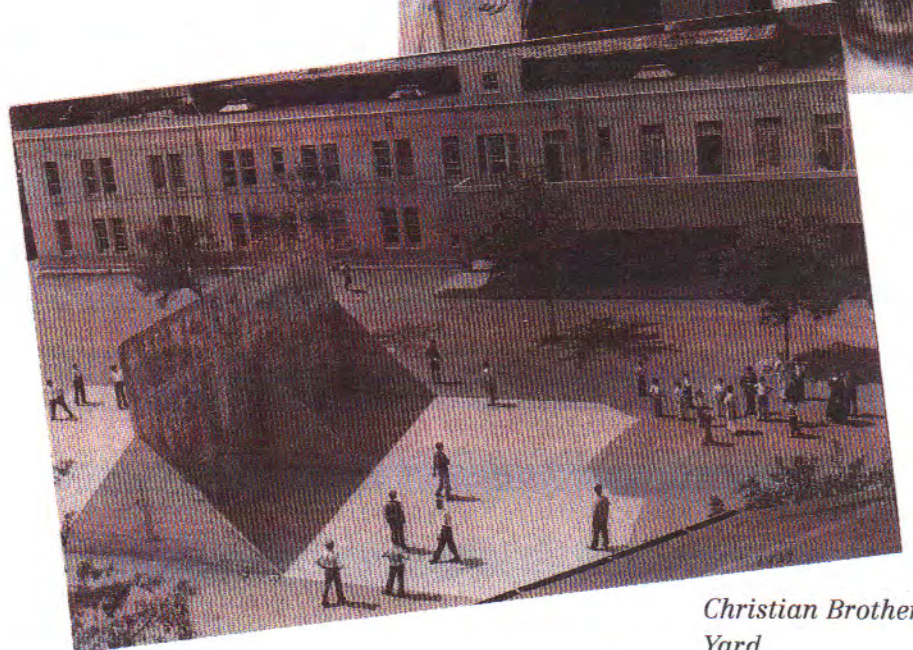

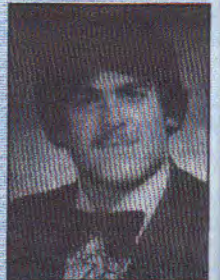

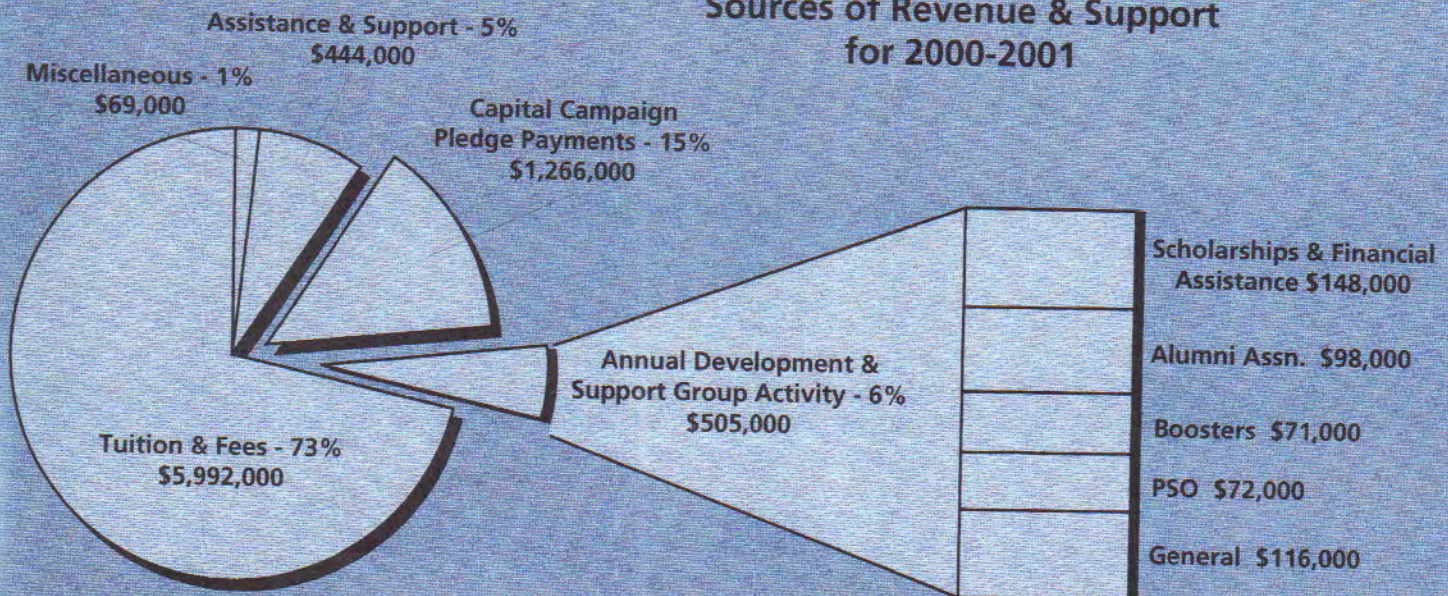

Partners in Lasallian Education – Serving Those Most in Need

“The Institute is concerned above all for the educational needs of the poor as they strive to become aware of their dignity and to live and to be recognized as human beings and children of God. The Institute establishes, renews, and diversifies its works according to what the kingdom of God requires.”
(The Brothers’ Rule, art. 11)

Here at Christian Brothers High School, the newly formed Partners in Lasallian Education Program enables the most financially needy students to join our community and participate in a Lasallian education. Our schools have always depended on the support of committed alumni, friends, parents, grandparents, companies and foundations. It began with Madame Maillefer, who endowed De La Salle’s first school in 1680, and continues today with those who join our Partners in the Lasallian Education Program.

John Baptist de La Salle and the early Brothers worked very hard to find new ways of addressing the huge problem of poverty in 17th century France, and we continue to do so today in 21st century Sacramento. As he became involved with a group of teachers who worked with poor children, De La Salle confronted the reality of poverty. He devised a way of addressing one of the causes of poverty and helped thousands of poor students and their families break the locked-in cycle of poverty – ignorance – exclusion. The approach that he and the Brothers introduced had three key elements:

1) A focused, comprehensive, and disciplined education for all who desired it

- 2) An education that took place in a faith community environment
- 3) All students were given a free education – the schools were fully endowed

The education that students received broke the chains of ignorance, bad habits, and little hope. The community of school and church brought different classes of students together and gave them a way of reaching beyond their poverty. Offering a free education gave credibility to the Gospel and to the students’ own dignity while also treating everyone in the school the same. Together, they provided students with the knowledge, habits, experience, contacts, and vision that could ensure their success.

Poverty is still around today, and if we take the Gospel seriously, we should take the problem of poverty seriously. UNICEF estimates that there are over 600 million poor children in the world today, a full 10% of the world’s population. In the U.S. alone, almost 9% of two-parent families and a staggering 59% of single-parent families live below the

Federal Poverty Line.

Yet while poverty is still around, so are Lasallian educators whose Gospel ministry is still focused on education, who still create a particular kind of school community, and who still stretch themselves to teach students in need without counting their own cost. The ongoing challenge is educating needy students who cannot afford to pay the tuition of the school.

Inroads are being made, however. In educational institutions around the world, the Brothers

continue to stretch the envelope, starting new works for the poor and making sure that the poor are included within existing works. Here in Sacramento, Christian Brothers High School has made a commitment to serve a minimum of 5% of the student body, or fifty of its students, tuition-free. There are currently seventeen students from families below the Federal Poverty Line

who attend the school tuition-free as part of this program. This is in addition to the 273 students who are already receiving over \$400,000 a year in partial tuition assistance. As in the 17th century, small steps that follow the Gospel Call and that answer real needs introduce new blessings and involve more and more people. The more we can address the third element of De La Salle’s educational vision – a free education – the more the entire mission of Lasallian education is brought to life for everyone, and the more the cycle of poverty will be broken for children who would otherwise continue to be “lost and far from salvation.” (De La Salle)

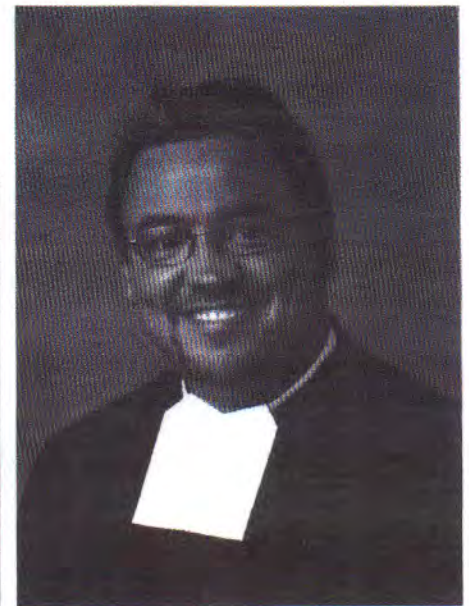

Working for 12 years in a summer camp, from simply a participant to the chief animator, I discovered that I liked to be with kids and teaching them. I felt perfectly at my place. The notion of working together at the same project is something I find very important and the Brothers show me that can be a way of life that can make you happy. Religious life

is also about prayer, personal and in community. This is an important part of who I am and the Brothers help me to grow as a religious.

Presently, I am teaching freshmen religion at CBHS. I enjoy teaching this class. The students are very nice and cooperative. At other schools, I have taught: religion, French, geography, computer sciences, multimedia and broadcasting. I also gave different seminars related with Computer and Communication.

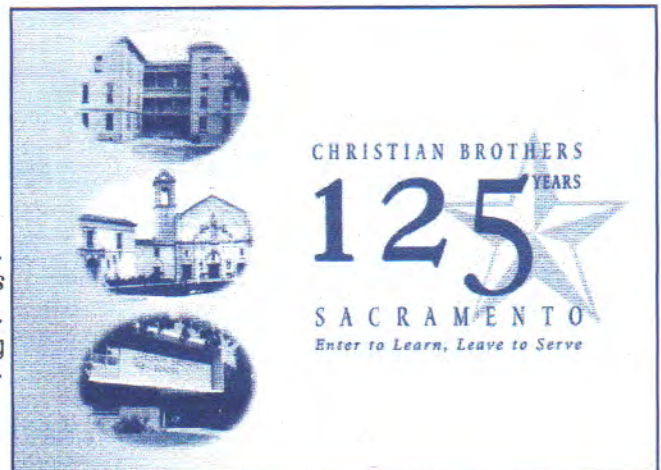

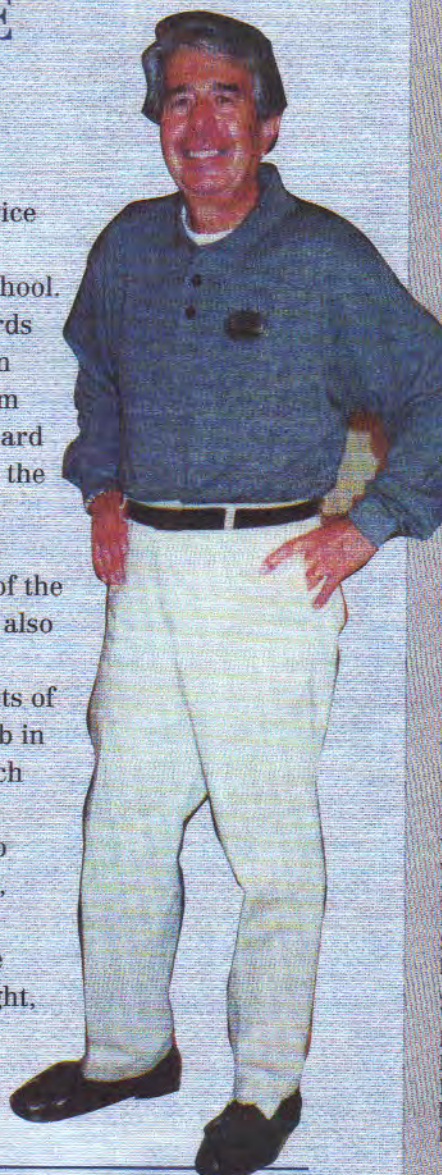
THE ALUMNI SERVICE AWARD FOR 2002
