Happy New Year! In the world of education, August/September marks our new beginning.



Mr. Ray Burnell Appointed Principal

Mr. Lorcan Barnes, President of Christian Brothers High School, announced in March the appointment of Mr. Raymond J. Burnell as Principal of Christian Brothers High School, effective July 1, 2005. The appointment was made after an exhaustive search and interview process.

Mr. Burnell comes to Christian Brothers with eighteen years experience in Catholic education. He served the Sacramento Catholic community as Principal of Sacred Heart School since 2001. He was also principal of two other Catholic schools in the Diocese of Monterey. From 1996-99, he served as Assistant Secretary of Education for Catholic Schools and Parental Rights Advocacy for the United States Catholic Conference in Washington D.C. In the late 1980's he taught three years at Palma Catholic High School in Salinas, California.

Mr. Burnell holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Political Science and a Master's degree in Public Administration from Arizona State University. He also earned a Master of Education degree with an emphasis in Catholic Educational Leadership from the University of San Francisco. In addition to these academic credentials, Mr. Burnell is a Master Catechist with an emphasis in social justice.

Mr. Burnell is a native of Tempe, Arizona. He and his wife, Bonnie, have one son, Benjamin.

Mr. Paul Rieschick Appointed Director of Advancement

In June, Mr. Lorcan Barnes, President of Christian Brothers High School, announced the appointment of Mr. Paul Rieschick as Director of Advancement, effective July 1, 2005.

Mr. Rieschick's background includes twenty-seven years experience in advancement/fundraising. Most of his career was spent in higher education where he held positions of increasing responsibility at Union College (NY), Lafayette College (PA), and Nichols College (MA). From 2001-04, he served as Director of Development for Theological College at The Catholic University of America in Washington D.C. In March 2004, he accepted the position of Director of Development and Stewardship for the Diocese of Sacramento, a position he held until moving to Christian Brothers.

Mr. Rieschick received unanimous and strong support from an interview panel comprised of the following members of the Christian Brothers community: Trustee Peter Berghuis, Br. Dan Morgan FSC, Chuck Sylva '65, and Roger Valine '67.

Mr. Rieschick is a native of upstate New York who has lived in Sacramento since spring of 2004. He is an active parishioner and member of the parish council at St. Francis parish in downtown Sacramento.

CB Acquires Land

Site Purpose to be Determined

The Oak Park neighborhood is one of the hottest real estate markets in the region, with property appreciating at double digit rates. In December 2004, the school purchased a small parcel (4/10 of an acre) on Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. directly across the street from the campus. We were motivated by market conditions, controlling our surroundings, and leaving all its options open for future campus development.

The administration has not determined how the property will be used. Plans will depend on funds available and the strategic needs of the school. "It is unlikely that the parcel will be used for programs that directly involve students as we don't want our students crossing a busy street for daily activities," said Lorcan Barnes, CB President. "But there are uses for that property that could free up other space on the main footprint of the campus for improved services to our students."

Membership Campaign

Inaugural Campaign Generates \$61,000 and 376 Charter Members

"The Inaugural Alumni Association Membership Campaign was a huge success in its first year," according to Larry Cline, Director of Alumni Relations. "We were very pleased with the increase in net revenue that the campaign generated over the previous appeal concept. The past couple of Alumni Appeals had produced \$44,000 and \$39,000 net revenue respectively so the \$61,000 raised was a substantial effort. The volunteer leadership of Kevin Crossland '69, Dave Macko '92 and Bobbi Pires '76, did a fabulous job of recruiting fellow alums into teams of five to participate in this most important fundraising campaign."

More than 50 community volunteers spent six weeks from March 9 to April 22 soliciting revenue for Christian Brothers. The campaign produced 376 charter members of the Alumni Association and \$61,452 in net membership money.

After the completion of the campaign, a Victory Party was held at Christian Brothers on May 26th to thank all the volunteers and to hand out special awards and individual incentive awards.

Taking top honors for producing the most money was Burrell DeVine '55 as he generated \$7,450 in membership revenue and winning a trip for two nights in San Diego. The Top Producer for Most Memberships went to Ron Bird '76 with 16 new members recruited, and he won a trip for two nights to Reno.

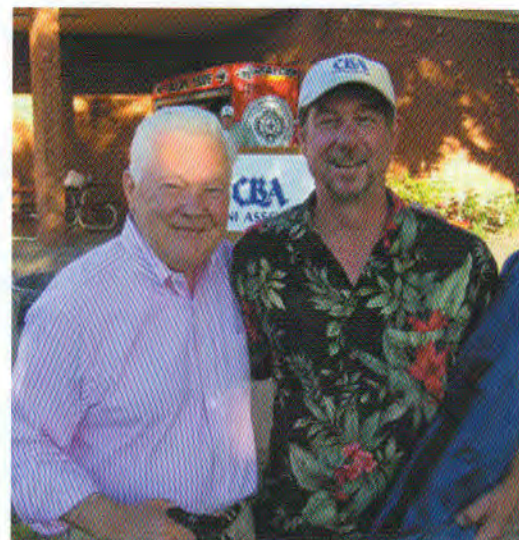
Top Team Captain of the Red Conference, Jim Westlake '51 and the Blue Conference, Burrell DeVine '55 both led their respective teams to the top of the leader board, winning CB attaché cases for their efforts.

Not only did the campaign produce new CB Alumni Association members and needed revenue, it also was fun for the participants as they were able to get involved with the Association and to win special incentive prizes consisting of a CB duffel bag, folding chair and jacket.

Al Scott, a .500 hitter and second baseman

“CB was the best thing in my life”

Almost three quarters of a century divide the man in front of me from his photographs as an athlete at CB. All those years have done little, however, to diminish the striking, masculine face of Alfred Irving Scott II. The clear eyes and firm grip of a .500 hitter remain. His hair is still full, his body capable. He is lean and alert, and he had better be as his wife of more than sixty years, Albeth, does not miss a thing. They are a handsome, urbane couple who live in Eskaton Village, Carmichael. They use to live over near Curtis Park on Donner and 25th, close to where my dad Jerry grew up. Typical of Sacramento, when I introduced myself over the phone to Albeth she said, “are you related to little Tommy Kirrene who grew up over on Marshall Way?” Tom is my dad’s brother, my godfather. I knew at that time that I would enjoy my visit with the Scotts.

Al and Albeth come from old Sacramento stock, hers dating back to the 1850’s. He was born in 1915, she “a little later.” They met each other at Sacramento Junior College in 1934, after Al returned to town. They married in ‘41 after saving enough money to begin a life together. Although a Sac High Dragon, and from the area, Albeth didn’t know about her “Tom’s” athletic prowess here in Sacramento, only that he was “strikingly handsome.” Albeth calls him “Tom,” an intimate nickname given to him by an uncle who apparently shouted out “Hooray for Tom” upon hearing that he had a newborn nephew. They have three sons who all attended IC and later Bishop Armstrong: Irv (Alfred Irving Scott III) ‘60; Roger ‘63; Mark ‘66. Irv’s three sons are alums of CBHS: Chris ‘85; Brian ‘89; Matt ‘01. I’d say three generations of Scotts from two different centuries is rather impressive, and what makes this school so special.

While visiting with the Scotts, Al shared with me the scrapbook of his days at Christian Brothers. Inside I discovered an era of sports in

Sacramento that could have only existed in the 1930’s. I found the athletic chronicles of Al Scott and Christian Brothers. He was one of those three-sport athletes of which Christian Brothers was so well-known, and of whom so few exist today. Looking through Al’s scrapbook takes me to a time in Sacramento that has long passed, when the football team of ‘32 was featured in the *San Francisco Chronicle Daily Sporting Green*, and the *Vallejo Evening News* printed up a ten page “Souvenir Program” of a grid-iron match between CBS and St. Vincent’s High of Vallejo, at Tobin Field.

Alumni Life

Al's association with this CBS of Sacramento began in 1924 when he moved over from Jefferson School during the fourth grade. From this period on, the Brothers at CBS had a profound effect on him, especially given the fact that his father, Alfred Irving I, had succumbed to the flu epidemic that struck the Central Valley in 1918 when Al was only three. From his earliest days on the "new campus" at 21st and Broadway, Al "felt a fit, a place where he belonged." He thrived in the all-male environment, where athletics and competition were part of his daily life. For Al, this date was to begin what he calls "the greatest experience of my life." Given his accomplishments during this period, I can understand why.

Al's list of accomplishments during his high school years presents a profile of a well-rounded individual: athlete; Student Body President; Editorial Staff Writer; strong student. Although Al managed to find time to be involved in leadership and journalism while at CBS, most of his experiences centered on sports, experiences that led him to receive scholarships from both the University of Oregon and the University of San Francisco. You can see even from his eighth grade class photo that he was built for sport: sturdy frame, strong jaw, confident gaze. During his high school years at the campus, Al lettered in three sports: basketball, baseball, football. His scrapbook chronicles well his and the school's sports history during this early period. Although Al considers baseball his best sport, he was not too shabby in the other two. In 1931 he played in the basketball game against Sacramento High School that Kirt MacBride's article phrased, "for the city prep championship." He was a member of the CBS team that battled St. Mary's of Stockton, during a time when "Santa Clara and St. Mary's colleges had nothing on Christian Brothers and the Gaels of Stockton when it came to rivalry." During the 1932 season, Al scored 101 points, second only to Gene Casey, the team captain! This gift for playing "round ball" was passed down to his son Irv and grandsons Chris and Brian who also played basketball at Bishop Armstrong and CBHS respectively. Equally of note was Al's success as an athlete on the gridiron. During the '31-'32 seasons, Coach Porcella ran the famed "Notre Dame Shift" with Al at quarterback. Al and his teammates met with unprecedented success in '32 as the team went unbeaten that year. Later, during the 1935 and '36 seasons, Al returned to CBS to help Head Coach Jimmy Flynn defeat the Sacramento High School Dragons, "at a time when the Dragons annually used CBS for target practice." In fact, it was the first time that Brothers had ever defeated Sacramento on the gridiron. However, despite his success at basketball and football, it was at baseball that Al most excelled. At second base he had a pretty handy glove and made use of his arm. During one season he led the league in hitting with a .500 average. His bat helped CBS to win two City Championships. In fact, during the '30-'31 seasons the team won 27 of 30 ball games. Quite an accomplishment for a small, Catholic high school team. This success that Al found in baseball continues on to this day with Al's son Irv playing in the Men's Senior Baseball League, winning seven "World Series" in the past twelve years. Irv says that his youngest son Matt is a natural with the ball: We will wait to hear good things from him in the future!

I truly enjoyed my visits with the Scotts. During our visits they mentioned names that I have heard the "old timers" critique throughout the years during the La Salle Club Hall of Fame dinners: Marty; Margetich; Separovich; Flynn; Casey; Porcella. They mentioned venues around town that my grandfather Joe would have known; Washburn, Moreing, and Edmonds fields.

Finally, they spoke, especially Al, of a love for Christian Brothers and the inefable impact it had on their lives, an impact that had made for "the greatest experience" of his life. I would say that is high praise coming from a man of Al's accomplishments and years of experience. I wish he and Albeth well.

The Neverending Reunion by Bill Chamberlin '52

Stats are usually boring to most people, unless you're one of those trying to make a sales quota or computing a batters ERA. To this Class of '52 quasi-historian, however, stats have a different meaning; in this case, evidence of special class camaraderie, arguably unmatched in the annals of Christian Brothers High School classes.

The Christian Brothers High School Gaels Class of 1952 had 80 graduates. Since that June some 53 years ago, class members have gotten together for 26 organized class reunions, including each year of the first 20 years! It has been five-year intervals for reunions since 1972, including two Tri-High reunions with the Class of '52 of old St. Francis and St. Joseph's Academy.

The first 20 reunions averaged 23 plus classmates attending. Not bad, considering many Gaels had gone off to the Korean War, many went away to college, some into the Christian Brothers and one into the priesthood.

The closeness that seemed to spontaneously emerge by the time of our graduation has not really diminished. Not that a few haven't become hermits, and we've lost track of six. We know for certain that 15 have moved on to the "other-life." Yet, of the 59 definitely accounted for, 35 made an appearance at one or more of the three-day events of the 50th Year Reunion in September of 2002: Golf, Napa Wine Train, and the traditional reunion dinner. If you're into stats, that's 59% of 59 known survivors from the Class of '52. Not bad after 50 years, no?

The Class of '52 continues to be close with some friendly competition in the form of "golf tourneys," the first one played in August of '88. There have been 26 tourneys since then twice a year, with an average of 11 classmates each time. Even one of our favorite high school teachers, Roy Cortopassi, has attended and has played in 14 of the 26 golf tournaments. Finally, 18 different classmates

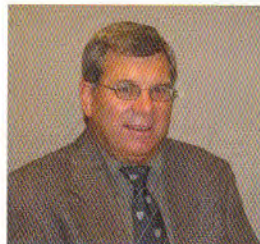

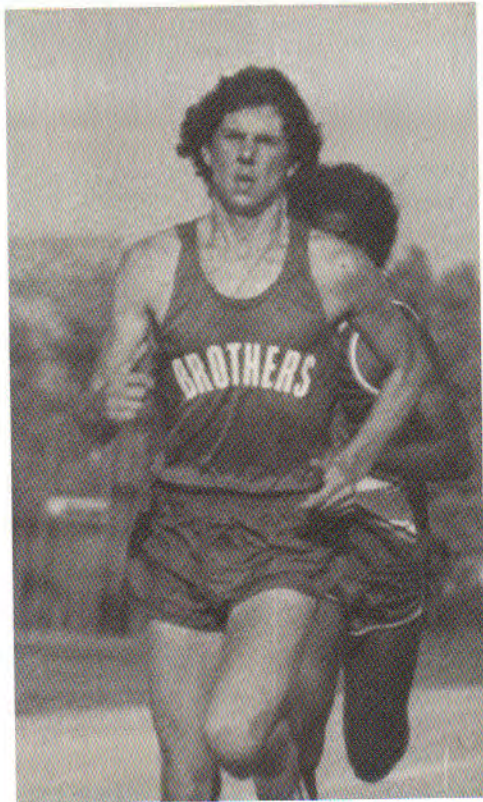

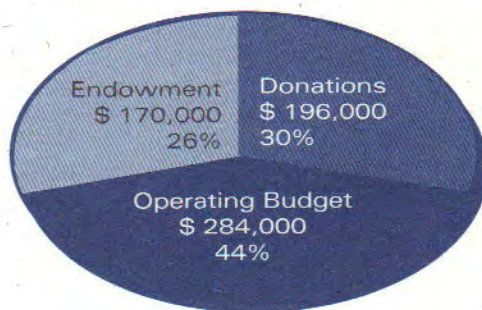

Alumni Profile: James Snyder '99, Hollywood Actor

From the time he was very young, James Snyder (Class of '99) funneled a large portion of his abundant energy into music. Piano, clarinet, guitar, harmonica, trumpet, voice—he enjoyed them all. In fact, he still receives a different musical instrument every Christmas from his family. So when he enrolled at Christian Brothers there was no doubt that he would also enroll in the music program. “From the very first liturgy that I attended,” James recalls, “I was impressed by the joy expressed by the students through their music, and I said to myself, I want to be part of that.” And part of that he was, for he ended up playing in both the concert and jazz bands and singing with the jazz choir. James attributes much of his growth as a musician during those years to the teachers who directed the program, in particular “Mr. Christian Bohm who, with his incredibly diverse talent, gave me something to aspire to.”

Although he discovered music very early on, it wasn't until his freshman year at Christian Brothers that James found a passion to equal his love of music—acting. It was in the spring of that year that he and several friends decided to audition for the musical *Godspell*. No one was more surprised than James when he was cast as Stephen, the Jesus character. As he states, “How can you top that role? At the time I did not realize the impact the words spoken by that character would ultimately have on me and my work as an actor.” After *Godspell*, James went on to perform in plays and the spring musicals, capping off his senior year with the role of Professor Harold Hill in *The Music Man*.

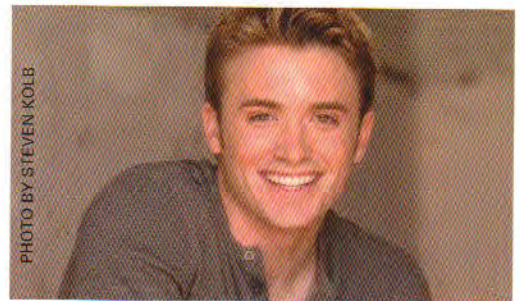
At some point during all those Christian Brothers performances, he doesn't remember the exact moment, James decided that he wanted to make his art his vocation, and so he applied to and was accepted into the Bachelor of Fine Arts program at the University of Southern California's School of Theatre. “The program at USC was a conservatory-type experience with a very small number of students,” James explains. “I received a lot of individual guidance which helped shape the art I wanted to create and the type of man I wanted to be. It also built my confidence, which really helps when you are sitting in front of a group of unsmiling producers at an audition.”

One of James' most memorable roles both during and after his college years was Luke Skywalker in *The Star Wars Trilogy in 30 Minutes*. “I have performed that role from Paris to Edinburgh, even in San Francisco for George Lucas and the heads of his companies. In April we performed the play 16 times in four days to an audience of 17 thousand fans at the *Star Wars* Convention in Indianapolis—those folks are very serious about their *Star Wars*!”

James' other professional credits include the role of Matt in last summer's Music Circus production of *The Fantasticks*, guest star spots on television shows such as *The Suite Life of Zack and Cody*, *The Gilmore Girls* and *Married to the Kellys*, and voice-overs for Disney DVD. In August, he wrapped up his first leading role in a major studio film, Dreamworks' *She's the Man*, starring Amanda Bynes, to be released in the spring of 2006. “It is based on Shakespeare's *Twelfth Night*, and my role is the Malvolio part, whose name in the movie is Malcolm,” states James. “It was a chance to play the comic bad guy, a type of character role that I had never done before.”

As focused as James is on his acting career, it is the fact that he has other interests that makes him such a well-rounded performer, a lesson that he says he learned in high school. “Christian Brothers offered such a wide range of experiences for me: Lasallian Youth with Brother Kevin; student government with Ms. Powers and Mr. Shumann; soccer with coaches Vince, Javier and Eddie; Ven a ver with Mr. Capogreco '86 and Ms. Hoffart; building the Great Wall of China in Mr. English's class; those were great times with great mentors who taught me that there is a world out there far beyond the boundaries of Sacramento and, more importantly, the necessity of getting outside yourself to make that world a better place.” As a final note, James adds, “I feel extremely fortunate to have spent my high school years with friends who were accepting of each other regardless of their particular interests. The atmosphere at Christian Brothers engenders the kind of love and acceptance that lets you know that you are going to be supported no matter what.”

CB Excels in Visual and Performing Arts

Challenged to go beyond where



Twelve years ago the Visual and Performing Arts Program at Christian Brothers was simply known as the “Arts” program and consisted of one full time and one part time art instructor who also taught Health Ed and PE, a Choir/band Director who directed a Beginning Band and a Pep Band, and a fledgling Drama program under the direction of the school’s chaplain producing a lone production each year.

In 1994 the school hired Ms. Bobbi Wilson to direct the music program (band and choir) in the newly revamped “Fine Arts” program under newly appointed department chair, Mr. Kevin McGovern ‘74. Ms Wilson’s background included professional voice training and experience in the entertainment and television industries. Her approach sparked a movement from traditional “gold school” models toward what was being done at university and professional levels. The same students who wallowed in the outdated and pedestrian programs that had been taught for years on campus were now challenged to go beyond where they perceived they could perform or achieve. Soon, Christian Brothers students were taking competitions and receiving honors throughout the region and were performing at such events as the Sacramento Jazz Jubilee.

What followed was an interest in the arts that has created six choirs or choruses (having performed for Governor Schwarzenegger, and twice at the Mondovi Center), five separate instrumental groups, including orchestra and string ensemble with students securing seats among the most notable of regional, state, and national orchestras and symphonies. What ensued was the construction of a music program under the direct supervision of two accomplished educators. Mr. Ron Slabbinck has taken the vocal program to unprecedented heights and to new performance venues that has consistently won praise, accolades and awards recognizing his program’s work as one of the best in the region. Mr. Travis Maslen, likewise, has built upon the growing success of the instrumental program through innovation and collaboration with both the choral and drama departments. Christian Brothers instrumentalists have been highlighted in local, state and national venues as top performers. To encourage and enjoy amateur music, a group of students, in collaboration with their teachers, created “Open Mic” nights at Christian Brothers. On these Friday nights, hundreds of CBHS students perform and enjoy their classmate’s talent in a coffee house atmosphere.

The drama department, under the direction of Ms. Loretta Kenney, has also moved into multiple productions and into areas of improvisation that encourages students of a truly diverse and non-traditional range of interests to involve themselves in the performing arts. In addition to performances of cutting edge dramatic productions throughout the year, multiple venues such as the recently renovated Guild Theatre (Off Broadway in Oak Park) and at various regional competitions, Christian Brothers students have competed in productions for student directed, one-act plays, at the Lenaea Festival at CSUS.

The Visual Arts program also blossomed to achieve local, state and national notoriety with the vision and direction of a faculty focused on tapping into the talent of the students who attend CB and to subsequently provide exposure to the world of art. Under the direction of the department chair, Mr. Kevin Haag '87, as well as former chair Mr. Kevin McGovern '74, and the multi-talented Mr. Findlay McIntosh, many Christian Brothers students and faculty/staff have been featured in galleries throughout Sacramento as well as in state and national galleries and museums. What began as a single, full time and a part time art instructor has evolved into three full instructors with a growing need to expand. Genres currently offered include sculpture, ceramics, three-dimensional art, art history, and studio art classes.

Added to the department three years ago was the technological twist that put Christian Brothers' Visual and Performing Arts program on the cutting edge. The infusion of the school's multimedia productions, primarily the school's television studio, launched a new avenue for which Christian Brothers students could express their creative and communication talents. Under the direction of Brother Roch Dufresne FSC, the school's television studio climbed to national recognition and in 2004 received the number one student television broadcast production in the country in just its third year. Former members of the production staff have landed internships in local news affiliates throughout Sacramento and the school's station KBFT remains the only facility of its kind in Northern California. Students are able to write, produce, film, edit and compose the news both on campus and in the surrounding Sacramento region. All broadcasts are aired live three times weekly to the entire school community as well as posted on the school's website for friends and family to view.

These talented students, dedicated faculty, and loyal parents have achieved this remarkable success despite limitations with the school's facilities. The 2004 renovation of the school gymnasium included state of the art sound, lighting, and acoustics to provide an on-campus setting for some performances. In spite of these improvements, The Limeberger Gymnasium is an incomplete solution to the growing needs of this dynamic and growing program. Program growth has also forced the administration to be creative this summer, temporarily converting the faculty lounge into a choir classroom. In 2005, Christian Brothers partnered with The Guild Theatre and St. Paul's Missionary Baptist Church (behind CBHS on 14th St.), both first-class venues in Oak Park for drama and choir programs. Parents and students-alike were pleasantly surprised to learn that Oak Park has a lot more to offer than Christian Brothers High School.

The success of the program has also inspired a support organization of parents and art patrons who formulated the "Friends of the Arts." This program is dedicated to celebrating and supporting Christian Brothers' students and faculty to the blossoming art culture in Sacramento and the surrounding areas.

Christian Brothers is proud to celebrate the success of our talented student artists. We encourage all students, parents, and alumni to come out and enjoy their public events.

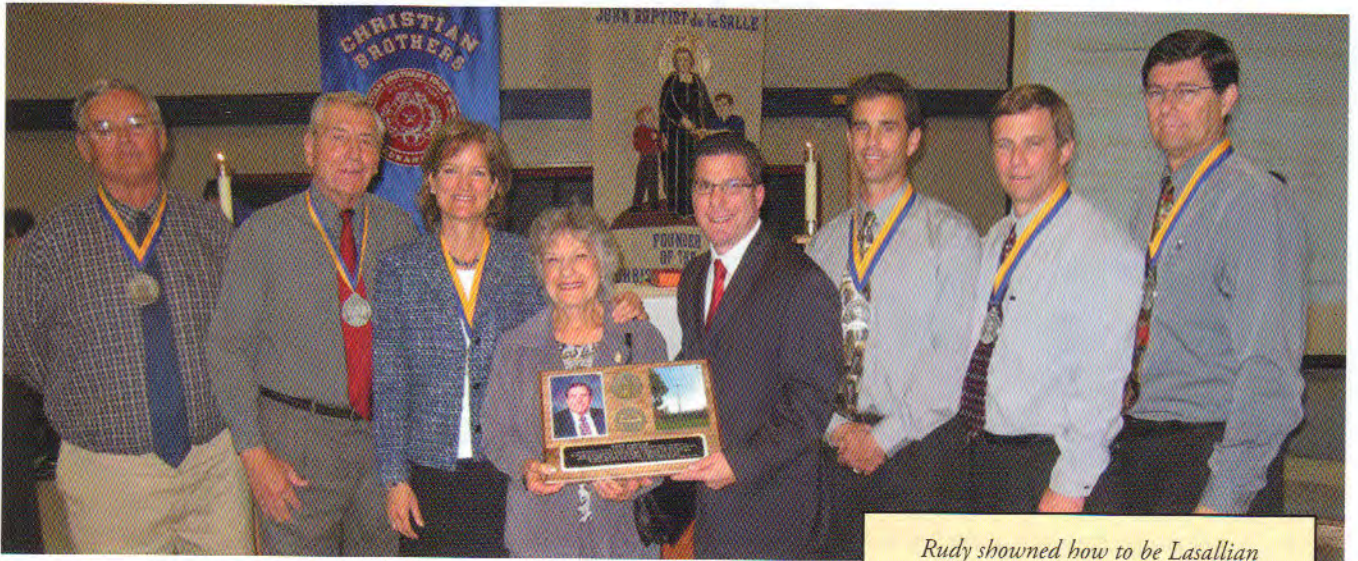
When the current breakfast participants graduate they will join the ranks of alumni who also quietly showed their compassion for those less fortunate through their actions.

Each year since 1991, Christian Brothers High School has recognized one member of the faculty/staff as a model Lasallian educator. Just a few days after graduation, the California Interscholastic Federation (C.I.F.) informed Ryan King that he was selected as the top male scholar athlete in the state. The award, established in 1982, recognizes student athletes who excel in the classroom, in athletics, and who are strong contributors to their schools and communities. Nominations for this prestigious award are received from the 1,372 high schools

that make up the CIF membership. Ryan is the first Sacramentan to earn this distinction. In June, he was honored at the State Capitol.
