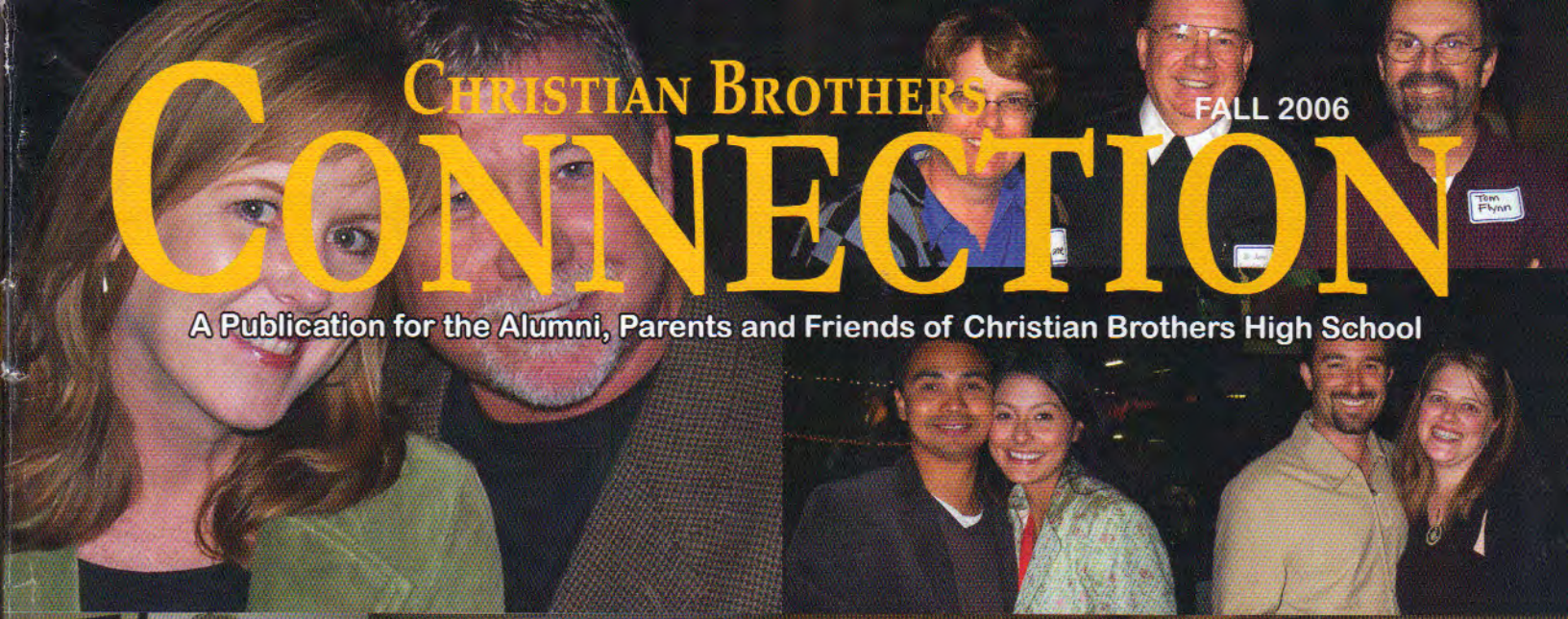

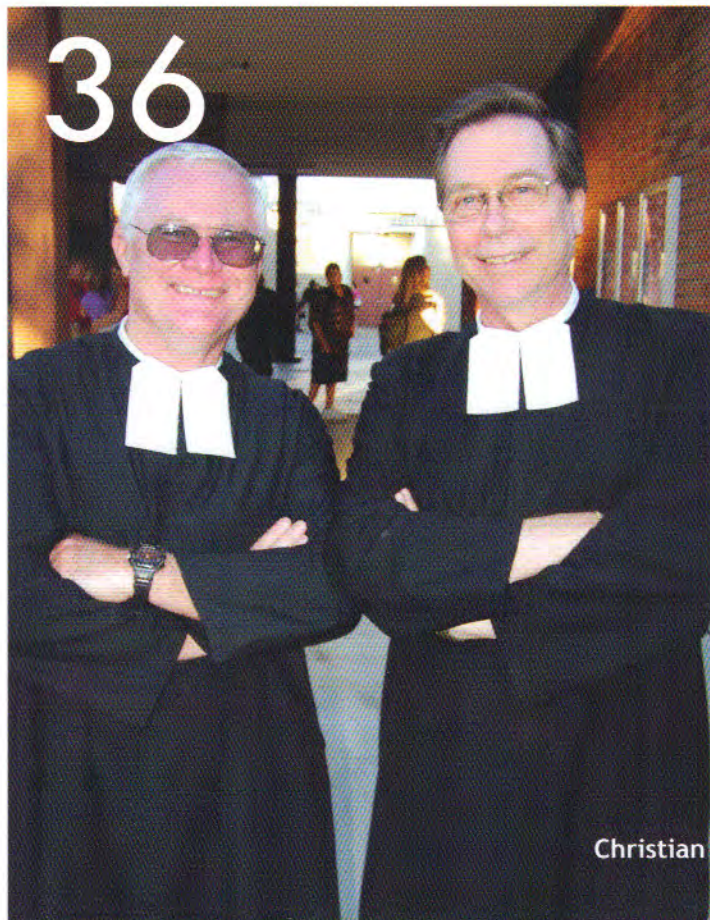

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

There are two seas in Palestine.

One is fresh, and fish are in it. Splashes of green adorn its banks. Trees spread their branches over it and stretch out their thirsty roots to sip of its healing waters.

Along its shores the children play as children played when He was there. He loved it. He could look across its silver surface when He spoke His parables. And on a rolling plain not far away He fed five thousand people.

The River Jordan makes this sea with sparkling water from the hills. So it laughs in the sunshine. And men build their houses near to it, and birds their nests; and every kind of life is happier because it is there.

The River Jordan flows on south into another sea.

Here no splash of fish, no fluttering of leaf, no song of birds, no children's laughter. Travelers choose another route, unless on urgent business. The air hangs heavy above its water, and neither man nor beast nor fowl will drink.

What makes this mighty difference in these neighbor seas? Not the River Jordan. It empties the same good water into both. Not the soil in which they lie; not the country round about.

This is the difference. The Sea of Galilee receives but does not keep the Jordan. For every drop that flows into it another drop flows out. The giving and receiving go on in equal measure.

The other sea is shrewder, hoarding its income. It will not be tempted into any generous impulse. Every drop it gets, it keeps.

The Sea of Galilee gives and lives. The other sea gives nothing. It is named The Dead.

DEAR ALUMNI, PARENTS AND FRIENDS:

The tale “There are Two Seas” has been around since the early part of the 20th century. I use it now to illustrate a central component of our faith: generosity. It is our baptismal calling to share our gifts with others. And it is from generosity that we find the seed of Lasallian education.

Long before he was a saint, John Baptist de La Salle was a priest serving the cathedral in Reims, France. In line to become a bishop, he had no aspirations to create schools. It took a chance encounter with a man named Adrian Nyel, a teacher committed to helping the poor, to get the young priest into the ministry of education. Indeed, it was the hand of God at work. Soon after taking upon Nyel's mission as his own, De La Salle tossed aside his personal ambitions and generously donated his time and treasure to the schooling of the poor. Much like the Sea of Galilee in Barton's story, De La Salle gave all that he could to support others.

Since the beginning of De La Salle's schools in 17th century France, the Christian Brothers have relied on generous benefactors to ensure that a quality Catholic education was available to the young—especially the poor.

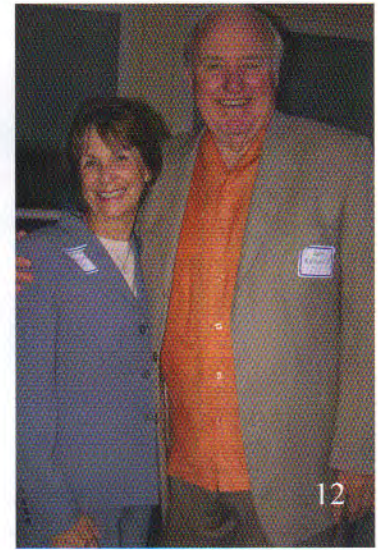
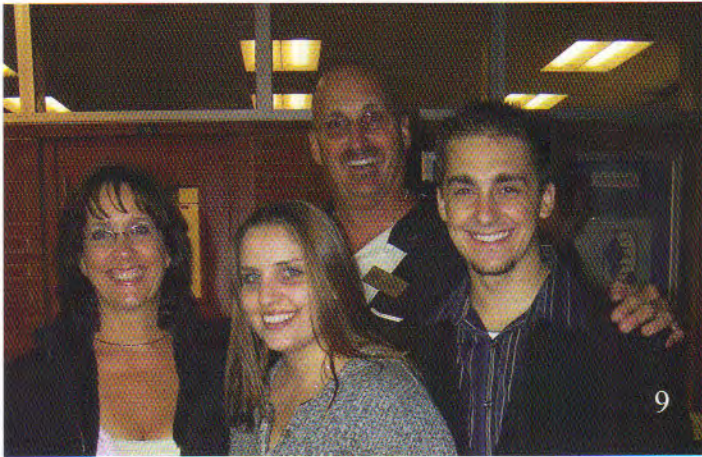
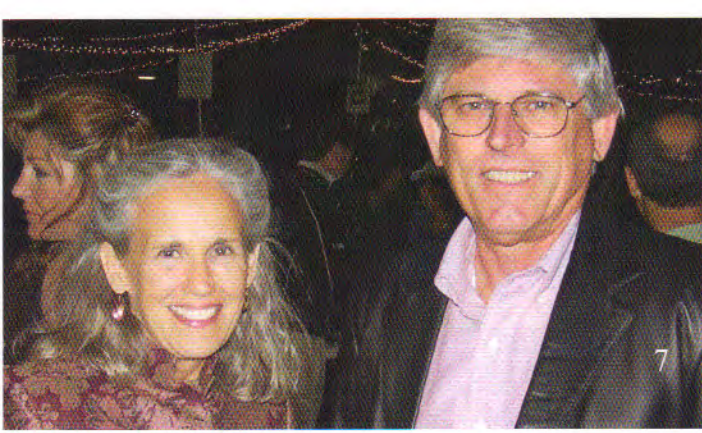
19TH ANNUAL WINE TASTING EXTRAVAGANZA

One of the largest social events in the Sacramento region is also one of the city's most exciting events. The Christian Brothers Wine Tasting Extravaganza draws hundreds from throughout the Sacramento Valley.

Held September 8 and hosted at Christian Brothers' historic Oak Park campus, 1,200 guests were treated to samples from 80 wineries, 25 local restaurants and scores of Sacramento breweries. Organized by the CB Alumni Association and chaired by Simon de Vere White '92 and Mark Madsen '89, the wine tasting raised close to \$50,000 (net).

CB, in My Own Words...

In the 1950's my parents made the decision to send the four Johnston boys through Catholic education in Sacramento. First at All Hallows Elementary School on 13th Avenue and then continuing at Christian Brothers High School on Broadway and Bishop Armstrong on Sacramento Blvd. I was the last of my parents' boys to go through the School then, and now Max is the last of our four boys to go through. I, my brothers, my nephews and now my sons are part of a tradition that my parents began for our family, beginning in the 1950's.

Tradition is something that a family can share with each other, a feeling that current students and alumni can share with each other. It spans many years and many eras. We as a family are proud to have graduated from a high school with 130 year history of teaching young men and women in Sacramento. I think a lot of mothers and fathers ~ like my wife, Jackie, and I ~ and how we all want to start or continue traditions that we see as important, especially family legacies. From only a few schools in Sacramento can one find family legacies: Sacramento High, McClatchy High and (of course) Christian Brothers High School, the oldest continuing teaching institution in Sacramento. When our son William '06 walked down the aisle to graduate at Memorial Auditorium in May he, like his

brothers, cousins and uncles, continued a Johnston family honor. He did not just graduate from high school, he graduated from CB. He became a "Brothers Boy."

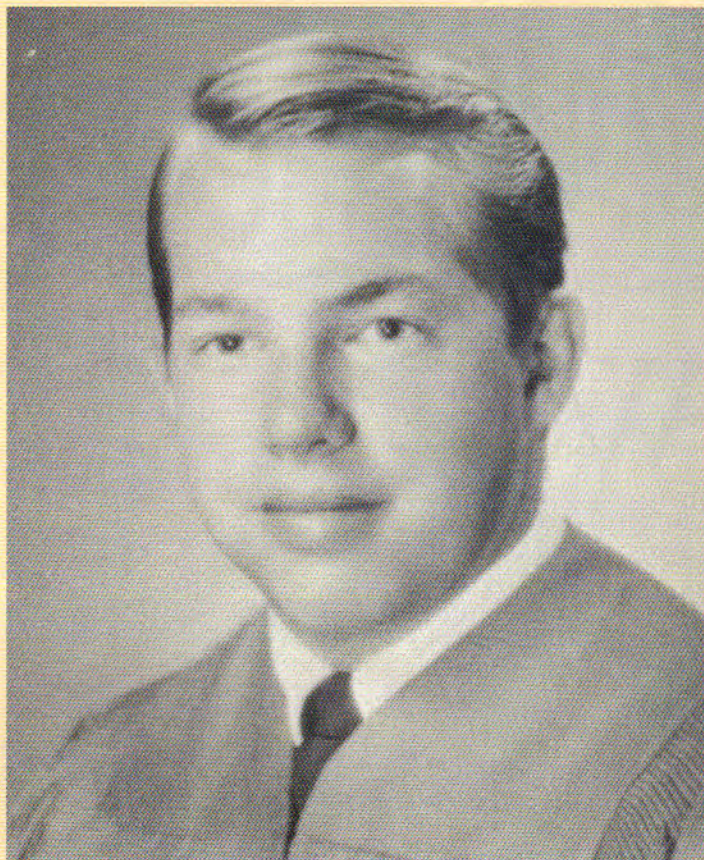

It is a chance to meet our son's new teachers and see if there are any that taught our other sons. We said hello to Mr. English who taught two of our sons history, to Mr. Kirrene '78 who taught two sons English. While sitting in the gym listening to Mr. Bobby Fresques, who also taught our

other sons, I reminisced about Mr. Ron Limeberger '53 who taught us all at one time or another. It is comfortable to have teachers that have stayed at CB enough years to have taught multiple decades of our family. At the same time it is encouraging to meet some of the new teachers coming to CB with fresh ideas and enthusiasm. As a parent it is a satisfying feeling to see the commitment the teachers have to educating our sons and daughters at Christian Brothers.

As a member of the Alumni Board at CB I often look with pride around the school campus. I see a high school that is growing with new up-to-date classrooms

for Science, Math, Technology, Music and Choir. These are state-of-the-art classrooms that my last two sons were able to enjoy. There are improved baseball and softball fields, a resurfaced football field, a remodeled gym and a newly planted quad for all. I see a campus that is being expanded and refined to give the student body great classes to attend and a great place to attend classes. This is not a stagnant campus. This campus is fun and exciting and evolving. I can see the enthusiasm in the faces of the students as they walk from class to class. And just like in his older brothers' faces, Jackie and I see the excitement in our son Max's freshman face as he begins his first year.

Extra curricular activities are plentiful at CB. This is our first son to play football and we went to the first frosh game in early September. It was fun to sit in the bleachers with all the other parents and relatives watching freshman football at our home field on Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard. We felt connected with the school in another aspect: sports. I will admit that I had my alumni hat on and felt proud of "my team" playing on "my home field." I expect to see a lot of alumni this year at the football games and rekindle some of that Falcon Pride we had back in our days during the 60's. Moreover, I hope I can enroll a few more of those alumni who have yet to join the CB Alumni Association and get them connected

Who "owns" Christian

With a history so long and involved as ours I am often asked, "Do the Brothers still own Christian Brothers High School?" People are interested in understanding the relationship between the Brothers, the Board of Trustees, the Diocese of Sacramento, and the school administration. With this article, it is my hope that I can shed some light on how these various groups collaborate to ensure our mission is carried out effectively.

"Ownership" is both temporal and cultural. Temporal ownership involves the practical, worldly responsibilities involved in managing our organization, otherwise called governance. Cultural ownership involves a profound belief in our charism, including our philosophy of education.

The Brothers

For most of our school's history, the Christian Brothers' District of San Francisco (our province) held each of its schools under the umbrella of De La Salle Institute, which acted as a central office for all of the schools. In 1994, the District went through a significant reorganization. Each school within the District was separately incorporated. The Lasallian Education Corporation (L.E.C.) was established, enabling the District to maintain canonical responsibility for, and oversight of, schools while leaving governance and management to local leadership. The L.E.C. is comprised of District leadership and is ultimately our school's legal owner and the legal owner of other Lasallian secondary schools on the west coast.

Christian Brothers High School is currently blessed to have a community of four Christian Brothers who live at the school, three of whom minister full time in the school.

Board of Trustees

At the time of reorganization in 1994, each school within the District established a Board of Trustees comprised of Brothers and lay partners. This method of leadership was consistent with the desire of Vatican II and the Brothers to have more lay involvement in leadership.

The Board of Trustees represents the Brothers, who remain the moral owners of the school. The Board of Trustees focuses on strategic direction, as opposed to administrative detail. It is concerned more with the future than the past or present. It maintains a clear distinction of Board roles and CEO roles. Among its specific responsibilities is to hire and evaluate the President/CEO.

Serving as a Trustee is a voluntary commitment. We are blessed to have ten dedicated trustees comprised of Christian Brothers, alumni, parents of alumni, and other community leaders. Each candidate is required to go through training on the Lasallian Mission and governance model before s/he is presented to the LEC for approval.

Ongoing formation in the Lasallian charism is also a part of each Board meeting. Trustees are formally appointed by LEC upon recommendation of the sitting Trustees. Terms are three years, renewable once. The Board meets approximately eight times a year.

The Diocese of Sacramento

Christian Brothers exists within the Diocese of Sacramento. As a ministry of the Catholic Church, all of our activities canonically fall under the auspices of the Bishop. As mentioned above, however, we are not legally "owned" by the diocese.

Christian Brothers High School?

While we enjoy a strong relationship with the diocese, it is important to note that our governance model makes us different from *diocesan owned* schools, such as St. Francis H.S. and parish grade schools. The diocese has full fiduciary responsibility for those schools. As a *private*, Catholic school, Christian Brothers High School is responsible for our own financial health.

Some of our students do receive tuition assistance through the diocese, in the form of funds established at the diocese. Our faculty and staff are employed by CB, not the diocese.

Faculty, Staff, and Administration

The De La Salle Christian Brothers are leaders in the Catholic Church in training the laity to serve and lead on behalf of the mission as a ministry of the Church. Christian Brothers Sacramento has a strong reputation nationally as having a high degree of faculty and staff participation in Lasallian formation programs. More than half of our faculty and administration have participated in formal Lasallian training or was a graduate of a Lasallian school, a current parent, or a parent of a graduate.

The President-Principal model of school leadership has formally been in place at Christian Brothers for approximately fifteen years. When we adopted the model in the early 1990's, approximately 20% of Catholic high schools employed this model. Today, according to the National Catholic Education Association, this number is approximately 60%. As President, I am hired by – and report to – the Board of Trustees. My role is to ensure that our mission is alive and tangible today and well into the future. In this model of leadership, the day-to-day operations of the school are delegated to our Principal, Mr. Ray Burnell.

Cultural Ownership

Those of us involved with the school today stand proudly on the shoulders of Christian Brothers, alumni, parents, and faculty and staff, who made tremendous sacrifices to create something special over the past 130 years. Today, this dedication remains. There are alumni, faculty and staff, parents, and students who bleed our

school colors. This is cultural ownership.

Being a member of the CB community is a privilege. It takes time, commitment, and sacrifice before one can truly say s/he is a Falcon. Over time, our students will realize that it is their responsibility to uphold the high standards of our school and to pass on our rich tradition. In other words, it is our hope that they will assume cultural ownership.

Divine Ownership

Temporal and cultural ownership are vital to any organization's strength. But we in Catholic schools have a higher calling. In our case, for example, we have to make sure that the Lasallian charism is passed on to successive generations.

A "charism" (Greek for "gift") includes a unique spirituality, a rich history, and special philosophy of education. The charism of St. John Baptist de La Salle is timeless, but it will only thrive if current leadership instills the charism in the hearts of current students. This responsibility is greater than temporal and cultural ownership. It is divine.

The Answer to the Question

Simply put, Christian Brothers High School is owned by the Christian Brothers. But we recognize our structure is unusual and complicated. Regardless of structure, strong schools rely on committed people. Christian Brothers High School is blessed to have committed ownership; temporal, cultural, and divine.

Our owners are faculty and staff who take seriously their responsibility as educational ministers of our Church. Our owners are parents who pay tuition and collaborate with us to provide quality education and moral example to tomorrow's leaders. Our owners are alumni who support the school financially because they understand that their education was subsidized and they feel an obligation to give back. Our owners include Christian Brothers and Trustees who challenge us to be true to the vision of our founder.

And, of course, our owners are our students...those who wear proudly the name "Christian Brothers" and demonstrate ownership by doing their very best to realize their God-given potential.

Campus Improvements

Meeting the Needs of Today's Students

In order to meet the needs of the 21st century high school student, the CB administration authorized significant improvements to some of the school's existing facilities.

Donations have played a significant role in modernizing the campus. If not for the generous contributions of loyal benefactors, many of these necessary renovations would not have been possible.

EAST ANNEX RENOVATION

One of CB's most recent endeavors was the remodel of the east annex building across from the cafeteria. Used largely for storage after the completion of the Science, Math, and Technology (SMAT) Wing in 2001, the east annex was renovated into three modern classrooms, one for science and two for our award-winning music program. Each room is air-conditioned and upgraded, containing state-of-the-art technology like a flat-screen television, overhead digital projectors and high-fidelity recording systems.

MAIN ATHLETIC FIELD

The main athletic field also received a much-needed renovation. The project was generously financed by the La Salle Club, with much of the money raised in honor of famed CB coach Ray Clemons (see page 14), who passed away in December 2005. The original sod was removed and replaced, the field was graded and received a new irrigation system.

MAIN HALLWAY

For years, the main corridor on campus seemed drab and dimly lit—a poor representation of the school. That changed this summer after a complete makeover for the school's most highly traveled hallway. After receiving new paint, new carpet, and a custom chair rail installed by Falcons football Coach Andre Johansen, the walls were decorated with images of our school's most powerful asset: our students. With plans to change the photos every year, the main hallway is now a welcoming place that proudly echoes the of spirit of the campus.

BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL FIELDS

After years of use and wear, the softball and baseball fields were also given a face-lift. The varsity baseball field received a total renovation, receiving a brand new infield, while the JV baseball field saw minor improvements. With funding from the Alumni Association, the school remodeled the softball field, reorienting the home plate closer to the school. The field also received new dugouts and a new backstop.

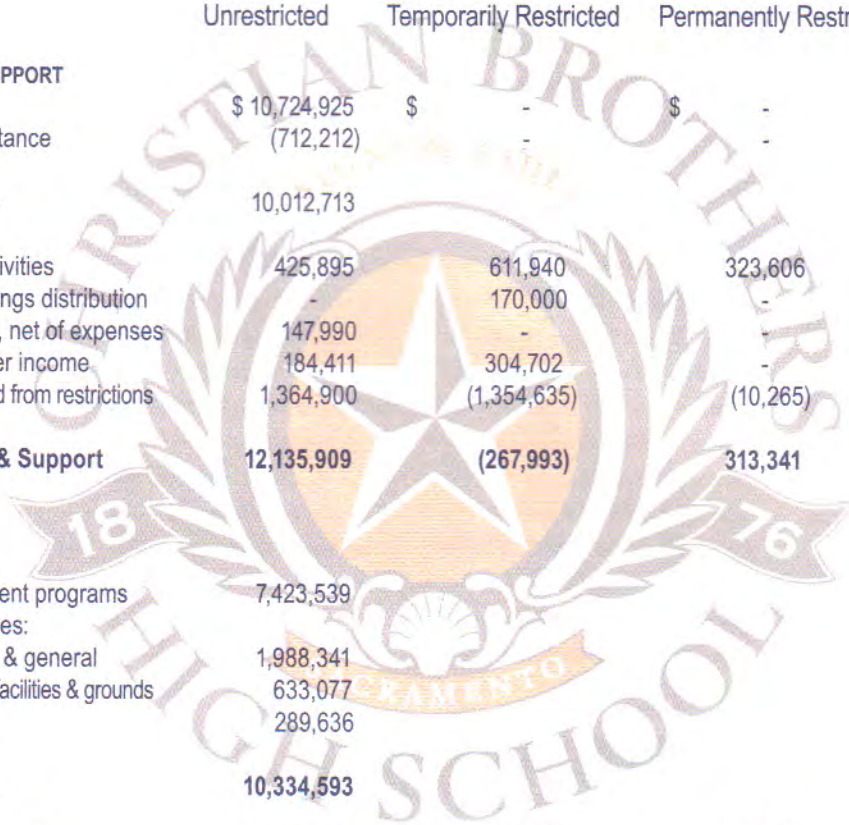

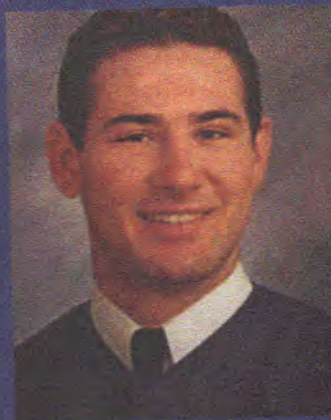
Paying It Forward

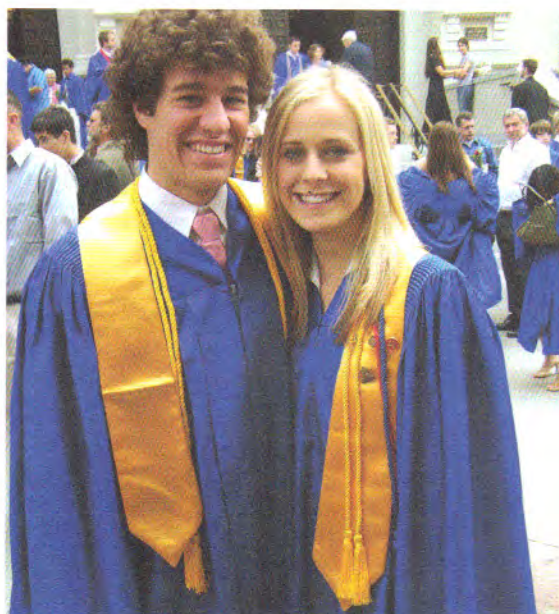

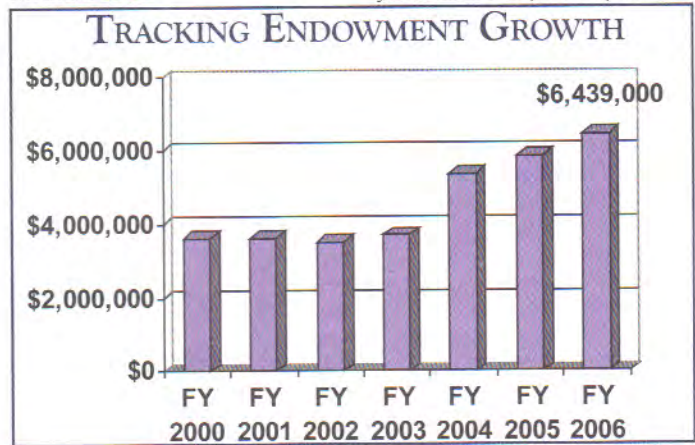

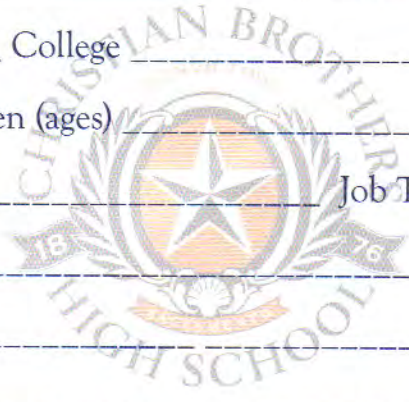

Honoring the La Salle Club and the Clemons Family

For more than sixty years, the La Salle Club has provided financial support to CB's athletic programs. In the past three years, the La Salle Club has contributed more than \$50,000 toward the gym improvement campaign, the purchase of two utility carts, and – most recently – to make major improvements to the main athletic field.

Ray Clemons was a hero to a generation of Christian Brothers' student-athletes. Joining CB as a coach and teacher in 1947, Coach Clemons strengthened the football team and captured the school's first conference championship in 21 seasons.

Upon Coach Clemons' death in December 2005, his family asked that gifts made in Ray's honor be directed to the CB La Salle Club. In collaboration with the school administration, the La Salle Club identified improvements to the main athletic field as an appropriate investment of these gifts and other proceeds of the La Salle Club.

At halftime of the September 30 football game, the La Salle Club and the Clemons family were honored for their years of generosity and loyalty to Christian Brothers High School. Rosemary Clemons, Ray's widow, was presented with a football signed by the 2006 Falcon football team.

Christian Brothers is honored to welcome Brother Christopher Donnelly, FSC and Brother Donald Johanson, FSC to our community. CB has a rich tradition developed by the Brothers' legacy, with many members of the alumni fondly remembering their own days sitting at a desk with a Brother at the head of the class. Although lay educators have increasingly supported their mission over the years, the Brothers' presence is still a vital part of the Christian Brothers experience. These men, who join Brother Thomas Pham, FSC and Brother George Van Grieken, FSC in residence, embody those great qualities to which students and graduates have become accustomed: they are faithful, they are gracious, they are warm and welcoming.

MEET BROTHER CHRISTOPHER DONNELLY, FSC

When first seeing Brother Christopher Donnelly, the first thing that pops out is his smile. Welcoming, hospitable, his gracious smile suddenly turns into a

laugh. He's a joker—it's the kind of personality that puts one at ease. It explains his success as a Brother, as a teacher and a friend.

Born in Oakland, California, Brother Christopher, 56, was one of six children. His father and mother divided the time with their children between homes in the Bay Area and the Sacramento region. The Donnellys also have a family cabin in Dunsmuir.

Catholic education has long been a part of Brother Christopher's life. Spending his winters in Oakland after finishing Catholic elementary school, he attended St. Mary's College High School in Berkeley—his first experience with the Brothers. They made such an impression on the young scholar that he joined the order after graduating from high school.

"While attending St. Mary's College High School the Brothers made a real impact on me," he said. "Their professionalism, dedication, and the care they showed for their students literally changed my life."

After joining the Christian Brothers, Brother Christopher attended St. Mary's College, graduating in 1973 with a Bachelor's Degree in Theology and minors in Math and Humanities. He holds two Master's Degrees: one in theology, the other in school administration; and fitting for a Christian Brother, he also holds a lifetime K-12 teaching credential and an administrative credential.

Since taking on St. John Baptist de La Salle's mission, Brother Chris has traveled all over the Western states, serving at San Joaquin Memorial High School in Fresno; La Salle High School in Pasadena and Milwaukie, Oregon; Justin Sienna High School in Napa; Sacred Heart High School in San Francisco and La Salle High School in Yakima. He has spent close to 40 years of his life serving the educational needs of hundreds—and it's a life he loves.

"There are many touching moments in my years as a Christian Brother, but I find that I am still in awe when I recognize times when God uses me to reach out to a student in need," he said.

Now at CB, Brother Chris teaches math and is the new Director of Facilities. Although he has only been in residence for a few months, he says the school feels like a good fit.

"Christian Brothers is a Christian community of teachers and learners who clearly care about each other," Brother Chris said. "I have seldom seen a school with so many smiling faces! I am impressed with the quality of both teachers and students."

Brother Chris keeps himself busy outside of the classroom, but sticks to his service roots. He is a fire chief in a volunteer fire department at Huntington Lake; he is an EMT, a bonded locksmith and a skilled craftsman. For fun, he is a private pilot (and he is looking for a copilot if someone has a plane he could share.)

MEET BROTHER DONALD JOHANSON, FSC

To look at Brother Donald Johanson, one can see the spirit of the Christian Brothers—affable and courteous, his friendliness goes without saying. Always ready to offer a helping hand or words of advice, he is a man consumed with the well-being of others. Simply put: he cares.

Brother Donald, 60, was born in Colusa, California. Moving to the Bay Area for school, he attended Sacred Heart High School, graduated from San Francisco State College with a B.S. in Mathematics, and eventually earned an M.S. in Computer Science at the University of San Francisco.

Brother Donald began his life with the Brothers teaching at De La Salle High School in Concord. In addition to his work in the classroom, he also spent time working in the Administrative Computer Center and then became the Vocation Director for the Brothers.

Returning to the school that provided him the inspiration for choosing the Brothers' vocation, Brother Donald began teaching at Sacred Heart in 1989. During his tenure there, he served as a math and computer science teacher, Director of Studies, Director of Technology and Director of the Brothers' Community.

In 1998, Rome came calling and Brother Donald went abroad to develop the Brothers' international Web site. While in Rome, he also served as the curator of the Christian Brothers museum, was Director of Technology and co-administrator of the Casa Generalizia.

Brother Donald returned to the states to join Christian Brothers High School. Now the Director of the Brothers' Community and back in front of a math class, he says that CB is a place he is happy to call home.

"Christian Brothers is a great place at every level," Brother Donald said. "The kids are wonderful, the staff and parents are very positive and supportive, and I am enjoying the challenge of returning to teaching after 10 years out of the classroom."

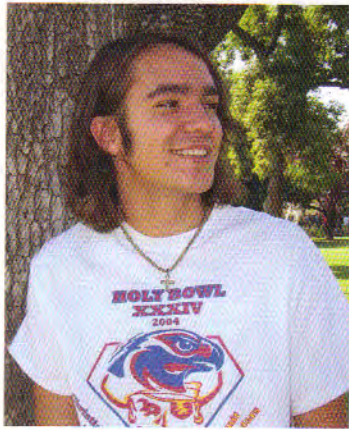

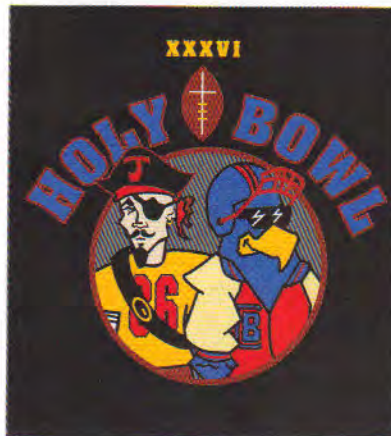
