Message from the President



Dear Alumni, Parents and Friends:

Our 132nd school year is upon us and we've hit the ground running with an outstanding range of courses taught by an incredibly talented and dedicated faculty (read more about some of their summer adventures on page 18). Numerous co-curricular activities are in full-swing including retreats, athletics, drama, community service, choir and band. On September 7, we enjoyed the 20th annual Wine Tasting Extravaganza hosted by our Alumni Association (see page 32) and attended by more than 1,500 alumni and friends of the school.

All of these activities take place against the backdrop of our 50-year-old campus in the heart of the Oak Park neighborhood. While Oak Park has seen its share of challenges, I'm pleased to say that *Sacramento Magazine* designated the area as "The Up and Comer" in its March 2007 issue. Pointing to its abundance of architectural jewels, tremendous concentration of churches, burgeoning visual and performing arts scene, surge in home ownership and energetic citizens, the magazine says the neighborhood is in the "midst of a major comeback." In its October 12, 2007 edition, the *Sacramento Bee* says that Oak Park may become the next Midtown.

It is also, without a doubt, the place where we want, and are called by our mission as a Lasallian school, to be. Our distinct location provides students and faculty with opportunities to engage in meaningful community service. Through the years, we have built a significant relationship with Oak Ridge Elementary School, the public school located just two doors down from CB. Sadly, 95 percent of the students at Oak Ridge qualify for free, or reduced-price lunch and 54 percent are struggling to learn English. Each day, at least 70 CB students visit Oak Ridge Elementary School as tutors. Each week, 62 students spend time acting as Big Brothers (see page 7). Every Friday, students meet in the campus kitchen and prepare pancakes and eggs for the women visiting the Wellspring Women's Center – a drop-in center for women and their children. Each Sunday, students join together to work at the Sacramento Food Bank. We also act as good neighbors participating the monthly neighborhood clean-up days at various locations throughout the community.

These experiences undoubtedly enrich the lives of the recipients. But, more so, give our students the chance to experience first-hand the joy and satisfaction that come so readily when helping others. *Enter to Learn. Leave to Serve.* That is not just our school motto, but a way of life.

In the early 1990's there was talk of moving CB. School leaders wisely understood that our mission calls us to be in this area and we are steadfastly committed to remaining in Oak Park. Just as exciting changes and developments are ahead for the Oak Park community, I see exciting changes and developments ahead for the school. I look forward to sharing those with you in future issues of *Connection*.

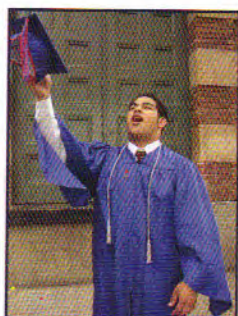

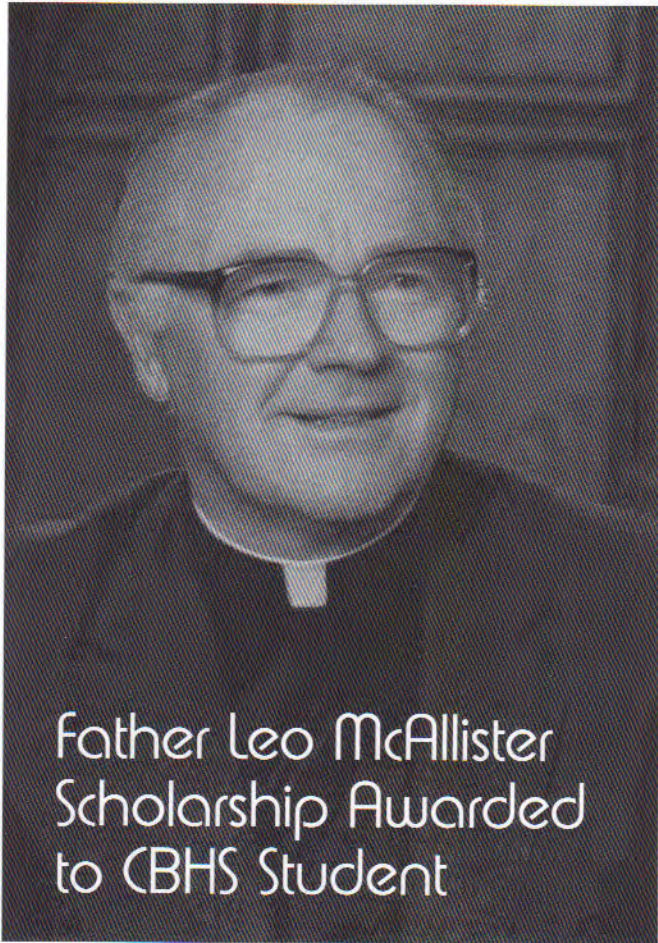

Good Things Happening at CBHS



Father Leo McAllister
Scholarship Awarded
to CBHS Student

Father Leo McAllister loved people, all people. In return, he was loved and admired by the many people whose lives he touched in his 51 years as a priest in the Diocese of Sacramento. When he passed away in 2005, his longtime friends and supporters decided to honor his memory by championing a cause that was closest to his heart, Catholic education for the poor. They rallied together to establish an endowment that would allow underprivileged young people to attend the area's Catholic high schools.

The 2007-08 school year marks the first time a student will be attending Christian Brothers High School with tuition and fees (\$11,025) provided by the Father Leo McAllister Scholarship Fund.

"I did not have the pleasure of knowing Fr. Leo. But, in a sense I have gotten to know him well through the passionate commitment of his friends," says CB President Lorcan Barnes. "We are honored to connect their philanthropy with our mission."

CB Earns Top Accreditation

After more than 18 months of planning and preparation, followed by an intensive on-site audit, Christian Brothers High School was honored in being awarded the highest rating of accreditation by both the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the Western Catholic Education Association (WCEA).

In granting CB a full six-year accreditation, WASC/WCEA affirmed that CBHS is "highly effective as a trustworthy, college preparatory, Catholic institution of learning," explains Principal Raymond Burnell. "Also, the school supports high achievement for all students through its organization for student learning, curriculum and instruction, support for student spiritual, personal and academic growth, and long range action plans."



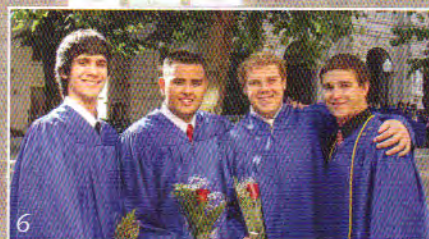
131st Commencement

The illustrious ranks of CBHS alumni increased by 259 young men and women as the school celebrated its 131st commencement on Friday, May 25. The warm spring morning began with Baccalaureate Mass at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament officiated by the Most Reverend Bishop Richard J. Garcia who traveled all the way from his new home in Monterey. Following the mass, graduates enjoyed a luncheon at the school and celebrated their Commencement Exercises that evening at the Memorial Auditorium.

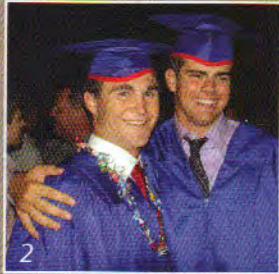
The event, a mix of laughter, tears and cheers proved to be the ideal ending to four years of hard work and special memories. Senior Class President Jessica Lam (U.C. Davis) served as master of ceremonies. Student Body President Javier Plasencia (Columbia University) provided the Salutatory Address with Anne Winslow (Stanford) serving as Valedictorian.

Out of the 259 graduates, 73% are attending four-year colleges; 26% are attending two-year colleges, one is studying abroad, and one is yet to decide.

"I'm so incredibly proud of all of this year's graduates," explains CBHS President Lorcan Barnes. "As this commencement celebration marks a new chapter in their lives, I look forward to seeing the many ways in which they will go out show the world what it means to be a Christian Brothers graduate."

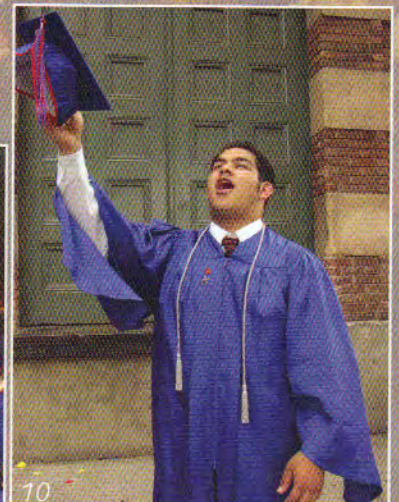
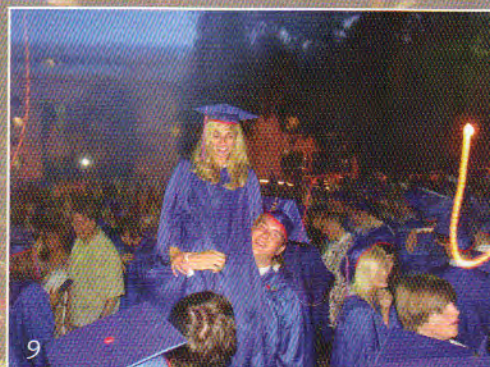

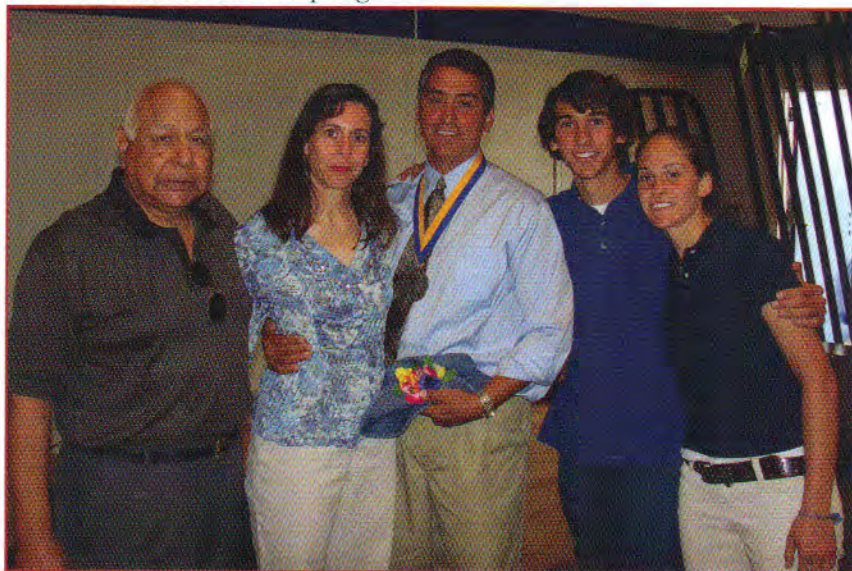


Technology Advances Language Study

Thanks to the generosity of 52 families and friends at last year's auction, CB now joins the ranks of Boston, Fordham, and Johns Hopkins Universities in providing our students with the state-of-the-art, award-winning language software Tell Me More.[®] The software supports all three of the languages taught at Christian Brothers and centers on developing the specific skills needed to succeed in learning a language including: reading, writing, listening, speaking, vocabulary, grammar and culture. This software offers more hours of content, in a wider variety of activities and skill levels, than any other program available. It is available to all students before and after school and to individual classes on a rotating basis. Our foreign language students tell us that the programs greatly enhance our foreign language curriculum.

Danny Delgado '79 Named CB's Lasallian Educator of the Year

Thunderous applause greeted President Lorcan Barnes' announcement that Danny Delgado '79 was selected as CB's 2006-07 Lasallian Educator of the Year by the administrators and faculty of the CBHS. 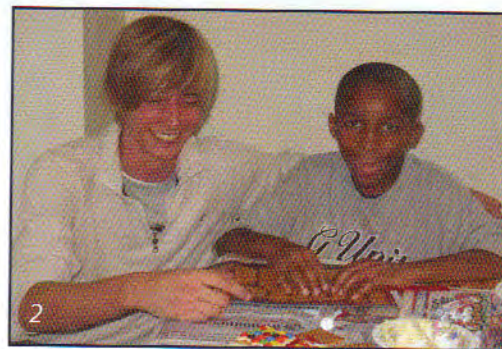
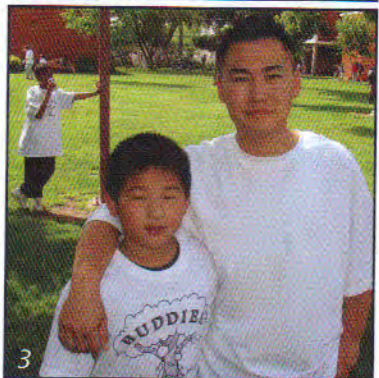
Students & Faculty Excel in Biotechnology



Congratulations to biotechnology students Cyle Zezotarski '07, Meghann Danley '07, Kate Collins '08, and Lauren Lahey '07 whose biotechnology project called Fashion Farm was designated in the top 10 percent of projects submitted from schools throughout the nation to the Toshiba/NSTA Exploravision contest. Their project examined the idea of providing another source for purchasing furs of endangered species by genetically engineering cows to produce the fur of the endangered species. Their teacher, Nicole Brousseau, was one of only 80 teachers nationwide designated as a Biotechnology Teacher-Leader by the Biotechnology Institute. Her enthusiasm and expertise inspire her students to create interesting, forward-thinking projects that are definitely noteworthy and among the best in the country.

Seven years ago, Rose Ann Holmes' leadership class came up with an idea to model love, friendship and responsibility to the students of Oak Ridge Elementary School. Located less than one block from CB, students at the school know all too well the challenges of poverty. Sadly, 93 percent qualify for free or reduced price lunch and 57 percent are struggling just to learn English. "They did not want to tutor the students, or make this something that the kids would have to work to be a part of," explains Holmes. "They just wanted to be buddies."

And so was born the CBHS "Big Brothers" program. Every week, CB students meet with their Oak Ridge buddy and spend time playing games, talking and most of all, being a consistent and caring friend to the kids.

This year, 62 CB students are participating in the program. "In addition to the weekly meetings, we have some type of celebration with the buddies once each quarter," says Holmes. We've had holiday parties, ice cream socials, and forged some really wonderful friendships throughout the years."

The Class of '07 Rallies to Help a Community in Need

The CBHS class of 2007 had 25 other senior students in their hearts and on their minds this spring—the graduating class of Greensburg High School in Kansas. On May 4, an F5 tornado destroyed most of the town, including the high school. Knowing how much they looked forward to their own graduation, the class of 2007 rallied together and raised more than \$2,800 for their fellow graduates.

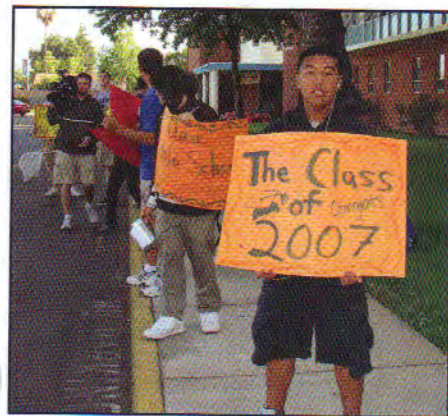
"We were sitting in Ms. Whitson's e-set literature class and she was telling us about the tornado. As we were talking, the idea just grew and we knew we had to raise money to help them," explained Daniel Cagley '07.

The students began collecting money during lunches and even came to school early to collect money from parents dropping off their students.

"I can't imagine being so close to graduation and suddenly having nothing," said Jessica Bryant '07. "We worked hard for four years and to have that taken away would be awful."

"We wanted to make sure that the Greensburg students would have a graduation as memorable as ours," explained Cagley. "Every teenager who has worked hard for four years deserves that."

"The gift from Christian Brothers was a wonderful, wonderful gesture," said Greg Soelter, a Rotary Club member from Ulysses, Kan., who helped coordinate donations for the Greensburg seniors. "More than 1,500 people attended the Greensburg graduation. There were a lot of tears and cheers when they announced the school would be rebuilt."



Jerry Keating '41— A True Brothers'

When Jerry Keating graduated from CBS in 1941, "The world was a different place," he says. "You have to remember when we were in school; there was enormous concern about the build up to war." In fact, Pearl Harbor was attacked just six short months after his graduation. By then, Keating had begun working his way through college. Unfortunately, his education would have to wait.

"I joined the army in 1942," he says. "Two of my three brothers had already enlisted. When my father found out, he was outraged. No man should have to risk losing three of his sons to war." Against his father's wishes, Keating went on to serve three years as a ground soldier in the South Pacific and 10 more in the reserves. Fortunately, all of the Keating boys made it home safely. Not all of Keating's classmates were so lucky. "A few of us did not come home."

Following his return, Keating was anxious to get back to college. This time, he earned his Bachelor's degree at U.C. Berkeley. "My background at Christian Brothers in the sciences and English were critical to my success in getting through those classes," remembers Keating. He then went on to earn a Master's degree at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

As an engineer, his professional successes have been many. Keating spent 24 years with Aerojet-General Corporation where he directed the engineering efforts on a number of critical projects. He served as president of SKS Die Casting and Machining for 29 years and built it up to be a thriving domestic and international business with employees in Alameda, California and in China. Though he has since turned the company over to his son, Sean, Keating continues to act as vice president. "Sean is the boss now," laughs Keating. "I'm lucky he's decided to keep me on."

"Jerry is an extremely remarkable and dedicated person," offers CBHS classmate Stan Gilliam '41. "He's been married 58 years, has a large family, and has built an industry. Through it all, he has always remained loyal to the Brothers."

Keating and his wife Lenore married in 1949 and together have raised eight children, seven of whom are sons. With his strong faith and deep, abiding belief in Lasallian education, Keating made sure that each of his sons attended Catholic schools. "Three of the boys went to Christian Brothers. Three attended Mater Dei in Sana Ana and my youngest son, Christopher, went to St. Mary's College High School in Berkeley.

"I've seen the results of the Lasallian educational tradition both in myself, my kids, and in many, many others," says Keating. "The thing that makes it unique is the fact that it is a complete education. The kids develop academically, but, there is also the spiritual, social and moral development that is stressed as well. It's so important that we provide that to young people in their teen years."

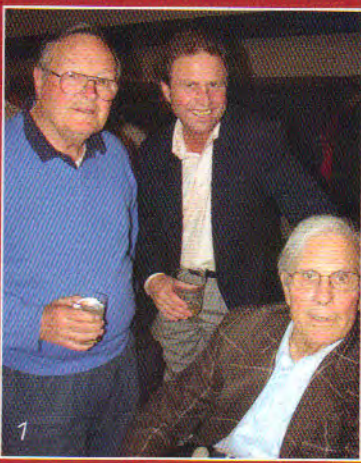
Ensuring that education is available to all young people is a priority for Keating. He is a benefactor to both Christian Brothers and St. Mary's College High School. He has worked closely with the Brothers at the Province and served as a longtime Regent and chairperson of the Board of Trustees at St. Mary's College High School.

For his many years of faith, dedication and extraordinary service, Keating was honored with the special designation as an Affiliated Brother for the Christian Schools (AFSC) in 1999. "This really is the highest honor and greatest expression of appreciation that we can extend," explains Brother George Van Grieken, FSC. "Very few people are given that distinction. In fact, in our entire District, there are only 10."

"Being named an Affiliate means a lot to me and I am so honored," says Keating.

"Jerry Keating is an all-around good guy," says Gilliam. "And, since his house is on the hill in Moraga, he's one of the luckiest, because he gets to wake up each morning to the bells of St. Mary's College."

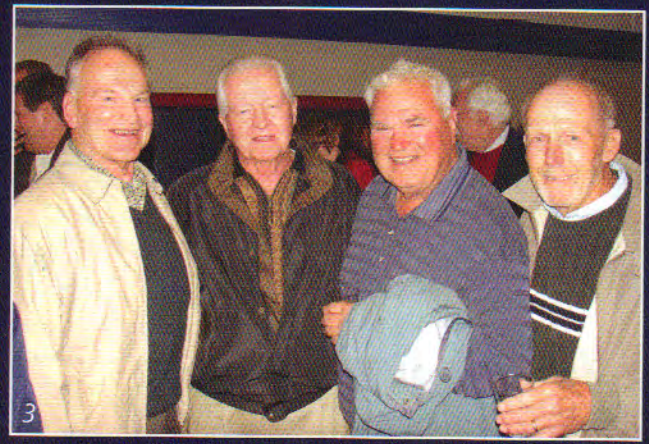

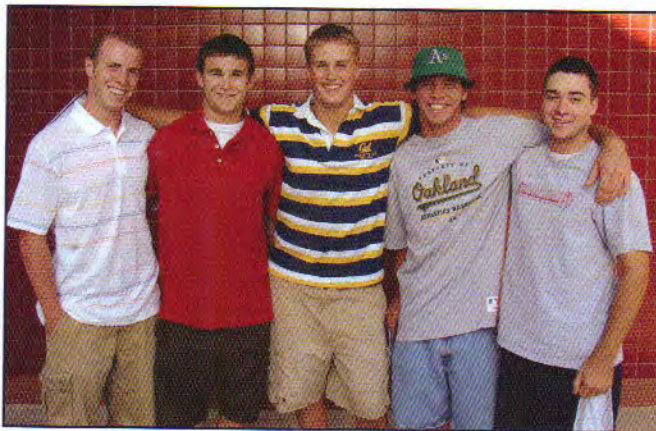
Falcons' Sports Coverage Goes Online

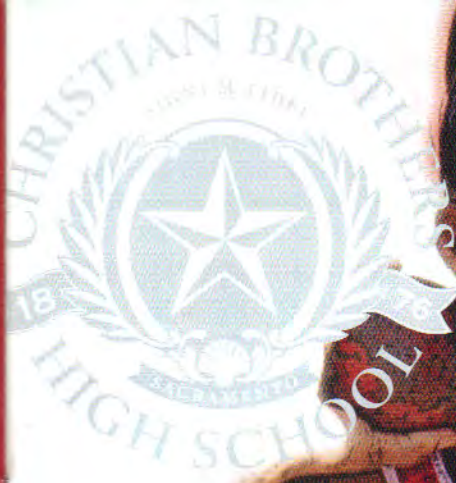
Cal-Hi Sports Names Henning '07 to All-State Team

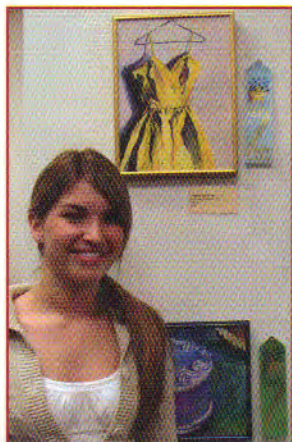

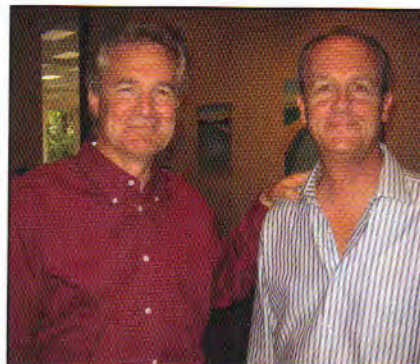

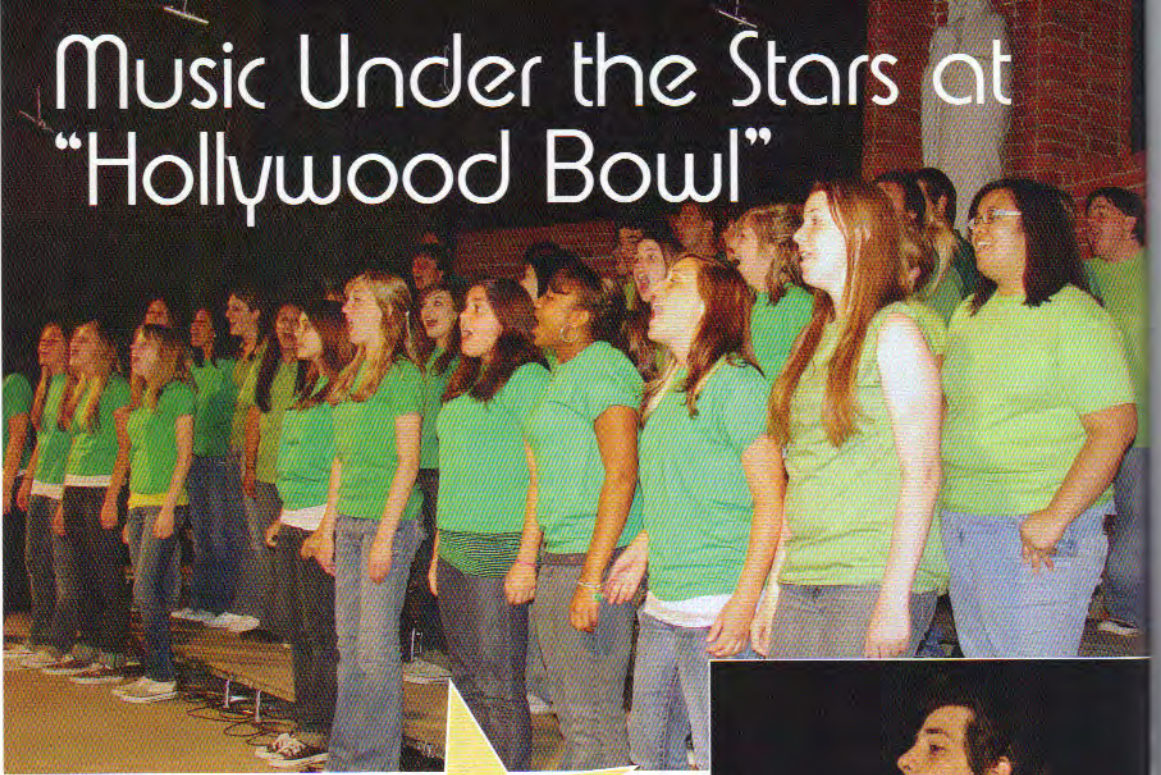
Senior Video Students Bring Home the Gold, Silver & Bronze



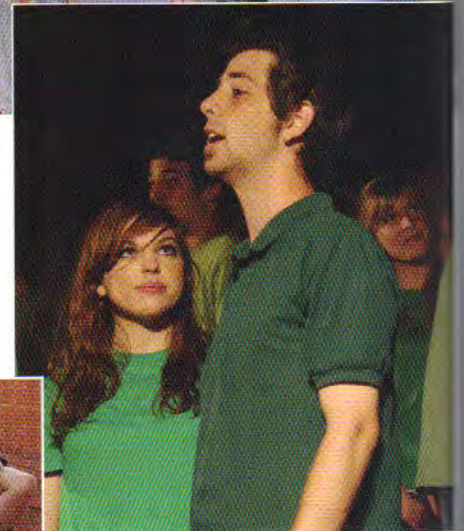

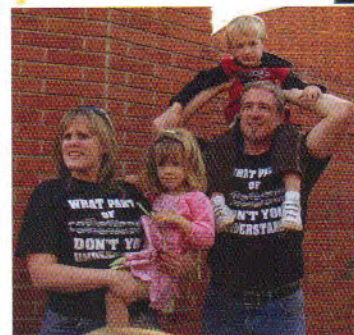

Celebrates Final Vows

*"And, I know that
God is going to take care
of the rest!"*

When Tho (his Vietnamese name) Pham moved to the United States from Vietnam 12 years ago, he spoke virtually no English and, in his own words, was "scared to death." Fortunately, the promise of a better future far outweighed his trepidation; so together with his parents and four of his six siblings, Pham left Vietnam and settled with his family in San Jose.

"The government in Vietnam controlled everything," explains Br. Thomas. "My parents wanted a better future for their children and that meant moving to America."

Upon arriving in San Jose, he quickly got involved in working at the La Salle Vietnam House/De La Salle Chapel in San Jose which serves the Vietnamese community. "I taught Catechism and led the choir during Sunday Mass," says Br. Thomas. "I really loved teaching and working with the kids."

Although he had not really considered becoming a Brother, encouraging words from Br. Joseph Hiep, FSC helped Pham begin the journey. "He encouraged me to go to Napa for the Postulancy Program," explains Br. Thomas. "I was really nervous because I didn't know very much English. But, I went and spent a year interacting with the Brothers, learning about God and St. John Baptist de La Salle, and tutoring kids. Every day, Br. Joseph would call me and remind me to take one step at a time, and that God would take care of the rest."

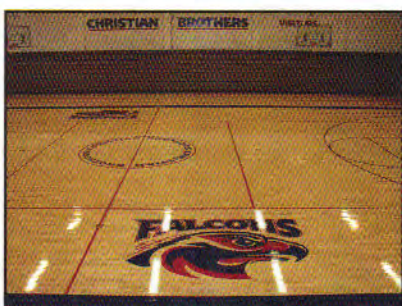
Following the year in Napa, he felt a calling to begin the Novitiate Program which is an in-depth year of prayer, community life, studying, learning and living the rules and expectations of Brother. At the end of the Novitiate year, Br. Thomas took the first, of what for him would become for him, seven annual vows and began to live and serve as a Brother in temporary profession. Each subsequent year, he reaffirmed the vow while serving as teacher and Brother at several Lasallian schools including St. Joseph's in Washington, De Marillac Academy in San Francisco, and the past four years at CBHS.

On Saturday, September 1, with his family, friends and numerous members of the De La Salle Christian Brothers community looking on, Br. Thomas, Br. Joe Kirk, FSC, and Br. David Caretti, FSC, celebrated their final vows at the beautiful chapel at St. Mary's College in Moraga.

"The Eucharistic Liturgy, the pronouncing of the vows themselves, and the subsequent celebration all witnessed to the fact that here were three young men who have found their vocation in life. And that is indeed a joyful occasion. Might we all discover, celebrate, and share the unique vocation through which God becomes present within ourselves and to those around us," explains Director of Vocation Ministry, Br. George Van Grieken, FSC.

"I was nervous but ready to make this final commitment," says Brother Pham. "And, I know that God is going to take care of the rest!"

Campus Improvements



While former students might romanticize the memory of suffering through the late spring days in Brother Colin's social studies class, and the students of today enjoy "hot" day schedule which ends the school day 45 minutes early, there is no getting past the fact that keeping temperatures cool on hot days allows for more productive learning time.

To that end, CBHS embarked on the first phase of adding air conditioning to the original wing of the school. The original, single-paned windows in the upstairs classrooms were replaced with dual-paned, energy-efficient windows over the Easter break. When school concluded in May, the duct work and air conditioning units were installed and the ceilings were lowered. The creative process helped contain costs while allowing for the much-needed improvements. In the spring, work commences on the downstairs classrooms. The estimated cost of the air conditioning project is between \$1.5 and \$2 million.

Gym floor

Fifty years of wear and tear worsened by latent water damage from the unfortunate flooding three years ago caused the gym floor to begin cracking, buckling and developing dead spots. By the end of basketball season, it was clear that a new floor was needed. Fortunately, because some of the damage was incurred in the flood, insurance would cover a portion of the replacement.

In late May, craftsmen removed the old floor and discovered that the entire sub-floor was in bad condition and also needed to be re-done. Workers then began the labor-intensive task of removing all of the wooden supports, pouring concrete, installing and painting the floor.

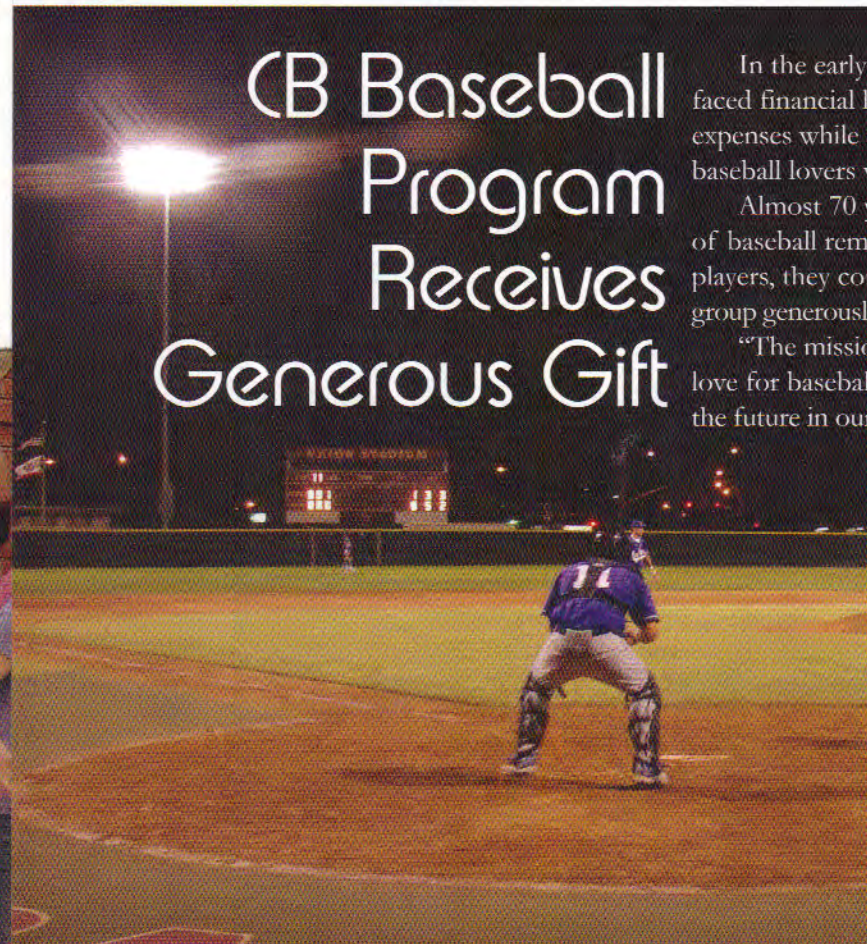
Three months later, just in time for the Red and Blue Scrimmage (the official kick-off for our fall sports), the new floor was freshly painted, polished and ready for the women's volleyball team. The total cost of replacing the gym floor was \$216,000.

CB Baseball Program Receives Generous Gift

In the early days of minor league baseball in Sacramento, injured players faced financial hardships without paychecks or healthcare plans to help with expenses while they recovered. Enter the Sacramento Bushers, a group of local baseball lovers who joined together in the late '30's to raise money to help.

Although they no longer raise money for injured players, they continue their efforts to support local baseball. In that spirit, the group generously presented a check for \$12,000 to support CB's baseball program.

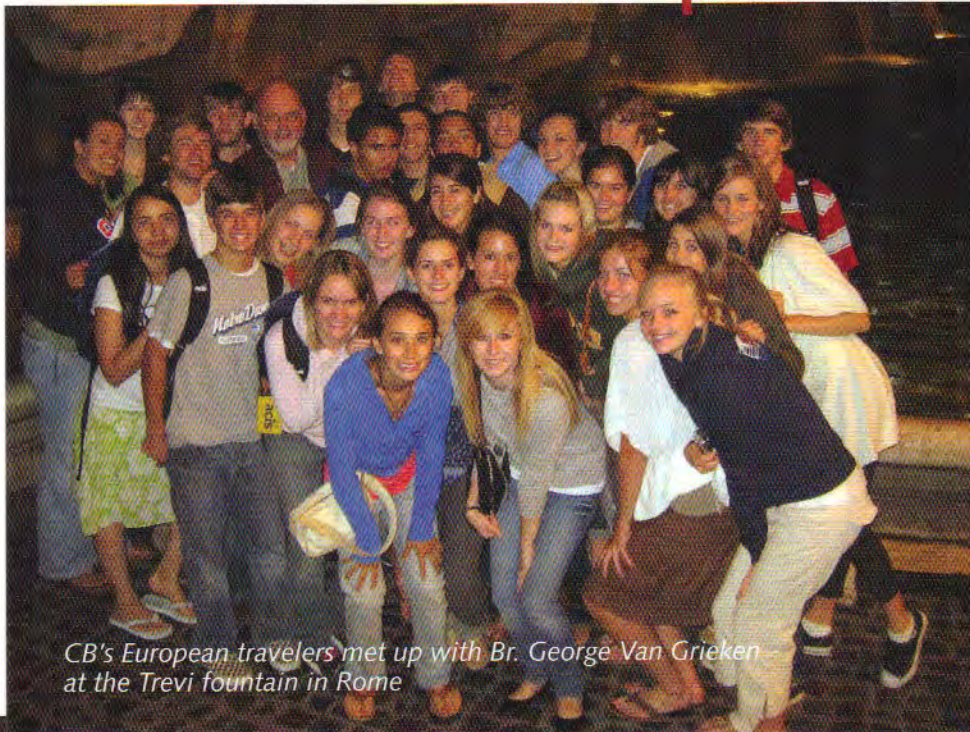

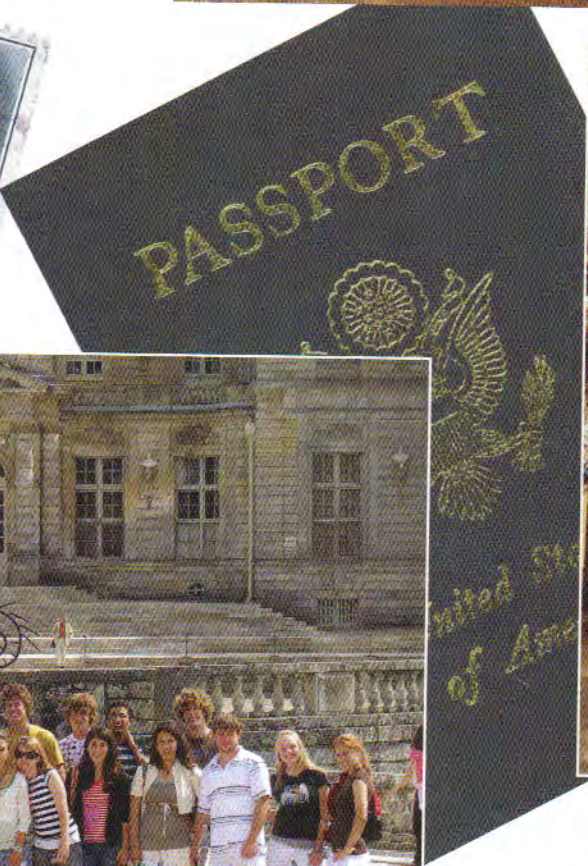
