# CBHS Celebrates 133<sup>rd</sup> Commencement

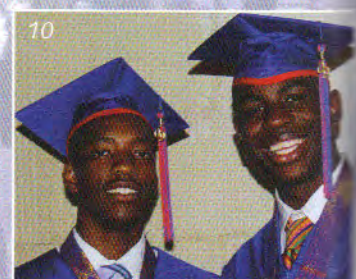
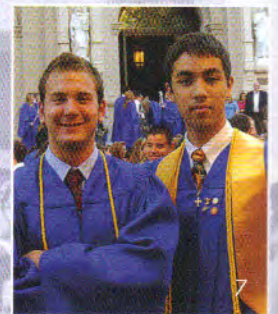
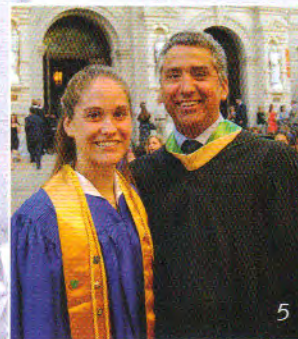

# Technology in the Classroom



Teenagers today live in a world surrounded by technology - the internet, cell phones, Mp3 players, text messaging, instant messaging, etc. Their ability to multitask and embrace new technologies has

changed the way they learn and, in turn, ultimately changes the way teachers teach. Integrating technology into CB's classrooms and enhancing the learning environment are priorities embraced by every educational department in the school.

"Phase I of the Building on the Tradition campaign (1999-2001) really set in motion the technological transformation of our campus," explains CB Systems Support Manager, Todd Miller. "The success of that campaign allowed us to begin the process of upgrading and expanding our data infrastructure into existing classrooms and it also brought us the science, math and technology wing (SMAT)."

## Science Classrooms

The addition of the SMAT wing truly brought Christian Brothers High School into the 21st century with state-of-the-art technology and equipment. Students in physics classes can collect data in real-time thanks to the computers and

software programs installed at every workstation. Chemistry students can record their data and create graphs while they are conducting experiments.

This year, physics teacher, Kevin Van den Bogart stopped using a traditional text book and transitioned to an interactive program students install on their home computers. For students whose access to home computers is limited, there are ten computers in the classroom and twelve in the library that are loaded with the same program.

"It really expands the learning opportunities for the student beyond what they can get in a traditional text book with carefully created animation clips that demonstrate the principles we are studying," explains Van den Bogart. "Forces in motion take on a whole new dimension when the students can see a visual, moving example come to life on the screen."

Biotechnology students in Nicole Brousseau's class become well versed in the art of web site construction as they research, design and build web sites. Each year, their efforts garner local and national awards for the ideas and sites the students create.

"The technology we are using really enhances the science experience for the student," explains Brousseau. "Our classes are more interactive and the students are actively engaged in the process of learning."







## Math Classes

Karen Perone's math classes can view the day's lecture notes online thanks to Smart technology that transfers everything she

writes on the board into files that are available on line to students.

"It's great because it allows the students to focus on the lecture, and not worry about taking notes," says Perone. "Also, if a student is absent, he/she can look up the notes for the class he/she missed and it helps him/her to catch up."

## Foreign Language Learning

Thanks to the generosity of attendees at the 2007 auction, CB joined the ranks of Boston, Fordham and Johns Hopkins Universities in providing students with the state-of-the-art, award winning language software Tell Me More.® The software supports the languages taught at CB (French, Spanish and German) and centers on developing the specific skills needed to succeed in learning a language including reading, writing, listening, speaking, vocabulary, grammar and culture.

"The program exposes students to a wide variety of vocabulary; both conversational and formal," offers French teacher Patti Gallagher.

They can listen to a variety of speakers (male, female, young, old), with different accents and varying dialects. And, the program contains a myriad of activities to keep them enthused - listening, speaking, writing and reading. The students love to hear how they sound in direct correlation to the native speaker.

There are patterns to see and hear and a green bar that MEASURES their accuracy...they get so excited when they reach the highest level of mastery in pronunciation."

To support the program, the school's expanded Technology Center includes 30 computers containing the Tell Me More® programs. Further, students enrolling in the Students Achieving Greater Educational Success (SAGES) program have access to technology that helps as they develop their silent reading fluency and comprehension.

## Social Studies

Minh Nguyen's world history classes benefit from his love of Smart® technology. Class may begin with a Google Earth image. Using a Smart® Board, an interactive chalk board of sorts, teachers have access many forms of modern media. With a fingertip, teachers and students can control computer applications, write notes, pull up charts and images, search the internet, show videos, save lessons and in-class work.

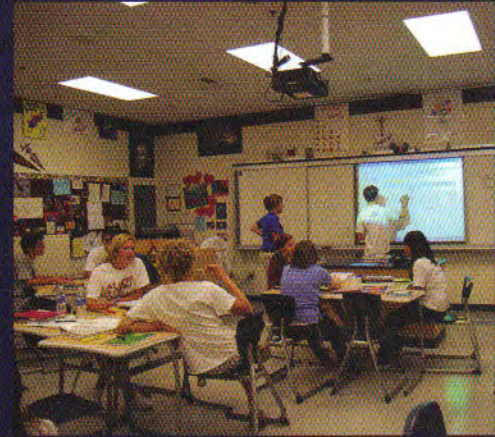
"It really allows teachers to interact with students in their modern media forms whether through video, the internet or a variety of other interactive visual forums," explains Nguyen. "It enhances the curriculum, but, does not negate the importance of quality teaching."

## Religious Studies

Students in Chris Symkowick-Rose's comparative religion classes benefit from interactive presentations that include Power Point slide shows, videos and music. An exploration of Judaism or Islam might include traditional music, photos from the region, suffused with facts about the religions.

"What I try to do is create presentations that spark student interest and assist me in conveying information in a format that appeals to them," says Symkowick-Rose.

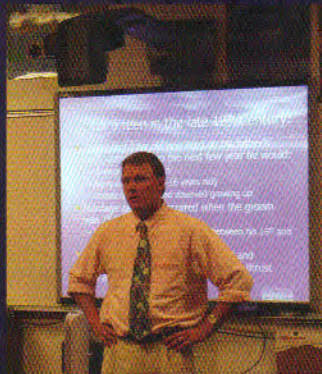
"In the future, as we expand the technology throughout the campus, I look forward to collaborating with other teachers in building lessons that capitalize on all of our area's of interest and expertise."



## Library

The school's library has been reconfigured to include 30 computer stations that serve as a tech-media research center supporting all academic classes. Students utilize the center for research, homework, study hall and more.

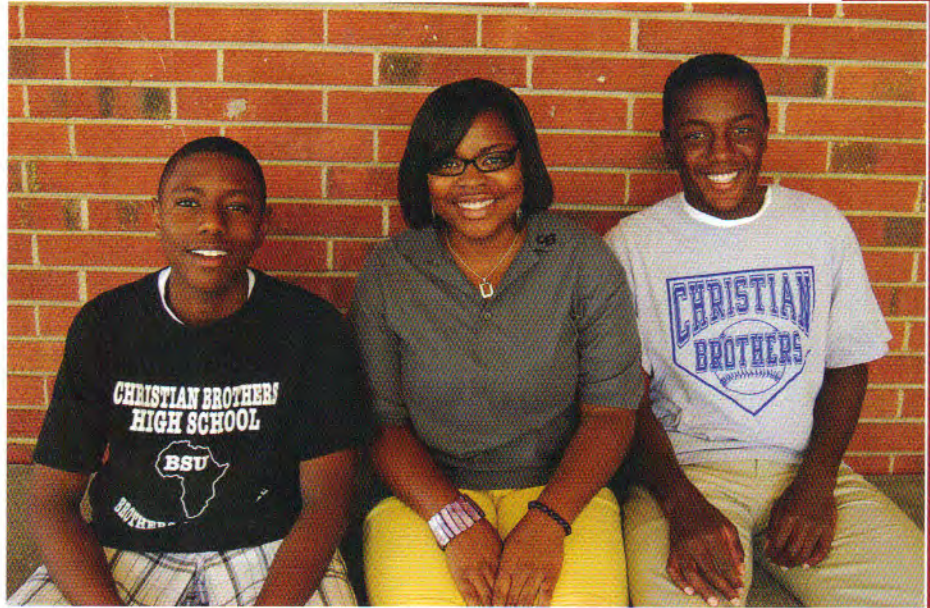
"When we reflect on our mission as Lasallian educators, there is a centuries' long tradition of meeting students where they are and taking them to the next level," explains Principal Raymond Burnell. "Integrating technology into our classrooms is a modern-day way of doing just that. Learning with technology is a vital 21st century skill that allows us to grasp the power, possibilities and limitations of technology in our lives. When I see some of many ways our teachers utilize technology, I often find myself wishing that I could be a student again."



# Three CB Sophomores Spend Summer Attending College

This summer, 36 bright, motivated high school sophomores participated in one of two challenging six-week college-level courses through the Telluride Association Sophomore Seminar (TASS). Of the 36, three are members of the CBHS Class of 2011.

Joseph Hill '11 and Aijalon Range '11 studied "Health and Illness in the African-American Community; Social and Neurobiological Perspectives" at Indiana University, Bloomington. Samuel Wallace '11 studied "Imaging Race in Literature and Visual Culture" at the University of Michigan.

Each day, the students attended a three-hour seminar, which typically included discussions, small-group work, lectures by university faculty and other activities. They were expected to prepare for class and write several papers during the summer. Outside of the seminar, they presented at public speaking programs and enjoyed lectures from guest professors visiting the TASS house. Writing workshops, field trips, and frequent cultural activities rounded out the summer. Admission to TASS is highly selective. Teachers and guidance counselors first nominate promising students for candidacy. In this case, CB's Class of 2011 counselor, Kirk Purdy, nominated the three. After completing rigorous five-essay applications, each candidate was interviewed by a member of the TASS board.

"I don't know how I could ever repay Mr. Purdy or thank him enough," says Hill. It really was the best summer I've ever had in terms of academic growth and I really feel like it clarified my direction in terms of what I want to study in college."

All three enjoyed the experience of meeting students from across the country and rose to the challenge of college-level academics.

"CB definitely prepared me well for the academic challenges," offers Wallace. "My writing definitely improved and it was a lot of fun living the college experience for six weeks."

Range hopes to attend the Telluride Association program for juniors next summer at Cornell University. "I'm a pretty motivated person," she says. "I loved the challenge and really felt like the topics we covered were very interesting."

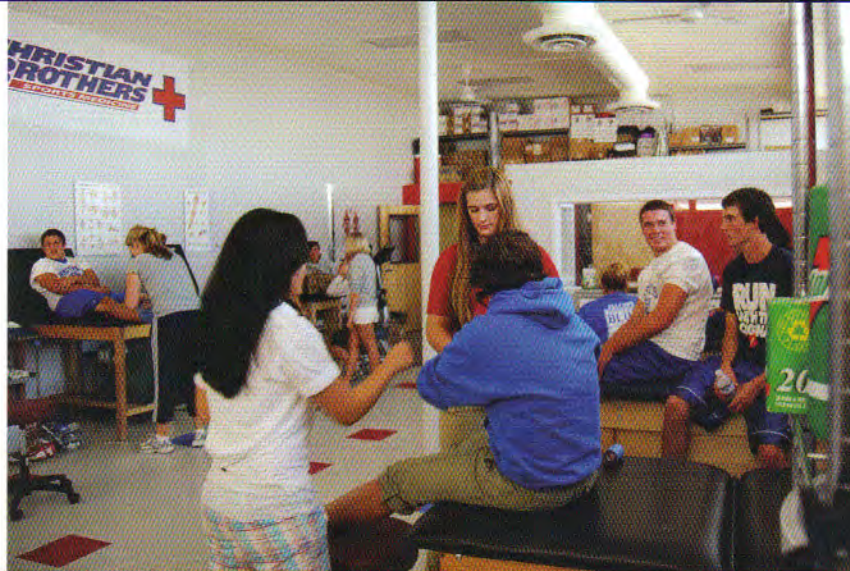
"It was phenomenal to be exposed to new ideas and philosophies," explains Hill. "My peers in the program are some of the brightest students in their own schools and it was fantastic being around them. I feel like this program provided me with an opportunity to improve my skills in writing and in time management, both of which are critical to my future. And, it crystallized for me the fact that I would like to attend Indiana University following graduation."

Housing, dining, and tuition expenses are covered by Telluride Association and the host institutions. Students pay only the costs of transportation and incidental expenses.

## Athletic Training Room Complete

With construction of the field house complete in November of 2008, the much needed relocation and upgrade of the athletic training room could begin. Thanks to the incredible generosity of donors at the 2007 auction, approximately \$35,000 had been raised to cover the cost of converting the old weight room into an 1,100 square-foot training room with additional treatment table, taping stations, a whirlpool and rehabilitation equipment.

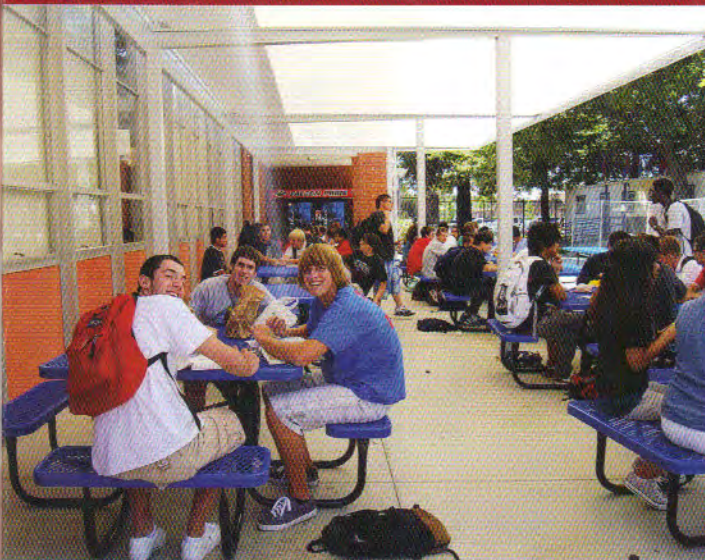
“This new space is great,” says CB athletic trainer and P.E. teacher, Darci Stark. “I’ve been able to expand the student athletic trainer training program. The additional training tables allow us to get athletes taped and out to practice sooner. We are also able to more effectively work with our athletes who are coming back from injuries. I absolutely love the new space and am so grateful to all of the donors who made this possible.”



# Campus Improvements

## CB Adds Covered Eating Area

On most days, CB students spend their lunch break in the cafeteria, or in groups sitting on the main lawn and around the senior lockers. Rainy and hot days present challenges in terms of space and comfort. “Our cafeteria simply wasn’t made to accommodate a student body of 1,070,” explains President Lorcan Barnes. “With the influx of 100 junior and senior transfer students this year, we knew we need to move this project to the top of our priority list. It’s great to see our students enjoying the space throughout the day and even after school.”



## Dance Room

CB added another venue for artistic expression with the opening of the newly outfitted dance room. This space will provide some much needed dance rehearsal space for our theater productions and a place for our growing dance club to hone their skills.





# Falcons Celebrate Holy Bowl Win

Although the Falcons were the visiting team, they made themselves at home at Hughes Stadium for Holy Bowl 2009. As the players prepared to battle on the gridiron, the visitors' stands filled with a vast student cheering section (Falcon Force), alumni, family and friends.

On the field, the Falcons were determined to win. "We knew we had to give our all on every play and we were determined not to let this one slip away," explained Asante-Jabari Cleveland '10. "The crowd was awesome and when I turned around and saw all the students doing a rollercoaster cheer, I got chills."

Behind the passing and running of quarterback Mike Lahey '10, the phenomenal perseverance of the entire offensive line, and the run-smothering efforts of the defensive line, the Falcons were victorious for the first time in seven years, defeating Jesuit 21-6.

"This was the best victory that I've ever had in my time at CB," says coach Andre Johansen. "I remember when I started here five years ago, an alumnus told me that it didn't matter if I went 1-9 for the season, as long as the one win was against Jesuit. At the time I didn't really understand it, but, when I got up on Sunday morning, I knew exactly what he meant. I'm so proud of our players, they played with so much heart and really gave it their all from start to finish."

"The Holy Bowl is such a fantastic tradition in Sacramento,"

says CB President Lorcan Barnes. "It was great to come out on top this year. Even better, though, is the fact that two of Sacramento's finest high schools, Catholic schools nonetheless, share such a celebrated rivalry that the game has become one of the biggest sporting events in Sacramento. Outside of some of the Kings' games, I can't really think of a Sacramento sporting event that draws more than the 16,000 fans at the Holy Bowl."

"This year, we really wanted to show everyone that Christian Brothers has amazing school spirit and that regardless of the score, we are proud of our players, and even prouder to attend Sacramento's best high school," explains Student Body President, Andrew Florita '10.

Quarterback Mike "Buddy" Lahey '10, a self-proclaimed Falcon fan since birth, is elated with the victory. "I can tell you right now, we did this for the alumni who continue rooting for us, for all the people thinking about coming to Christian Brothers High School, and for the people in the stands. What a great night!"

"The best feeling of all was seeing that everyone else was just as happy as we were," offers running back Corey Crowder '10. "I will always remember that feeling. But now, we've got Union Mine next Friday. It's time for league, and hopefully, if we stay focused and continue to work hard, we'll bring home another league championship."

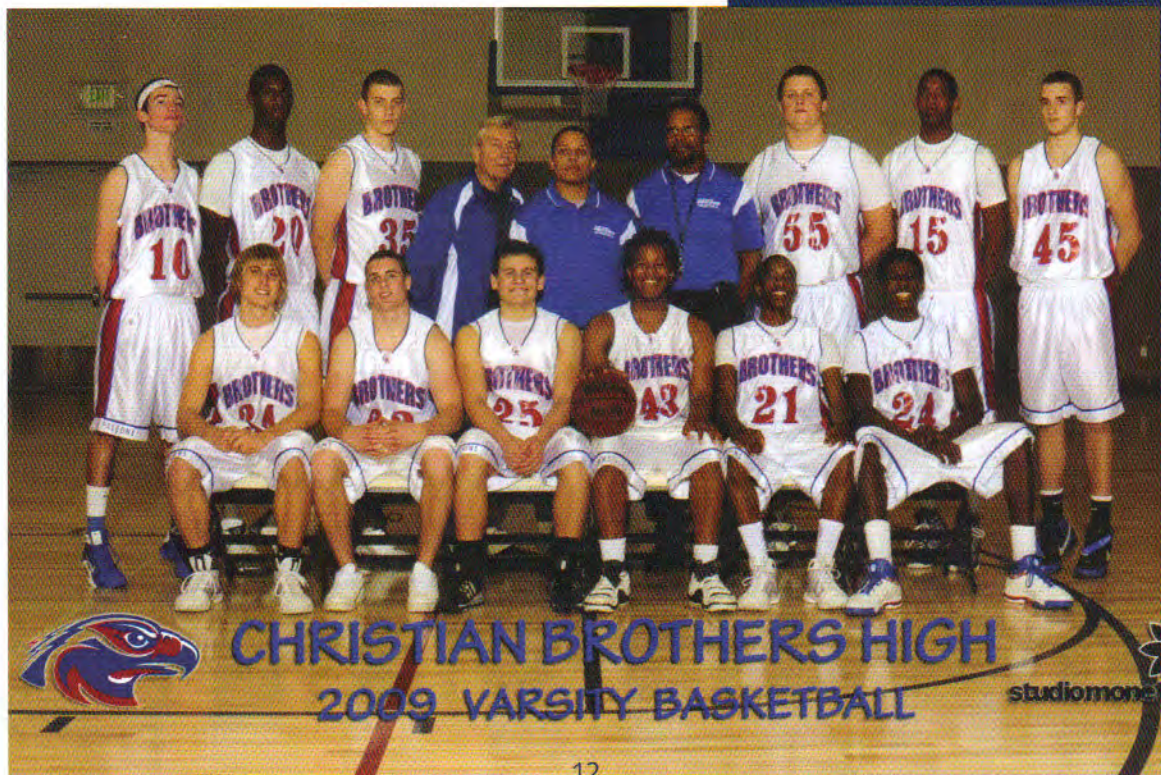

## Rugby Advances to National finals

While rugby at Christian Brothers High School enjoyed some popularity in the 1980's, the sport reemerged four years ago, thanks in large part to a resolute group of students who petitioned the athletic department to add a team. What began with a dedicated group of about 15 student-athletes has quickly become a campus favorite with more than 80 players taking the field on the school's three teams. In May, the varsity team won its way into the National Championship tournament which was held in Pittsburg, Pennsylvania. There, they defeated the number two and six seeds to earn their way into the championship where, ironically, they faced cross-town rival, Jesuit High School.

Although the game did not turn out in the Falcon's favor, head coach Sean Lyon had high praise for the players. "We were not expected to advance beyond our first game," explains Lyon. "The fact that we ended up playing against Jesuit in the championship match really speaks to the strength of Sacramento's rugby programs."

"Beyond their performance on the field, I was incredibly proud of our players and the way they represented Christian Brothers everywhere we went," says Lyon. "The airlines, hotel and even the restaurants where we had meals complimented me on how well mannered our players were."



## Men's Golf Captures Fourth Consecutive Section Title

Kudos to the CB men's golf team as they successfully defended their Sac-Joaquin Section Division II Championship. Highlights of the season include Jarrett Link '10 hitting a hole-in-one at the Sierra Valley Conference tournament on the eighth hole at the Empire Ranch Golf Course in Folsom. 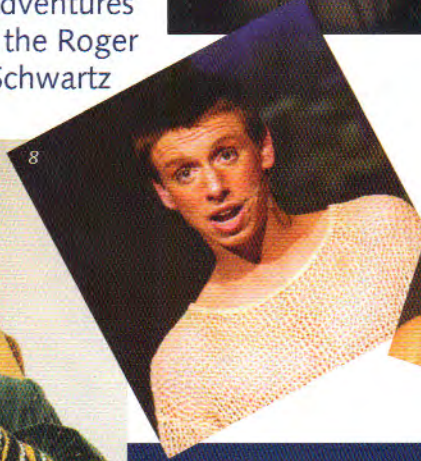

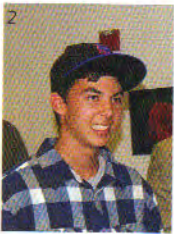


## Talent on Display at La Salle Art Exhibit

# Paul Havey '81 Named CBHS 2009 Lasallian Educator of the Year

Paul Havey '81 was surprised and humbled to hear his name announced as CB's Lasallian Educator of the Year. The award, typically presented at the St. La Salle liturgy in the spring, is given to the faculty member who most exemplifies the spirit and dedication of St. John Baptist de La Salle and his ministry to educate young people. Recipients are nominated by CB faculty and staff and selected by the school's management team.

Havey, who began teaching at CB 14 years ago, was actually enjoying a successful career in business when he felt a calling to the vocation of Catholic education. "I was tutoring a boy at church who was far behind in school. One day, it clicked for him, and at that moment, I knew that that was what I was supposed to be doing in my career."

As a student and as a teacher, Havey credits some classic CB teachers and staff with his success.

"There were the icons at CB like Joe Gill '63, Ronnie Limeberger '53, Tom English, Fred Quontamatteo and Joe Guilherme who were present when I attended CB, and when I started teaching," explains Havey. "They became my mentors. As a student, many of the Brothers inspired me in how they could be men of faith and yet be themselves. I was amazed at how they could live in community and at their commitment to teaching. It seemed like they went out of their way to be present to the students. It is an experience that I carry as a teacher and try to do with my students. Joe Gill was a profound man with a tremendous work ethic as a coach of two sports, a teacher of English and an athletic director. I bring many of his lessons from humanities to my classroom to help my students learn to think for themselves and to have ownership in what they do."

After taking several service trips to Tijuana through the Venaver program, Havey realized that he wanted to bring that service experience to the Oak Park neighborhood.

"Four years ago, I found a home serving people on a regular basis through the Sunday Lunch Program at the Sacramento Food Bank," explains Havey. "I bring 20 to 30 students to make lunches, sort groceries and pass out food to people in need. It has been a wonderful experience for me and for the students.

It takes us out of our normal environment and neighborhoods and we experience people at a much different socio-economic level. The students visit with people and hear about their lives and struggles. Our work has had a huge impact on the students and how they see the world around them."

As for what he likes most about CB, Havey credits the closeness and kindness of the community. "The students are pretty amazing in how they interact with each other and all the service work they are involved with throughout the school year. They show a tremendous amount of heart in whatever they do," says Havey. "I enjoy the alumni connections and find it amazing the way that generations of family members come through this school. Parents are honoring their parents' commitment to a quality, Catholic education by sending their children to the same school they attended."

"There is a reason that generations of families attend Christian Brothers High School, and it has everything to do with the excellent, Catholic, Lasallian education that you can only get here," explains CB President, Lorcan Barnes. "Paul Havey is the living embodiment of our motto, *Enter to Learn, Leave to Serve* and we are honored to recognize him as the 2009 Lasallian Educator of the Year."

# CB Students Learn About the Risks of Drunk Driving

Some of life's lessons are best learned through experience. Unfortunately, when the target audience is teens and the topic is drinking and driving, experience is not the teacher of choice.

This past spring, CB administrators brought the Every 15 Minutes Program to campus in order to proactively provide students with real-life experience without the real-life risks. This emotionally charged program is designed to dramatically instill teenagers with the potentially dangerous consequences of drinking alcohol.

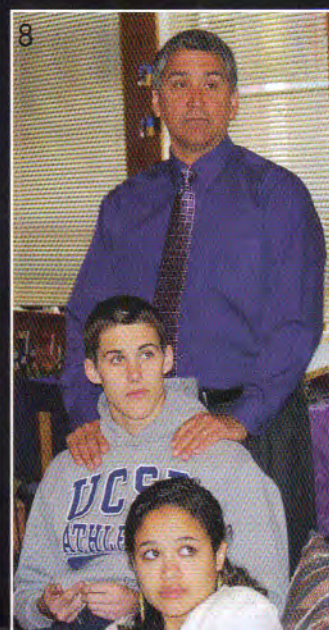
During the first day, the "Grim Reaper" removed one student from class every 15 minutes and they became the "living dead." A uniformed CHP officer and campus minister then read an obituary written by the "dead" student's parent(s). The obituaries were then posted on the dead students' lockers and a tombstones were placed beneath the campus cross.

The student body then attended a simulated traffic collision on the school grounds. Beloved teacher, Danny Delgado '79 and his daughter, Elise '09, were in a car that had been hit by James Ward '09. Ward's passenger, Quincey Gutman '09 was killed in the accident as was Danny Delgado. Ward was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol. While the situation was simulated, students had a glimpse of being involved in a tragic, alcohol-related collision.

"We are so grateful to the students and parents who participated," explains Julie Olson '99, assistant dean of students. "The program actually took months to plan and the participants had to attend a number of meetings and training sessions. I'm especially grateful to the Delgado, Gutman and Ward families who went above and beyond the call of duty in making this program happen."

On the second day of the program, students attended a powerful assembly that included a mock funeral service for the victims and a viewing of a video that included scenes from the first day of the "Grim Reaper" and the staged accident. Parents whose daughters and sons were involved in the program shared their reactions. And, possibly the most powerful speaker of the day, Dee Sova, shared the emotional story of the day her daughter, Sharmelia Jeffries '04, was tragically hit and killed by a drunk driver while walking to the bus stop in front of Christian Brothers.

"I wanted to bring Every 15 Minutes back to Christian Brothers when I came on board almost seven years ago," says Kent Morrison,



CB wellness counselor.

"Tragically, our community lived the experience on December 2, of 2003 when we lost Sharmelia. Several weeks after that,



we lost another student, Matt Prentice '04, in a car accident. It was a lot of loss and pain for our community to bear. This year was the right time to bring it back."

The assembly ended with a call to action by Delgado '79, "Choices have consequences, so please make the best decision for you, your family, your friends and the hundreds of other people that will be affected by your decision."

At the inception of the Every 15 Minutes program, an individual was killed every 15 minutes in an alcohol-related collision. While today that number reportedly has been reduced to roughly one fatality every 37 minutes, there is much work to be done as thousands of families still receive visits from law enforcement, telling them their loved one was not coming home, due to an entirely preventable crime.

# Building on the Tradition Campaign – Phase II

Next year's event is scheduled for Friday, September 10, 2010.

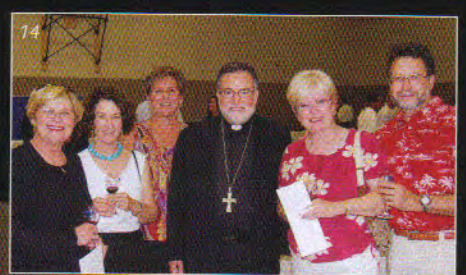

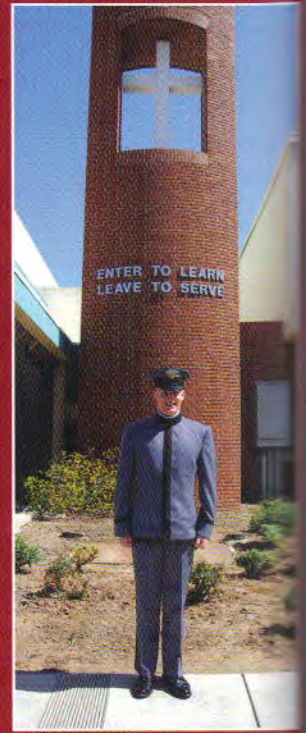
