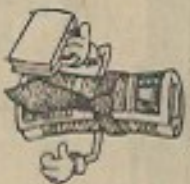

At one point in life or another we need to make changes. We never stop learning, we must always be up to new



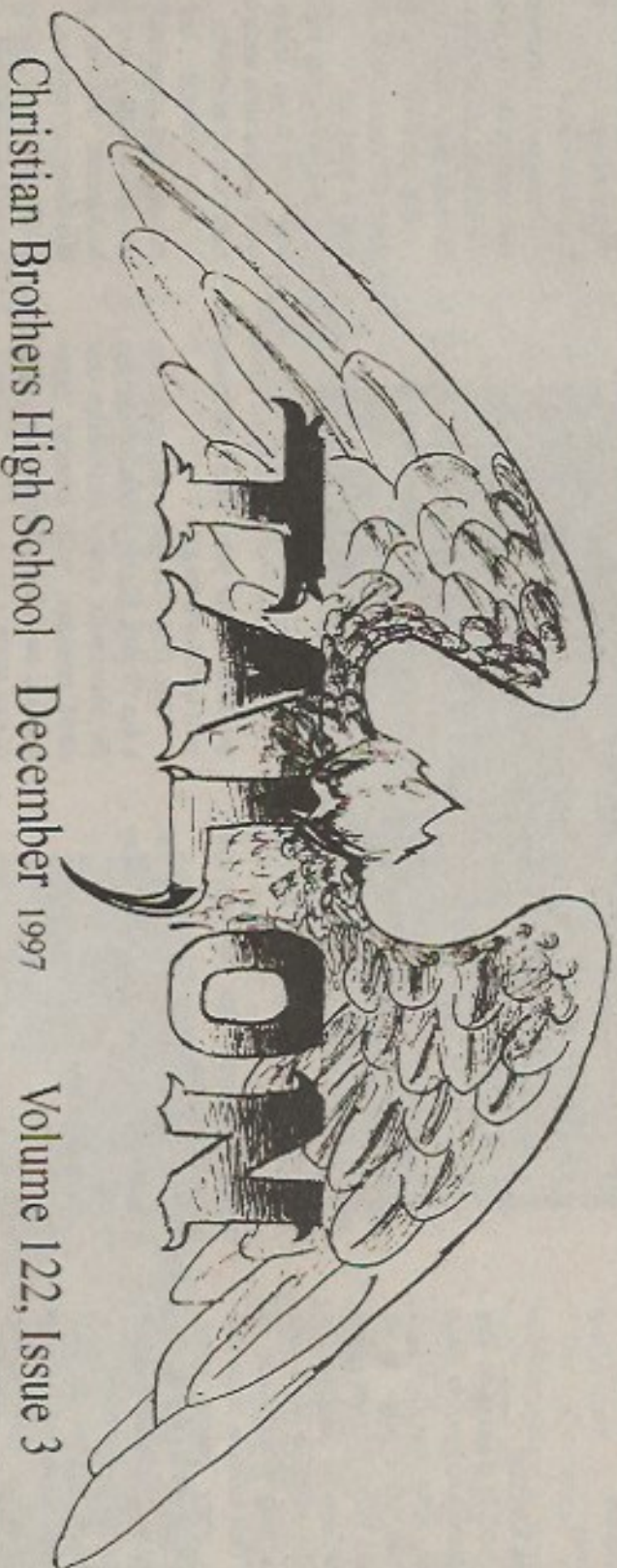
