Mr. Desmond was born May 1, 1937,

to Edna Nicolaus and Earl D. Desmond, both descendants of Gold Rush pioneers. She was the daughter of Louis Nicolaus, a founder of Sacramento's old Buffalo Brewery at 21st and Q streets.

Mr. Desmond graduated from Christian Brothers in 1956, then attended seminary in Oregon before graduating from Seattle University. Later, he was awarded his teaching credential at Gonzaga University and a master's at the University of San Francisco.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by daughters Kerry Desmond of Kansas City, Mo., Katie Desmond of Flagstaff, Ariz., and Colleen Desmond of Washington, D.C.; a son, David Desmond of Pasadena; and brothers Richard and Louis
