

INTRODUCING RAY CURRY

Ray Curry arrived at Christian Brothers in the spring of 1946 and immediately assumed coaching and academic teaching duties.

Born in Los Angeles twenty-seven years ago, Curry attended Cathedral High where he played football for three years, meriting an end position on that school's All-Time eleven, landing on the Southern California All-Star team, and participating in the Chicago-Los Angeles prep grid battle in 1938.

He enrolled at St. Mary's College in the fall of 1939 and saw gridiron service under "Slip" Madigan, "Red" Strader and Jimmy Phelan. As a junior he snared sixteen passes to lead his team in that department, and the following year made many All-Coast selections.

An Army veteran who spent two years in the European theatre, the CBS mentor is considered by authorities as a sound fundamentalist with a keen sense of originality in all sports.
