CHRISTIAN BROTHERS HIGH SCHOOL TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

A Christian Brothers education is an investment in your child's future, a choice that requires careful financial planning and sacrifice for many families. We are committed to making a Christian Brothers education affordable and accessible. To the extent that our funds permit, tuition assistance is available to all admitted students who qualify. In the 2019-20 school year, 36% of our families qualified for tuition assistance. Applying for tuition assistance has no bearing on a student's admissions status.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How are awards determined?

Christian Brothers contracts with FACTS, a third-party company that specializes in evaluating a family's ability to pay tuition based on a variety of factors including family size, income, net worth, number of children for whom the family pays tuition and other data.

The Christian Brothers Tuition Assistance Committee reviews all FACTS applications for tuition assistance and determines the amount of assistance to be provided each family based on the amount of tuition assistance funds available, the number of families who apply and each family's need.

How much can we earn and still receive tuition assistance (is there a cutoff amount)?

There is no pre-determined level of earnings that will automatically disqualify a family from receiving tuition assistance. Applicants with the same income level may have other factors that are considered, such as the number of students, assets owned and other personal circumstances. The amount of tuition assistance provided is based on a careful evaluation of all of the financial information furnished. Awards are determined on a case-by-case basis.

How do I apply for tuition assistance?

Families begin the process by completing an online FACTS application. Applications will be available online starting October 8, 2019. All information is kept strictly confidential. Application forms are available on our website. A non-refundable processing fee of \$36 is required to complete your online application.

If I do not have all of the necessary information to complete the application online, will I have to start over?

No. As you complete the online application, there will be a "Save and Continue" button at the end of each section. If you are unable to complete the entire application in one sitting, you can select the "Finish Later" button and continue your application at a later time.

When do I apply?

Complete your application online by:

- January 9, 2020 for new students (and their siblings)
- March 1, 2020 for returning students

When will I be notified whether or not I will receive tuition assistance?

Incoming freshmen families will receive notification by mail in the middle of February, prior to their deadline to register for the next school year. Returning student families will receive notification by mail in late April.

Financial Information

We recognize that your investment in a Catholic education at Christian Brothers is a significant financial commitment. Tuition for the 2020-2021 school year will be determined in March 2020. In order to provide you with a basis for financial planning, the following is a summary of the costs for attending Christian Brothers during the 2019-20 school year:

Tuition: The 2019-20 tuition is \$14,060

Enrollment Fee: A \$700 enrollment fee is due at the time of registration

Graduation Fee (seniors only): \$320

Tuition may be paid by using a ten-month payment plan or by one-time payment. Other fees and expenses may apply for optional activities such as athletic teams, clubs, parking and cafeteria meals. Books are purchased through the school's online bookstore. Each student is required to purchase an iPad.
