In the locker room, major changes were made. The old varsity room and part of the coach's outer office were removed. Where the little theater stood, there are now lockers. Thirty-five hundred dollars worth of new lockers have been installed.

The tables and other equipment of the former chemistry laboratory have been removed and desks installed. The room will probably be used as a projection room for slides and motion pictures.
