## FROM THE PREFECTS

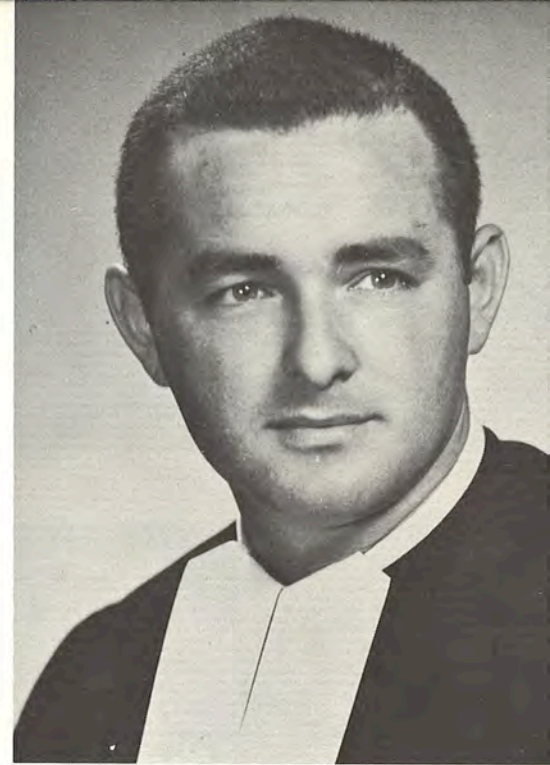

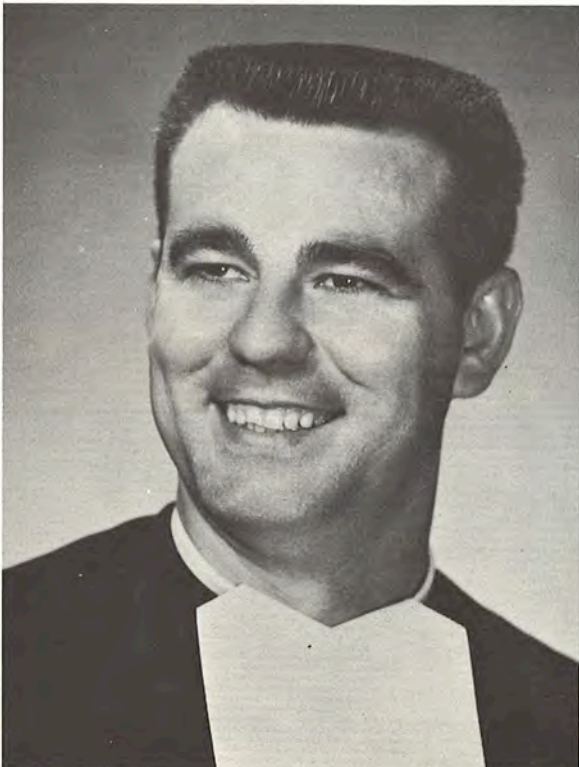
Your exemplary spirit of cooperation and generosity to the rules and regulations are worthy of our admiration and pose themselves as ideals for those returning next year.

# SENIOR GRADUATES



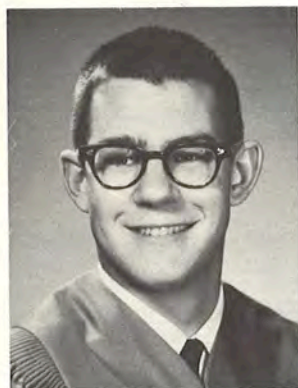
**MIKE GREEN**

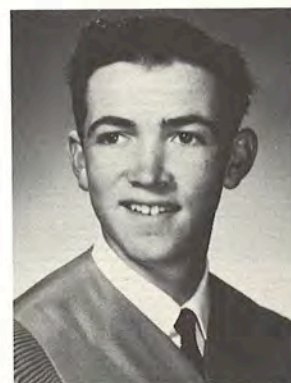
**TOM CONNOLLY**

**JOHN WILLEY**

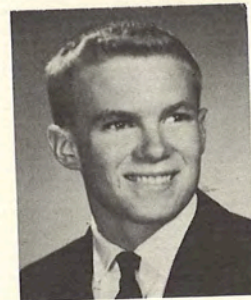
