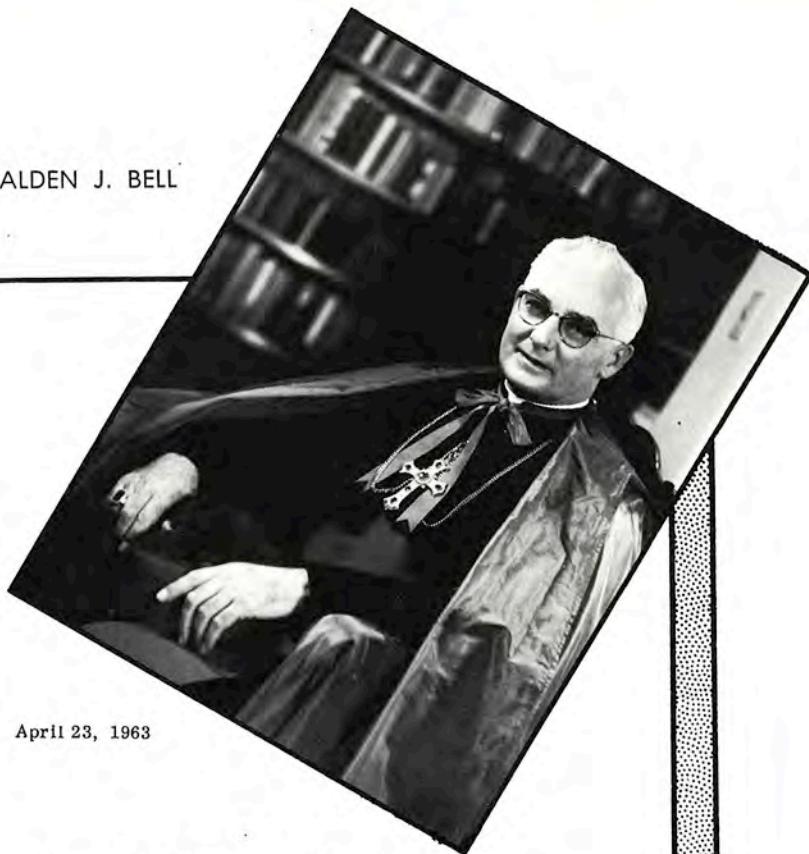


DEDICATION


Dear Students:

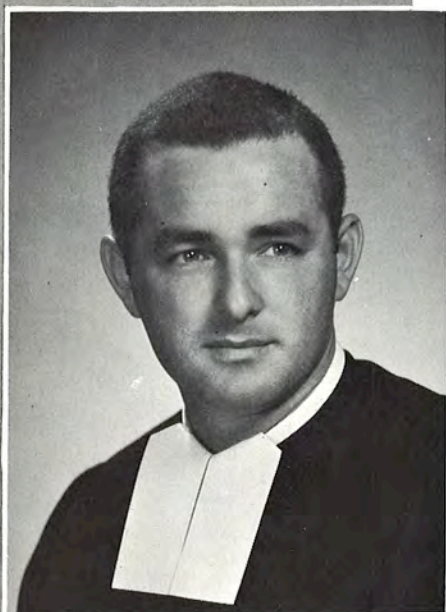

LYNN WILLIAMS — Shoshone, Calif.

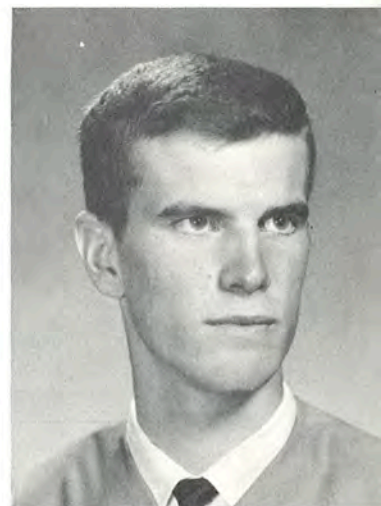
