HOLY BOWL HISTORY

Series Overall Record

Jesuit: 23

Christian Brothers: 14

Tie: 2

1969

Christian Brothers 20 Jesuit 13

Jesuit came into the game as the underdog, but had the city's second leading rusher in Joe Mangiaracina (5.8 yds. avg. carry) and the number one defense in the city (101 yds./game and 8 pts./game). The CBS victory was sparked by Dennis Bertacchi and Danny Galvez. Jesuit was led by offensive captain Joe Mangiaracina and defensive captains Marshall Alameida and Tim Warren at American River College (ARC).

1970

Jesuit 8 Christian Brothers 7

The second Holy Bowl (at ARC) may have been the most thrilling ever played. Both teams were league champion, CBS rated fourth in the city and Jesuit fifth. Brothers was fielding its first undefeated team since 1936. Playing before 8,000 plus fans at a soggy American River College stadium Jesuit scored with seconds left in the game to pull within a point of CBS, 7-6. On the last play of the game, sophomore quarterback Dano McGinn, in for his only play of the game, scrambled for a two point conversion to give the Marauders the victory. Brothers was led by future U.C. Davis star Dan Carmazzi and some of the best linemen to ever play for the Falcons - Jim Sarti, Stan Olsufka, and John Blanchard. Jesuit was led by future Columbia star Joe Ratterman and Fritz Hoffman, Paul Schaffer and Tim Coyle.

1971

Christian Brothers 40 Jesuit 7

Again at ARC, Holy Bowl III once again brought league champions together, but this time CBS running back Mark Gabrielli (his cousins later played football at Jesuit), recently out of a hospital bed, was the difference as he gained 202 yards to lead the Falcons to the convincing victory.

1972

Jesuit 21 Christian Brothers 0

This year's contest was a virtual replay of the previous season, but with the roles reversed. Before a crowd of 7,900 at Sac State's Hornet Stadium, Jesuit QB Larry McGovern hooked up with his favorite receiver, Marty Kloser, often enough to give the Marauders the big win. CBS was anchored by three-time All-Metro League lineman John Cartwright.

1973

Christian Brothers 0 Jesuit 0

Holy Bowl V saw one of the finest CBS teams ever assembled. Led by QB Jeff Tisdell and tight end Eason Ramson, the Falcons were rated No. 1 in the city, with a record of 8-1. The Marauders were 5-4. Despite the strength of CBS, a driving rain at the CSUS stadium slowed both teams in a scoreless tie and dubbed the game the "Mud Bowl".

1974

Christian Brothers 53 Jesuit 28

Passing became a factor in the game for the first time since 1972. The Falcons rode ten brilliant catches by All-American end Dan Farrell in the rout. CBS scored on every possession, preventing Jesuit quarterback Matt Bouza from closing the gap in the second half. Brothers accumulated 450 yards of total offense, 309 in the air.

1975

Jesuit 7 Christian Brothers 6

Holy Bowl VII featured another match-up between league champions. Jesuit voted to forego a first-ever playoff berth in favor of a season-ending match-up with CBS. Defenses dominated as the game was played in a steady rain from start to finish - the Marauders yielding 128 total yards to the Falcons equally impressive 147. Led by running backs Tim Lee, Joe Riehl and Pat Barclay, Jesuit scored before the half on a 14-play, 99-yard drive. Brothers countered late in the contest on a five yard run by Steve Sules. CBS elected to go for two points and the win, but was denied on the ensuing attempt by the "Red Brick Wall."

1976

Jesuit 13 Christian Brothers 6

In another "Mud Bowl", Jesuit jumped to an early 13-point lead behind the running and passing of Phil Cantelme, and the defense of Randy O'Rourke and Guy Coe. The Falcons were led by super-backs Jeff Muljat and Richie Simms.

1977-1978: Cancelled: This was due to the conflicts with City playoffs. Both teams continued to dominate their respective leagues this year.

1979

Christian Brothers 53 Jesuit 14

The Holy Bowl was back, and CBS returned in a big way. Mark Murphy passed for three touchdowns and Dave Perreira carried the ball eight times for 108 yards and three TD's to lead the Falcons. Jesuit was led by All-League lineman Dan Reilly, Mark Hilder and Dave Alameida.

1980

Christian Brothers 40 Jesuit 7

In a replay of the previous game, CBS ran over the Marauders behind Greg Murphy, Bob Crump and Charlie Hoffman. Jesuit's lone score came on a Jeff Sperbeck to Steve Halvorson pass.

1981

Christian Brothers 17 Jesuit 10

In a defensive standoff, the game was determined by the special teams. Played at Woodland High School, the margin of victory was 60-yard punt return by Rob Delgado. CBS, the eventual city champion, was led by Dave Jablonsky, John Arbuckle and Bill Callaghan. Jesuit was paced by running back Scott Lippi and receiver Jeff Thomas, and anchored by John Gedney and Pat Dentinger.

1982

Christian Brothers 21 Jesuit 0

The reigning city champions, CBS looked to repeat their 1981 performance. Behind super-back Vince Delgado, the Falcons looked invincible. Delgado carried the ball 15 times for 169 yds. and one TD. The Marauders played CBS to a scoreless first half. Three quick scoring drives by the Falcons in the second half sealed the fate of Holy Bowl XII. Jesuit was braced by the play of Greg Chelini and linemen Ted Hornback and Joe Schaeffer.

HOLY BOWL HISTORY (CON'T)

1983

Christian Brothers 31 Jesuit 14

Holy Bowl XIII was the final year for one of the finest backs ever to play in the Sacramento area and Vince Delgado left behind some lasting memories, rushing for 204 yards on 26 carries. All-leaguer John Foster blocked two punts that resulted in CBS scores. Rob Quintero passed to Ken Omlin for two TDs and Kellan Matthews also scored twice. Jesuit's Greg Goldman returned the opening kickoff of the second half 97 yards for a touchdown, only to have it nullified by a penalty. When CBS kicked again, Goldman ran 98 yards for a Marauders' TD that remained on the scoreboard.

1984

Christian Brothers 17 Jesuit 6

The Falcons, the defending Sac-Joaquin Section champions, made it six Holy Bowls in a row with outstanding defense in the first half. CBS surrendered a TD in the second half when Paul Willover connected with John Nolan on a scoring strike.

1985

Christian Brothers 35 Jesuit 7

Holy Bowl XV was CBS's seventh consecutive victory. The Falcons' James McDonald ran for 104 yards and Paul Delgado added 93 as Brothers ran over the Marauders. Jesuit's lone rally came on a pass from John Rathfon to Vince Quilici.

1986

Jesuit 13 Christian Brothers 10

Jesuit entered the game as the underdog, and trailed 10-0 at halftime as CBS scored on its first two possessions. In the third quarter, Jesuit's Mike Walter scored and then Mike McIntee threw a TD pass to Dan Cahill to end Brothers' seven-year streak.

1987

Jesuit 24 Christian Brothers 6

Jesuit rushed by the Falcons as running back Joe Deaser ran for 95 yds and a TD, and kicker Sherman Dausses tallied five points with a field goal and two extra points. CBS was led by QB Mark Peterson, who connected on 12 of 26 passes for 103 yards.

1988

Christian Brothers 11 Jesuit 0

Jonathan Kelley raced 84 yards for a third-quarter touchdown and Pat Ryan added a field goal as the Falcons broke Jesuit's two-game winning streak. Despite the strong leadership of Jesuit's Greg Harcos, the Falcons held the Marauders to 130 yards in total offense.

1989

Jesuit 21 Christian Brothers 14

Charles Alimena hauled in a 40 yard TD pass from Chris Bradford with just over six minutes to play to break the tie. Alimena also halted a CBS drive at the end of the game when he intercepted a Rick Marsten pass in the end zone.

1990

Christian Brothers 3 Jesuit 0

Julian Gutierrez kicked a field goal in the closing minutes of what had been a game dominated by the defensive teams to give CBS a 3-0 win over the Marauders.

1991

Jesuit 39 Christian Brothers 7

Ignited by Greg Haubner's exciting fourth down 27 yd. TD scramble, the Marauders went on to build a 31-0 lead. Pat Cummings rushed for 2 TDs while Chris Oliver intercepted a Kevin McKechnie pass for a TD, and caught a 37 yd. TD pass from Haubner to spark Jesuit.

1992

Christian Brothers 21 Jesuit 16

In a tight defensive struggle, tied 0-0 at the half, Mike Casagrande's pass to Matt Carmazzi started the Marauders on their way to victory. Nigel Burton's 6 yd. run late in the game sealed the victory.

1993 #2 PLAYOFFS

Jesuit 33 Christian Brothers 13

In the initial playoff contest between the two schools, Jesuit's Andy Stanton scored 3 TDs and Jerry Ortiz rushed for 103 yds. as the Marauders raced to their first ever post-season victory. Donyel Williams set a school record with his 95 yd. TD kickoff return to open the second half. Matt Orr rushed for 129 and a TD for CBS.

1994

Jesuit 28 Christian Brothers 0

Reminiscent of the '73 "Mud Bowl", this year's game was played in a continual downpour. It didn't hamper Jesuit's Gio Carmazzi, who rushed for 86 yds. and a TD and added a TD pass. Mike Harrington contributed 82 yds. on the ground and a TD. The Marauder defense stifled the Falcons' potent offense and helped clinch Jesuit's third consecutive appearance in the playoffs.

1995

Jesuit 38 Christian Brothers 14

On their way to a first ever section title and a 13-0-1 season, Jesuit stormed out to a 31 point lead on their way to a 38-14 victory. Monte Franks led the ground attack with 118 yds. and 2 TD's, while QBs J.T. O'Sullivan and Adam Curry combined for 222 yds. in the air. Their primary targets included All-League players Mike Kravich, Eric Frazer and Kyle Sweeney. Defensively, Jake Hays led the Marauders with 9 tackles. Falcon QB Sean Donalley led a spirited CBS squad with 2 TD passes.

1996

Jesuit 23 Christian Brothers 0

In recording their third Holy Bowl shut-out in the '90s, the Marauders defeated CBS 23-0 in a driving rainstorm. Metro League Offensive Player of the Year, Josh Ehlers, scored 2 TDs to go along with 89 yards rushing. A trio of line backers, Chris Waters, Kevin Khasigian and Josh Ehlers each had 7 tackles to spark the Marauder defensive effort. Zorba Lindros rushed for 110 yds. to lead the Falcons.

1997

Jesuit 34 Christian Brothers 14

Led by Kevin Khasigian's 3 TDs and 115 yds. and K.C. Maxwell's 113 yds., the Marauders turned back an exciting rally by the Falcons. After taking a 21-0 lead at halftime, Jesuit had to withstand a CBS comeback that threatened to tie the score in the 4th quarter. Tim Olson had 2 clutch receptions, including a 15 yd. TD pass from QB Paul O'Neill, that helped put the game away. Spearheaded by Greg McLaughlin, the Marauder defense held CBS to 59 yds. rushing.

On the opening kickoff, Charles Bell's explosive 96 yd. return set the stage for the Marauders' 6th straight Holy Bowl win. In a pivotal step toward a 3rd Metro League championship and a 12-1 season, Jesuit relied on K.C. Maxwell, Metro League Defensive MVP Jeff Reiman, and Bell for all the scoring in racing to a 42-0 halftime lead. With 126 yards rushing, Mark Gayton turned in an outstanding performance for the Falcons, who reached the playoffs for the first time under Coach Greg Meegan.

1999

Jesuit 63

Christian Brothers 14

Duplicating the 1998 contest, Jesuit stormed out to a 49-7 halftime lead behind the combined 5 rushing touchdowns of Metro League MVPs Charles Bell and Jeff Reiman. Bell led the Jesuit offense with 4 TDs and 137 yards rushing, including a 71 yard jaunt, while Reiman had 7 carries for 75 yards. Quarterback Joe Elftmann was on target with 10-15 passing for 142 yards. Reiman, Mike Luca and Billy Bunfill combined for 30 tackles to spark the Marauder defense, which was the key factor in a 4th Metro League championship and a second consecutive 12-1 season for Jesuit. Bunfill also excelled on special teams with 2 blocked punts, including one returned for a TD to start the scoring. The Falcons were led by All State and Georgia-bound running back Albert Hollis who ran for 163 yards, including a 75 yard scamper down the sideline.

With a combined 13 turnovers for both teams, play on the field often times matched the sloppy field conditions. After a tight first quarter resulting in only one score, a 70 yard fumble return by Marauder Josh Jimenez, Jesuit began to pull away behind the running of Jason Auguste who had 18 carries for 102 yards and a TD. Metro League MVP Blake Mori passed for 155 yards and 2 TDs, including 1 each to Chris Leary and Tony Jenks. The Marauder defense blanked the Falcon offense as Jesuit recorded its 9th straight Holy Bowl victory and 8th consecutive playoff appearance. Danny Glero accounted for the CBS points with an exciting 60-yard pass interception return.

Christian Brothers captured their first Holy Bowl victory since 1992 with this one-point thriller. Led by seniors Mel Cukovich and Matt Traverso the Falcons stormed out to an early lead. They then held off the Marauders and Quarterback Blake Mori as Jesuit scored a late touchdown but failed on the two point conversion for the win.

Jesuit avenged their 2001 Holy Bowl loss with this victory over the Falcons. Led by Senior all purpose player Chris Buck and Junior Quarterback C.J. Bacher, the Marauders controlled both sides of the ball. However, Christian Brothers and Senior Quarterback George Smith refused to let this game turn into a one sided affair and kept it close for most of the contest.

Matt Evan's exciting 80 TD bomb from C.J. Bacher ignited the Marauders on their way to a convincing victory. Bacher had 3 TD passes, including 2 to Evans. Armond Jackson added 2 more scores while rushing for 127 yards on only 6 carries. Kameron White caught a 52 yard pass from Andrew Bettencourt to account for the Falcon points.

2004

Jesuit 55

Christian Brothers 7

After a scoreless 1st period, Jesuit erupted for 55 points in the next 2 quarters to pull away from the scrappy Falcons. Marauder running back Tim Doyle started the scoring with a 4 yard run and later added a 32 yard TD reception. QB Evan Boylan threw 3 TD passes, including 2 to TE Joe Rost. Brian Devlin added a 65 yard punt return for a touchdown.

2005

Jesuit 19

Christian Brothers 19

After Jesuit jumped out to a 13-0 lead, Christian Brothers battled back to tie the score midway through the fourth quarter. Neither team could capitalize on turnovers throughout the rest of the game and the contest ended in only the second tie in the series. Evan Reuter led the Marauders on offense with 7 catches for 90 yards and 1 TD while Kevin Novick sparked the Jesuit defense with 11 tackles and 1 sack. Falcon QB Curtis Raulinaitis led the Falcons with 183 yards in total offense and had a hand in all 3 Christian Brothers touchdowns as he threw for two and rushed for one. Defensive stalwarts David Bonomi and Mike Macaluso had 25 tackles between them to hold the Jesuit offense in check.

2006

Jesuit 21

Christian Brothers 6

Jesuit's Marquese Smith electrified the crowd with a 99 yard return on the opening kickoff. The Marauder running back trio of Jordan Haynes, Anthony Wright and Isaiah Frey led the Jesuit offense with 192 yards rushing among them. Dominic Carmazzi threw 2 touchdown passes, to Justin Parker and Isaac Serwanga. Pat Gormley accounted for the lone Falcon touchdown with an 85 yard fumble return. Jake Schuering, Leo Vellutini, Asa Jackson and Danny Bird led a swarming Falcon defense that stopped a number of Jesuit drives in the red zone.

2007

Jesuit 32

Christian Brothers 29

In a back and forth contest, the Marauders opened the scoring with the first of 4 touchdowns by Isaiah Frey but Christian Brothers stormed back behind an Asa Jackson rushing TD and a fumble return for six. A Jesuit drive just before halftime was capped by a strike from Dominic Carmazzi to Isaiah Frey in the back of the end zone to close the gap to 14-12. Marcus McDaniel returned the second half kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown, giving CB a 21-12 lead. Jesuit responded with a 24 yard run by Jordan Haynes, who finished with 108 yards on the ground and then took a 25-21 lead on another Carmazzi to Frey touchdown pass. After Josh Tucker's 14 yard TD run and a 2 point conversion by Jackson, the Falcons had a 29-25 midway through the 4th quarter. It all came down to Jesuit's last possession. The Marauders responded twice on 4th down, first with a fake punt run for a first down and then a 20 yard touchdown run by Frey to put an exclamation mark on one of the most exciting Holy Bowls ever.

After Jesuit scored on its opening drive on Tom Blocker's 10 yard run, the Falcons dominated the game for the next 3 1/2 quarters behind the rushing of Marcus McDaniel and Josh Tucker, who combined for 205 yards rushing and 2 touchdowns. After Michael Lahey's TD pass to Cory Crowder put CB comfortably ahead in the 4th quarter, the Marauders started a remarkable comeback by scoring 2 touchdowns on two 1-play drives in the last 4 minutes of the game. Blocker scored his second touchdown on a leaping pass reception in the corner of the end zone and Travis Snider raced down the sideline for a 45 yard score after catching a short pass from Chris Piwinski. Dan Toro-Lira sealed the victory with an interception in the red zone that stopped a valiant, last gasp drive by the Falcons.

Dear Parents

The role of the parent in the education of students is vital. The support shown at home is often manifested in the ability of the student to accept the opportunities presented at school and in life.

There is a value system — established in the home, nurtured in the school — that young people are developing. Their involvement in the classroom and other activities contributes to that development. Trustworthiness, citizenship, caring, fairness and respect are lifetime values taught through athletics. These are the principles of good sportsmanship and character. With them, the spirit of competition thrives, fueled by honest rivalry, courteous relations, and graceful acceptance of the results.

As a parent of a student-athlete at our school, your goals should include:

- Realizing that athletics are part of the educational experience, and the benefits of involvement go beyond the final score of a game;
- Encouraging our students to perform their best, just as we would urge them on with their class work;

- Participating in positive cheers that encourage student-athletes, and discouraging any cheers that would redirect that focus - including those that taunt and intimidate opponents, their fans, and officials;
- Learning, understanding, and respecting the rules of the game, the officials who administer them, and their decisions;
- Respecting the task our coaches face as teachers and supporting them as they strive to educate our youth;
- Respecting our opponents as student-athletes, and acknowledging them for striving to do their best and
- Developing a sense of dignity and civility under all circumstances.

You can have a major influence on your student's attitude about academics and athletics. The leadership role you take will help influence your child, and our community, for years to come.

What is Pursuing Victory With Honor

"Pursuing Victory with Honor" came about through the Arizona Accord Conference, where major sports and educational leaders met in Scottsdale, AZ, to discuss the ethical and character-building aspects of athletic competition, with the hope that the framework of principals and values set forth would be adopted and practiced widely. The Josephson Institute of Ethics, CHARACTER COUNTS! Coalition and the United States Olympic Committee convened the conference on May 12-13, 1999. Invited to attend were 50 major sports leaders, including Jim Naber, coaching legend John Wooden, NBC Commentator Bob Costas, CIF Director Jack Hayes, college and university presidents, collegiate coaches and athletic di-

rectors from major universities, Olympic coaches and athletes, representatives of the national sports media and national youth organizations.

The CIF unanimously adopted the principles of "Pursuing Victory With Honor" at its November 5, 1999, Federated Council meeting, consisting of educational leaders representing California's 1263 high schools. The CIF recognizes the impact that high school athletics can play in society and is committed to the character-building goals of the program. In fact, the CIF felt so strongly about the 16 principals of the program that these have been made the operating principals of the organization.

Together, the CIF and its member schools can change the very nature of high school athletics and bring back the character, sportsmanship, ethics and integrity that high school sports can instill.

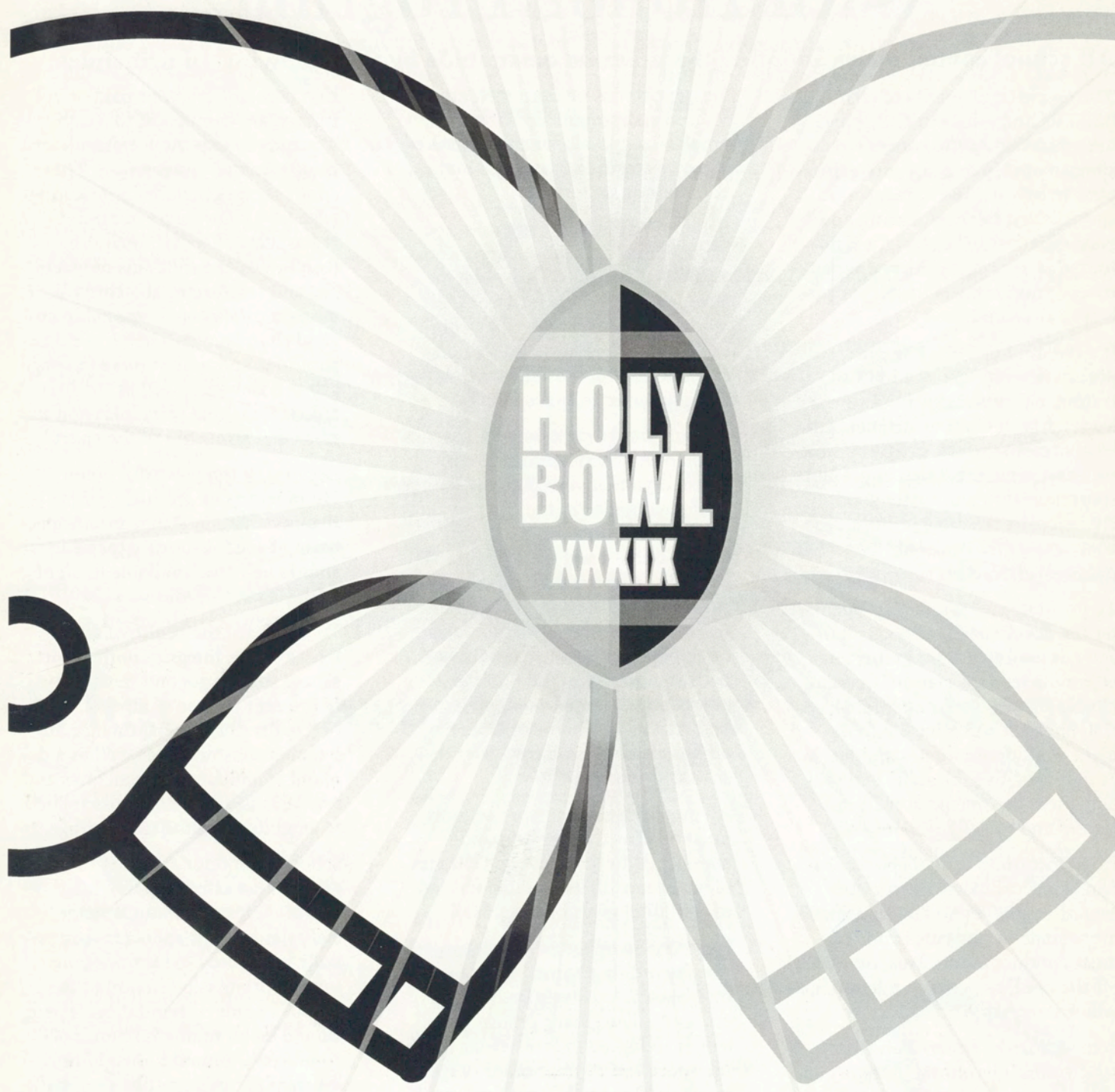

CIF Pursuing Victory With Honor Program

All school communities adopting the program must abide by the following 16 principles:

1. The essential elements of character building and ethics in CIF sports are embodied in the concept of sportsmanship and six core principles: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and good citizenship. The highest potential of sports is achieved when competition reflects these "six pillars of character."
2. It's the duty of School Boards, superintendents, school administrators, parents and school sports leadership -including coaches, athletic administrators, program directors and game officials - to promote sportsmanship and foster good character by teaching, enforcing, advocating and modeling these "six pillars of character."
3. To promote sportsmanship and foster the development of good character, school sports programs must be conducted in a manner that enhances the academic, emotional, social, physical and ethical development of student-athletes and teaches them positive life skills that will help them become personally successful and socially responsible.
4. Participation in school sports programs is a privilege, not a right. To earn that privilege, student-athletes must abide by the rules and they must conduct themselves, on and off the field, as positive role models who exemplify good character.
5. School Boards, superintendents, school administrators, parents and school sports leadership shall establish standards for participation by adopting and enforcing codes of conduct for coaches, athletes, parents and spectators.
6. All participants in high school sports must consistently demonstrate and demand scrupulous integrity and observe and enforce the spirit as well as the letter of the rules.
7. The importance of character, ethics and sportsmanship should be emphasized in all communications directed to student-athletes and their parents.
8. School Boards, superintendents, school administrators, parents and school sports leadership must ensure that the first priority of their student-athletes is a serious commitment to getting an education and developing the academic skills and character to succeed.
9. School Boards, superintendents, principals, school administrators and everyone involved at any level of governance in the CIF must maintain ultimate responsibility for the quality and integrity of CIF programs. Such individuals must assure that education and character development responsibilities are not compromised to achieve sports performance goals and that the academic, social, emotional, physical and ethical well-being of student-athletes is always placed above desires and pressured to win.
10. All employees of member schools must be directly involved and committed to the academic success of student-athletes and the character-building goals of the school.
11. Everyone involved in competition including parents, spectators, associated study body leaders, and all auxiliary groups have a duty to honor the traditions of the sport and to treat other participants with respect. Coaches have a special responsibility to model respectful behavior and the duty to demand that their student-athletes refrain from disrespectful conduct including verbal abuse of opponents and officials, profane or belligerent trash-talking, taunting and inappropriate celebrations.
12. School Boards, superintendents, and school administrators of CIF member schools must ensure that coaches, whether paid or voluntary, are competent to coach. Training or experience may determine minimal competence. These competencies include basic knowledge of: 1) The character building aspects of sports, including techniques and methods of teaching and reinforcing the core values comprising sportsmanship and good character. 2) The physical capabilities and limitations of the age group coached as well as the first aid. 3) Coaching principles and the rules and strategies of the sport.
13. Because of the powerful potential of sports as a vehicle for positive personal growth, a broad spectrum of school sports experiences should be made available to all of our diverse communities.
14. To safeguard the health of athletes and the integrity of the sport, school sports program must actively prohibit the use of alcohol, tobacco, drugs and performance enhancing substances, as well as a demand compliance with all laws and regulations, including those related to gambling and the use of drugs.
15. Schools that offer athletic programs must safeguard the integrity of their programs. Commercial relationships should be continually monitored to ensure against inappropriate exploitation of the school's name or reputation. There should be no undue influence of commercial interests. In addition, sports programs must be prudent, avoiding undue dependency on particular companies or sponsors.
16. The profession of coaching is a profession of teaching. In addition to teaching the mental and physical dimensions of their sport, coaches, through words and example, must also strive to build the character of their athletes by teaching them to be trustworthy, respectful, responsible, fair, caring and good citizens.

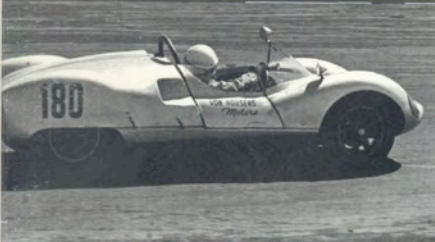
