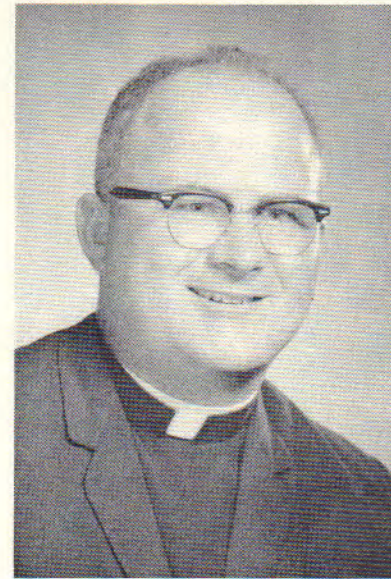

Each of us participates in the reputation, the prestige and the honor of this rivalry and this pride. So, it is imperative that each of us share in the responsibility to further that same image and pride.

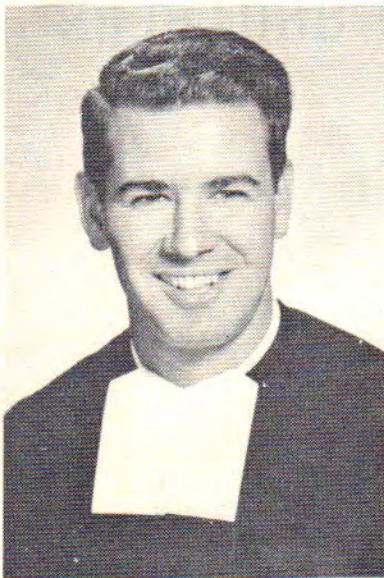

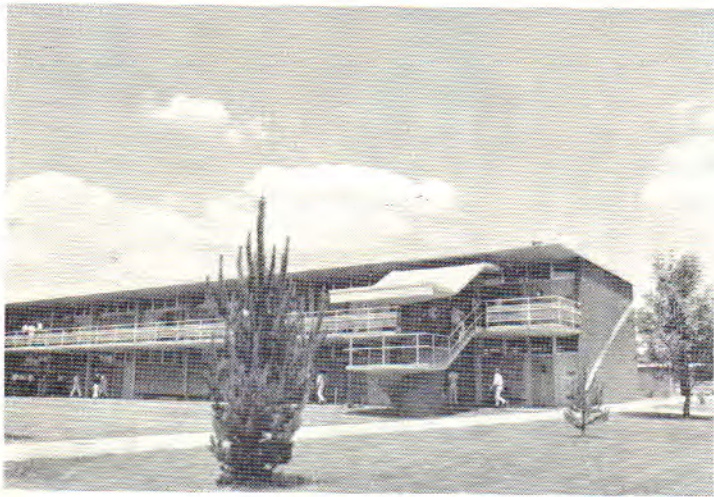

# Jesuit . . . .

## 8 Years of Excellence



It was the late Bishop Armstrong who first had the idea to invite the Jesuits to open a school in the Sacramento diocese, but it was with the encouragement and help of his two successors, Bishops McGucken and Bell that the idea became a reality. In late summer of 1961, Fr. Joseph Keane, S.J. was appointed the director of development, in charge of raising the money for the new school, and once this had been accomplished, of beginning the construction of the new facilities.

After two years, Jesuit High opened its doors to an incoming class of 93 freshmen at the Carmichael site. Only the classroom and administration buildings were completed by the September 17, 1963 opening date; the faculty was even living in rented quarters two miles away from the school. Little by little, the new school grew as new classrooms were added, the faculty residence was completed, and landscaping had converted a former hops field into an attractive high school campus.

Each year the school added another class of students until 1967 when Jesuit had its first graduating class. As we became a four-year high school, we began to develop our athletic program so that we could provide all aspects of a total high school formation. The symbol for the part that athletics contributes to the student life at Jesuit is the Gymnasium which was completed in June 1968 and was ready for use when the school year 1968-69 opened.

This year Jesuit is in its eighth year, helping to serve the needs of secondary school education for the Catholics of the Sacramento area. Under the leadership of Fr. Warren Schoeppe, S.J., President of the school, and Fr. Edward Callanan, S.J., Principal of the school, the faculty and students of Jesuit High hope to continue the tradition of service to the community which the pioneer years of the early 60's have established.

For the past century, the Christian Brothers have labored successfully in California educational fields of elementary, secondary and collegiate teaching. Their beginnings were not ostentatious as the community of Sacramento some 94 years ago did observe. At that time, in July of 1876, Christian Brothers was founded as an out-growth of St. Rose's parish school, first called St. Patrick's by the Pastor, Rev. Father Scanlan. Eventually, when the Christian Brothers of San Francisco accepted a new three-story building at the corner of 12th and K Streets, the school assumed the name of Christian Brothers College.

Here, the tradition of "CBC" flourished, impressing upon Sacramento its educational benefit and prominence. Although it never achieved a degree granting status, it was Sacramento's first school to offer college courses. In due time, however, Christian Brothers pursued the interests of a secondary school. By November 5, 1924, the State of California, by incorporation, restricted Christian Brothers to a high school in its new Mission styled buildings on 21st and Broadway Streets. Attracting students to its boarding department, the school here enhanced its reputation for academic excellence and athletic prowess in the Sacramento area. Finally, the pressure of need and change re-situated this worthy school on Sacramento Blvd., its present campus, where a thriving, renewed Christian Brothers continues its educational influence and success.

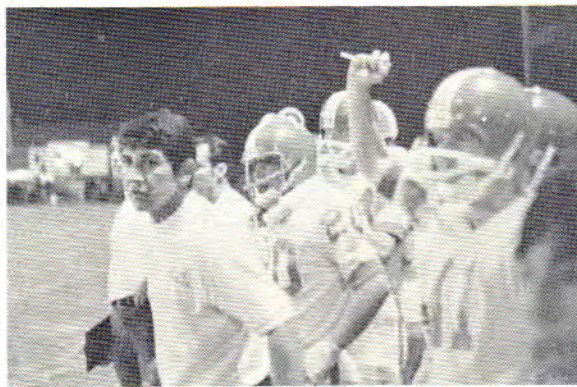

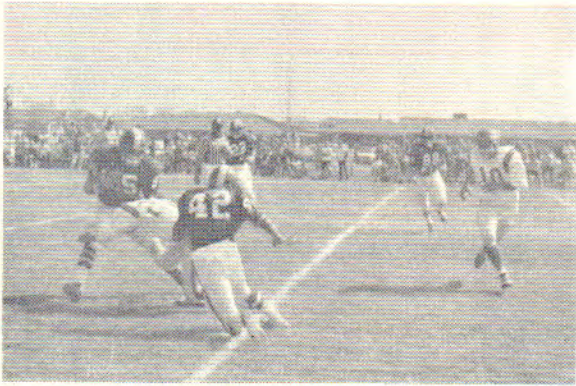

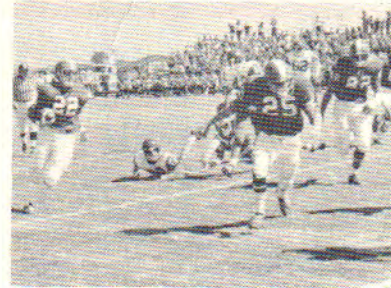
The gridiron contest will be sparked by a Cross-Country exhibition between the top runners of each school.

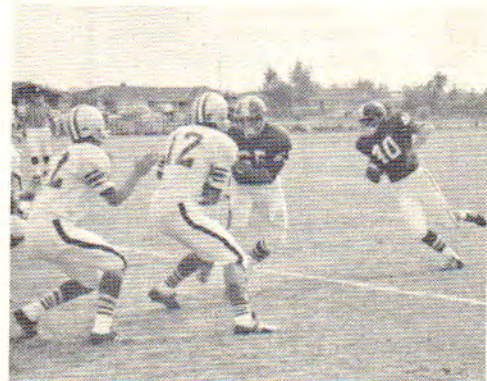

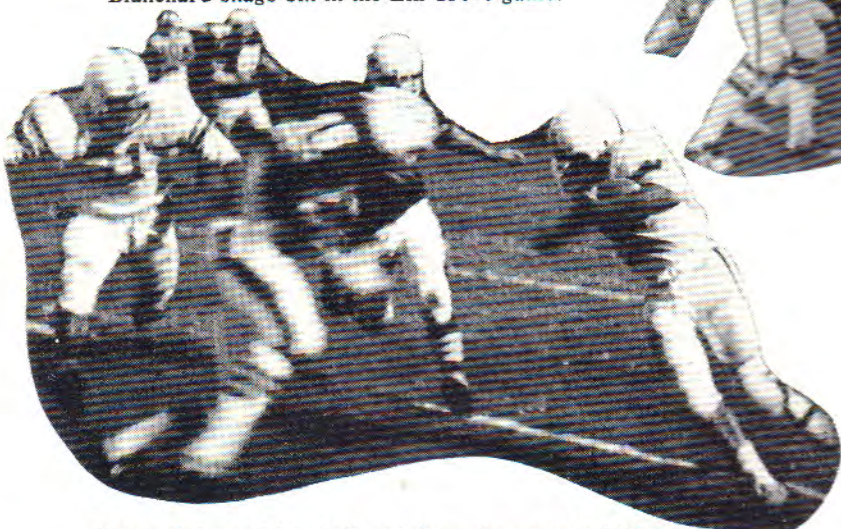

# Christian Brothers High School Jesuit High School CLOSE

It was announced today, in Sacramento, that two major Catholic high schools, Jesuit and Christian Brothers, have been forced to close!

In the last five years, 51 Catholic elementary and secondary schools in California have closed. Over 50,000 students have had to seek their education elsewhere. In the past school year alone (1969-70), it cost the taxpayers of California \$38 million dollars to educate those former Catholic school students in the public schools of the State.

Based on an average annual public school cost of \$750 per pupil, the Catholic schools of California save taxpayers \$233 million dollars a year! With escalating cost of education, a decline in the number of religious (priests, brothers, and nuns) available to staff the schools, and additional employment of qualified lay teachers to fill these positions, it is becoming increasingly difficult to support the Catholic school system in California through tuition and parish and diocesan subsidies.

Public school officials report that the costs of high school education in the Sacramento School District and San Juan School District range from \$750 to \$900 per pupil annually. Christian Brothers and Jesuit High Schools save these districts over \$1,000,000 each year. Parents who support Jesuit and Christian Brothers are presently denied any benefits from their State education taxes.
