Lasallian Education: An Introduction



Lasallian Education highlights the Lasallian mission of “transforming lives since 1680” and its commitment to “transformative experiences that are innovative and holistic.” All Lasallian educational institutions and ministries in the Region share this common identity which is centered on Catholic values and personal relationships.

Lasallian Education emphasizes excellence, faith formation, inclusion, respect for the individual, service and social justice.

Since 1680, educational institutions in more than 80 countries have been influenced by the vision and innovative spirit of Saint John Baptist de La Salle, the Founder of the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools and the patron saint of teachers. De La Salle transformed education by forming a community of educators with whom he developed a spirituality of teaching and learning, to give a human and Christian education to young people, especially the poor.

Today, the De La Salle Christian Brothers and their Partners continue to serve the young with the same vision as their founder, through advancements in teaching methodology, technology and scholarship. Lasallians reach out to those they serve by touching hearts, stimulating minds and cultivating leadership to prepare them for life, work, and service to society and the Church.

The Brothers of the Christian Schools

The Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools is committed to providing the young, especially the economically poor, with a human and Christian education, according to the ministry which the Catholic Church has entrusted to it. Together with more than 80,000 Lasallian Partners in almost a thousand educational ministries in 80 countries, nearly 5,000 Brothers continue this vision of their founder, St. John Baptist de La Salle. This worldwide religious community of educators is headquartered in Rome, Italy, and consists of five Regions that cover wide geographic areas throughout world.

The Lasallian Region of North America/Région Lasallienne de l'Amérique du Nord (RELAN) consists of the Districts of Eastern North America, Francophone Canada, Midwest, New Orleans-Santa Fe, and San Francisco. Approximately 2,760 Brothers and Partners serve more than 70,000 students through a network of 7 colleges/universities, 54 high schools (2 Cristo Rey), 16 middle schools (11 San Miguel), and 4 elementary schools. Other ministries, which total 28, include youth care facilities, residential and day treatment programs for young people with special educational and behavioral needs, retreat centers, after school programs, and summer camps.

The Founding



In 1694, De La Salle and 12 of his companions consecrated themselves to God for life, making vows of association for the education of the poor, stability, and obedience.

John Baptist de La Salle was born on April 30, 1651 in Reims, France, during the reign of Louis XIV. The eldest of 11 children, De La Salle was raised in the midst of privilege and modest wealth, and made known his intention to enter the priesthood at the age of 11. At 16, De La Salle was named Canon of the Reims Cathedral, a position of great honor and financial benefit, and one that placed him on a course for high ecclesiastical power.

In March 1679, a chance encounter with Adrien Nyel, a layman and an administrator of social services for the poor, met the young priest at the doorway of a convent the two men happened to be visiting. De La Salle was recruited by Nyel to assist with the opening of a parish school for poor boys. It was a reluctant first step on a journey that led De La Salle to new places he never envisioned for himself, including the founding of many more schools for poor boys and a religious community of lay teachers—men he called “Brothers”—to conduct those schools.

Led by God from one commitment to another, De La Salle gradually found himself immersed in the world of the poor and their desperate

The Brothers established a school in St. Genevieve, Missouri, which closed in 1822.

Four Brothers from France arrived in Montreal and established the first permanent foundation of the Institute in North America.

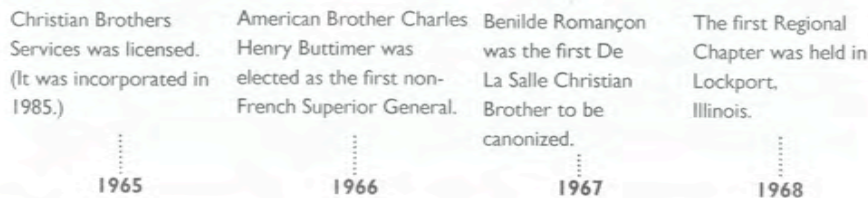

Established by the RCCB in 2011, the LEC is responsible for the oversight of mission formation/education programs and the expansion of mission-related activities and ministries. It also serves as a platform for mission-related collaboration among the Districts and creates greater partnerships within and outside the Lasallian world to strengthen the legacy of Saint John Baptist de La Salle.

THE OFFICE OF LASALLIAN EDUCATION is a new structure that helps guide the mission in the Region. It provides the Districts with programming and support services, including the Huether Lasallian Conference, the Buttimer Institute of Lasallian Studies, the Lasallian Leadership Institute, and the Lasallian Social Justice Institute. It also publishes the Regional magazine, *De La Salle Today*, and maintains an online presence. In addition, the Office coordinates the Institute's Twinning Program in the Region and assists the Lasallian Association of Secondary School Chief Administrators in planning and managing its annual conference.

THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS SERVICES is a nonprofit organization that administers cooperative programs in the areas of health/retirement, property/casualty and consulting/technology to church organizations. Founded in 1960, it started as a mutual cooperative purchasing group for Lasallian high schools in the Chicago area. Today, Christian Brothers Services administers and serves 11 trusts, which provide a variety of programs to congregations, organizations and dioceses in the U.S. and Canada.



Lasallian Volunteers

Lasallian Volunteers provide dedicated and professional service to Lasallian schools and agencies that serve an economically poor clientele. Acting out of faith, rooted in the Gospel, and sharing

community with the Brothers and other Lasallians, the Volunteers empower the poor by personalized service primarily through education. Lasallian Volunteers change the world for the better and discover themselves transformed in the process.

Since its inception in the 1980s, the program has grown into a national movement, with a staff working to recruit, train and support volunteers through the Christian Brothers Conference. From one volunteer in 1981-1982, the ensuing years saw an increase in the number of volunteers. Today, up to 50 men and women are commissioned each year to Lasallian ministries in some of the poorest neighborhoods of America. More than 500 volunteers have participated in this intense program of faith, community and service.



Formation and Education Programs

The Office of Lasallian Education conducts formation programs designed to deepen and strengthen the commitment of participants to the Lasallian mission and enhance their educational and leadership skills.

THE LASALLIAN LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

(currently on hiatus) began in 1997 and has served approximately 800 Lasallians by giving them a deeper understanding of Lasallian heritage and preparing them to

be leaders in the mission. The program is currently being evaluated and revised to meet current and future formation needs of Lasallians. An announcement of the new format will be made once plans are finalized.

THE BUTTIMER INSTITUTE OF LASALLIAN STUDIES provides participants with a deeper understanding and appreciation of the Lasallian charism through an in-depth study of John Baptist de La Salle's personal journey and the Lasallian spirituality and pedagogy. Two-week sessions are held for three consecutive summers. Graduate degree credits or professional development units are available.

THE LASALLIAN SOCIAL JUSTICE INSTITUTE grounds participants experientially, practically and spiritually in the Catholic Church's teachings on social justice and in the Lasallian mission of serving the poor. The week-long immersion program consists of four integrated components: a relational encounter with persons living in poverty; an examination of the Lasallian tradition and the Church teachings on poverty and social justice, as well as sociological and economic commentaries on these issues; a community of Lasallians who pray together and further discern their Lasallian vocation; and an exploration of their roles in creating programs of social justice as catalysts for influence and change in their local ministries.

THE HUETHER LASALLIAN CONFERENCE is an annual gathering of Lasallian educators in the Region that explores emerging educational issues and themes related to formation for mission and Lasallian spirituality. The conference concludes with a banquet honoring each District's Distinguished Lasallian Educators of the Year.

Professional Organizations

The chief administrators of educational institutions in RELAN have organized according to their respective levels of education for the purpose of working together and assisting each other in upholding and strengthening Lasallian educational values.

THE LASALLIAN ASSOCIATION OF COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY PRESIDENTS provides a forum for interaction and collaboration among the presidents of Lasallian colleges and universities in the Region. It meets regularly regarding common plans, programs, challenges and opportunities.

THE LASALLIAN ASSOCIATION OF SECONDARY SCHOOL CHIEF ADMINISTRATORS fosters and preserves a cooperative spirit among the chief administrators of Lasallian secondary schools in the Region. It establishes a forum for discussion and a vehicle for action whereby leaders collaborate in the promotion of the Lasallian mission. LASSCA also holds an annual conference for Lasallian chief administrators and board chairs.

Bethlehem University

Established in 1973 as the first Catholic university in the Holy Land, Bethlehem University plays a significant role in serving the educational and professional development needs of the Palestinian community, and in fostering inter-religious dialogue. Jointly founded by the Vatican and the De La Salle Christian Brothers, Bethlehem University opened its doors in 1973 with an enrollment of 112 students. Now, with more than 13,000 graduates since its founding, Bethlehem University annually enrolls more than 3,000 students in bachelor, master and professional diploma programs.



De La Salle Hall at Bethlehem University was built in 1893 to house the Christian Brothers elementary school known as Freres School. In 1973 Freres School moved to a different location and Bethlehem University was founded by three Brothers from the U.S.

Despite being closed 12 times by Israeli military imposed orders, the longest of which lasted for three years from October 1987 to October 1990, classes have continually been held on and off campus. Bethlehem University was one of the founding members of the Palestinian Council for Higher Education in 1978 and continues membership with the Ministry of Education and Higher Education resulting from the coming of the Palestinian Authority in 1995.

The USAT and Francophone Canada Regions joined to create the Lasallian Region of North America/Région Lasallienne de l'Amérique du Nord (RELAN).

Twinning Program



St. Mary's Secondary School in Nyeri, Kenya, opened on October 1, 1959. In 1990, the Brothers were asked by the Archbishop of Nyeri to take over administration of the school.

Twinning is an initiative from the center of the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools that encourages financially able Districts to aid those most in need. In response to the General Chapter's call for Twinning, the District Visitors of the former United States and Toronto Region launched a Twinning Program in 1995 to financially assist the Lwanga

District in Africa and enable it to achieve self-sufficiency in the long term.

Twinning partners each Lasallian school in RELAN with a Lasallian school in Ethiopia, Eritrea, Kenya, South Africa and Nigeria.

The annual Twinning appeal provides for the educational needs of African students who are economically poor or even without families. Financial contributions from Lasallian students in the U.S. and Canada are used to cover the cost of educating students in their respective twin schools. This includes tuition, teacher salaries, building/maintenance expenses, purchase of books and school supplies, etc., including board and lodging.

The Office of Lasallian Education coordinates the implementation of the Twinning Program in the Region. It is responsible for collecting contributions from schools, facilitating communication between twin schools and serving as a resource center.
