

Unbeaten Grid Mentor Will Enter U.S.C.

Seeks Teacher's Certificate and May Apply for New High Job Next Fall

The most successful football coach in Sacramento during the past season tendered his resignation yesterday.

Jimmy Flynn, whose Christian Brothers school prep elevens lost only one game in the two years he handled the reins, quit to enter the University of Southern California as a student.

He is seeking a teacher's certificate so that he will be eligible to apply for a football coaching post at a public high school.

This writer has information that Flynn will apply for the grid berth at the new Sacramen-

to main high school next fall, if he successfully passes the teachers' requirements.

Flynn will go to Los Angeles Monday, leaving the Brothers without a basketball coach the rest of the season and without a baseball mentor in the spring.

In announcing Flynn's resignation yesterday, Brother Patrick, principal of the Catholic school at 21st and Y streets, said:

Bud Hanna yesterday was named the head baseball and basketball coach at the Christian Brothers School.

Hanna succeeds Jimmy Flynn at the Twenty-first and Y Streets institution. Flynn resigned this week to enter the University of California.

Hanna is a graduate of the Brothers school and was a star on the diamond and the basketball court for the Irish. He also was a hoop luminary for St. Mary's College a few seasons ago.

The new pilot at the local school was a member of the Young Men's Institute quintet when it ruled the basketball teams in these parts when Jack Radonich and Louie Smith were tops.

Hanna also has had experience on the professional baseball field. Two years ago he was signed by the Sacramento Senators and saw service as an infielder.

He has played in the Sacramento Winter Baseball League and now is the second baseman for the Chinn-Beretta nine of the National division.

The basketball tossers at the Brothers will report to Hanna for the first time Monday afternoon when cage practice will be resumed after a layoff due to the holidays.

"We regret very much that Jimmy is leaving. He is one of the finest young men I have ever known and his record as a football coach speaks for himself. He is welcome back next season if he wants to come, but of course, we all want to see him get ahead."

This fall Flynn's gridmen were the only undefeated outfit in the Sacramento district, winning six games and tying one. The Brothers whipped Sacramento High, 13-0, and whipped a strong Grant Union High team, 24-0.

PREP CHAMPIONS

The team won the mythical city prep title for the first time in the school's history. Flynn coached the only two victories the Brothers ever scored at the expense of much bigger Sacramento High, in 1935 and this year.

The only game the Brothers under Flynn's two-year reign was to the champion Sacramento High eleven.
