

Christian Brothers High School dedicates new state-of-the-art science wing



Christian Brothers High School in Sacramento opened its new science, math, and technology wing on April 8. Bishop William K. Weigand presided at the dedication ceremony of the \$7.8 million, 34,000-square-foot addition. The wing includes chemistry, physics, and biology labs, seven additional math classrooms, multimedia and technology centers, and expanded publications areas. The expansion was the first construction project undertaken at Christian Brothers since the original campus
