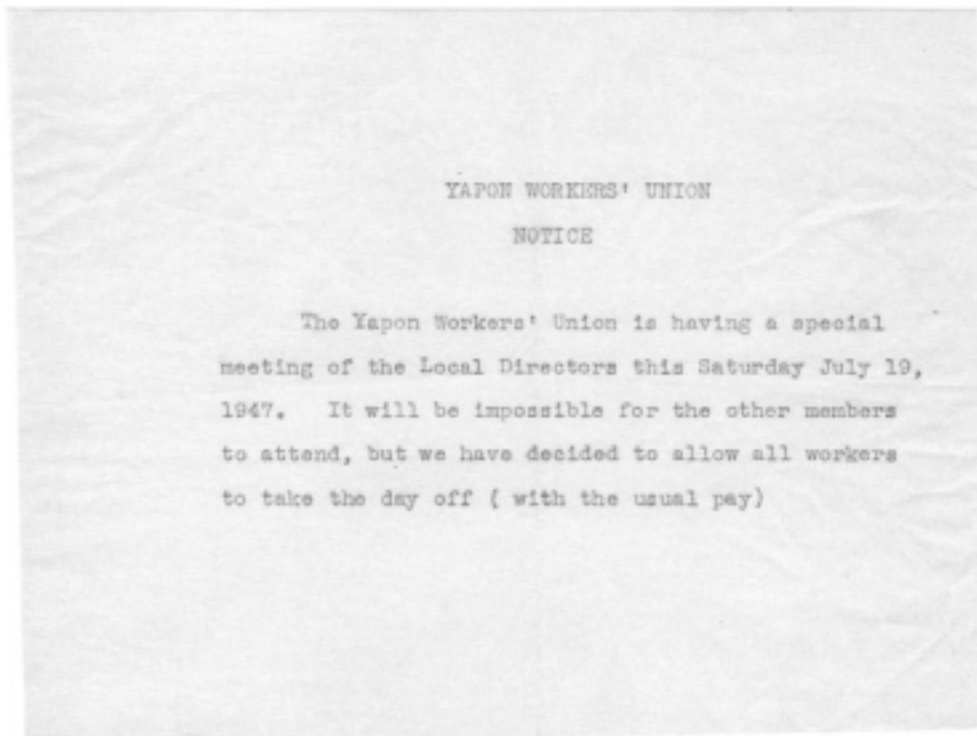
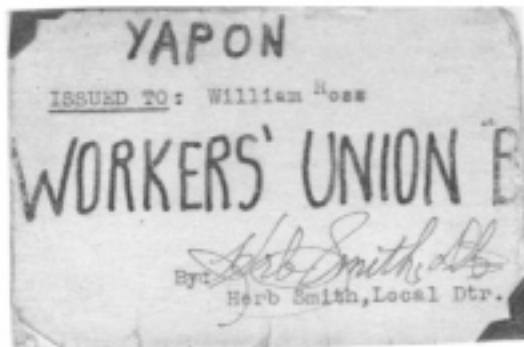
Grammar Team Wins Championship

Ray Clemens, new coach at the Frithers, made his initial bow before the home folks in impressive fashion. His charges had a lot of polish and made few mistakes during the 48 minutes," said the Bee reporting on the Gael-Dracoon game of the 1948 season. Last Year's Game

Sac High's Dragons had an uphill fight all the way in opening their 1948 season with a 13-0 win over Christian Brothers before 4,000 spectators in Hughes Stadium.

Until mid-way in the third quarter the Brothers held Sacramento scoreless—until Harry Slaughter feeted across on a 19 yard run. In the final period Bruce Ayers went a dozen yards for the other Sac score.

John Lusk-ot, Tom Connerston, Joe Crane, and Ray Molina helped the Gaels' cause by playing good defensive ball the entire game. For Sacramento, Roger Bolivar, Frank Bianchini, and John Calava were stalwarts in the line.

Though defeated, the Gaels made their best showing against the Dragons since 1936, when they beat Sac 14-0.

Eighteen of 29 games in the Sacramento-Christian Brothers rivalry have been won by the Dragons.

BROTHERS TURN BACK CRUSAD

Gaels Annex Fifth Straight; Ross Wins Alumni Award

Christian Brothers used a solid defensive line and a smashing ground offensive to mark up their fifth straight football victory of the year yesterday as they walloped Rioridan High of San Francisco, 37-0, before 2000 CBS Homecoming Day fans.

The triumph was the seventh in a row for coach Ray Clemens on the 21st and Broadway turf to preserve his record of never having lost a home game since he started coaching the Gaels in 1948.

CHRISTIAN BROTHERS scored twice in the opening minutes of the first quarter and tallied another in the second period to gain an 18-0 lead at halftime. The Gael varsity pushed over another score in the third quarter to put the game away but in the fourth, the reserves came up with two of their own to complete the rout.

The Brothers threw a little drama into the ball game in the second and fourth quarters. On both occasions they counted touchdowns as the gun barked the end of the half and the game.

Halfback Bill Bell heaved the punt in on the CBS 30, eluded several tacklers, jumped over another and was virtually in the clear on the Rioridan 30. As he crossed the 30 yard stripe, however, the ball bounded out of his arms and was bounced crudely on the turf where Rioridan's John Lannavechia scooped it up and started for the CBS goal. He didn't get far and was cut down on the Rioridan 26.

Towne and Gill smashed down Arata and Lannavechia in two plays for a total loss of 14 yards. A pass clicked for 36 yards but when Al Serafino went back to punt, the pass from center sailed over his head and the Gaels took over on the Rioridan 21.

THE GAELS couldn't score, however. On three straight plays, they were penalized 45 yards, and to top off the Gaels' woes, a bad pass from center on Sweeney's punt try gave Rioridan possession on the Gael 43. During the penalty series, the Gaels went into the end zone twice for scores, only to have them nullified.

Christian Brothers went 38 yards for its final score in the second quarter. Dick Traversi used a quick opener to go 14 yards and Bell rolled 22 to the three. With 15 seconds left, O'Donnell smashed for the tally.

Near the end of the third period, the Gaels used the air lines to get their fourth touchdown. O'Donnell took a straight snap back from center and passed on a line to Ross for 27 yards to the Rioridan 17. Castro moved for four and Sweeney passed to Towne on the right flank in the clear and the big end eased into yardir.

OVER

Individual stars were difficult to distinguish among the hard hitting Gael forwards and the ground sulking backs. But, it was end Bill Ross whose sparkling play field was particularly outstanding and he was named by sportswriters to receive the Christian Brothers alumni trophy. Dr. James Keating made the presentation after the game as Gael rooters and players alike cheered for the hard hitting Gael flanker.

THE GAELS, using their ace fullback Tom O'Donnell sparingly because of a recently mended ankle, moved at will against the Crusaders as the forwards chopped sniping holes in the enemy line. They ran for 348 yards on the ground and added 94 more on four passes.

The Crusaders, using a widely spread offense with two backs deep, couldn't move on the ground as the Gaels moved in time after time to cut them down for long losses. It was Ross, end Will Towne and tackle Tom Gill leading the charge. Riordan wound up with a minus 83 yards from rushing. Their three completed passes out of 13 attempts netted them 45 yards, leaving them in the red by 28 yards in the statistics.

In addition, Riordan was held to only one first down, in the fourth period.

ROSS STARTED the Gaels to their first touchdown of the game when he floated back to intercept quarterback Ray Arata's first pass, a short toss over the line.

Halfback Dick Castro flanked the left side for 10 yards on the first play and a first down on the Riordan 27. O'Donnell smashed for five and Sweener sliced the center for three more. O'Donnell's smash over center netted three yards and another first down on the 16.

Castro slashed left tackle for three and O'Donnell's romp around right end for eight yards gave the Gaels a new series on the five. In two plays O'Donnell went for one yard and four yards, respectively, for the touchdown. O'Donnell's conversion try was wide.

TOWNE'S KICKOFF went out of bounds and Riordan took over on its own 40 yard line. A Crusader line try gained two yards and Arata passed incompletes.

TACKLE JOHN FACINO recovered Jim Aguirre's fumble on the Riordan 43 to set up the fifth tally. Pat Bobo, Charles Stratfield, Tony Latino and Tom Santos composed the Gael backfield at the time, and the yearlings weren't to be stopped.

They moved to the Riordan 24 in five plays but were moved back 15 yards by a holding penalty. Then Sanchez punted 39 yards to end George Thomas for the touchdown.

The same set cracked the end once again four plays later when Facino again recovered a fourth down fumble on the Riordan 15. They did it in one try on a bit of razzle-dazzle. Stratfield pitched out to Sanchez who lateralized to Latino with the latter going over standing up.

Immaculate Conception and Christian Brothers grammar schools played to a 12-12 tie in a flag football game preliminary.

3 Lions and Gaels Chosen; Lone Grant Pacer Tabbed

Sacramento High Dragons annexed four positions on The Sacramento Union's 1951 All-City football team as selected by the captain's prep coaches and The Union sports staff. McClatchy and Christian Brothers each gained three berths with Grant Union landing one when final ballots were tabulated.

On the second team, the Dragons, Lions and Gaels were equally represented with three players each and Grant picked up another to land two on the team.

ALTHOUGH NEARLY EVERY player selected for the first team was a unanimous choice of the judges, second team voting was split with some 20 players nominated.

This year's team is completely dominated by seniors and, of the 11 prep stars picked, only Joe Uln, fullback from Sacramento High, is a holdover from the 1950 team.

Uln missed a good part of the season for the Dragons but his performances in the games in which he participated made him an overwhelming choice for the fullback position.

ULIN IS A 285 POUNDER who hits hard through the middle and has exceptional speed for a big player, enabling him to run the ends well. He's a good blocker and plays defense well.

The team has speed and size which combine to make it one of the hardest hitting ever selected as the mythical team of capital prepdom. Several of the players are destined for future success on the college gridiron.

Christian Brothers' Tom O'Donnell gives the unit two pile driving backs in the backfield. O'Donnell would carry on in this combination as a halfback with Mickey Goncalves of McClatchy. A fullback for the Gaels, O'Donnell was the city's leading scorer this season with 101 points.

GONCALVES GIVES THE UNIT a runner with good speed and open field running. The McClatchy back has the ability to hit a hole quickly and to slide off would-be tacklers. A long striding runner, he breaks away easily and has a good change of pace for defensive men to cope with.

In the T-formation, the Lions' Chuck Pollard won in a photo finish for the quarterback berth. Pollard is an accurate passer and good ball handler. He's big enough at 6-1, 288 pounds, to handle the T-post successfully. In addition to these chores, Pollard would inherit the conversion duties. Throughout the season he has been the most consistent of the city's conversion specialists.

He aggressive and a great team player.

Dale Gardner, 5-3, 190 pounds, is the team's center. Ganda played offensive center for the Dragons and defensive linebacker He performed well at both jobs, especially as a linebacker pit ging holes whenever they appeared in the Sacramento forwa wall.—By A. R.

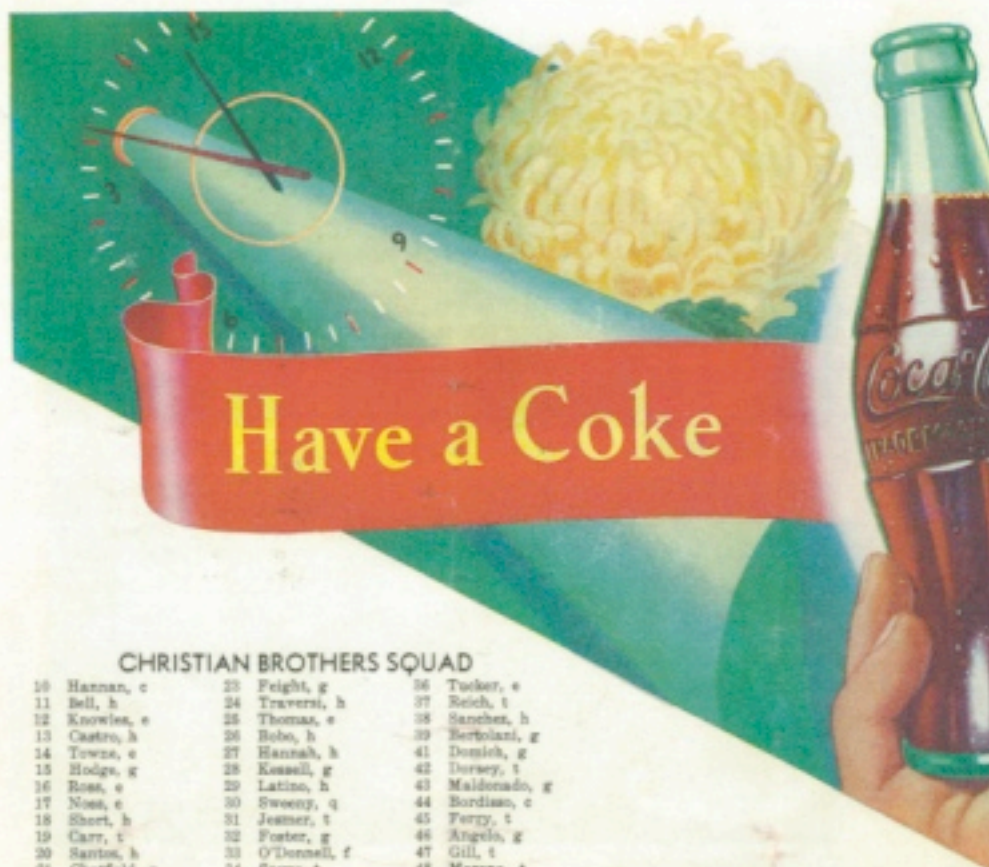

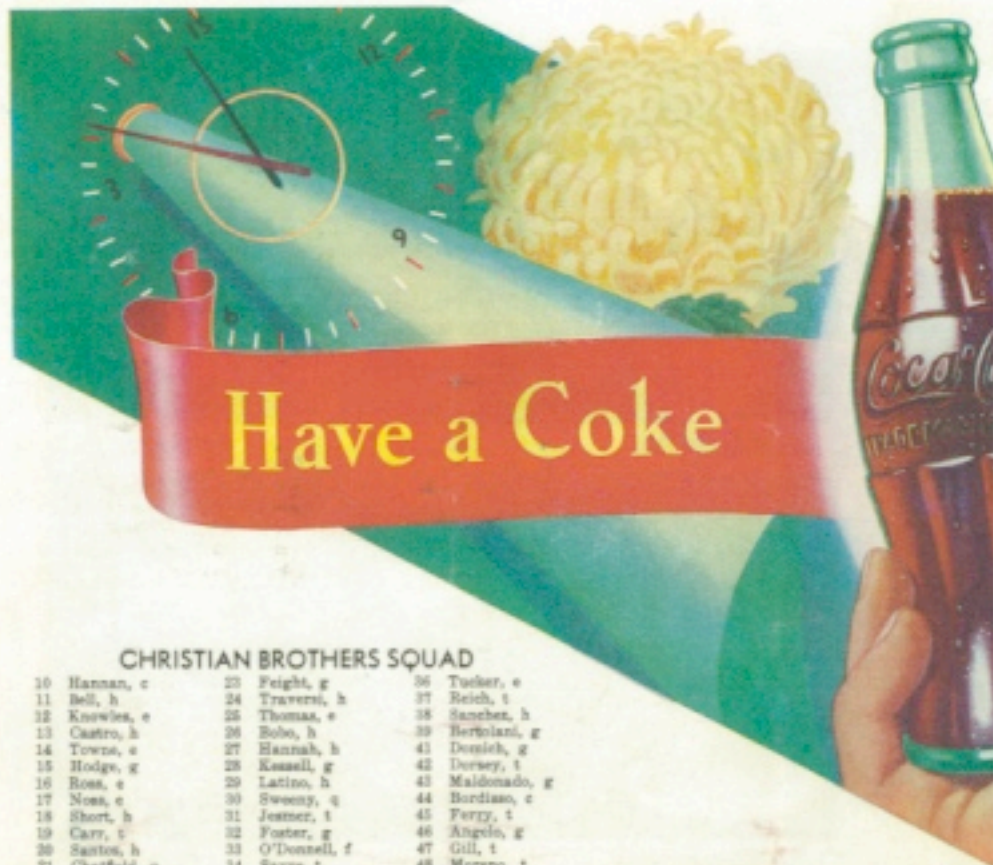

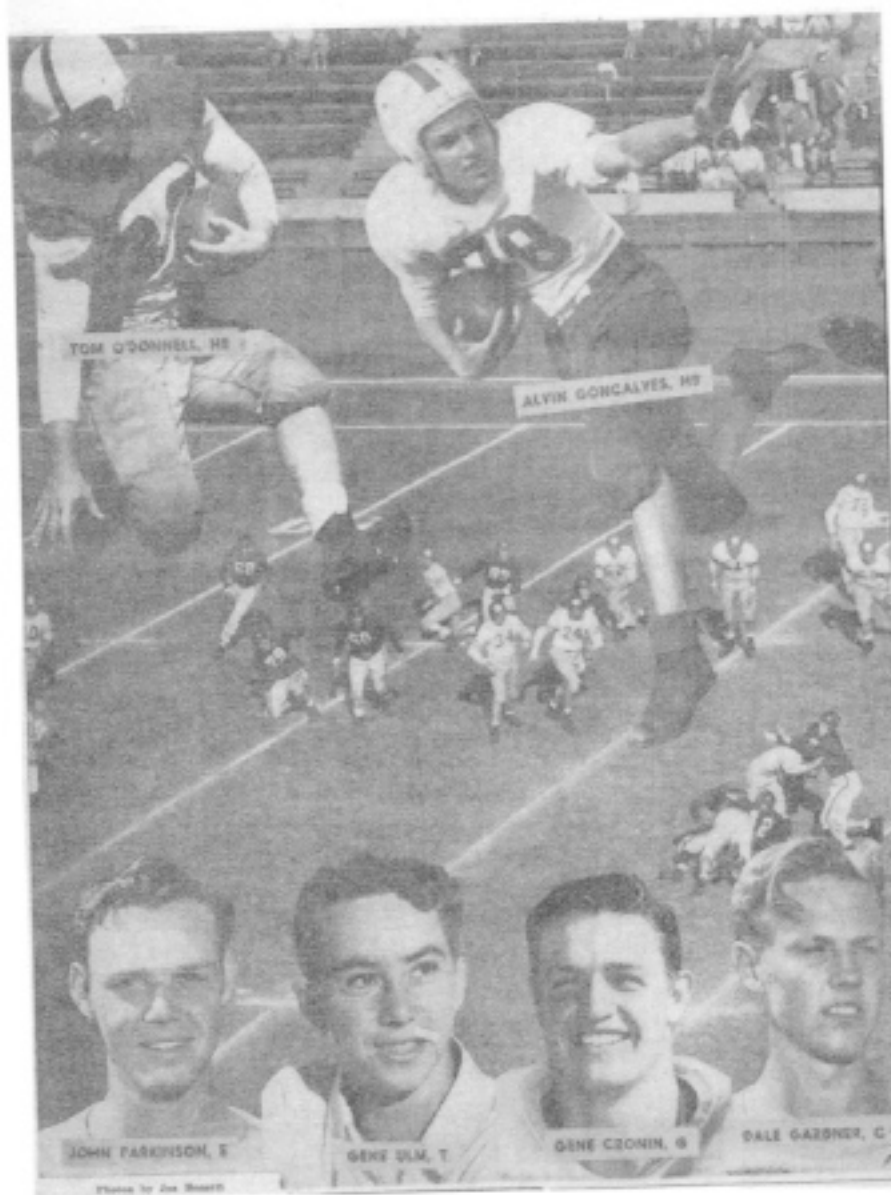
