Roger Goodell, Commissioner of the NFL, sent footballs to the High Schools who had graduates that were on the roster of teams that played in a Super Bowl.

Eason Ramson of Christian Brothers was on the roster of the San Francisco 49ers of the NFL that played against Cincinnati Bengals of the AFL in Super Bowl XVI. The year was 1982 and 49ers won 27 to 21.

Eason graduated from Christian Brothers in 1974. While there he was known to be a hard working athlete.

He received a four year scholarship to Washington State and graduated in 1978.

He was drafted by the Green Bay Packers in 1978 in the 13th round as a tight end and released to the St. Lewis Cardinals the same year.

The next year he played for the San Francisco 49ers and played for them until 1983.

He played for the Buffalo Bills in 1985 and retired later that year.

During his professional career Eason caught 104 passes for 983 yards.
