Cardinal's Traverso' looks ahead

Monday wasn't a day of doom and despair on the Farm, Matt Traverso was saying.

Stanford firing football coach Walt Harris can be viewed as a new beginning, the tight end and team leader from Christian Brothers High School insisted.
