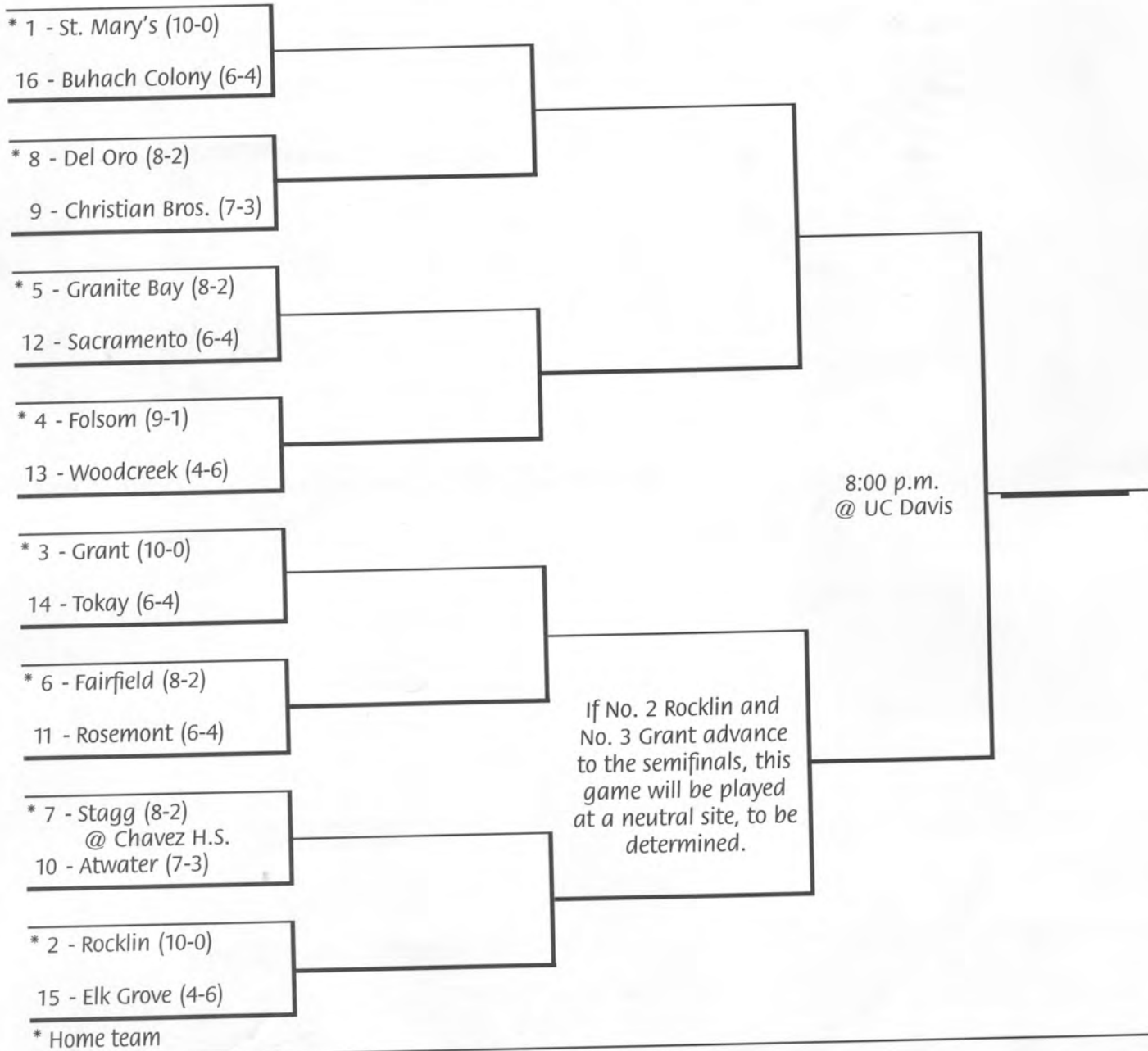

TONIGHT'S MATCHUP

Golden Eagles, Falcons set to Battle in Round One

The Christian Brothers football team started their season off on a positive note beating Burbank High School 36-20. Although the Falcons dropped their second game of the year to San Joaquin Memorial of Fresno 31-6, the team responded by beating long time rival Jesuit High School the next week convincingly 21-6 and finished the pre-season 2-1.

Entering league play CBS lost their opener 9-12 to Union Mine. The Diamondbacks kicked a field goal with 41 seconds remaining to win the game. The Falcons responded the next two weeks with convincing wins over Ponderosa (48-23) and Lathrop (41-0). Week seven saw the Falcons come just short of a comeback falling 31-28 to Oak Ridge after being behind in 17-0 in the second half.

With their playoff lives at stake, the Christian Brothers Falcons got red hot winning their last three games by an average margin of 31 points. Last week, the Falcons took the field against Vista Del Lago trying to secure second place in the SVC. Christian Brothers dominated the game throughout on their way to a 29-13 victory.

The Falcon defense was stout holding the Eagle offense to only 240 yards of total offense and intercepting Vista quarterback Anthony Mull twice. Offensively, CBS was led by Michael Lahey who threw for a touchdown, ran for another, and kicked a 36 yard field goal. The 6'1" quarterback has led the team all season throwing for over 1000 yards and rushing for nearly seven yards a carry. The Falcons have also had good production in their running attack from Julien Winters and Corey Crowder as the two have combined for over 1200 yards and 13 touchdowns.



Del Oro started its 50th anniversary off with a red hot football season winning its opener against California High School 28-21. The team rolled through the rest of the pre-season beating Cardinal Newman, Franklin, Merced, and Vintage by an average of 35 points. Bryce Pratt and the Golden Eagles shattered records on their way to a perfect pre-season and a number one ranking in Division II.

The team opened Sierra Foothill League play against Granite Bay. In front of a capacity crowd, the Golden Eagles held on to defeat the Grizzlies in overtime. Del Oro followed this epic battle up with another impressive victory over Roseville winning 49-0. Junior quarterback Max Magleby continued his impressive season with a 9-11, 201 yard, and three touchdown performance.

It didn't take long for the Golden Eagle defense to return to form, as they blocked a punt on the Vikings first possession and intercepted an Alex Ford pass on the second. The team harassed Oakmont into three turnovers that night and kept them out of the end zone, until late in the game.

Equally as impressive was the offensive side of the ball where Bryce Pratt added four more rushing touchdowns to his career record and finished with a 116 yards. Back up Ibrahim Abukhdair also got it going, with 66 yards and two touchdowns of his own. The airiel attack was also on display as Magleby threw for over 200 yards and hooked up with Spencer Butterfield for two touchdowns as well. When it was over Coach Taylor felt good about the 56-8 victory and where the team was headed, going into the playoffs.

“We needed to get a little momentum going into the playoffs,” Coach Taylor said. “Now the post-season starts and we have to stay focused.”

Del Oro has faced Christian Brothers in each of their last three playoff appearances winning all three games. The Golden Eagles won 37-7 in 2005 and 46-12 in 2006. The last matchup in 2007 was a virtual shootout with both teams finding the end zone early and often, until the Del Oro pulled away late with a 48-32 victory. With the speed of the Falcons and the high powered Golden Eagle attack, fans could be in for another exciting contest between these two teams.

Playoff Team Reviews

#1 St. Mary's

Undefeated and ranked #1 in the section the Rams enter the playoffs as one of the favorites to reach the section finals. Fresh off their third Tri-City Athletic League championship, St. Mary's looks to win its second consecutive section championship and a return trip to the state bowl game. Led by quarterback Marcus McDade and running back Maurice Howze the Rams will be tough to stop.

#2 Rocklin

Playing in arguably the toughest league in the section Rocklin escaped the SFL unscathed. At 10-0, the team finished undefeated for the first time in school history and is looking to return to the section final game for the first time since 2005. The Thunder are led by quarterback Jimmy Laughrea and running back Jackson Cummings. The duo has accounted for over 3600 yards and 45 touchdowns.

#3 Grant

As the #1 ranked team in the state and reigning state champion, Grant High School returns to the playoffs riding a 23 game winning streak. The Metro league champions are led by running back Devontae Butler and a stifling defense, the team has only given up 36 points the entire season. The Pacers again look to be the favorites to bring home another section title.

#4 Folsom

At 9-1, the Folsom Bulldogs come into the playoffs as the Delta River League champions. Led by quarterback Dano Graves the Bulldogs high powered offense hasn't been held below 20 points all season and have only failed to score less than 40 twice this year.

#5 Granite Bay

The early SFL favorite, Granite Bay suffered back to back losses to league rivals Del Oro and Rocklin. While this ended their hopes of a league title, the Grizzlies enter the playoffs battle tested and ready for redemption. Led by running back Devaunte Bolton and Sophomore quarterback Brendan Keeney the Grizzlies fly sweep attack is always tough to stop.

#6 Fairfield

Fairfield enters the playoffs with an 8-2 record. With their only two losses to Benicia and Vacaville in weeks five and six, the Falcons come are riding a four game winning streak. Led on both sides of the ball by quarterback/linebacker Tra'mayne Bondurant, Fairfield averages well over 300 yards a game.

#7 Stagg

After a 6-5 season and third place finish in 2008, the Delta Kings improved to 8-2 and finished second to undefeated St. Mary's in the Tri-City Athletic League. Riding a four game winning streak, the team will continue to look to quarterback Aaron Raya and running back Theo Wofford. Wofford rushed for 105 yards, caught five passes, and scored two touchdowns in the team season finale against Lodi last week.

#8 Del Oro

Del Oro returns to the playoffs after struggling last season. Led by the offensive trio of Magleby, Pratt, and Butterfield the Golden Eagles are tough to stop. Defensively, the team is much improved. Setbacks against Woodcreek and Rocklin moved the team down to the number eight seed but as always the five time section champion looks to make some noise in the playoffs again this season.

#9 Christian Brothers

Christian Brothers comes into the playoffs on a three game winning streak. After finishing second in the Sierra Valley Conference, the team feels they have the speed to cause problems for teams in the playoffs. Led by quarterback Michael Lahey and Julian Winters, the Falcons won't go down easy.

#10 Atwater

Atwater rebounded from a 41-0 loss to Los Banos in week nine to defeat Turlock 41-10 last week. With the win the Falcons finished 7-3 and second in the Central California Conference. Senior Quarterback Nathan Sanchez leads the team in passing and rushing averaging nearly 200 yards per game.

#11 Rosemont

Rosemont finished third in the Metro league behind state power Grant and Burbank High School. The team comes into the playoffs hungry after an upset loss to non-league opponent Union Mine in week 10. Led by quarterback Anthony Enriquez the Wolverines are hoping to pull off an upset and make it to the second round of the playoffs.

#12 Sacramento

Sacramento High struggled to start the season losing four of their first six games. The team responded by turning things around and winning their last four games of the season. Led by running back Clinton Johnson, the Dragons hope their speed will be enough to get by Granite Bay.

#13 Woodcreek

The team no one wanted to face in the playoffs as the team has upset both Del Oro and Del Campo during the regular season. Woodcreek will look to match Folsom's passing attack with their ground game. As running back James Nunley goes so do the Timberwolves. A four year starter, Nunley is averaging over 180 yards a game.

#14 Tokay

At 6-1, Tokay looked to be one of the best teams in the section. Three consecutive losses to end the season drop the Tigers to the #14 seed and a first round match-up with Grant. Led by dual threat Seth Siddle-Mitchell, the Tigers will try to pull off one of the most stunning first round upsets of all time.

#15 Elk Grove

Playing one of the toughest pre-season schedules, Elk Grove compiled a regular season record of 4-6. The Thundering Herd finished the season on a high note winning three of their last four in the tough Delta Valley League which was good enough for third place and a playoff birth. Led by quarterback Alex Angell, the team will travel to Rocklin and take on the Thunder.

#16 Buhach Colony

Buhach Colony enters the playoffs with a 6-4 record. The team put a scare into league champion Los Banos last week falling 47-48. The team is led by running back Corey Chapman who is averaging 17 points per game. Also impressive was fellow running back Dallan Muse who ran for five touchdowns in the loss last week.
