

# Christian Brothers High School — Fast Facts

The 2020-21 school year marks CB's 145th year of Lasallian Catholic education in Sacramento.

The foundation of our mission as a Lasallian Catholic school is the spiritual development of our students. Students explore and experience faith in a community steadfastly dedicated to finding and fostering God-given gifts. A four-year retreat program and monthly liturgies enrich the faith experience for students and families.

## Graduation Requirements (270 Credits):

- 9 semesters of English
- 6 semesters of Math
- 2 semesters of Visual or Performing Arts
- 7 semesters of Social Studies
- 4 semesters of Lab Science
- 2 semesters of Physical Education
- 4 semesters of Foreign Language
- 8 semesters of Religious Studies
- 12 semesters of an Elective

*99% of CB graduates typically enroll in college. Recent graduates were offered admission to Georgetown, MIT, Notre Dame, Stanford, Cal, all three military academies, all eight Ivy League schools, and many more throughout the country and abroad. Members of the Class of 2020 are attending colleges in 24 states, the District of Columbia and three foreign countries.*

*CB leads the region in providing need-based tuition assistance. This year, the school is providing \$3 million to 450 deserving young men and women.*

*CB offers 32 Honors and Advanced Placement courses.*

*CB athletes participate in 27 varsity sports. Professional athletic trainers work personally with student-athletes and coaches to develop and implement sport-specific training programs.*

CB's Media, Visual & Performing Arts Program offers courses in:

- Instrumental Music
- Media Arts (Video Production & Journalism)
- Theatre Arts
- Visual Arts
- Vocal Music

Four-year programs allow for advanced study in instrumental music, visual arts and vocal music.

CB provides students with a four-year comprehensive counseling program, dedicated grade-level counselors, two full-time college counselors, and a wellness program to proactively address the many challenges facing teens today.

*As we navigate the COVID-19 pandemic, CB's HyFlex schedule allows students to learn online, in person, and in a combination of the two as necessitated by changing health conditions.*

**Pathway to Engineering Program**  
*CB offers a sequence of UC-approved engineering courses for high school students that begins with Introduction to Engineering in year one, followed by Principles of Engineering, Civil Engineering and Architecture, and Aeronautical Engineering. Curiosity, innovation and imagination are the order of the day.*

*More than 40 student clubs and activities help students become involved in campus life outside of the classroom.*
