Both Sacred Heart in San Francisco and CBS in Sacramento used the word "college" in a different sense than we do. Students at both schools (starting in 1874 and 76) used the word college to include some courses that were offered in the high school curriculum. If a student took it the credit would be recognized through St Mary's College. The title that included "College" persisted for a long time.

As for the term "Institute" as used by CBS, I believe it was in recognition of the "Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools," otherwise know popularly as the Christian Brothers or DeLaSalle Brothers.

Unfortunately, today the Christian Brothers of Ireland, an religious order that based their rules and constitutions on the De La Salle Brothers, has had a lot of trouble with sexual abuse of kids especially in Australia. So to distance the CB Brothers from that stain, the title DeLaSalle Brothers is being used. The Christian Brothers of Ireland run Iona College in New York and their nickname is very familiar to you, "Gaels."
