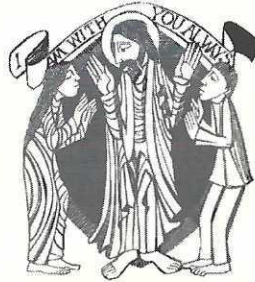
Welcome to the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament.



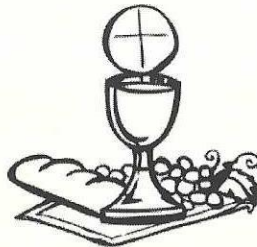

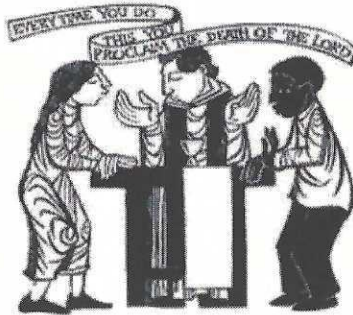
