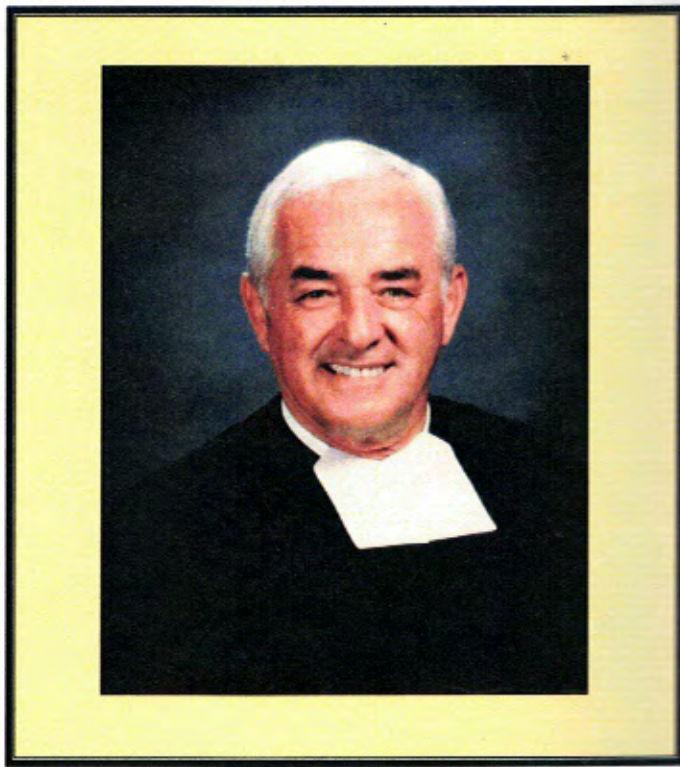

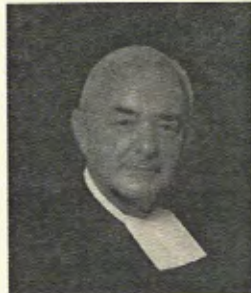

Who are the Brothers?

Together and by Association

Brothers serve others through education

..... Brothers commit themselves to giving a human and Christian education to the young, especially those in situations of poverty, according to the ministry the Church has entrusted to them and to the service they personally are assigned.

Brothers live in community and pray daily

..... Together, Brothers share prayer, Mass, meals, social time as well as support and challenge each other to grow in their vocation, spiritually, professionally, and in their ministry of service. They look upon everything with faith so as to grow in their relationship with God, others and their lives.

Brothers consecrate themselves to God

..... Brothers educate and minister to others through the daily witness of the vow of poverty, chastity and obedience. The De La Salle Christian Brothers profess these vows, in addition to two others particular to their Institute: the vow of association for the service of the poor through education and the vow of stability, that is, living a lifetime commitment to the Brothers' ministries officially recognized by the Church

Brothers live the spirit and charism of a long tradition

..... Brothers live with the conviction that the Holy Spirit is manifested in the life, work and writings of Saint John Baptist de La Salle, their founder (1651-1719), proclaimed Patron of all Educators, in the living tradition of their Institute and in all their ministries.

Brothers share their mission in a global "Institute"

..... Brothers serve in a local province known in the Order as a "District". Brothers may be called to serve in one of over 80 countries of the world where they educate, serve, and minister in the Church and to humanity. There are approximately 9000 Brothers throughout the world. The Institute is officially called the Brothers of the Christian Schools, more commonly known around the world as the De La Salle Christian Brothers. It is the largest religious order in the Catholic Church exclusively of Brothers.

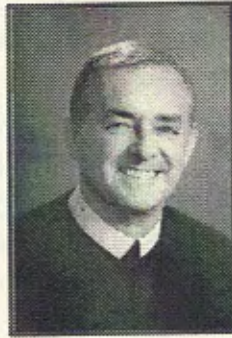
Brothers have a "distinct" vocation

..... Each Brother takes responsibility for integrating within his own person the consecration to God as a lay religious professing a committed life of faith, community and service of Christian education or related ministries. Brothers and Priests are two distinct religious vocations. Brothers serve the Church through some specialized mission, some kind of ministry. Priests usually serve the Church in parishes where they celebrate Mass and provide for other Sacraments. Brothers in their consecration and Priests in their ordination commit to a lifetime of celibacy which is essential to their respective vocations.

Brothers profess final vows for life

..... Brothers through their profession of vows become "Brothers" among themselves and to all they are privileged to serve. Their life of dedication and commitment reflects Jesus' words: "...always remember, you did not choose me...It is I who chose you."
