

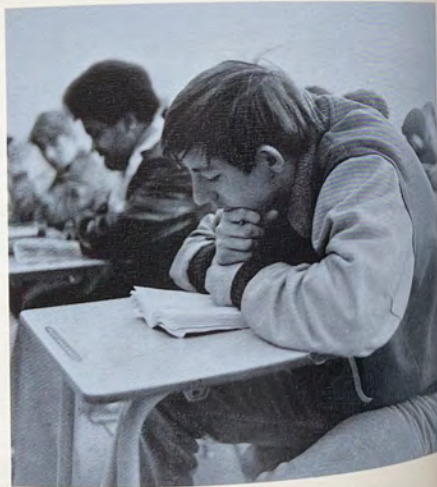
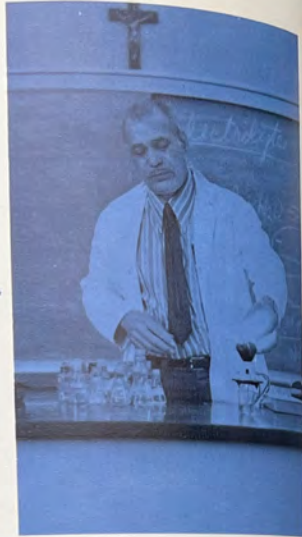


## NOTHING HAPPENED

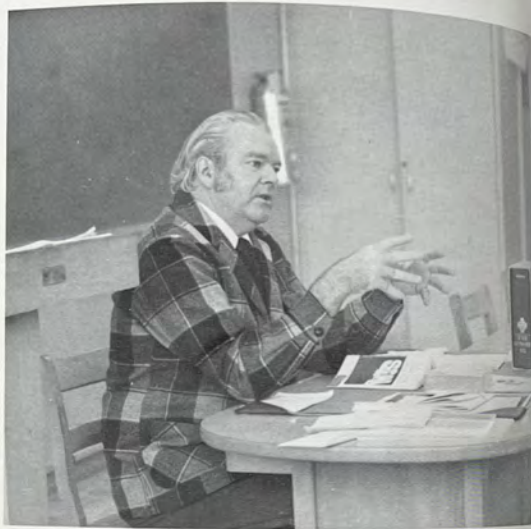




## THE BELIEF OF LIFE

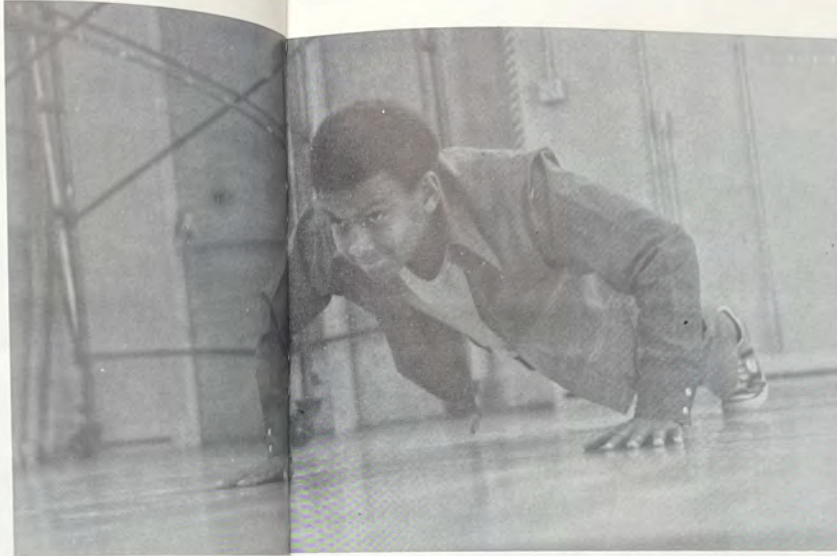


## COMMUNICATION

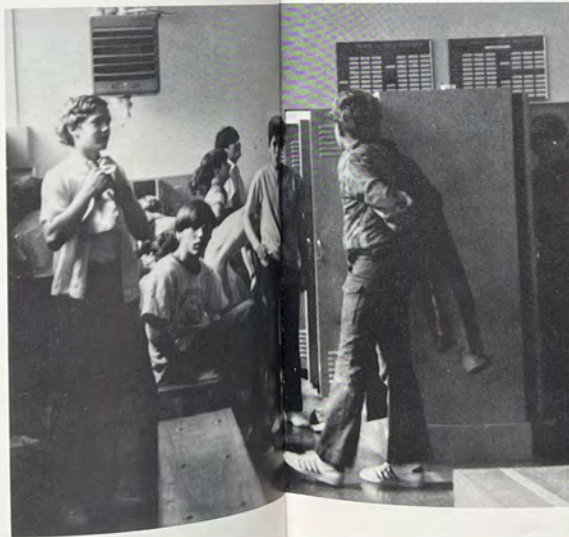

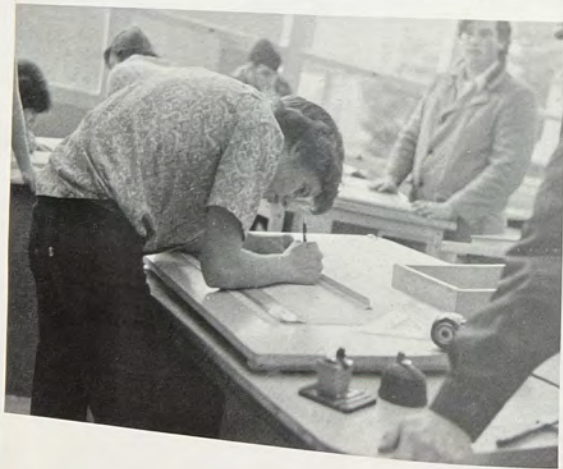
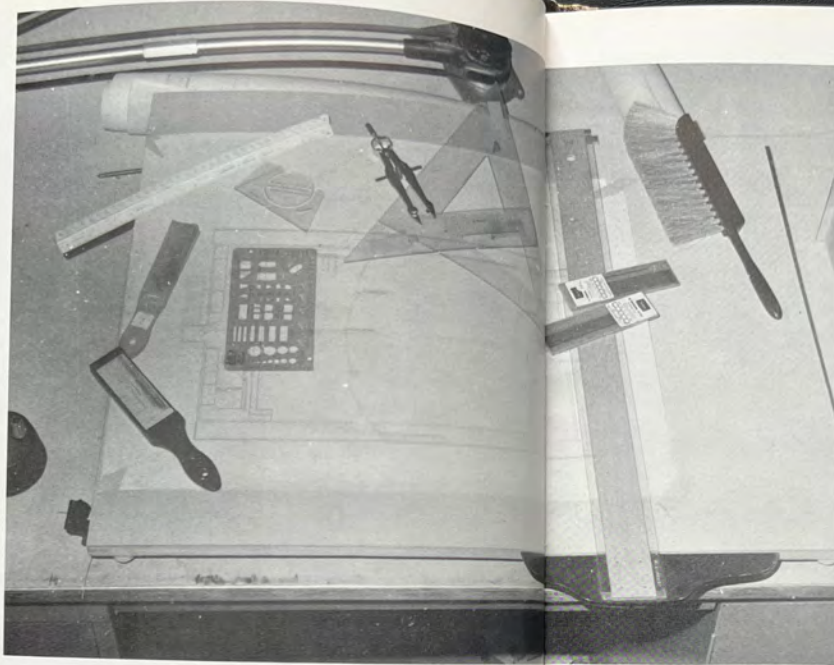




## DESIGN

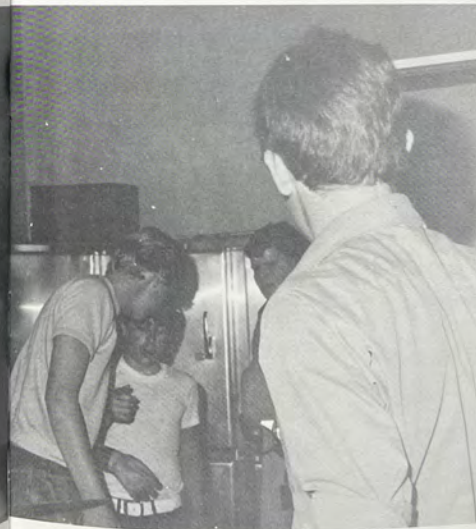




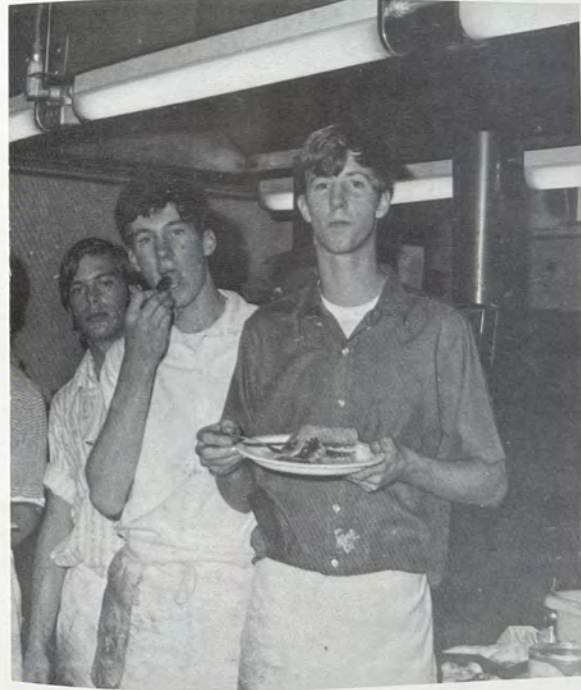
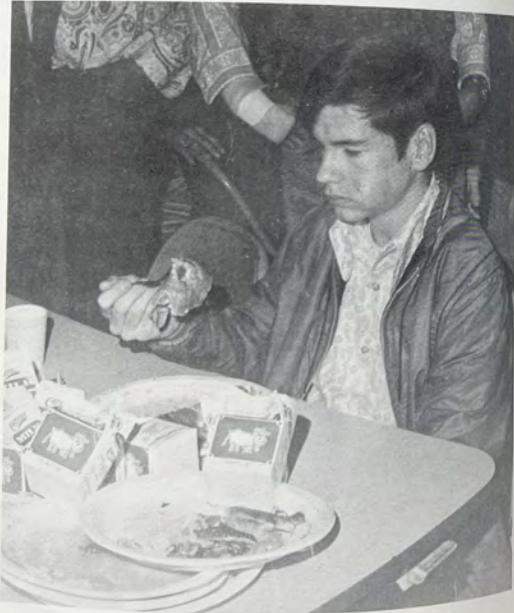
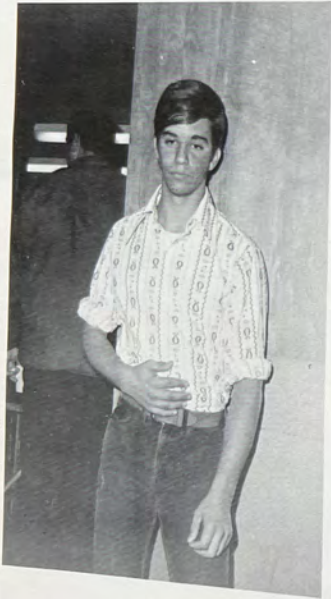
## CELEBRATION

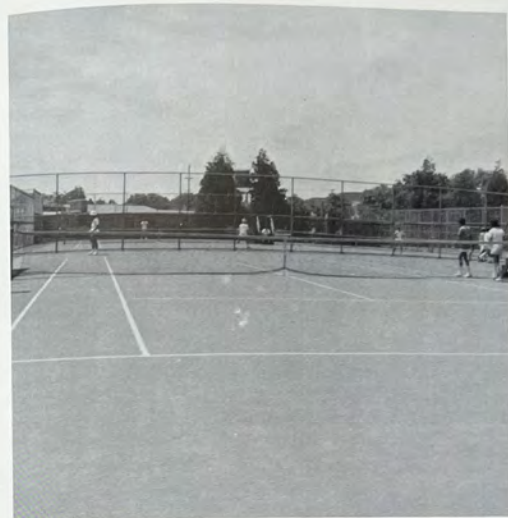
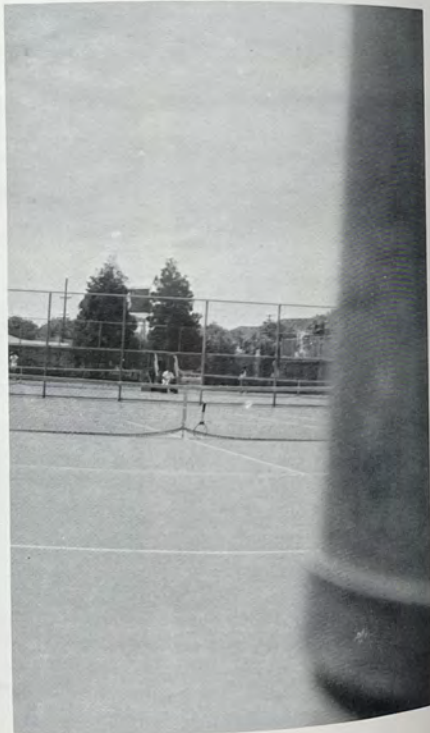
The swim team, made up largely
