

What did you like about the show/story of the show?


What I love about <u>No, No, Nanette</u> is how different each character is, but how they all interact with each other; and the tap dancing.


Open Mic has been an institution at Christian Brothers since 2002. 21 years later, the club decided to introduce something new and revive something old.

When asked about this year, he reported that it has been fantastic and so nice to be back at CB, the place to be.





















