Principal's Message

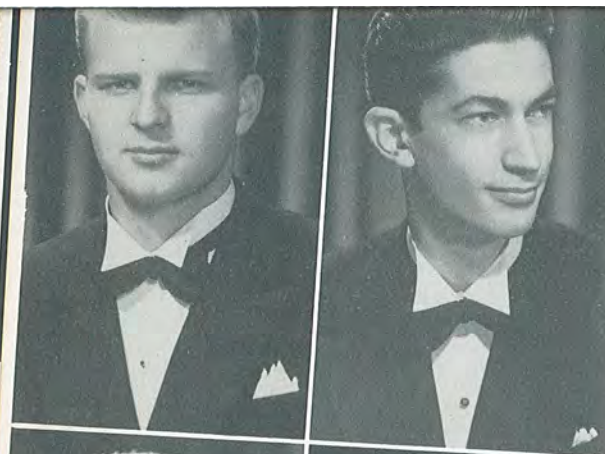
Dear Graduates:

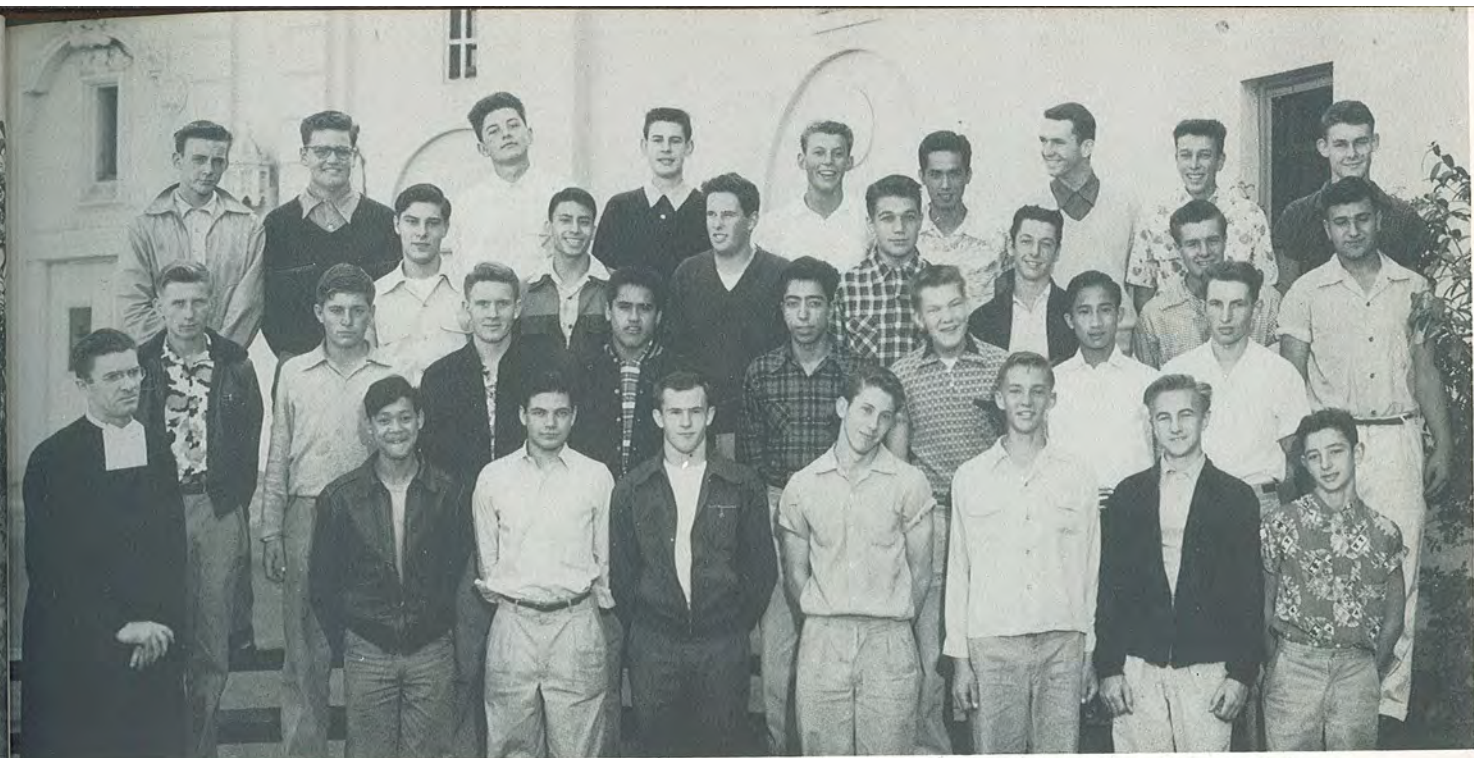
Sophomores

Class 119 took honors in the Propagation of Faith drive.



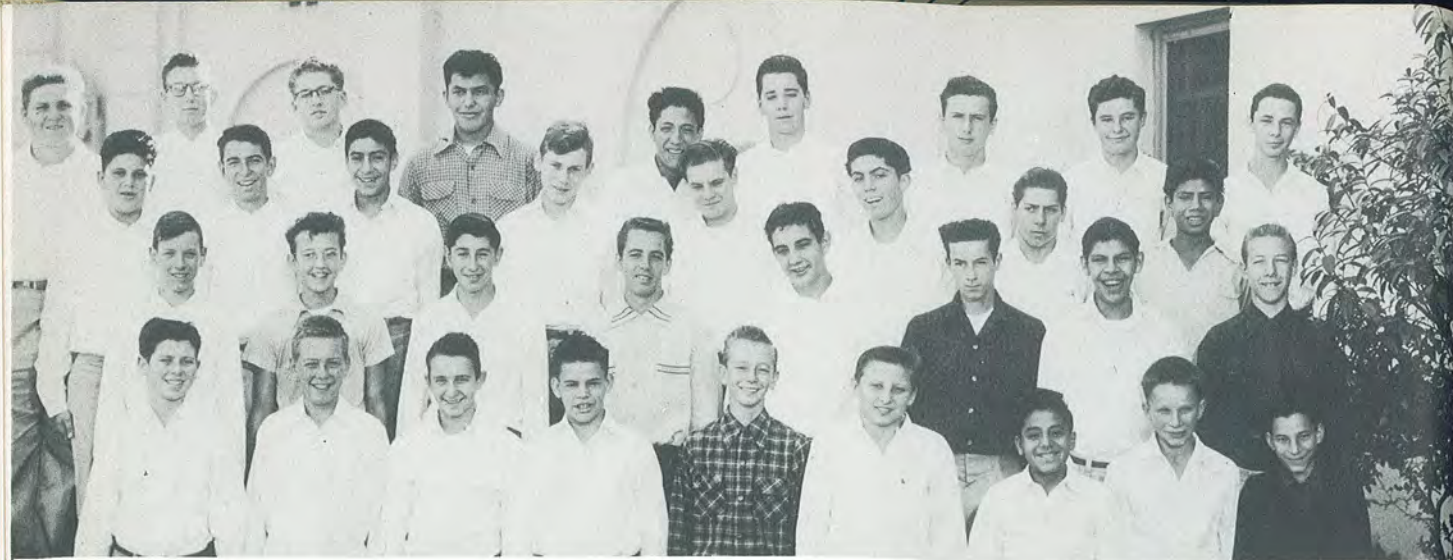

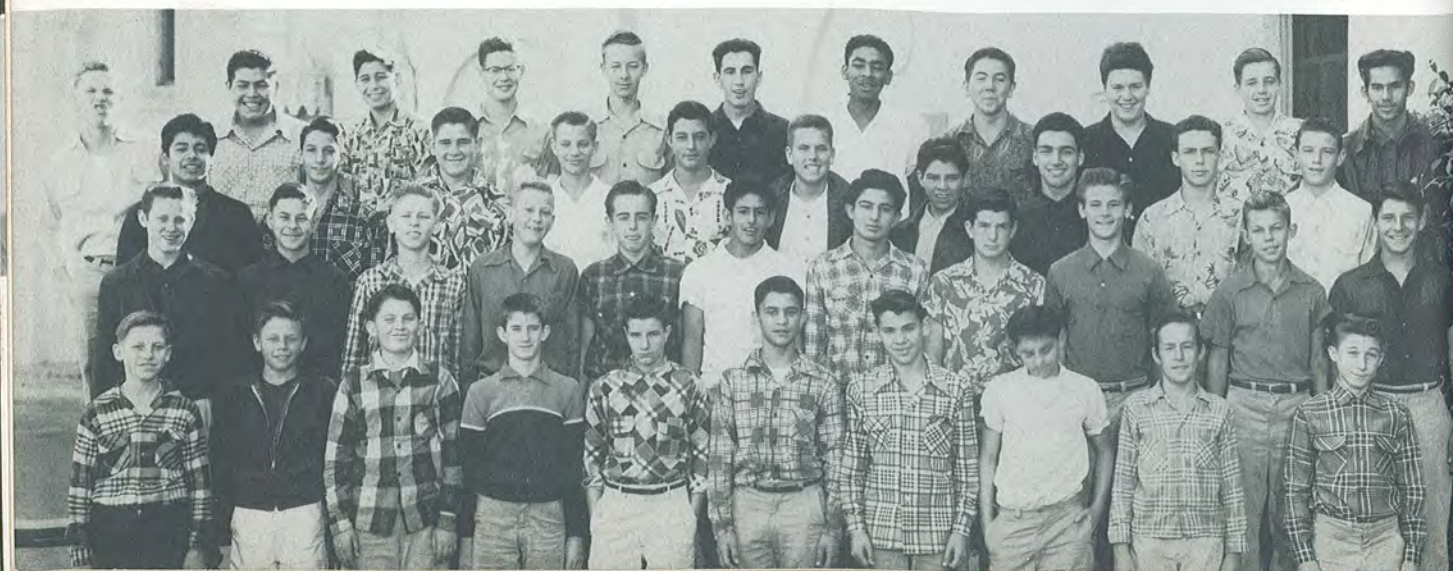
Freshmen

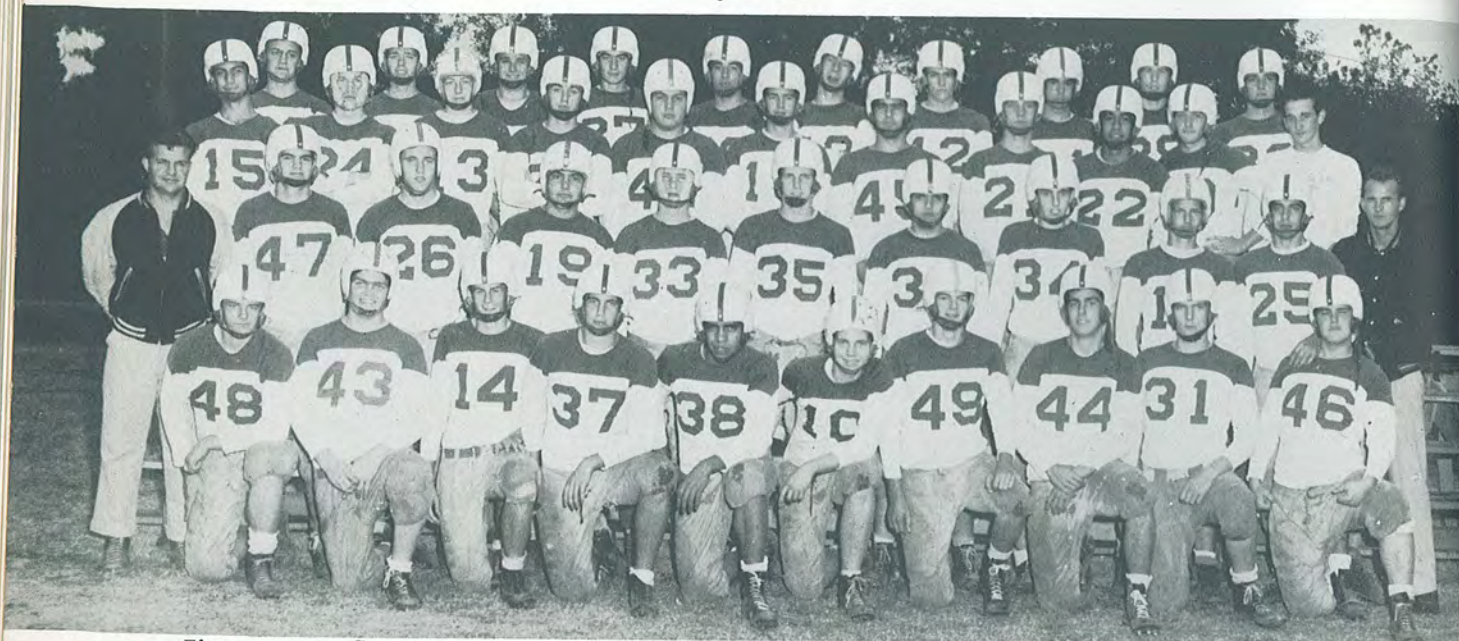

At this time street cleaner Bob Foiles came up and threw paper into the trash can. So, having nothing else to do I am retiring to the Home for Tired Yearbook Writers.

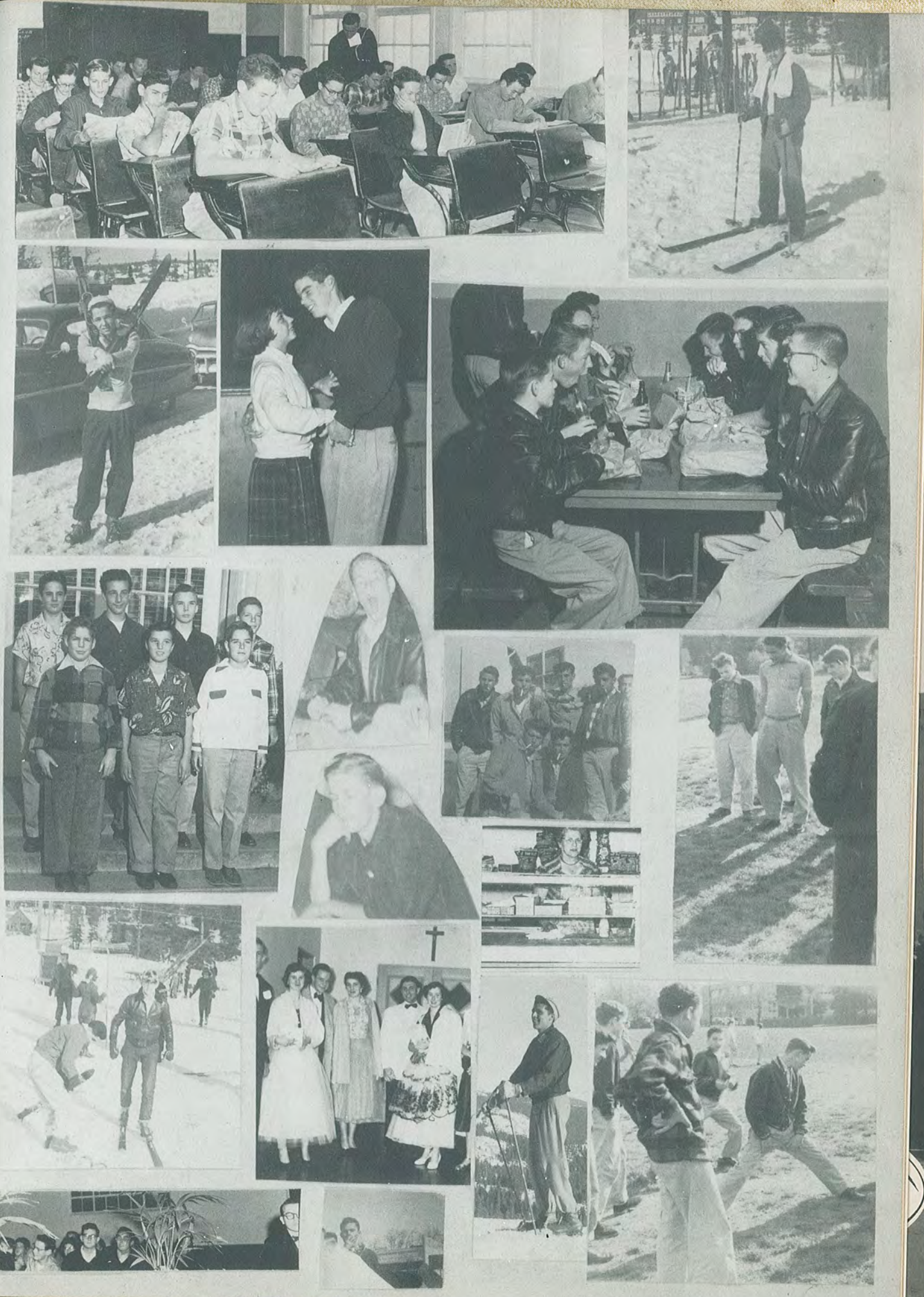

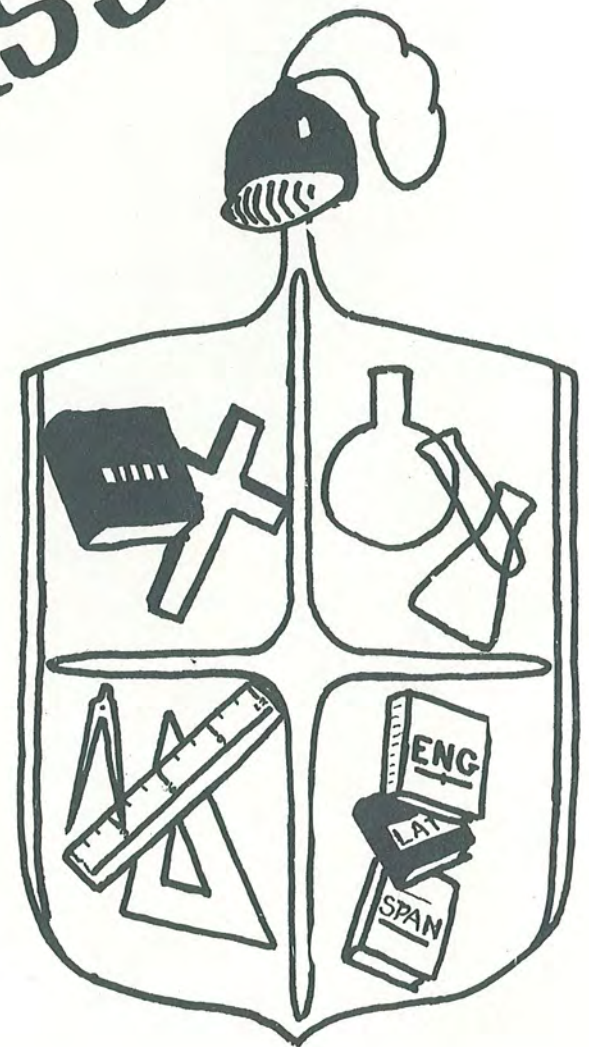
