- C. [Then the entire assembly rose up and led him before Pilate.
They started his prosecution by saying,
- SS. "We found this man subverting our nation,
opposing the payment of taxes to Caesar,
and calling himself the Messiah, a king."
- C. Pilate asked him,
S. "Are you the king of the Jews?"
C. He answered,
✠ "That is your term."
- C. Pilate reported to the chief priests and the crowds,
S. "I do not find a case against this man."
C. But they insisted,
SS. "He stirs up the people by his teaching
throughout the whole of Judea,
from Galilee, where he began,
to this very place."
- C. On hearing this,
Pilate asked if the man was a Galilean;
and when he learned that he was under Herod's jurisdiction,
he sent him to Herod,
who also happened to be in Jerusalem at the time.
Herod was extremely pleased to see Jesus.
From the reports about him
he had wanted for a long time to see him,
and he was hoping to see him work some miracle.
He questioned Jesus at considerable length,
but Jesus made no answer.
The chief priests and scribes were at hand
to accuse him vehemently.



Herod and his guards
then treated him with contempt and insult,
after which they put a magnificent robe on him
and sent him back to Pilate.

Herod and Pilate,
who had previously been set against each other,
became friends from that day.

Pilate then called together
the chief priests, the ruling class, and the people,
and said to them:

- S. "You have brought this man before me
as one who subverts the people.
I have examined him in your presence
and have no charge against him
arising from your allegations.
Neither has Herod,
who therefore has sent him back to us;
obviously this man has done nothing that calls for death.
Therefore I mean to release him,
once I have taught him a lesson."
- C. The whole crowd cried out,
SS. "Away with this man;
release Ba·rab'bas for us!"
- C. This Ba·rab'bas had been thrown in prison
for causing an uprising in the city and for murder.
Pilate addressed them again,
for he wanted Jesus to be the one he released.
But they shouted back,
SS. "Crucify him, crucify him!"
- C. He said to them for the third time,
S. "What wrong is this man guilty of?
I have not discovered anything about him
that calls for the death penalty.
I will therefore chastise him and release him."
- C. But they demanded with loud cries that he be crucified,
and their shouts increased in violence.
Pilate then decreed that what they demanded should be done.
He released the one they asked for,
who had been thrown in prison for insurrection and murder,
and delivered Jesus up to their wishes.
As they led him away,
they laid hold of one Simon the Cy·rē'nēan
who was coming in from the fields.
They put a crossbeam on Simon's shoulder
for him to carry along behind Jesus.
A great crowd of people followed him,
including women who beat their breasts
and lamented over him.
Jesus turned to them and said:

- ✠ "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me.
Weep for yourselves and for your children.
The days are coming when they will say,
'Happy are the sterile,
the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed.'
Then they will begin saying to the mountains, 'Fall on us,'
and to the hills 'Cover us.'
If they do these things in the green wood,
what will happen in the dry?"
- C. Two others who were criminals
were led along with him to be crucified.
When they came to Skull Place, as it was called,
they crucified him there
and the criminals as well,
one on his right and the other on his left.
Jesus said,
- ✠ "Father, forgive them;
they do not know what they are doing."
- C. They divided his garments, rolling dice for them.
The people stood there watching,
and the leaders kept jeering at him, saying,
- SS. "He saved others;
let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God,
the chosen one."
- C. The soldiers also made fun of him,
coming forward to offer him their sour wine and saying,
- SS. "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself."
- C. There was an inscription over his head:
"THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS."
One of the criminals hanging in crucifixion blasphemed him:
- S. "Aren't you the Messiah?
Then save yourself and us."
- C. But the other one rebuked him:
- S. "Have you no fear of God,
seeing you are under the same sentence?
We deserve it, after all.
We are only paying the price for what we've done,
but this man has done nothing wrong."
- C. Then he said,
- S. "Jesus, remember me when you enter upon your reign."
- C. And Jesus replied,
- ✠ "I assure you:
this day you will be with me in paradise."
- C. It was now around midday,
and darkness came over the whole land until midafternoon
with an eclipse of the sun.
The curtain in the sanctuary was torn in two.
Jesus uttered a loud cry and said,



- ✠ "Father,
into your hands I commend my spirit."
C. After he said this, he expired.

(HERE KNEEL AND PAUSE MOMENTARILY)

The centurion, upon seeing, what had happened,
gave glory to God by saying,

- S. "Surely this was an innocent man."
C. When the crowd which had assembled for this spectacle
saw what had happened,
they went home beating their breasts.
All his friends
and the women who had accompanied him from Galilee
were standing at a distance watching everything.]

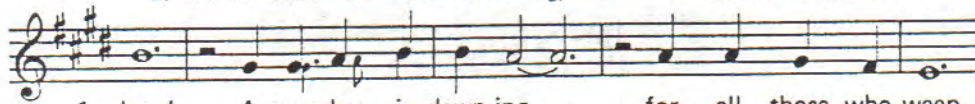

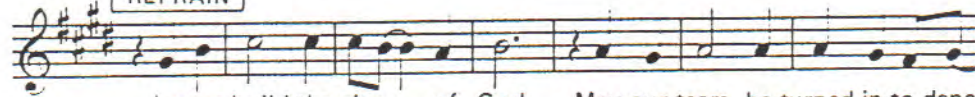
