Wally Played With The Best



When there were only 16 teams in themajor leagues and baseball was in its Golden Era of unparalleled talent, Wally Westlake's major league career blossomed.

Wally graduated from Christian Brothers High School in 1939. In 1940 he signed a contract with the Brooklyn Dodgers and was sent to their Dayton farm club in the class C mid- Atlantic league. He did not last long and was told to go home and find another job. In 1941 Bill Avila, a local scout, realized his potential and signed Wally to a contract with the Oakland Acorns of the Pacific Coast League. He was sent to Oakland's farm team, Merced, in the California State League, had a great year and was called up to finish the season with Oakland. His career was then interrupted by a 3 year stint in the Coast Guard.

In 1946, after completing his military obligation, he

returned to Oakland to resume his baseball career. Casey Stengel was the manager and Wally credits Stengel with giving him his "big break" and "teaching me how to play the game". Wally was having a great year under Casey, playing center field and hitting .315. With two weeks left in the season, Wally was sold to the Pittsburgh Pirates for 3 players and \$50,000 (a good sum in those days).

Wally had 4½ great years with the Pittsburgh Pirates from 1947 to 1951. In 1947, his rookie year, Wally hit .273 with 17 home runs, 69 RBIs and a .459 slugging percentage. This performance along with his outstanding fielding, earned Wally the runner up position to Jackie Robinson as Rookie of the Year.

During those years with Pittsburgh Wally batted behind Ralph Kiner. In 1949 when Kiner hit 54 home runs, Wally was constantly knocked down by the opposing pitchers. As Wally puts it, "Every time Ralph put one out, I got knocked on my butt". Wally also had an excellent season that year, hitting .282 with 23 home runs and 104 RBIs.

After his stay with Pittsburgh, Wally was traded to the St. Louis Cardinals in 1951 and then to the Cincinnati Reds in 1952.

In 1953 Wally was traded to the Cleveland Indians. In 1954 they easily won the American League pennant and faced the underdog New York Giants in the World Series. The Indians won the pennant early and were heavily favored to win the Series mainly because of their great pitching staff that included Early Winn, Bob Lemon, Mike Garcia, Bob Feller, Hal Newhouser and others. However, the Giants beat Cleveland 4-0. (This series is probably most remembered for Willie Mays' famous over the shoulder catch of Vic Wertz's long drive.) Wally says "We should have won that series" and it still bothers him to this day.

During his 10 year career, "The Beast" as he was affectionately called by his teammates because of this tough demeanor, played with 6 major league teams: Pittsburgh Pirates, St. Louis Cardinals, Cincinatti Reds, Cleveland

Indians, Baltimore Orioles and the Philadelphia Phillies. His lifetime major league numbers are impressive: 958 games, 3117 at bats, 848 hits, 107 doubles, 33 triples (he could run), 127 home runs (he had power), 539 RBIs, and a .272 lifetime batting average.

A few other highlights from Wally's major league career include: 7 career grand slam home runs, 6 consecutive base hits including 3 home runs during a double header at the Polo Grounds, a 7 RBI day at Ebbets Field featuring a grand slam and a 3 run double, hitting for the cycle twice for Pittsburgh in 1947 and 1948, leading all national league outfielders in 1950 with a .991 fielding percentage committing only 3 errors in 139 games and, last but not least, being selected to the 1951 National League All Star Team.

These accomplishments were achieved at a time when the competition and talent in the major leagues was at its best. He faced such pitching greats as Robin Roberts, Warren Spahn, Sal Maglie, Ed Lopat, Whitey Ford, Allie Reynolds, Ewell Blackwell ("The toughest pitcher I faced") and played with and against such stars as Willie Mays, Ralph Kiner, Ted Williams, Al Rosen, Mickey Mantle, Stan Musial, Red Schoendienst, Jackie Robinson, Larry Doby, Bobby Avila, Hank Greenberg, PeeWee Reese and Hank Bauer to name a few.

Wally and his late wife, Rose, have five children: daughters Pat, Connie and Cathleen and two catchers, Steve and Joe. His late brother, Jim Westlake, also a well known local talent had a long career in the Pacific Coast League and made it to the Philadelphia Phillies in 1955.

Tonight the La Salle Club takes great pleasure in honoring Wally Westlake as one of the greatest major league ball players to come out of Sacramento. Wally will forever be remembered for his baseball achievements. He has brought pride to his family and to our Sacramento community.






