Students Fine Arts Festival Set For Tonight

Music, Art, Drama, Are Featured At Dual Presentation

Drama, art and music go on parade tonight as the second annual Students Fine Arts Festival opens for its 2 day showing at the Tuesday Clubhouse. Curtain time for this event, which proved very successful last year in displaying the talent of Catholic High School students, is 7:30.

The combined orchestra of Christian Brothers and St. Joseph's Academy, under the direction of Mrs. Mildred Springer, will commence the musical part of the Festival by playing "The Russian Sailor Dance" and Romeo and Juliet.

The vocal section of the evening is to be provided by the Glee Clubs of the 3 schools. CBS and St. Francis will each sing one song. Mr. Anton Dorndorf directing. Sister Raymond, with 40 voices from SJA, will take the stage and finally all three schools will unite to present two more numbers.

This year three one act plays, directed by Sister Teresina of St. Francis, will replace the one longer play of last year. This is to give more students the chance to participate.

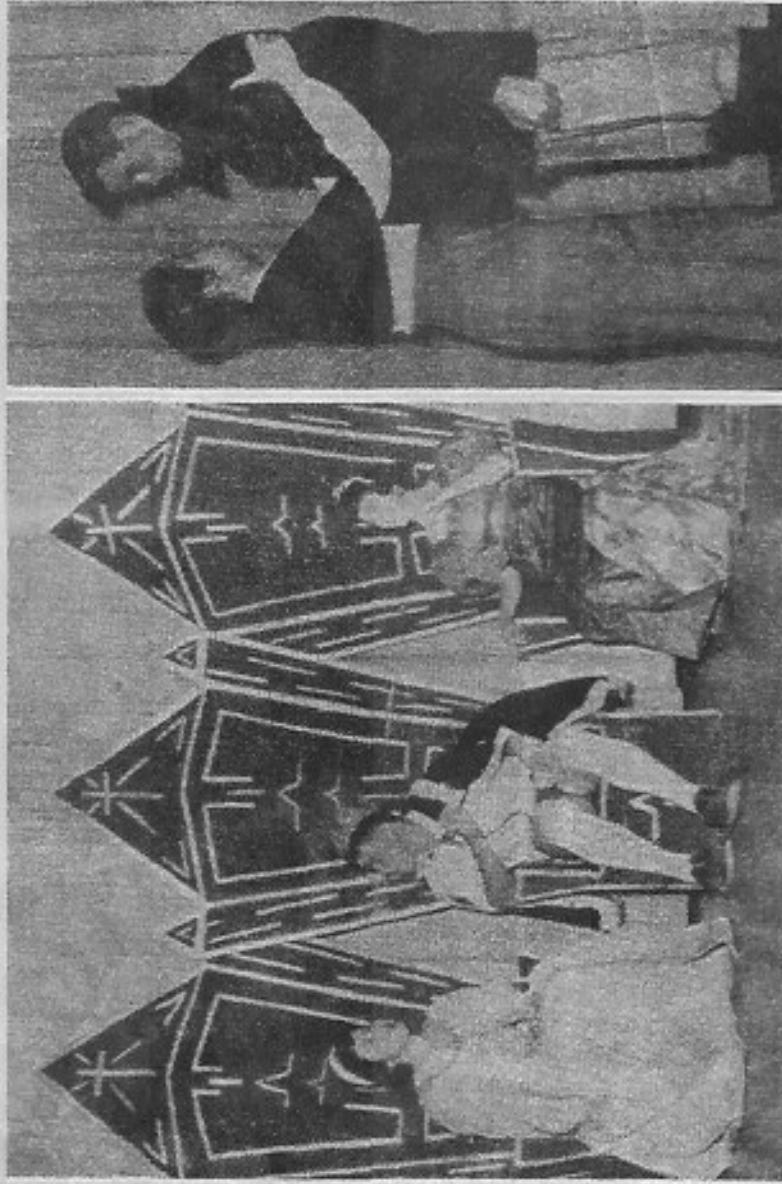
