


Brother William Cyril, FSC, principal of CBS from 1939 to 1945, injected plenty of life into the school with the first of his popular Minstrel Shows. 1943 and 1945 witnessed two more of these humor-

ous musical extravaganzas.

Brother stuggled valiantly to collect many "past due" tuitions to get the school on its financial feet. Unfortunately, however, some people of means resented his efforts and tried to discredit him publicly by vengeful letters. Another means of raising the needed revenue to run the school was the operation of the California State Fair Luncheon booth. The Mothers Club, under the leadership of Brother Walter and with the practical aid of Mr. Bill Flarety made this venture a great success for many years. Fire Chief Terrance Mulligan, together with Brothers S. Robert and A. Joseph combined their talents in making the annual Bar-B-Q a \$ and \$\varepsilon \text{success}\$. Also during Brother's six-year term, the La Salle Club was founded with Mr. Tom Armstrong its first president.

Brother served as principal of Cathedral High School Los Angeles from 1946 to 1952. He died in 1956 of injuries suffered in an auto-

mobile accident on Highway 99 near Merced.
