In 1939 he won honors by being named to an end position on the All Southern California high school football team. Thereafter, he began performing grid chores for St. Mary's College, where he was tutored under such colorful coaches as Slip Madigan, Red Strader, and Jim Phelan. In his senior year, Currey, after three years as a first-stringer for the Galloping Gaels, won twofold honors by being picked as an All Coast end, and by being voted season captain for the Gaels.



During the war, Currey ended up as a paratrooper in the rugged 101st Division. Since his discharge, he has been mentoring Christian Brothers grid teams for two seasons. Football is a favorite topic around the Currey household, for he is married to the daughter of his former coach, Jim Phelan.

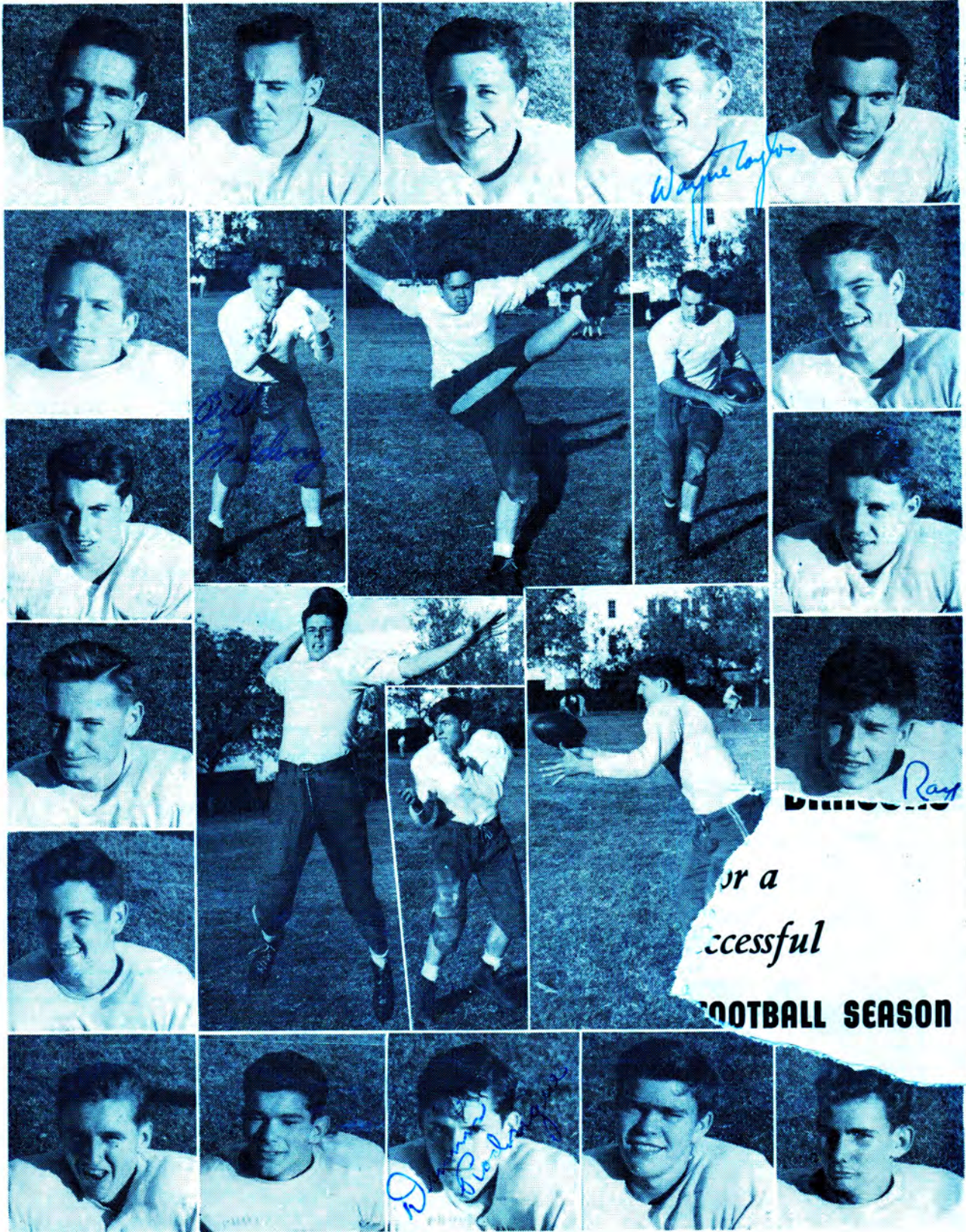
The Third Time---Tonight?

Tonight's Game

Report On The Gaels

The Christian Brothers Gaels, coached by Ray Currey, enter Hughes Stadium tonight hoping to capture some of that "luck of the Irish," which has evaded them so far this season. Facing the undefeated Sacramento High Dragons, the Brothers are definite underdogs in tonight's game.

Out of five games this year, the Curreymen, featuring an aerial attack, have won over Elk Grove, 20-13, and St. Elizabeth's, 27-7. They have lost to McClatchy, 36-6, Willows High, 14-7, and Rio Vista, 13-6.

Sparking the Irish backfield are Johnny Lysaght, Jerry Mikacich and Harold Matthews, student body president. Quarterback Matthews, who passes with the accuracy of a big leaguer, has ends Bob Letola and Larry Kehoe on the receiving end of his tosses. Guard Johnny Concannon is another top lineman. The Gael backfield averages 167 pounds; the line, 172 pounds.

Left Guard Jack Tucker broke his nose in the Gaels' encounter with Rio Vista last Friday and will probably be out of tonight's game. The Brothers also have lost Rudy Garcia, backbone of the '46 line, and Pat Hammond, backfield breakaway threat, who are ineligible to play this season because of their ages.

Last year when the Gaels and Dragons met, the Brothers were trimmed 19-0 in a hard fought game. During the first half of this game, fumbles by both teams predominated the play. It was not until the third quarter that the Dragons broke loose when Louis Pisanti went over for a touchdown. The Dragons tallied again in the third quarter when Barsanti ran twelve yards through the entire Gael team. The Gaels failed to stop the Dragons in the fourth quarter when Pisanti hit pay dirt, and Bob Kent kicked the conversion.

The Brothers and Sac High are the oldest high school rivals in Sacramento. In all their meetings, except two, the Gaels have come out on the losing end. Highest score the SHS team has piled up against Christian Brothers was 84-0, in 1927. The Gaels have succeeded in beating the Dragons only in 1937 and 1936, when the scores were 6-0 and 7-0. They would like very much to turn the trick again tonight.

Tonight's Game

Report On The Dragons

Coach George Relles' Purple Dragons are getting a breather in tonight's game—and after the Woodland game last week, which SHS barely won, 21-13, they can use it. Tonight's game figures to ease the pressure on the Purple Dragons, as it is a non-conference tilt, and the only trouble Relles will have is to keep the score from going too high. To do this, he is planning to rest his star backs for most of the game, for unlike many coaches he is not "touchdown-happy."

Although CBS has a strong passer in Harold Matthews, SHS can match him with quarterback Jack Higdon. This figures to be a passing game, as both team's pass defense leaves much to be desired. The battered SHS gridders have recovered from the Woodland rondo, and although many first stringers may play for only small portions of the game, the reserve strength of the Dragons is three and four deep in most positions.

CBS has had a mediocre season this year, winning from St. Elizabeth's of Berkeley 27-7, and from the Elk Grove Herd 20-13. They have lost to McClatchy 36-6, Willows 14-7, and Rio Vista 31-6. They are weak in reserves, and this figures to be a deciding factor in tonight's game.

In contrast to this, the Purple gridders have a season record of five wins, no losses. They have defeated Richmond 12-0, Turlock 12-0, Modesto 25-7, Lodi 13-6, and Woodland 21-13. Last week's game with Woodland broke a Dragon jinx; until then, the Purple gridders had never won a game on Woodland's home field.

The game with Woodland, which most experts predicted that SHS would win easily, was a thriller, with each team battling desperately down to the final gun. The Dragons were held scoreless all during the first half, while Woodland scored two touchdowns and completed one conversion. It wasn't until the second half that the Dragons started rolling; they scored one TD early in the fourth quarter, and came back again in the closing minutes of the game to score the six-pointer that sent them ahead, 14-13. With two minutes to play, they managed to cross the Wolves' goal line again for another touchdown. Henry Barsanti, who played the game with an injured shoulder, Ed Day and Harry Slaughter, who was at his fastest and trickiest, were the big guns who pulled the game out of the fire.

Upsets have been accomplished before, and CBS Gaels might prove too much of a wind for SHS to handle; however, we're looking for the superb Purple and White line to handle anything the Gaels try, and the backfield will provide the winning touchdowns.

Co-captains for tonight's game are Jack Higdon, quarterback, and Tom Moore, tackle.

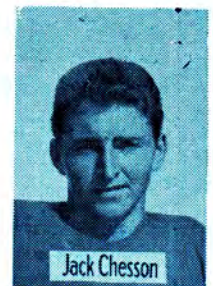
