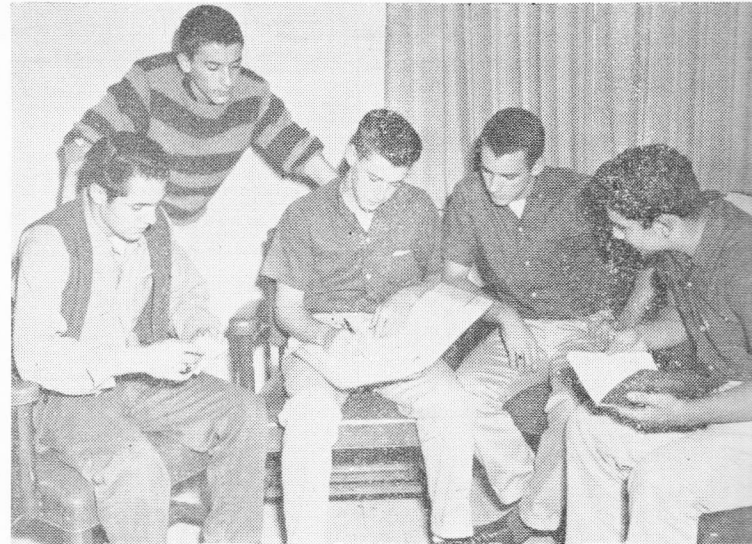

The results of the LaSalle Club Drive are in. The Drive in which the students of Bishop Armstrong and Christian Brothers went out to sell tickets throughout the city and county has been a complete success.

The individual class totals are as follows:

Heading the list and top class is Sophomore TC3 with \$410.00.

Next is Soph class 219 with \$410.00, then comes Freshman 109, having a total of \$381.00; Sophomore TC2 has \$363.00, followed by Sophomore 113 with \$354.50; close behind is Freshman 106 which has \$354.50 and Sophomore 223 with \$352.50; then come Freshman classes 119, \$338.00; Freshman 109, \$295.50; Sophomore TC2, \$293.50 and Freshman TC1 which has \$287.00. The Seminarian class, which brought in \$30.00 which they generously donated to the other classes. The extra bonus of \$1.00 for bringing in the class quota was awarded to Sophomore TC3 with a quota of \$410.00. In addition to the bonus of \$1.00 per student for each class which obtained their quota.

The total of these proceeds equals \$4,275.50, approximately 94% of the school's quota. The money will be used to supply school athletic equipment.

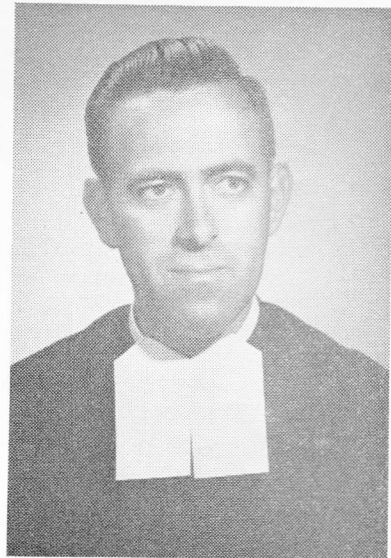
